On Friday afternoon, we will have Pat Murphy from the University of Alabama, University of Iowa Head Coach Rick Heller, Creighton Head Coach Ed Servais, and one more speaker TBA in the pitching area. Our coaches mini-clinics will conclude Friday's sessions running from 4:55 to 6:50 pm. On Saturday, we will have our annual IHSAA rules meeting and add these two additional speakers - New York Yankee's minor league catching coach Tyson Blaser, Cleveland Indians minor league assistant Director of Player Development Justin Toole. We will continue to host the annual McDonalds/FCA Breakfast on Saturday morning starting at 7:30 am. Mike Botts is heading up the umpire side of the clinic. Our umpire sessions will follow the same time frame on both Friday and Saturday. Hope to see everyone! Vendors will be allowed to start setting up their displays on Friday morning beginning at 9:00 am. The clinic sessions will begin at 1:00 pm on Friday afternoon and continue through Saturday, concluding at 3:45 pm.

The Awards Banquet will be held at the Marriott Hotel on Saturday evening, beginning at 6:00 pm. We are again looking forward to another outstanding weekend of baseball. With the clinic fast approaching, please check to make sure your membership has been paid for the 2018-2019 season. For that continued support, dedication, and contributions he has made during his 55-year coaching career, we would like to recognize Dennis Olejniczak with the 2018 IHSBCA President's Award. Dennis is the long time and very successful head baseball coach at Decorah High School. He retired from his successful coaching career this fall after 55 years at the helm. He's been an active member of our association, a founding father, has served on numerous committees and worked his way through the officers chairs, serving as president of our association. Dennis's 55-year career led him to become the 2nd winningest high school baseball coach in the nation with 1,417 victories. Dennis has guided his teams to 3 state titles, appeared in 9 state title games, has 11 state tournament appearances, and 21 Northeast lowa Conference titles. What an impressive career.On behalf of the lowa High School Baseball Coaches Association, we would like to congratulate Dennis Olejniczak for being named the 2018 President's Award Winner.

Harold "Pinky" Primrose Award to Alan Beste:

Alan Beste, the executive director of the Iowa High School
Athletic Association, announced that he will retire after 30
years with the organization. His retirement will be effective
July 10, 2019. Alan first joined the association as a Wellness
Coordinator in 1989 and became an assistant associate directo

Coordinator in 1989 and became an assistant associate director in July 1998. He took over as the IHSAA's fifth executive director in August 2014, after Rick Wulkow resigned. Alan joined the association after spending 7 years as a teacher and athletic director at Pleasant Valley High School. He emphasized student-athlete's wellness and safety during his tenure. He earned a bachelor's degree in health education from St. Cloud State and a master's in health and physical education from Northwest Missouri State. Mr. Beste Commented: "I am proud to have had the opportunity to lead the IHSAA, but of equal importance, I have been able to serve our member schools, students, and officials for 30 years. While some of the days were long, the days have gone by quickly. Rarely did I think of what I did as 'going to work. Instead, it was more like being able to live out my passion for education-based athletics and activities." On behalf of the IHSBCA, we would like to





Six are selected to enter the IHSBCA Hall of Fame

This year, the IHSBCA Hall of Fame Class of 2019 will induct two coaches, two players, one contributor and one umpire. This year's inductee's are: Jay Ryan (Coach) from Davenport, Rod Unger (Coach) from Missouri Valley, Steve Fink (Player) from Kee Lansing, Bill Sandry (Player) from Davenport, Lyle Gibson (Contributor) from Burlington, and Joe Nelson (Umpire) from Des Moines. The Hall of Fame class of 2019 will be inducted during the IHSBCA Awards Banquet on Saturday, January 19, 2019, in Cedar Rapids. They will join the 277 previously inducted Hall of Fame members.

