CLINIC MARCH 14-15: The Twelfth Annual Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association Clinic is rapidly approaching. We hope you have made your plans to attend and bring the team along, the assistant coach, softball coach and the coach "down the road" with you. Enclosed you will find a tentative clinic line-up about the speakers, topics, times, etc.. Show it to your Athletic Director, Principal, and Superintendent, and make sure you get the day off to attend the weekend of baseball. They might want to come along! Softball Coaches will also have sessions once again. We have a number of them already signed up.

BANQUET TICKETS: Enclosed you will find a card to return so we can make a reservation for you for the Friday banquet, Saturday breakfast, and the Saturday noon lunch. Fill it out and mail it back with your check covering your Clinic fees. Admission to the Clinic will be \$15.00 for members this year. It will include all your meals and the opportunity to hear many top-notch speakers. If you are not a member of the association it will cost you \$25.00 in advance for the clinic. This will include your membership. High School students rates are \$6.00 for full clinic or \$3.00 per day. If they want to eat the meals, it will cost the student \$17.50.

Remember, if you are not a member of the coaches association by March 1, 1980, the clinic will cost you \$30.00. Make your check payable to the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association. We will only order as many meals and noon lunches as we have paid reservations.

HALL OF FAME ANNOUNCED: Enclosed you will find the press release of the 1980 Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. A brief history follows each man's name. Not only will we honor Hall of Fame, but coaches who have served over 15 years, College Coaches of Year, High School District Coaches of Year and High School Coach of Year. We hope you all are planning to attend and help honor these people.

CONFERENCE CHAMPION COACHES: Once again the Coaches Association will be honoring the Conference Championship Coaches. The Conference champion who attend the Clinic will be able to pick up a certificate of Conference Championship. This is the second year for this award.

Remember, in order to receive this certificate, a coach must be in attendance at the clinic. You will be proud to display this certificate.

GLENN TUCKETT DINNER SPEAKER: Glenn Tuckett, Athletic Director at Brigham Young University, after 17 years as baseball coach, and assistant football coach. Under the guidance of Glenn, B.Y.U. won 13 division titles, three conference titles, two District 7 titles, and have been at the College World Series twice. His is the past president of A.A.C.B.C. and was the Clinic director in 1976. Glenn Tuckett is in constant demand as a speaker. He is nationally known. He is acknowledged as one of the foremost leaders in his field. His topic will be "Feed my Sheep".

HER CLINIC SPEAKERS:

DICK FINN is a former standout pitcher for Ohio State and is entering his fifth year as head coach of the Buckeyes. Dick coached at Toledo, Ohio before going to Ohio State. In 1965 Dick became the head coach at the University of Toledo baseball team where he remained for five years. He joined the Ohio State staff in 1969 as an assistant coach, taking over in 1976.

His overall record at Ohio State is 90-89 in the tough Big Ten Conference.

JOE HICKS coached at Long Beach City College for 25 years after a couple of years in the minor leagues. Joe graduated from U.C.L.A. where he played baseball and basketball. Over the 25 years, Joe's teams have won 514 and lost 240. They have won 16 conference championships, 7 Southern Calif. championships, and 3 state championships. 114 players who have played for Joe have signed pro contracts. Ten of his players played in the major leagues. Joe is a part-time actor/stunt man in many movies/T.V. and commercials. He is now Vice President of Diamond Baseball Co.

GEORGE TOMA: Head groundskeeper for the Kansas City Royals and Chiefs, comes to us once again. George started in the late 50's with the Kansas City A's moving to Oakland when they moved west. He came back to K.C. in 1969 with the Royals, serving both baseball and football complexes. George has received many awards because of his national reputation as one of the best groundskeepers in professional sports. He contributed the article in our May-June-July Newsletter. We are fortunate to have George Toma back.

BUZ KELLER: By popular request, Buz Keller comes back to our clinic for the third time, everyone who attended the 1974 and 76 clinic will not forget Buz Keller, and his great knowledge of the game. Buz was the former Director of Player Development and Coordinator of Instruction for the Kansas City Royal Academy Team, field manager for the St. Louis Card's minor league teams, and presently area scout for the Pirates. Buz was a former infielder for the Chicago Cubs Farm System. He coached college baseball at Texas Lutheran College for 11 years before entering the pro ranks. Buz Keller has been one of the most popular speakers at our clinic over the past years. He has conducted many clinics throughout the U.S., and is one of the outstanding speakers and motivators in the game.

LARRY CORRIGAN: Former All-American from Iowa State University and recently a pro player in the Dodger Organization will be with us this year. Larry is currently assisting at Iowa State. At Iowa State Larry pitched and caught. Entering the pro ranks, he caught for 2 years and then pitched from 1972 until 1978. Larry played Triple A ball for 4 years, ending his career with the Twins Organization in 1978.

