Jared has worked hand-in-hand with our Baseball Advisory Committee to help level and improve the playing field for high school baseball. He has helped develop and has orchestrated changes that have made lowa high school baseball better for the high school athletes who participate. Jared is the first to step out of his Boone office and attended our annual association Board meetings to discuss baseball concerns and issues with our group. He has been on the forefront organizing and finding the right fit for the state baseball tournament the past two years. Without his help, dedication, and commitment to lowa high school baseball, our organization would not be as strong as we are today. On behalf of the lowa High School Baseball Coaches Association, we would like to congratulate Jared Chizek for being named the 2022 President's Award Winner.

Harold "Pinky" Primrose Award to Pat Hoberg:

When you look at the criteria for this award, we take a look at things that a home grown lowan has done to make a difference not only in their life, but also making an impact within their profession. Pat has done that in a short time as



a major league umpire. Pat is an Urbandale High School and Grand View University graduate. Pat started out as a high school umpire and finished this past season umpiring behind the plate in game 2 of the World Series. Pat is already highly regarded as one of the best umpires in MLB. Hoberg, according to Umpire Scorecards, correctly called all 129 pitches taken during Game 2. It was an extraordinary feat for any umpire. especially considering the amount of scrutiny for every pitch. The perfect game made Hoberg a social media star. Pat made his big-league debut in 2014 and was promoted to the full-time staff in 2017. Pat has worked three Division Series, a Wild Card Game/Series and one League Championship Series. Pat also worked in the replay room for last year's World Series. Pat was the home plate umpire in the 2021 Field of Dreams game between the New York Yankees and the Chicago White Sox. According to Umpire Scorecards, Pat correctly called all 129 pitches taken during Game 2 of the World Series. It was an extraordinary feat for any umpire, especially considering the amount of scrutiny for every pitch. The perfect game made Pat Hoberg a social media star. He received widespread praise from both fans and commentators of baseball for this accomplishment. For the 2018 regular season he was found to be a Top 10 performing home plate umpire in terms of accuracy in calling balls and strikes. His error rate was 7.93 percent. This was based on a study conducted at Boston University where 372,442 pitches were analyzed. On behalf of the IHSBCA, we would like to honor, praise, and congratulate Pat Hoberg with our 2022 Harold "Pinky" Primrose Award.

Seven Selected to Enter the IHSBCA Hall of Fame

This year, the IHSBCA Hall of Fame Class of 2023 will induct three coaches, two players, one umpire, and one contributor. This year's inductees are: Jeff Douglas (Coach) from Truro, Keith McSweeney (Coach) from Solon, Jake Souhrada (Coach) from Wilton, Joel Hanrahan (Player) from Norwalk, Larry Frakes (Player) from Audubon, George Engebretson (Contributor) from Rembrandt, and Steve Shantz (Umpire) from Greenfield. The Hall of Fame class of 2023 will be inducted during the IHSBCA Awards Banquet on Saturday, January 21, 2023, in Des Moines. They will join the 296 previously inducted members.

<u>Jeff Douglas (Coach)</u> – Longevity, diversity, and flexibility describes Coach Douglas. Jeff has spent 23 years at Interstate 35 Schools and 11 years coaching baseball and softball at Graceland University. He attended Wayne Community Schools where he was a 5-year baseball starter, playing multiple positions – 3B, C, outfield, and pitcher. He was also selected as an all-conference player all five years. He graduated from Wayne in 1979 and took his baseball talents to Graceland College (University now). Jeff was a four-year starter playing multiple positions in college – SS, 2B, outfield, and pitcher. He was selected as an all-district college player three times. Jeff started coaching high school baseball after college at Seymour Community Schools filing in for the high school coach who was out due to surgery. He then moved over to Interstate 35 where he has been coaching baseball for the past 23 years. His teams have made four trips to the state tournament, won 6 conference titles, over 400 wins, and has been awarded district coach of the year 3 times. Jeff also coached at the college level at Graceland, which combined with his high school baseball record, he has over 600 wins. Jeff was instrumental in building the youth programs in his area. He had the honor to coach his two talented sons, Brett and Brandon. Jeff has served on a variety of committees for the association, served as a district officer, All-Star coach, and district meeting chairman.