Jay Ryan (Coach) – The love of baseball came early in life for this Minnesota native growing up in Twins country. Jay found himself coaching youth Park and Rec teams at the age of 15. He coached players that were not old enough for a Little League team or players that did not make a roster for one of the Little League teams. Jay graduated from Rochester Mayo High School in 1975 where he was a twoyear varsity starter. He played second base, catcher, and outfield. He earned All-Conference honors his senior season. Jay also played American Legion Baseball for three years. Jay attended the University of Wisconsin in LaCrosse. During that freshman year in college, Jay would return home to Rochester to begin his coaching career as an assistant for his old Legion team. That team would qualify for the Minnesota State Legion Tournament for the first time in the team's history. Jay would take over the head coaching duties for the next four years where his Legion team won 110 games with only 36 losses, finishing as high as 3rd in the legion state tournament. Jay moved on to bigger and better things and found himself teaching and coaching at Davenport Central. He would spend 4 years as the sophomore assistant coach, then 12 years as the head sophomore coach, and finished his coaching career as the varsity head coach for 19 years. During his varsity tenure, Jay won 383 games, 3 conference titles, four state tournament appearances with one runner-up finish and 2 semi-final round finishes. Jay also coached 8th grade football. Jay was instrumental in fundraising \$9,000 for a new irrigation system at Brady Field. He also organized a spring league for schools in the area that allowed kids to play at no charge. Jay has been heavily involved within the organization. He has served on and chaired several committees, worked through the officer chairs and finished as the association president, served on the board of directors, currently he oversees the All-Academic Award process and helps with the All-Star Series and clinic operations. Jay was named MAC Coach of the Year twice and named SE District Coach of the Year 7 times.

Rod Unger (Coach) - Rod began his high school coaching career at Missouri Valley High School in 1975, hired as an Industrial Arts teacher and ran the youth and Legion

programs. He moved to the assistant varsity position in 1986, and became the head varsity coach in 1990. Rod played his high school baseball at West Harrison High School, where he was a four year starter in the outfield. Rod attended Wayne State College, lettering for three years in track and field. Rod threw the javelin on the track team. During his 43 year career at Missouri Valley, Rod has won 15 conference titles, over 16 conference tournament titles and ending his career with 469 wins. Rod was very active with the youth programs in his community, hosting camps for the little leagues and youth coaches. He encouraged his athletes to continue baseball at the collegiate level. He would take many of his players to college camps in the surrounding area to improve their skills and knowledge of the game. Rod is a 42-year member of the coaches association. He has served on many committees, has coached in the All-Star Series, and is a member of the 400 win club. Coach Unger is a man of extraordinary character and a tremendous ambassador to our game.

Steve Fink (Player) – Steve played his high school baseball at Kee High Lansing. He left quite a legacy behind after his playing days ended upon high school graduation. He holds many school and state level records. Steve ended his high school career with a 47-9 record, a 0.70 ERA, with 661 strikeouts. He allowed only 152 hits in 366 innings pitched. Steve ranks in the top 15 all-time in career wins with 47. Ranks 6th all-time with 661 strikeouts, and 5th all-time in ERA at 0.70, and struck out 15 batters in the 1973 Championship game, which he was the winning pitcher, winning a state title. Steve went on to play at Luther College, where he again dominated the competition. He pitched a complete game and was the winning pitcher against the University of Iowa. Steve finished his college career at Luther in the top 5 in ERA, the all-time leader in career strikeouts, 4th all-time in wins, and 3rd all-time in complete games. After his college days where over, Steve spent time coaching with the Hall of Fame legend Jim Van Scoyoc at Norway. He was instrumental in helping Norway win many state titles. Oh and by the way, Steve wasn't a bad offensive baseball player either. He hit .360 for his career with 119 RBI and 5 homeruns.

Bill Sandry (Player) – Bill played his high school baseball at Davenport Central High School. Bill played varsity for 3 years at first base. Bill was selected 2nd Team All-State his senior season. He finished the season leading the team in batting average, homeruns, and RBI's. He played on a team that had 5 players eventually play professional baseball. Two of those teammates are in the Hall of Fame: Dave Hoeksema and Tom Mullen. His senior year team finished 2nd at the state tournament. Bill played for Hall of Fame

coaches Bill Freese and Jack Leabo. After high school, Bill went on to play at Muscatine Community College. He hit .388 with 19 homeruns and 72 RBI's his sophomore year at Muscatine. He was selected as an All-Region JUCO player. A highlight that year was hitting 2 grand slams in one inning against Kirkwood CC. His dream came true after his sophomore season at Muscatine when he accepted a full scholarship to the University of Kentucky. He was selected to the First Team All-Southeastern Conference (SEC) Team. He set the SEC record with 24 doubles in a season. And he broke the school record for hits in a season. He led the team in homeruns and RBI's, and he also tied a NCAA D1 record with four homeruns in a game. He was voted Team Captain his senior season. His next step came in 1982 when he was drafted by the Chicago White Sox in the 23rd round. He played two seasons with the White Sox and one season with the Chicago Cubs organization, playing for the Quad City Cubs. He had a career batting average of .295 in the minor leagues. Bill now coaches high school baseball at Pleasant Valley High School, sharing his baseball knowledge. Bill works as a financial advisor for Merrill Lynch.

