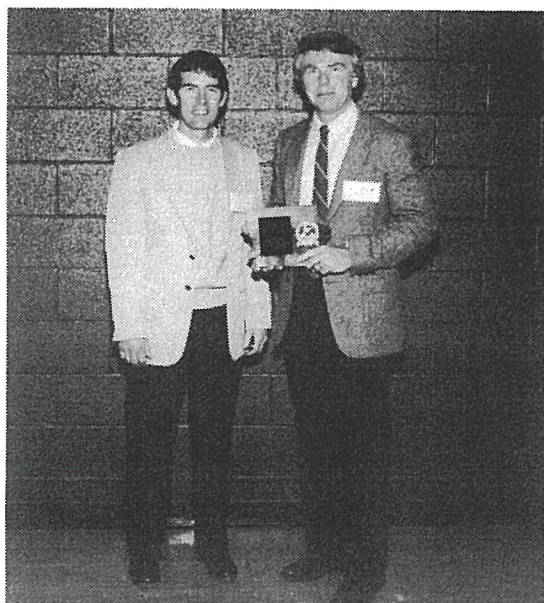

The officers and directors addresses and phone numbers are enclosed in this letter.

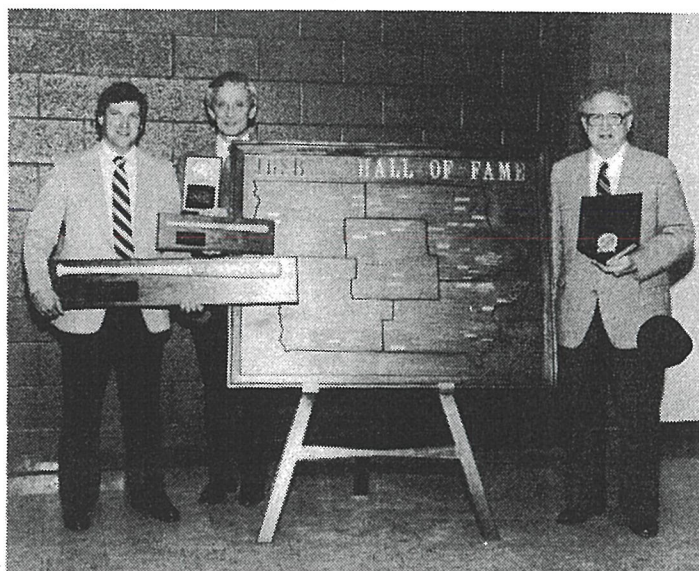


**MEDIA AWARD WINNER:** 1 to r: Andy McGaffin, Spencer and Bob Cotton of K.C.I.S.

#### WHAT ARE SOME OF THE RULES :

1 The pitchers can pitch a full game (rather than a 5 inning max.)

2 All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings.

3 Tie breaker system will be announced in advance of who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition; Most runs scored, least runs given up; Most hits, least hits given up.

All of the examples can be given points. The team with the most points will play for 1st place. The team with second highest points will also play for 1st place game.

This system will give more boys an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict pitchers on amount of innings he can pitch in one day.

Coaches were picked by the Steering committee! They filled out an application that was found in the last newsletter.

\*\*\*\*\*Players that do not make the All-District Team will still be able to play in the All-Star Series. \*\*\*\*

If a coach fills out a player profile form that is found in this newsletter and sends it in, this player will have the same opportunity as a player on the All-District Team. This system was necessary because of a number of good ball players being left off the All-Star Squad

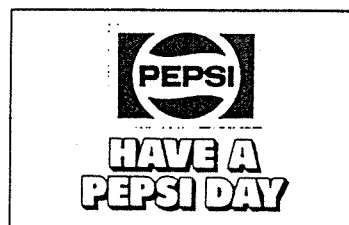

HOLIDAY INN, CEDAR RAPIDS  
MARCH 8, 1984

The March 8, 1984 meeting of the Board was called to order by president Dick Core. The minutes of the October 14, 1983 meeting and the financial statement presented by the executive secretary were approved as published.

