IHSBCA BOARD MEETING

February 17, 1980 Newton, Iowa

The meeting was called to order at 2:00 pm by President Dave Posegate at the Newton Inn in Newton. Board Members present were: Dave Posegate, Al Sutton, Don Mauro, Bob Watson, John Zahn, Jim Schotten, Jim Jagim, Stu McCord, Jim Mahoney, Jim Van Scoyoc, Terry Heald, Steve Duncan, Mick Mattice, and "Pinky" Primrose. Also present were Duane Banks and Lanny Peterson.

Minutes of the October 6, 1979 board of directors meeting were read and approved without correction.

PRESIDENTS REPORT was presented by Dave Posegate who expressed that the past year had been an enjoyable one and that the Association had progressed a great deal. He stated that the committees had worked well and things went very smoothly.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT was presented by "Pinky" Primrose and the following was discussed:

- 1) Discussed "Coach of the Year" awards and if any change was necessary. Pinky presented some new ideas for Dist. "Coach of the Year" and also State "Coach of the Year". Considerable discussion on the cost of the rings now given and alternatives due to the drastic price increase of gold. Many alternatives to awards were presented and will be discussed in Cedar Rapids.
- 2) Improved participation of the softball coaches
- 3) Went over current financial report showing a current balance on hand as of Oct. 6, 1979 of \$426.23 with \$2,141.02 in Pass Book Savings giving a current total of \$2,567.25. Pinky expressed great concern for the All-Star Series and the Association having to spend \$1,800 plus this past year.
- 4) A possible alternative to the above problem was discussed by all. The directors felt that a \$25.00 sponsorship be obtained by the coach of each young man selected for the All-Star Game. It was mentioned that in some communities more than one sponsor could be obtained leaving no limit as to how many sponsors a young man can obtain. A minimum of one sponsor per player would generate \$1,500 for the All-Star game and would give us some base money from which to operate.
- 5) Pinky also discussed the limitation rule and its affect on everyones program and that we should continually work toward lifting this restriction.

HALL OF FAME COMMITTEE- Pinky mentioned that more participation in this years Hall of Fame nominations was a great boost to the overall selection process. Thanks to Bill Freese and his committee.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT was presented by Jim Schotten and he simply expressed that we have a need to reach out for more participation on all areas of our organization. A definite need to involve more umpires and also press to involve more softball coaches in some way. The concern of how we are going to handle softball coaches within our organizational framework was expressed.

ALL DISTRICT COMMITTEE REPORT- No report. We did discussed 1A and 2A separate meeting place and times. Everyone seemed to be in agreement that it has been for the better. Hopefully this has created an opportunity for more coaches to take an active part in their district selections.

ALL-STAR GAME COMMITTEE REPORT was given by Steve Duncan on the tentative plans for this years series in Iowa City. He will present those plans at the meetings in Cedar Rapids.

RATING POLL REPORT was given by Bob Watson and expressed to the group that he had made contact with the IDPA about the possibility of running their own Rating Poll for summer baseball and they were not interested at this time. Chuch Burdick, in conjunction with the Des Moines Register, will conduct their ratings as in the past. Chuck also expressed that he would like to conduct his All-State teams selections at the All-Star Series.

STEERING COMMITTEE REPORT — Pinky mentioned that action would have to be taken on the replacement of Steve Duncan as Secretary since he is no longer involved in high school coaching. Also the Steering Committee will meet to select the All-Star Game coaches at the March Clinic.

CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE REPORT was given by Jim VanSdoyoc. He felt a need for the boundaries of the All-Star Game to be defined by towns in each area East & West. Hopefully this would eliminate some confussion on the coaches part as to where they should send their ballots. He suggested maps be printed to show the location of the schools in each division.


PROGRAM COMMITTEE REPORT was given by Pinky who gave a brief report on this years clinci and said things were running on schedule and that pre-registrations were already above 100. He previewed some of the speakers and as always Pinky has come up with not only a good baseball clinic, but also an excellent softball clinic.

ADVISORY BOARD to IHSAA REPORT - Due to incliment weather Jim VanScoyoc and Bill Freese were unable to attend. The following items were discusse at that meeting:

- 1) The limitation rule was discussed at great length and the Advisory Board recommended baseball Practice start $\underline{\text{May 1}}$ for everyone, not just pitchers and catchers.
- 2) Committee wanted a clarification on Invitational Tournaments that run two or three days as to how many playing dates this would be.
- 3) The State Tournament format was discussed and it was decided the same format would be followed this season.
- 4) Player and Coach conduct was discussed and the largest concern was over obscene language by both coaches and players.

COMMUNICATIONS— Lanny Peterson representing the Umpires of Iowa discussed the possibility of selecting a "District Umpire of the Year" and also possibly a "State Umpire of the Year" by the Association. Reasoning behind this was for more involvement of the umpires. This would be another way along with working the All-Star Game of honoring umpires. He also asked for possible reimbursement of expenses for umpires while at the All-Star Series.


