IHSBCA Clinic returns to Cedar Rapids: This years clinic will return to Cedar Rapids at the Marriott Hotel, 1200 Collins Road NE, on January 17-18, 2020. You can make reservations by going to the IHSBCA website and clicking on the reservations tab at the top of the front page. We are very excited with our list of clinic speakers this year. On Friday afternoon, we will have Pat Murphy from the University of Alabama, Paul Davis - big league pitching coach for the Seattle Mariners, and Ryan Brownlee - ABCA Assistant Executive Director and former Iowa assistant and Western Illinois Head Coach. Our coaches mini-clinics will conclude Friday's sessions running from 4:55 to 6:50 pm. On Saturday, we will have our annual IHSA rules meeting and add these additional speakers - Cleveland Indians minor league assistant Director of Player Development and hitting coach Justin Toole, Robin Lund - University of Iowa Assistant Coach, Seth Wing - Cornell College Head Coach. and Marty Sutherland-University of Iowa Assistant Coach. We will continue to host the annual McDonalds/FCA Breakfast on Saturday morning starting at 7:30 am. Mike Botts is heading up the umpire side of the clinic. Our umpire sessions will follow the same time frame on both Friday and Saturday. Hope to see everyone! Vendors will be allowed to start setting up their displays on Friday morning beginning at 9:00 am. The clinic sessions will begin at 1:00 pm on Friday afternoon and continue through Saturday, concluding at 3:45 pm.

The Awards Banquet will be held at the Marriott Hotel on Saturday evening, beginning at 6:00 pm. We are again looking forward to another outstanding weekend of baseball. With the clinic fast approaching, please check to make sure your membership has been paid for the 2019-2020 season. The new membership calendar year started on September 1, 2019 and runs through August 31, 2020. If your mailing label does not say 2020 on it, your dues have not yet been paid for this year. If you have questions, please give Lee Toole a call. Schools are reminded to take advantage of the school membership group rates. A reminder of how the discount works: the head coach is \$30.00, the first assistant coach is \$30.00, the second assistant coach is \$20.00, and the third assistant coach and beyond are \$15.00 each. The only catch to qualify for this coaching staff group discount rate is that all coaches, from the same school, must send in their membership forms together at the same time.

Six are selected to enter the IHSBCA Hall of Fame

This year, the IHSBCA Hall of Fame Class of 2020 will induct two coaches, two players, one contributor and one umpire. This year's inductee's are: Joel Holst (Coach) from Waverly, Scott Belger (Coach) from Des Moines, Ron Anderson (Player) from Ankeny, Kory DeHaan (Player) from Pella, Sherry Freese (Contributor) from Davenport, and Michael Botts (Umpire) from Davenport. The Hall of Fame class of 2020 will be inducted during the IHSBCA Awards Banquet on Saturday, January 18, 2020, in Cedar Rapids. They will join the 283 previously inducted Hall of Fame members.

Joel Holst (Coach) – Four coaching stops, 930 wins later, and he is still not done. Since 1985, Joel has been coaching baseball at one level or another. Joel started his baseball coaching career in 1985 at West Delaware High School. Joel coached at West Delaware for 4 years, finishing with a record of (100-50). He moved to Loras College in 1990. He spent 5 seasons at Loras College adding 100 more wins to his total, (100-80). His next move brought him to Wartburg College in 1995. He has spent the past 24 years at Wartburg where he has won an amazing number of baseball games, (700-332). You then add in two season back at the high school level at Waverly-Shell Rock in 1990 and 2000, (30-20), you get an amazing win total for Coach Holst career of 930-482. Joel played his high school baseball at Clarence-Lowden High School where he was a pitcher and played the outfield. Joel played his college baseball at Coe College, playing the outfield. Joel has taken his baseball knowledge and used it to make an impact in his community by providing weekend baseball camps and clinics. As the Waverly-Shell Rock High School Booster President, Joel organized all levels of baseball and helped fundraise the needed funds to get the program off the ground. He has also used his baseball influence to bring the NCAA DIII Baseball Championships to Cedar Rapids. He has served on the NCAA DIII Baseball Committee. Joel has been active with our association as a five time clinic speaker, an All-Star Coach in 1989, and winning the District Coach of the Year award twice. He has also been named the College Coach of the Year by the IHSBCA 6 times.