DICK BIRMINGHAM: By request Dick comes back to our clinic for the second time. Dick is one of the outstanding high school coaches in the country, from Hillcrest High School, Springfield, Mo.. Dick's high school record is 245-96 and Legion record 546-275 over a period of 23 years. He just received the high school Coach of the Year award in New Orleans. He is one of the outstanding clinicians in the high school ranks.

200 WIN CLUB: Enclosed you will find the names of coaches who have won over 200 games. These coaches have received a certificate for their accomplishment. We have four different clubs--The 200,300,400 and a 500 win club. The coaches whose names are underlined will receive a certificate. Summer final round gross income of \$ 5,922.00 with a net loss of \$1,777.78.

The total tournaments grossed \$127,398.00 and showed a net profie of 54,595.42.

TO BE RELEASE FEBRUARY 1980

CEDAR RAPIDS: (Special)--Seven new names will be added to the Hall of Fame of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association at its annual Clinic Awards Banquet in Cedar Rapids, March 14, 1980.

Alphabetically, the new members are Dale Alderson of Alden; Art Huinker of Dubuque; Jim Jagim of Valley of West Des Moines; J.J. O'Connor of Wiota; Earnest Oppermann of Wartburg College; Donald Protexter of Morningside College, and Bill Zuber of Homestead.

While the group includes four former coaches, two college coaches and a player, it should come as no surprise that every man on the list played baseball from his early teens. Two were in the majors where both pitched, one for the Cubs and the other Yankees. Bill Zuber had a stint with the Indians, Yankees, and Red Sox and Dale Alderson with the Cubs.

The 1980 class is strong on coaching with two college coaches spending many years at their present institutions, and four spending from 15 to 20 plus years coaching at the high school level.

Without exception, all seven new members of the Hall of Fame have gone "that extra mile" to boost baseball in their communities, as well as ranging far afield to bring honor to baseball. Thumbnail sketches of the new members follow:

DALE ALDERSON, a Denison High School and Upper Iowa College star athlete, spent two-and-one-half years in the major leagues as a Cub, but his major league career was short-lived due to an arm injury. Dale played baseball every season from age 13 to 40. He signed with the Cubs in 1943 for \$9,000 as a relief pitcher. Dale has coached every high school sport imaginable, but stayed with baseball for 25 years. He coached at Adair, Audubon, Cumberland, East Union, Stuart and Merden-Cleghorn before retiring. Dale never had a chance to play baseball in high school, but did play in the semi-pro leagues in western Iowa. In Dale's two years in the big leagues he pitched 175 innings, allowed 172 hits, and 82 runs ranking next to the top in hit-run averages. He struck out 91 and only walked 63. Dale is presently retired in Cleghorn.

ART HUINKER has proven himself as a player, coach, and official. Art started his career at Loras College where he started for four years never losing a college baseball game he pitched. He signed a professional contract with the St. Louis Cardinals organization and moved up to triple A ball. Art pitched a lot of semi-pro ball while coaching at Ossian and Dyersville. At Dyersville Art took his team to the State tournament several times, winning the State Championship in 1969. Today, Art is one of the outstanding umpires in eastern Iowa.

JIM JAGIM started his coaching career in 1960 at Indianola where he had an overall record of 158-50, with six conference championships. Jim moved to Valley West Des Moines in 1970 and had a 170-92 overall record, adding 2 more conference championships. Jim was a charter member of the Coaches Association, during his career he was selected District Coach of Year in 1969, also served as assistant coach and head coach of the All-Star games in 1977-78. He served as president of the coaches association from 1975-76. Jim played on many championship clubs as a player at Van Horne, Simpson College, and on semi-pro teams. He has coached many outstanding players over the past 20 years.

J.J.O'CONNOR has been out of coaching since 1947, but during his 13 years as a coach/principal/ superintendent he was very successful. Joe started his coaching career at Wiota. At Wiota his basketball teams won 91% of their games and the girls teams won 94% including two State Championships. In baseball his teams won 89% of their games played. During this period they won their conference 10 years, won 11 sectional tournaments and were in the State finals 7 years and won the State Championship in the fall of 1944. Joe left the educational field and became Vice-President and then President of Walnut Grove Products. He was successful player-coach administrator.

EARNEST OPPERMAN currently coaches the Wartburg College baseball team. Earnest attended Strawberry Point High School, going to Luther College and Wartburg, graduating in 1938. As a coach he spend 4 years at Popejoy and Hampton before going into service. When Earnest returned to coaching his Wartburg College teams, they have been some of the best in the Mid-west. Over the years they have won over 325 games, 5 Iowa Conference Championships, 3 District N.A.I.A. Champions, 1 Area IV NAIA Championship. His teams play all the large schools in the surrounding states and win their share of games. Earnest has served as a lecturer for the I.H.S.B.C.A. clinics and other clinics in the state.

