

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE RULES :

1 The pitchers can pitch a full game (rather than a 5 inning max.)

2 All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings.

3 Tie breaker system will be announced in advance of who will play for 1st and 2ed place. Example: Head to Head competition; Most runs scored, least runs given up; Most hits, least hits given up.

All of the examples can be given points. The team with the most points will play for 1st place. The team with second highest points will also play for 1st place game.

This system will give, more boys an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict pitchers on amount fo innings he can pitch in one day.

Coaches were picked by the Steering committee! They filled out an application that was found in the last newsletter.