Keith McSweeney (Coach) – Keith has made an impact over the past 23 years while at Solon. He has not only built a strong baseball program but was instrumental in designing and fundraising the Solon Nature and Recreation Center, which houses the high school baseball field along with 4 other baseball diamonds and batting cages. Keith played his high school baseball at Hoffman Estates High School in Illinois. He was a three-year starter as a catcher and outfielder. Keith did not play college baseball while he attended the University of Iowa earning a degree in Business Administration. He has also earned an MA degree from DePaul University in Secondary History, another MA degree in Administration from Drake University, and is currently working on a third MA degree in Graduate History from the University of Iowa. Keith just finished up his 23rd season as the head baseball coach at Solon. He has accumulated over 560 wins, won two state titles, has made 7 trips to the state tournament, was won 11 district titles, and won 4 conference titles. Keith has been very active within the association serving on many committees, has spoken at our clinic, served on the Board of Directors, and currently working his way through the Board of Directors officer's chairs. Keith has been named state coach of the year twice, district coach of the year 4 times, and named the National Guard AD of the year in 2008.

Jake Souhrada (Coach) — Coach Souhrada has spent the past 24 seasons as the head baseball coach at Wilton. He has built a strong baseball program at Wilton, winning a state title, making two trips to the state tournament, winning 8 district titles, along with 14 conference titles. During his 24-year tenure at Wilton, Jake has accumulated over 620 wins. Jake played his high school baseball at Davenport West for his longtime head coach and "Hall of Fame" father, Coach Tom Souhrada. Jake played 2B, SS, and catcher. Jake and his longtime assistant coach and "Hall of Famer" Ed Sawvell have run a youth pitching clinic for Wilton Elementary students. Many of Jake's players have earned state honors, with a combined 39 players earning Super team and All-State honors. Two of those players earned players of the year honors. He has also coached 17 All-Academic winners with one Player earning the Lanny Peterson Award for then top Academic player. Jake has coached in 5 All-Star Series, served on many district and state committees, served on the Board of Directors, and is a past president of the association. Jake has been named state coach of the year once, district coach of the year 6 times, conference coach of the year 7 times, and National Regional Coach of the Year once. Jake won the Spirit in Education Award in 2021 from Wilton Schools for his contributions in the classroom and as a coach.

Joel Hanrahan (Player) – Joel is a Norwalk High School 2000 graduate. He is arguably the most accomplished professional athlete to have graduated from Norwalk High School. Joel was a very successful high school baseball player being selected All-Conference 1st Team twice and 1st Team All-State his sophomore and junior seasons. He holds the school record for homeruns with 24. He competed in only a handful of games his senior season as he was selected in the 2nd round of the 2000 MLB draft by the Los Angeles Dodgers. Joel spent 7 seasons in the minor leagues before making his major league debut with the Washington Nationals as a starter against the New York Mets on July 28, 2007. While a member of the Nationals, Joel partnered with the Red Cross in 2008 to assist in raising over \$50,000 for Iowa flood victims in Eastern Iowa and was named the Washington Nationals recipient of the Roberto Clemente Award which honors those major league players who exemplify the game of baseball, sportsmanship, community involvement, and civic contributions. In 2009 he was traded to the Pittsburgh Pirates and was

converted into a relief pitcher and in turn his career flourished. In 2011 and 2012, Joel was chosen to play in the Major League All-Star Game on the National League Team and also represented the United States in the World Baseball Classic as a member of Team USA in 2009. In 2013, he was traded to the Boston Red Sox and within the first month of the season suffered a serious arm injury which has resulted in two surgeries. In 2014 and 2015, he attempted to make a come back with the Detroit Tigers only to suffer setbacks. Joel retired from professional baseball on November 15, 2016. His career stats in 7 professional seasons included 404 innings pitched with an overall record of 22-18, 100 saves, and 441 strikeouts. Currently, Joel works with pitchers in the Pirates minor league system.