I. Audit

A. Jim Brems reported on the audit. He reported that the books are in good shape. There was a brief discussion regarding the format of the financial statements. Clements moved and Hora seconded to accept the audit. Passed.

II. Reports

A. President's Report: President Core reported that throughout his 16 years of membership he has seen the organization grow and improve. The growth of the All-Star game is just one example of that growth.

The President thanked all the committee workers for their efforts.

He discussed the recent questionnaire from the State Association which reflects more understanding of the coaches position. Even though the proposal was turned down, it did stimulate thought and discussion which is a positive sign.

B. Executive Secretary's Report: Pinky Primrose thanked Dick Core for all his work. He also thanked all those who helped during the year.

There was a brief update on the upcoming clinic and its speakers. We have largest pre-registration for clinic ever.

Jim Van Scoyoc was recognized for being selected National High School Coach of the Year.

Pinky suggested that the Hall of Fame perhaps should be considering more former players from high school teams.

The All-Star game school division were discussed. Some realignment is necessary in order to give the 3A schools more equal participation. Pinky recommended the adoption of Dick Wagner's plan.

A common date and time for all All-District meetings was strongly recommended.

Pinky recommended the purchase of an IBM-PC computer with duo disc drive and printer. It would greatly improve and facilitate our communications and record keeping.

Due to steadily increasing costs, Pinky recommended an increase in clinic fees by \$5.00 for next year.

Lastly, Pinky led a discussion regarding bringing players for the All-Star game in on Thursday.

C. Hall of Fame Committee: A report was made regarding the new member to be inducted this year. There was concern expressed over the lack of players. Also, we need more nominees, in general.

D. Umpire Committee: Lanny Peterson reminded the Board that as of tomorrow (3-9-84) umpires will be officially represented on the Board. It was announced that Lanny Peterson (2 yrs.), Fr. Craig Collison (1 yr.) and Terry Curtis (alt.) have been elected to the Board.

It was further reported that a sub-committee has been established to refine the duties of the umpire committee.

E. All Star Game Committee: It was announced that the Iron Man Inn will be the host motel. Work is being done on shuttle transportation to alleviate some of the problems that developed last summer. The ground work for the corporate sponsors has been laid

Direction was requested regarding when the players should be brought in and the associated costs. After much discussion it was moved by Mahoney and seconded by Van Scoyoc that the players be brought in on Thursday and the sponsor's fee be raised to \$75.00. Motion passed.

III. COMMUNICATION

A. Bob Vrbicek reported on the letter he had received regarding the USBF selection process for the team for the World Games. Suggestions were sought. It was moved by Koenigsfeld and seconded by Mattiace that the IHSBCA not be firmly involved in this process. Motion carried.

B. Duane Wilson submitted a letter to the Board requesting the creation of a formal division of the IHSBCA especially for softball coaches. It is their wish to have voting membership on the Board. Discussion followed but no action was taken.

IV. OLD BUSINESS: None

V. NEW BUSINESS:

A. The 1984-85 budget was presented. It was moved by Thelen and seconded by Hora that the proposed budget be accepted. Motion carried.



MARCH 9, 1984

President Dick Core called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m. It was moved by Collison and seconded by Watson to accept the minutes as published. Passed.

Executive Secretary Pinky Primrose presented a brief financial report. He reported that the Association book currently show a balance on hand of \$14,608.00. He also presented a proposed budget of \$31,000 for 1984-85.

Dick Core reported on his term of office. He reflected on his experience in the organization. He is very proud to see the growth in both size and stature of the organization.

The Executive Secretary presented a brief report regarding the upcoming clinic. He also reported that membership is rising. The membership was brought up to date on the interest in expanding into a specific softball division.

The following committee reports were presented by the various chairmen.

EDIT COMMITTEE: Books are in good shape. Recommend to keep present system. Terry Heald reported.

HALL OF FAME: Lou Koenigsfeld chairman. 1. Need more qualified nominees; 2. Recommend: a. at district meetings in summer, the membership consider nominating a person to Hall of Fame.