Lyle Gibson (Contributor) - Lyle is a 1971 graduate of Burlington High School. He played 3 years at the varsity level, playing second base. His senior year team finished 2nd at the state tournament. Lyle holds a state record with 3 triples in a game, 2 triples in one inning. He played his college baseball at Mankato State, Parsons College. And Monmouth College. In his freshman year at Mankato State, Lyle hit .500 and committed no errors while playing second base. Lyle's baseball influence goes well beyond his playing days from high school and college. Lyle coached high school baseball for 17 years at Burlington High School and 4 years at Burlington Notre Dame High School, with most of those years being an unpaid assistant coach. He coached little league for 10 years, and was a committee member for the 1999 Babe Ruth 16-year old World Series. Lyle provided private hitting instruction for 35 years. Lyle did coach tennis at Burlington High School for 10 years and was named Conference Coach of the Year in 1986. He continued to play baseball in his adult life winning two 50 and over National Championships and three 60 and over National Championships. Lyle was named 3 time MVP. Lyle has been very involved within his community during his career. Here are a few of his community involvements, which includes: United Way Vice Chairman for 21 years, Chairman for local March of Dimes for 2 years, YMCA Board of Directors for 6 years, Co-Chair of the committee to build the new

Burlington High School track, President of the Burlington Invitational Industrial Games for 5 years, Co-founder of the Great River Bridge Run and Course Director, Race Director of Juvenile Diabetes 5K Run, the YMCA 5K Run, and the 5K Run for the Homeless Shelter. Along with the Director for the American Heart Association Walk. Lyle is an advocate for Parkinson's disease, speaking in over 30 midwestern cities about the importance of exercise to increase the quality of life for those with the disease. Lyle is also an author of a "Best Selling Book" - "A Lifetime in Motion: Lessons Learned from a Student of the Game(s). His book reached #26 on Amazon's hot 100 list and #9 on Amazon's Kindle rankings. Lyle's book has promoted a screen play that is being written about his life, including all his baseball successes. Not bad for a guy who also ran in 16 marathons, logging in over 80,000 miles over a 28-year span.

Joe Nelson (Umpire) – Joe is a longtime umpire from Des Moines. He has been umpiring for over 29 years. Joe umpires in central lowa where he covers 4 different baseball conferences. Those include the Raccoon River, Heart of Iowa, Pride of Iowa, and the West Central Conference. Joe has also umpired at the college level in the lowa Conference, the Big 10 Conference, and the Missouri Valley Conference. Joe has also umpired at the professional level in the Pacific Coast League. Joe has umpired in the IHSAA District tournament for over 22 years, the sub-state tournament for over 22 years, and has umpired in the state baseball tournament for over 20 years. Joe has been an active 25-year member of the association, umpiring in many of our annual August All-Star Series. Joe has been selected and honored 8 times as District Umpire of the Year. Joe is very instrumental in encouraging young people to get involved in umpiring. His colleagues mention that Joe is very professional on the field, a very positive influence, and his leadership is defined by a willingness to serve others. It has been said that Joe isn't in this profession for the money, but rather to be involved with young athletes and to observe their skills and growth within the sport of baseball over their competing years. Joe is currently the athletic director at Johnston High School.

College Coaches of the Year Nominations

2 Year College Coaches:

Justin Schulte (Southeastern CC) - just completed his 19th year overall as a head coach and 12th season at Southeastern. The Blackhawks turned in their fourth straight 40 win season with a 43-19 record. The Blackhawks made a run to the Regional Championship losing a tough 11-8 game. The 43 wins in 2017 pushed Schulte's win total to 473 in 12 seasons, the most successful 12-year run in the program history. This season also adds to Coach Schulte's career win total eclipsing the 749 wins in 19 seasons as a collegiate head coach. The Blackhawks spent all of the season ranked in the top 25 nationally. The 2017 Blackhawks included 1st team All-American Luis Vargas as well as ICCAC Reliever of the Year Trace Hoffman. Oswaldo Calderon and Braeden Brown also joined Vargas and Hoffman as First Team All-Region XI members. Zeb Adreon and Sam Noel also received 2nd Team All-Region honors.