Larry Frakes (Player) – Larry played his high school baseball at Goldfield High School. He graduated in 1972 as one of the most decorated baseball players to come out of Goldfield. He was a pitcher and shortstop combination for four years. His career batting average was .418. His career pitching stats are 36 wins with only 10 loses, 455 strikeouts, with 18 no hitters thrown. Today he still holds Iowa high school state pitching records for his 18 no hitters thrown and 5th most for career strikeouts. He was selected as a North Star Conference player for 3 years along with being selected 2nd Team All-State his senior season. He moved onto Buena Vista College where he continued to tear up the baseball field for four seasons. His career pitching stats while at Buena Vista ended up with a career record of 24-5, an ERA of 2.14. He pitched 22 complete games with 7 of those games being shut outs (school record) and threw 228 strikeouts (school record). He earned first team All-Iowa Conference three years in a row. His high school coach, Mike Brinsko, said – "Larry was the greatest athlete he had ever coached. He could have been a big-time hoops star as he had ungodly court sense and could score with either hand. He was just as good at short stop with outstanding range and was like Robert Redford in "The Natural" and even better hitter than pitcher. More importantly, he was a role model, an outstanding citizen and student. He was the first one on the field and the last one off." Larry dominated the baseball field at every level. Larry did play professionally within the Cincinnati Reds minor leagues making it to the double-A level. Larry has spent time in the educational field and was the high school principal at Coon Rapids-Bayard High School for several years.

George Engebretson (Contributor) - George is Mr. Baseball in the community of Rembrandt. Even though he is no longer with us, George's legendary presence continues to live on. A book was compiled by the Rembrandt High School Alumni which detailed everything that George did in his life for the community of Rembrandt and for the game of baseball. The title of the book says it all, A Man of Service and Dedication to family, Community, Country, and Baseball. George did not coach high school, but he coached every youth team in Rembrandt. He developed and molded many young lives through his coaching and love for baseball. George had such an impact on this small community, his name is placed on a sign near the scoreboard designating the grounds as "George Engebretson Field." George saw the need in the community for an outlet with the youth's energy and competitive spirit. The summer program that George built became a legacy in northwest Iowa. George played football at Linn Grove High School and at State Teachers College in Cedar Falls and at Morningside College in Sioux City. Rumor has it he was offered a chance with the Chicago Bears but opted for family and small-town living. Georges' family ran the family-oriented tavern called "Georges Place," which was the center for fundraising activities for the baseball program and a great place to grab a burger and coke. George held other positions in the community. He was a member of the fire department, city council, and American Legion. He even operated the local theatre for a time. George was an all-around promoter of the community. George built a dynamic baseball program in Rembrandt, which fueled the high school program. He worked with kids ages 5 through 18. He sometimes would coach 8 teams in a single summer. Georges teams were always successful. Most of the competition George's teams would play came from larger communities in the area with more talent. George's teams most always came out victorious because George had his players so well grounded in fundamentals. His teams did not make mistakes and beat themselves.

<u>Steve Shantz (Umpire)</u> – Steve has been involved with high school baseball umpiring for 25 plus years. He has spent most of his days umpiring within the central Iowa conferences, but you will also find him umpiring in western Iowa in the Hawkeye 10 and the Western Iowa Conference. He has umpired 18 State Tournaments and 10 All-Star Series. Steve has been a member of the association for 18 years and has been involved with the umpires committee and currently serving on the Board of Directors. Steve has been named District Umpire 7 times, State Umpire of the Year twice, and Newcomer of the Year. Steve brings to the game the qualities that coaches, players, and fans admire about "the men in blue." He brings an attitude of professionalism to the game. Knowledge, fairness, and consistency are other qualities that Steve brings to the job site. Steve's reputation gains him the respect that he deserves. Steve is considered one of the top high school umpires in Iowa. He has mentored many young umpires along the way. He believes in the importance of working with coaches, players, and other umpires to keep this game great. Building positive relationships with coaches and school administrators is key to making the players experience an enjoyable one.