Scott Belger (Coach) - Scott began his baseball career back in high school, playing for his Hall of Fame Father, Vic Belger, at Creston High School. Scott was a shortstop/pitcher for his father. He earned 1st Team All-State honors in 1989 and 1990. He took his next steps towards his coaching career playing college baseball at North Central Missouri Junior College for 1 year, then for 3 years at Culver Stockton College, where he graduated in 1995. Scott began his coaching career in Savannah, Missouri at Savannah High School. After a five year stay, he moved to ADM High School in Adel. Scott coached at ADM for 3 years before making another move to Hoover High

School in Des Moines. Scott again took a program to new heights with his leadership and baseball knowledge. Then in 2007, Scott moved to SE Polk. He again turned an average program around into a consistent winner. He took SE Polk to the state tournament for the first time in school history in 2008. Things came together for Scott during the 2014 and 2015 seasons, winning the Class 4A State Championship. Scott retired from coaching in 2017 to become an administrator for the SE Polk School District. Scott left the game with a career record of 570-345. He participated in 4 state tournaments, winning two state titles and 2 conference titles in the very tough CIML Conference. During his coaching tenure, Scott conducted little league and USSSA Coaches Clinics, held multiple baseball camps in his coaching communities. While at Hoover High School, Scott helped raise 1 million dollars for improvements to the baseball field, field lights, tennis courts, soccer fields, practice football fields, and outdoor campus lights. Scott has been active within the coaches association, serving on a variety of committee's, coaching in the All-Star Series, speaking at the annual clinic, and earned many district coach of the year awards. He was named state coach of the year in 2014 and 2015.

Kory DeHaan (Player) – Kory played his high school baseball at Pella Christian High School. He played mainly SS and pitched, but also played 3rd base and in the outfield. He won a state title his senior season, hitting .398 with 27 RBI, 5 home runs and 18 stolen bases. After high school, Kory attended Morningside College in Sioux City. He played every game in the outfield. He lead the team stolen bases and in the top 3 in batting average. Kory began his professional playing career as an outfielder in the Pittsburgh organization after being selected by the Pirates in the 7th round of the 1997 MLB Player Draft. In 1999, Kory was selected in the Rule 5 Draft by the San Diego Padres. He made his major league debut with the Padres on 4/25/00 at Pittsburg and doubled off Pittsburg's Brad Clontz for his first big league hit. His first major league home run came on July 5, 2000 at Jack Murphy Stadium in San Diego. He played in 102 major league games during a 2 year stretch with the Padres, and 632 games during his 7 year minor league career. Kory is in his 8th season as a coach in the Pirates organization; his second straight as the hitting coach with the GCL Pirates. He began coaching in 2009 with the Chico Outlaws of the Independent Golden League, before moving back with the Padres as their rookie level hitting coach in Peoria, Arizona. Kory received the Chuck Tanner Award in 2016. This is an award given annually since 2011 by the Pirates Player Development department to the minor league staff person who best exemplifies Coach Tanner's optimism, work ethic and leadership.

Six are selected to enter the IHSBCA Hall of Fame

Ron Anderson (Player) – Ron played his high school baseball at Iowa Falls High School. He played four years of varsity baseball; mainly as a pitcher, but also played 1st base and in the outfield. His four year pitching record was 51-12. During that stretch he pitched 5 no-hitters, 4 one hitters, 1 perfect game, 47 complete games and 17 shutouts. His overall ERA was 1.24. He earned 1st team All-State honors his senior year. Back in 1972, there was only one big class for All-State honors. Ron is listed in 8 different pitching records in the state high school baseball record books. Ron continued his baseball career attending Ellsworth Junior College for two years. Ron played the outfield and earned first team All-Conference. He played the next two years at the University of Northern Iowa. He again played the outfield, earning 1st Team All-Conference honors. During his summer's, Ron played town team baseball for the Iowa falls A's, Waterloo Merchants and with Grundy Center. Ron coached high school baseball at four different schools: 1977-78 at Everly High School, 1979 at Alden High School, 1979-80 at Steamboat Rock, and 1981-1994 at Carlisle High School. He coached in two All-Star Series, was named district coach of the year twice and has been a member of the association since 1981.

