THE RUN DOWN PLAY

There are several good rules to follow in making this play. The most important is: **RUN THE RUNNER BACK TO THE BAG FROM WHICH HE CAME.**

1. Try to start this play when the runner is half-way between the bases.
2. Give the ball to the forward man, and let him run the runner back to the bag from which he came.
3. The forward man should run hard at the runner, but not with a faking motion of the arm.
4. The tagger should stay in front of his bag, and inside the base line. This will give him the proper angle of the throw.
5. When the runner is about ten feet from the tagger, the tagger should make a BREAK toward the runner. This is the sign to the thrower to give the tagger the ball on his first step.
6. The thrower makes an easy, chest-high toss.
7. When play is worked right, one throw is all that is needed to get the runner at any base.
8. The man without the ball must avoid interfering with the runner.

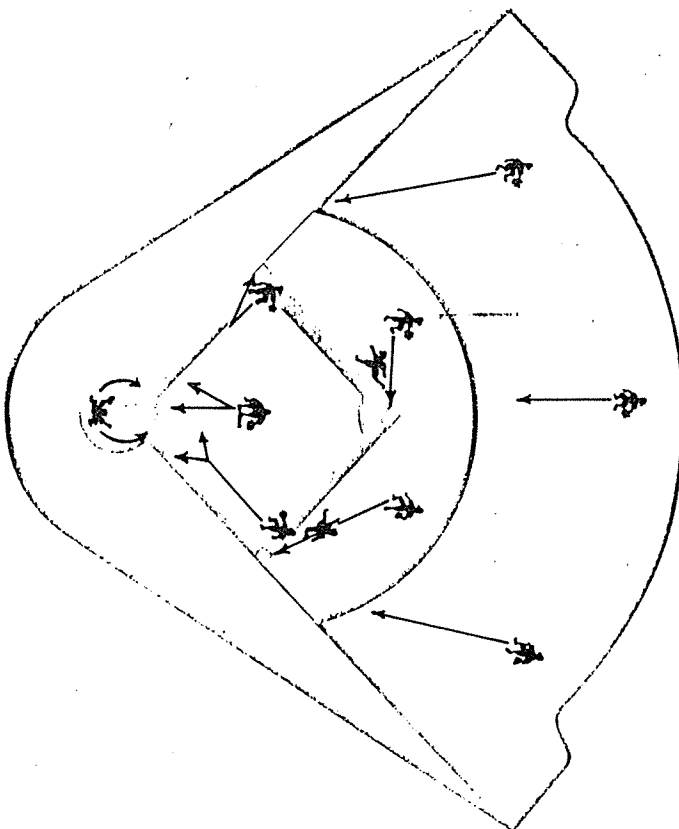
RULES TO REMEMBER...

1. Run the runner back to the bag from which he came.
2. Run the runner hard.
3. The tagger and the thrower stay inside the base line.
4. The tagger must stay in front of his bag until making his break.
5. The thrower should make an easy, chest-high toss...not a quick, hard throw.

DEFENSIVE ASSIGNMENTS ON BUNT SITUATIONS

SITUATION #2

With runners on 1st and 2nd -- bunt situation in order.



Pitcher:
Break toward 3rd base line upon delivering the ball.

Catcher:
Field bunts in front of plate; call the play.

1st Baseman:
Be responsible for all balls in the area between 1st and 2nd base.
Home.

2nd Baseman:
Cover 1st base.

Shortstop:
Hold runner close to bag before pitch; cover 2nd base.

3rd Baseman:
Take position on the edge of the grass; call the play - whether the pitcher or the 3rd baseman is to field the bunt.

Left Fielder:
Back up 3rd base.

Center Fielder:
Back up 2nd base.

Right Fielder:
Back up 1st base.

First objective is to retire the runner at 3rd, but one runner MUST be retired.

THE HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETE'S SEARCH FOR A SCHOLARSHIP OR GRANT IN AID

Many times in a public high school situation, we are blessed with that exceptionally talented athlete, and he becomes a highly recruited person. To make this time as easy and with as little pressure as possible to the student, I believe a closer understanding and working relationship is needed between the high school counselor and the coach.

I've listed seven check points to help us in our attempts to make sure that each of our student athletes understand recruitment. This process often should include the parents and coach. The more information this potential college athlete has before decision making time, the easier and safer it should make his selection process.

CHECKLIST

1) Each student athlete, with the help of his counselor and coach should determine his/her academic admissibility into further education. Does he/she have the proper required courses? Has he/she taken the SAT or the ACT? What major course of study or field is he/she pursuing? From the past high school records, does it seem to indicate a better than 50 percent chance of success at that particular school?

2) Make a decision on level of college: Division I, Division II, Division III, based on athletic ability. This determines amount of dollars available. If you're looking at a Division I and II school, NCAA rules demand that you have at least a 2.0 average or 70 percent average in order to be a candidate for scholarship.

Remember that scholarships are outright non-refunded financial aids. Grants in aid may include scholarships, loans, and work-study dollars. Be aware of the difference.

The larger the school in divisional competition, the more competitive and demanding the performance level and ability the athlete must have. Division I being the major level, for sports may have 95 scholarships in football and 15 in basketball. Division II-45 football scholarships, 12 basketball. Division III-based on financial need only (in a grant in aid approach).

3) Understand the various ways through which a student can finance a college education. There are four sources of dollars for college bound students in a financial packet:

a) Scholarship b) Grants c) Work Study d) Loans

4) The student/athlete should get all Scholarship or Grant in Aid promises in writing, signed by financial aid offices, and should be certain that he is aware of exactly what the coverage is. It can not exceed tuition, room, board, fees, and required course related books in Division I and II. Division III is based on need.

5) In Division III, the need factor is determined by the processing of an ACT or CSS (FAF) form. This formula is computed, and the need index is forwarded to schools who then put together the financial packet.

6) It is important to be aware of what constitutes a campus visit and to know how many the athlete is allowed to have. In general, one expense paid visit is not to exceed 48 hours. This can occur only in the senior year of high school, and can not exceed a total of six visits for Division I and II Schools. Also, Division I and II Schools are limited to only three in-person contacts with a prospect, off-campus, for any recruiting purposes. A prospect may visit a campus as many times as he/she wishes, but these visits are to remain at the athlete's own expense.

7) No recruiter should contact a prospect at the site of his/her athletic competition, or if the athlete is participating or preparing to participate in a contest or competition, until he has been released by school authority, dresses, and leaves the dressing room.

Keeping these seven points in mind, the selection and recruitment process will prove less complex and stressful for the athlete, and will allow for an intelligent decision.
