The Fifth Annual All Star Game will be held in Ames, August 14th and 15th. Any coach that feels he has a player or two that should be playing in the All Star Game should fill out the Player Recommendation Sheet that is enclosed in this newsletter. Please enclose a photo of your player in his uniform on the recommendation sheet. The guide lines for the All-Star selection will be the same as last year. All the advance information we can get on the best ball players in the state would help in the selection of the best All Stars.

The Board of Directors passed a policy that any ball player must have at least two-\$25.00 sponsors. It will be the coaches responsibility to get the players sponsor if he wishes him to play in the All Star games. This policy was necessary in order to offset the high cost of putting on the All-Star series. If you have any questions about this policy contact any of the officers or directors in your area, they will explain it to you.

UMPIRES: Any umpire that wishes to work in the All Star Game should contact the Executive Secretary or the chairman of the Umpires committee Lanny Peterson by July 15th.


Looking ahead, the All-Star Game is going to continue to grow and, I believe, the sky is the limit as to what can be attained through the All-Star Game with your support.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

March 12, 1981

The meeting was called to order by president Terry Heald at 7:30 PM.

Report of Secretary - The minutes of the preceding meetings on Oct. 12, 1980 and Feb. 15, 1981 were read and approved.

Financial Report by Executive Secretary - A statement of receipts and disbursements was presented with a brief explanation. The balance in the checking account as of March 12, 1981 was \$5,090.23. There is \$4,282.60 in the savings account making the total assets \$9,372.83. Last year at this time we had approximately \$7,900 in assets. Byron Rhodes moved and Mick Mattiace seconded that the financial report be approved. Motion carried.

Executive Secretary's Report - Many items were discussed but mainly the everyday operations of the association were of concern. Pinky recommended that each player in the All-Star Game should have at least \$50.00 in sponsorships.

All-Star Game Report - Jim Mahoney reported that the distribution of schools in the new four class system is very similar to that of the old two class system when we use the East-West cut off line. He recommended we use the present dividing line and have 4A-3A and 2A-1A squads.

New Business - A motion was made by Bob Watson and seconded by Lowell Thompson to adopt the 1981-82 budget with the Executive Secretary's salary being raised to \$2100. Motion carried.

Dave Posegate moved and Jim Mahoney seconded the adoption of the 1981-82 calendar. Motion carried.

Mick Mattiace moved the adoption of a \$50.00 sponsorship for each All-Star player. Jim VanScoyoc seconded and the motion carried.

Jim Mahoney moved and Byron Rhodes seconded a motion for East-West All-Star teams with 4A & 3A combined together and 2A & 1A together. Motion carried.

Bob Watson moved that we select two All-District teams with the 4A & 3A together and 2A & 1A together. Two teams should be selected in each division. Byron Rhodes seconded and the motion carried.

Bill Freese moved and Duane Banks seconded a motion for adjournment. Motion carried.

1981 ANNUAL MEETING

March 13

The meeting was called to order by president Terry Heald at 10:30 AM.

Report of Secretary - The minutes of the March 12 meeting were read and accepted.

Financial Report - The total assests are \$9,372.83. Same report as in March 12 minutes.

All District Committee Report - A list of umpires that are members and eligible to be nominated for awards should be made available for district meetings.

All State Coach Committee Report - Bob Watson moved and Ed McNeil seconded the motion to continue with 2 coaches awards, 4A-3A and 2A-1A Coach of the Year. Motion carried.

Hall of Fame Committee Report - Members must get the nominations to the committee but also sell their candidate to board members. A complete and detailed nomination form is a must.

Audit Committee Report - Terry Heald, Dick Wagner, Bob Watson and Dick Core reviewed the books and found them to be in order. The report was accepted.