Sherry Freese (Contributor) – If you ever needed someone to go to battle with you, you would want Sherry Freese on your side. She is a go-getter and never stops till she gets the job done. Whatever you ask of her, she will see it through. Sherry has been a long-time contributor of this association for a very long time. Sherry helps with many of the organizational situations during the annual January clinic and the annual August All-Star Series. You will always find her friendly spirit and outgoing personality greeting coaches, players and their families, umpires, vendors, and guests at all our events. Sherry is an Iowa girl, born in the southwest Iowa town of Tabor. Sherry attended and graduated from the University of Colorado in 1957 with a degree in Journalism. The story goes that she captured Bill's heart one summer evening as she drove around in her convertible corvette. Bill and Sherry were married in Harlan on August 5, 1961. Sherry taught for a few years at Davenport High School and then Central High School as the Journalism/English teacher. She was the advisor for the schools "Blackhawk" Newspaper and school Yearbook. She moved out of the teacher realm in 1969 and became the manager/editor of Club Publications and Magazine. Her creative works included the Iowa Motor News, Home & Away Magazine, AAA Living, AAA Iowa/AAA Minnesota and the Auto Club Group. She also worked with AAA Four

Diamond hotel/restaurant manager. She retired from this position in 2006. She has been very active in her community and other various organizations. Just to name a few – Davenport Schools Foundation Board member, Quad Cities Better Business Bureau Board of Directors representing AAA Iowa Tourism and Travel Federation of Iowa, Elementary School PTA, Chapter LH, P.E.O. member and past officer and served as president, Iowa State P.E.O. Chapter, IHSBCA History Committee Chair, Holy Cross Lutheran Church Board Secretary and Sunday school teacher. And above everything else, Sherry is a cancer survivor! She is a fighter. Sherry and Bill have two daughters, Elizabeth Canute from North Carolina and MaryKay Hahn from Wisconsin. They also have a granddaughter Kelly Canute Keele. It is an honor for this association to have had the pleasure and opportunity to have Sherry as part of our group. Her dedication, her hard work, her passion for life are examples that we should all follow. Sherry is a role model and a mentor. If we all took a small piece of her and molded it into our lives, the world would be such a better place.

Michael Botts (Umpire) – Mike is a longtime umpire from Davenport. He has been umpiring for over 35 years. Mike umpires in eastern Iowa where he covers 5 different baseball conferences. Those include the Mississippi Valley, MAC, WAMAC, River Valley, and the Tri-Rivers Conferences. Mike has umpired in the IHSAA District tournament for over 25 years, the sub-state tournament for over 15 years, and is a regular at the state baseball tournament. Mike has been an active 25-year member of the association, umpiring in many of our annual August All-Star Series. Mike has been selected and honored 4 times as District Umpire of the Year. He was honored as the State Umpire of the Year in 2012. Mike is currently serving as the next in the chairs as President of the association, in which he will take that position after this year's clinic. Mike is also our chairman for the umpires within our association. He puts together the umpire side of our clinic. He also works closely with the Iowa High School Athletic Association in Boone towards the umpire side of things with baseball in the state. Mike has served on the Board of Directors and has helped with many committee's within the association. Mike umpires on average, 60 plus games each summer, plus district, sub-state, and state tournament games. Mike has mentored many young umpires throughout his career, many have grown into great officials in their own right thanks to his guidance.

2 Year College Coaches:

Todd Rima (Kirkwood CC) - Todd Rima is in his seventh season as the head coach of the Kirkwood Eagles baseball program. Rima has 594 career wins and has led the Eagles to a 236-134 record in seven seasons. Last year's team finished with an overall record of 33-20 losing to Northeast Community College, 7-4, in the losers bracket final and finished third at the regional tournament in 2019. Last season, the Eagles landed four players on the All-Region teams. The Eagles also took great pride in the classroom and had 4 Academic All-Americans. Under Rima, the Eagles have put an emphasis on player development and placement. Last year, the Eagles had 13 players commit to D1 schools, and a total of 18 players move onto 4-year schools. Additionally, shortstop Koray Howell was recently drafted in the 12th round by the Milwaukee Brewers in this year's MLB Draft.