DON PROTEXTER graduated from Little Rock High School and then spent five years serving his country. Don then went to Morningside College graduating in 1949. At Morningside he played for 3 years as a catcher. Before going back to his college to coach, Don coached at Gruver and Albert City High Schools. At Morningside College his teams have won 50% of their games. A number of his players have gone into professional baseball, most notably are Paul Splittorff of the Kansas City Royals and Tom McWilliams, a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization. A large number of his players have gone into the teaching and coaching field and have established some excellent records. Don not only coaches, but he also umpired in the northwest part of the State, umpiring in numerous Legion-high school tournaments and National Tournament umpire in 1965. Don has been a clinic speaker numerous times at the State and National Clinics.

BILL ZUBER grew up in Amana, Iowa, never playing a high school game. He was discovered by a former Hall of Famer Cy Slapnicka while playing in the M & J League in Cedar Rapids. Bill was a hard throwing pitcher, pitching with and against the likes of Lefty Gomez, Bob Feller, Carl Hubbel, etc. Bill played 11 years in the Major Leagues with the Cleveland Indians, New York Yankees and the Boston Red Sox. While he was in the Red Sox uniform played in the 1946 World Series. Bill has a career record of 43-42. His best year was in 1942 with a 9-9 record. In 1943, Bill was 8-4 for the Yankees. He pitched in 224 major league games and completed 65 games. He had a life time E.R.A. of 4.28. Bill is presently owner of the Bill Zuber Restuarant in Amana.

These new member join 58 other Hall of Fame members.

DISTRICT COACH OF YEAR NOMINEES BACKGROUND: CLASS A

NORTH EAST DISTRICT

KEVIN PINK: Independence St. John's High School, has been coaching 2 years with an overall record of 65-26. Kevin's 1979 team record was 34-6, winning the Sectional, District, Sub-state and State championship. His team also won the Buchanan County and Linn-Mar Invitational Tournaments. Kevin has promoted baseball in Independence by encouraging as much participation as possible among players and fans. He was been a member of the coaches association for 2 years.

DAVID RIPLEY: Riceville High School, has been coaching for 9 years with an overall record of 138-126. His 1979 team record was 20-7, winning the Cornbowl conference. David coached two years at LaMont before moving to Riceville. David has been a member of the coaches association for 8 years.

JIM VAN SCOYOC: Norway High School, has been coaching for 14 years with an overall record of 361-161. Jim's 1979 team record was 40-21, winning the State championship this past fall. Jim has been very active in the coaches Association serving on a number of committees. He is presently a board of director and heading up the Constitution Committee. This past year he was the head coach of the Class A East All Star Team. He is a member of the 300 win club. Jim has been a member of the association for 12 years.

NORTH WEST DISTRICT

VIC BELGER: Rockwell City High School, has been coaching for 13 years with an overall record of 330-77. Vic's 1979 team record was 21-3, winning the Twin Lakes Conference and the Sectional Tournament, losing in the District finals to Bancroft. Vic was selected coach of the Year in his District in 1970. He has been a member of the association for 12 years. He is the Twin Lakes Conference representative and 6 of the 8 coaches are members of the association.

VINCE MEYER: Bancroft High School, has been coaching for 45 years with an overall record of 1200+-200+. His 1979 team record was 35-6, winning the Sectional, District, Sub-State and coming in third in the State Championship. Vince has taken many teams to the state finals and has won many championships over the past years. He is a member of the coaches association Hall of Fame. Vince has been a member of the association for 12 years.

MARV THELEN: Remsen St. Mary's High School, has been coaching for 30 years with an overall record of 349-70 at Remsen. Marv's 1979 team record was 34-5, winning the Cherokee Invitational Tournament and his Sectional, District and losing out to Bancroft in the State. Marv has been a super promoter for baseball in the Northwest District. He coached the 1A All Star West team in 1979, and was selected District Coach of Year in 72. He was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1975. Marv has been a member of the association for 10 years.

CENTRAL DISTRICT

ESTEL ALEXANDER: Hubbard High School, has been coaching for 22 years with an overall record of 300 158. His 1979 team record was 18-4, winning the Iowa River Valley Conference. Estel has been selected Iowa River Valley Coach of year in 1979. He has help promote the coaches association in central Iowa over the years. Estel has been a member of the coaches association for 11 years.

DALLAS KRAY: Roland-Story Community High School, has been coaching for 18 years with an overall record of 178-134. Dallas's 1979 team record was 16-8 winning the Sectional tournament. He was selected Ames Tribune area "Coach of Year" in 1976-79. He has only finished 4 times below .500 in 18 years. Dallas has been a member of the association for 12 years.