Todd Rima (Kirkwood CC) - is in his seventh season as the head coach of the Kirkwood Eagles baseball program. Rima has over 500 career wins and has led the Eagles to a 203-114 record in six seasons. Last year's team finished with an overall record of 42-17 which also included a regional tournament championship and a trip to the NJCAA World Series. Last season, the Eagles landed eight players on the All-Region team, led by First Team recipients Taylor Jackson and Izaya Fullard. Fullard was also honored as a First Team All-American. The Eagles also took great pride in the classroom and had 4 Academic All-Americans.

Marc Rardin (lowa Western CC) - begins his 17th season as head baseball coach at Iowa Western Community College. While leading the tradition rich Reiver baseball program, Coach Rardin's teams have rewritten the record books in every facet of the program. In addition, the Reivers have made NJCAA Division I baseball history by being the first Northern District team to win the World Series in 2010 in Grand Junction, Colo., and then repeating that historic act again in 2012 and 2014. Along with winning the national title, the 2010 Reiver baseball team also lead the country in hitting with a .398 team batting average. The team also proved to be champions in the classroom, earning NJCAA Spring Male Scholar Team of the Year honors. The 2011 team nearly duplicated the 2010, 2012 and 2014 championship feats by finishing just one game away from landing in the championship game. Rardin's young 2011 squad, with 21 freshmen on the roster, came home with a third-place finish at the national tournament. Rardin's Reivers have participated in 11 Junior College World Series tournaments, brought home three national championships, and won 13 Regional titles and 11 Northern District titles.

4 Year College Coaches:

Paul Wyczawski (University of Dubuque) - (pronounced Why-Chow-Skee), the 17th coach in school history. He joins a program which has over 38 All-lowa Conference selections and 10 All-Region performers in the past 16 seasons, including one All-American and a Golden Glove recipient. UD placed second in the IIAC in 2017 and he earned Coach of the Year honors for his work. In 2018, UD returned to their winning form by claiming the IIAC title and tournament title. Wyczawski earned his 2nd consecutive Coach of the Year honors and helped his squad advance to the NCAA Division III National Championship Midwest Regional and placed third and ended with a 26-17 overall record and 32 school records in the process.

Brian Wede (Northwestern College) - The 2019 season will mark Wede's 13th as the head coach. Wede's teams have won 346 games and 7 conference titles. His teams have also been very strong in the postseason, winning 36 postseason games. Wede, the winningest coach in the history of the program, was named the GPAC Coach of the Year in 2018. Wede is also very respected across the country; serving for 4-years as the Chairman of the NAIA Baseball Rules Committee and representing the GPAC as the baseball coaches chair and the national rater. He is currently the President of the NAIA baseball coaches executive committee. Wede has coached eight All-Americans at Northwestern, 26-1st Team All-GPAC players, 33-2nd Team All-GPAC players, 12 Gold Glove winners, two GPAC Pitchers of the Year, two GPAC Players of the Year, 53 All-GPAC honorable mentions, 27 NAIA Scholar Athletes and two Capital One Academic All-Americans.

Dan Spain (Clarke University) -, the Clarke baseball program accomplished another record breaking season, its fourth in five years under Spain, posting a 46-14 overall record, establishing itself as not only one of the top NAIA programs in the Midwest, but also in being recognized on a national level, ranked as high as No. 6 in the NAIA Baseball Coaches Poll. The 2017 team also accomplished its first regular season conference championship in its first season joining the Heart of America Athletic Conference going, 26-6 in conference play, earning an automatic berth in the NAIA National Championship Opening Round Tournament for the second straight season and a No. 1 seed in the Hutchinson bracket. Clarke was recognized with individual accolades based on the success of the season including eight all-conference performers. Spain was also named the 2017 Heart of America Athletic Conference baseball Coach of the Year, as well as becoming the winningest coach in Clarke baseball history.