Eric Stein (Iowa Central CC) - Former Triton baseball player and assistant baseball coach Eric Stein will be entering his second season as the Triton Head Coach after accepting the head baseball coaching position in the fall of 2018. Eric, a 2003 Harlan HS (IA) graduate, played two years at Iowa Central before transferring to Grandview University. Stein was hired in the fall of 2008 as an assistant coach. He has served the program well for the past 9 seasons. Iowa Central director of athletics Kevin Twait had this to say about Eric Stein. "When Justin informed the administration of his decision to step away from our baseball program, we did not take long to elevate Eric Stein to the head coaching position. Our baseball program has a proven track record for success both in the classroom and on the field. Eric has been a huge part of our success and knows the processes associated with running a top-notch program. We are anxious to support him and his staff and watch the baseball program continue to thrive under his leadership."

Marc Rardin (Iowa Western CC) - Marc Rardin begins the 2019-20 season as the dean of Reiver coaches, set for his 18th season as head baseball coach at Iowa Western Community College., coming off another trip to the World Series last season. While leading the tradition-rich Reiver baseball program, Coach Rardin's teams have re-written the record books in every facet of the program. In addition, the Reivers have made NJCAA Division I baseball history by being the first Northern District team to win the World Series in 2010 in Grand Junction, Colo., and then repeating that historic act again in 2012 and 2014. In 17 seasons, Rardin's Reivers have participated in 12 Junior College World Series tournaments, brought home three national championships, and won 14 Regional titles and 12 Northern District titles. In the past 17 years, no other Division I junior college baseball program has won more games and more post season championships (regionals, districts, JUCO World Series) than Iowa Western for total of 28 post season titles combined.

4 Year College Coaches:

Steve Cook (Coe College) - Steve Cook came to Coe in 1996 as an assistant baseball coach, moving to the head coach position the following year. Cook is a 1993 graduate of Allegheny College in Pennsylvania, a traditional NCAA Division III powerhouse. A four-year starter in the infield, Cook was an All-American in 1993 when his nationally ranked team finished 37-5 overall. Cook was inducted into the Allegheny College Athletics Hall of Fame in 2009. While at Allegheny, Cook set 10 offensive records. He spent three years playing in the minor leagues, including a stop with the Cedar Rapids Kernels. During the 1994 season, Cook and the Kernels won the Midwest League championship. Cook surpassed the 500-win plateau during the 2019 season. Cook's teams have recorded the top eight win totals in school history, including a 37-win season in 2019 and a 34-win season in 2015. Coe won the A-R-C regular season championship in 2019 and Cook was named Coach of the Year in the conference and the region.

Steve Eddie (Buena Vista University) - Steve Eddie will begin his 20th season in 2020. He has spent his entire coaching career at BVU, has a career overall record of 438-333-2 and is the fourth current coach in the American Rivers Conference to reach 400 career wins. His teams have captured a pair of regular season conference championships (2010, 2014) while winning three league tournament championships (2010, 2014, 2019), and a World Series berth (2011). Since taking over the program in 2001, Eddie's squads have made 16 conference tournament appearances. A graduate of Albert City-Truesdale, he went on to play at the University of Iowa, as an infielder, on the Big Ten Championship team in 1990. At the conclusion of his college career, Eddie then spent seven seasons in minor leagues. He reached the AAA level for part of the 1999 season with both Indianapolis (Cincinnati) and Charlotte (White Sox) before ending his career with AA Birmingham Barons (White Sox).

Seth Wing (Cornell College) - Wing has reshaped Cornell baseball into a perennial postseason contender through eight seasons on the Hilltop, highlighted by the program's first-ever Midwest Conference Tournament title and NCAA berth in 2019. Cornell's all-time winningest baseball coach, Wing has directed the Rams to the MWC Tournament five times in the past six years, compiling 124 wins during the span. The Maquoketa, Iowa, native has coached 24 all-conference performers and 13 all-region honorees since 2012. The 2019 squad finished with a 26-19 overall record, one win shy of the program's single-season mark. That team won four elimination games in the MWC Tournament to take the title and punch a berth to nationals. The Rams have posted a winning MWC South Division record in six consecutive seasons under Wing's guidance. They've landed the South Division Position Player of the Year three times and Pitcher of the Year once.