JAMES MAHONEY: Johnston High School, has been coaching for 11 years with an overall record of 159-113. Jim's 1979 team record was 20-11 winning his conference, Sectional, District and coming in second in the state championship. Jim has been very active in the association, serving on the board of directors, chairman of the All Star Game Committee. He was selected District and State Coach of the Year in 1977. Jim has been a member of the association for 11 years.

SOUTH EAST DISTRICT

STEVE RIENERT: Durant High School, has been coaching for 6 years with an overall record of Steve's 1979 team record was . Steve has been active in the coaches association. He served as a member of the board of directors, assistant All-Star Coach, and on several committees. Steve has been a member of the association for 6 years.

BOB ROE: H.L.V. Victor High School, has been coaching for 16 years, 9 years in baseball, with an over-all record of 145-72. Bob's 1979 team record was 19-6, winning the South Iowa Cedar Conference. He was selected Conference Coach of Year in 79, this is his third out of five years that he received this honor. Bob has been a member of the association for 5 years.

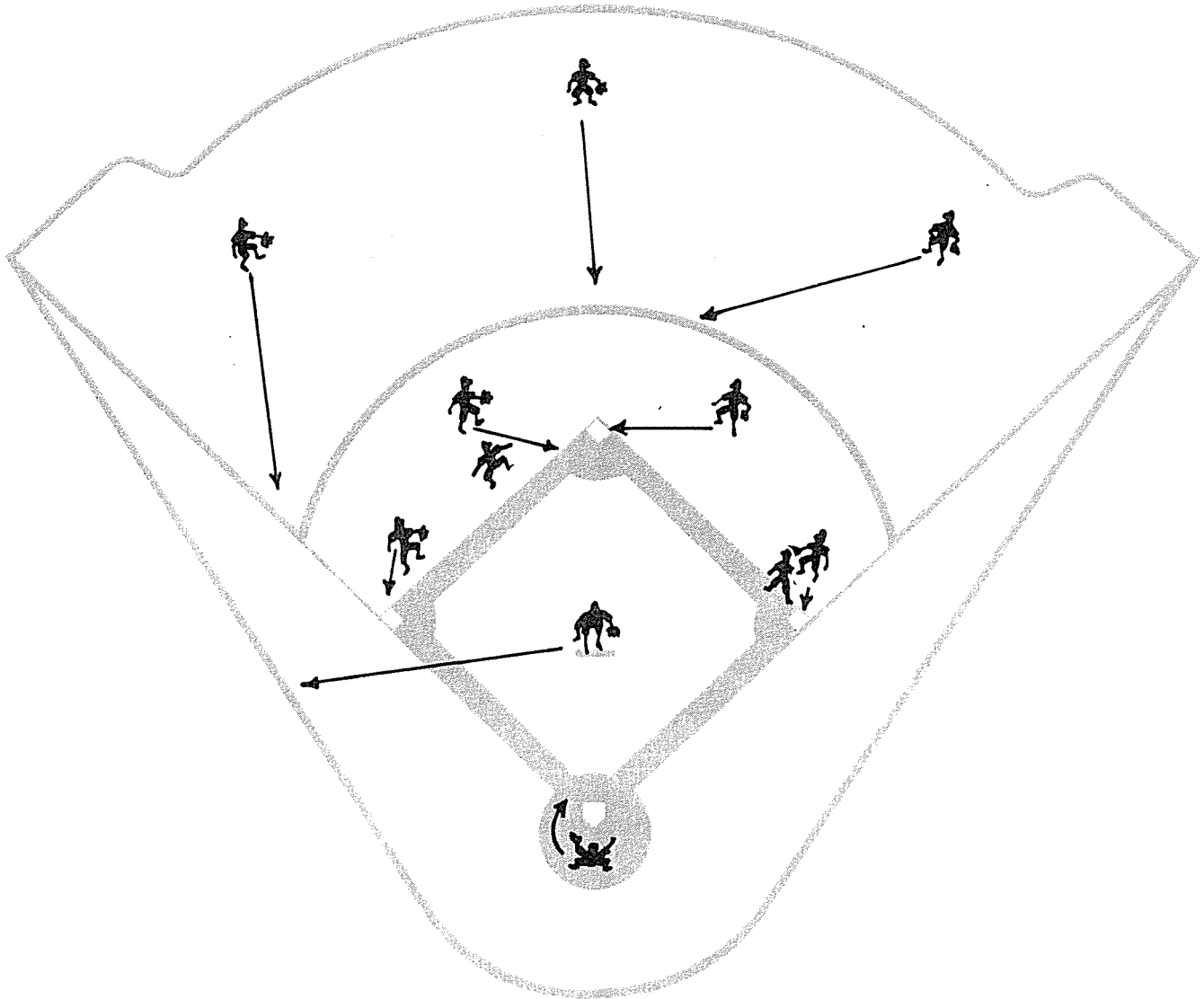
