## IOWA HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION Secretary's Report Thursday March 14, 1980

Those present at Thursday evening's meeting were: Pinky Primrose, Cedar Rapids Washington; Jim Mahoney, Johnston; Bob Watson, D.M. Hoover; Rom Adams, C.B. Previous Minutes of Oct. 6 and Feb. 17, 1980 Meeting- A motion was made by Terry Helad and seconded by Al Seabrooke to accept the previous board minutes.

Executive Secretary's Financial Report— The reading of expenditures and Income was presented by Pinky and he explained briefly the bills paid and miscellaneous income. Balance in the checking account as of March 30 was \$3,270.54 and in Savings \$4,665.13. Pinky explained the over-expenditure of the 1979-80 budget was due to the increased cost of the All-Star game. A motion was made by Jim Jagim and seconded by Ron Adams to accept the financial Report.

President's Report- Dave said he enjoyed the year and working with the various committees. He thought the committees worked hard to carry out their various finctions. Dave sited a need to keep improving the All-Star game and also a need to work with the basketball coaches Association to solve the problem of the elegibility problem of those young men participating in the basketball All-Star game. Dave also expressed that he felt that the association should continue to involve young blood in the association.

Executive Secretary's Report— Pinky discussed the upcoming clinic and mentioned that pre-registration was around 350 and with good weather the "walk-in" registration should make this years clinic highly successful. He said the clinic speakers will be in their game uniforms this year as a little change and for added color. Pinky indicated we could anticipate75-100 softball coaches this year and that a great program was in store for those coaches.

Pinky expressed concern over the low membership in the Class A schools and encouraged district "reps" to sell the association as much as possible.

Pinky went over the 1980-81 budget and felt it was very workable and one that can get our association goals accomplished. One budget concern was the All-Star game and the idea of a\$25.00 sponsorship per player as discussed. Also the Coach of the year rings were discussed in relation to the drastic increse in price due to the gold prices. Alternatives were mentioned and the possibility of a gold alloy was going to be looked into.

Pinky felt that overall it was a good year for the association and hoped the clinic would be enjoyable for everyone.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS

### All-District- NONE

All-State Coach- Don Mauro recommended that a coach be able to vote for anyone in another district or class if they have played them. Also he moved that three coaches be nominated at district meetings and two more be added by the executive board at the fall meeting.

Hall of Fame- Bill Greese felt that not enough coaches had been nominated and in general not enough men were nominated. He said all of this years inductees would be in attendance except for Bill Zuber who could not travel due to illness.

Constitution- No Report

Membership- No Report

Rating Poll- Bob Watson said everything is set to go as in the past.

All-Star Game- Steve Duncan reported that all plans have been made for this Falls game in Iowa City. The foremat will be basically the same as in the past. The adoption of the \$25.00 per/player sponsorship should help offset some costs for the All-Star Series.

Umpire Committee- Lanny Peterson recommended that some formal recognition of umpires be done by the association to help increse umpire involvment in the association. He moved that-Beginning in the 1980 season that the association select "District Umpires of the Year" using the same foremat as the Coach of the Year" selection. From these Umpiresof the year the selection for the All-Star game umpires would be made. The motion also included the reimbursement for travel expenses(not including gas) be handled by the All-Star Committee. It was moved by Bob Watson and seconded by Ron Adams that the motion be accepted and was passed.

### Steering Committee- No Report

Communications— Dave Etchen, President elect, of the Iowa High School basket-ball coaches association spoke on the conflict of their All-Star game with out tournament series in the late summer. He said it had been proposed to Bernie Saggau that young men who participate in the basketball All-Star game be eligible to play in the baseball state tournament or remaining games of thier schools baseball season. (Presently they are ineligible if they participate in an All-Star game.) Dave mentioned the young men may now leave the basketball All-Star game camp and return to their schools for games on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of the All-Star week. He hoped that both associations could continue to work together to solve this severe problem.

New Business— A motion was made by Jim Magoney and seconded by Ron Adams to adopt the 1980-81 budget and was so passed. A motion was made by Bob Watson and seconded by Terry Heald to adopt the 1980-81 calendar and was so passes. A motion was made by Al Seabrooke and seconded by Jim VanScoyoc to retain Pinky Primrose as Executive Secretary of the Association and passed. A motion was also make by Jim Mahoney and seconded by Bill Freese to raise Pinky's annual salary to \$1,800 and passed. A motion was make by Jim Jagim and seconded by Bob Watson to attain at least one (1) twenty(\$20) sponsorship per player in the All-Star series and was passed.

At approximately 10:40 p.m. it was moved by Ron Adams and seconded by Bob Watson to adjourn and passed.

### NOMINATION BALLOT FOR BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 2. Board of Directors. (A) The representatives to the Board of Directors shall be elected by the members within their district. By October 15 of each year, the association members will receive an official blank nomination ballot. Upon voting, the nomination ballot to be returned (within ten days from mailing) to the executive secretary. In the presence of two other association members, there shall be a canvass of the ballots. The 3 receiving the highest number of votes shall be considered the nominees. In case of a tie of more than 3, all those in the ties shall be considered nominees. In case the number of nomination ballots for any one of the nominees is a majority of the number of members in the respective district, he shall be declared elected. The executive secretary shall prepare and mail official election ballots to the members of the district. Upon voting, the election ballot to be returned (within ten days from mailing) to the executive secretary. The procedure in canvassing shall be the same as in canvassing nomination ballots and the person receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected. In case of a tie, the election shall be decided by lot by the candidates in the presence of the canvassing committee. The third highest vote getter shall be considered the alternate and in event of inability of elected Director to serve alternate will be appointed to the Board of Directors.

Please nominate two coaches from your district who are members of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association to be members of the Board of Directors to represent your district.