DISTRICT COMMITTEE: It was recommended that a list of member schools for each district be sent to the Board of Directors in all districts so that there would be no confusion as to what district a school belonged.

It has been approved by the Board of Directors that July 1:00 p.m. will be the set time for 1A-2A district meetings sites should also be set.

It was also recommended that all All District meetings coaches keep their remarks to statistics and pertinent information. Time can be saved by avoiding personal opinions such as rifle arm, bona fide all stater, etc.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE: The Membership Committee recommend the following--

That in April the Board of Directors from each district receive a list of the schools that are non-members in their district.

The 2 year Board of Director will contact 3A-4A coaches that are not members and the 1 year Board of Director contact the 1A-2A coaches in May.

We would hope that the computer could be used to provide this list to the Directors along with the form letter to be sent.

It is also recommended that the Association either provide the stamps and envelopes or reimburse the directors for postage and envelopes.

We want the letters sent out in May because this is the time the coach actually starts working with his athletes and also to emphasize that in order for his players to play in All State games and receive All District and All State recognition.

VINCE MEYER AWARD

Recommend that all players selected for the All Star Series be nominated for the Vince Meyer Award.

Player profile are to include ACT or SAT composite score if taken, high school grade point average, and high school class rank so the Vince Meyer Committee can make the selection. The announcement of the winner will be made at the All-Star Banquet each year. The winner is to receive a plaque from the IHSBCA.

The Vince Meyer committee will develop guidelines for making the selection based on academic and athletic ability.

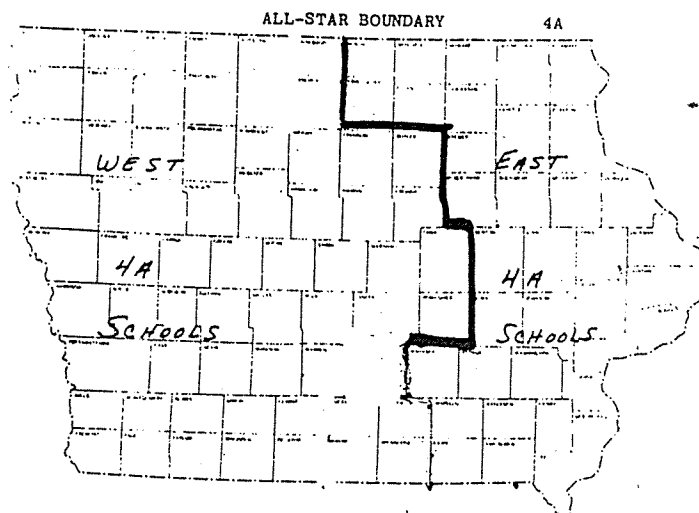
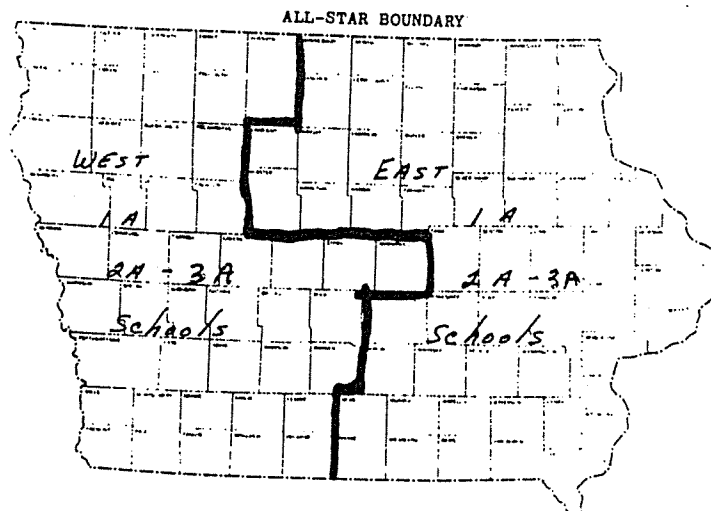

The meeting was adjourned at noon.

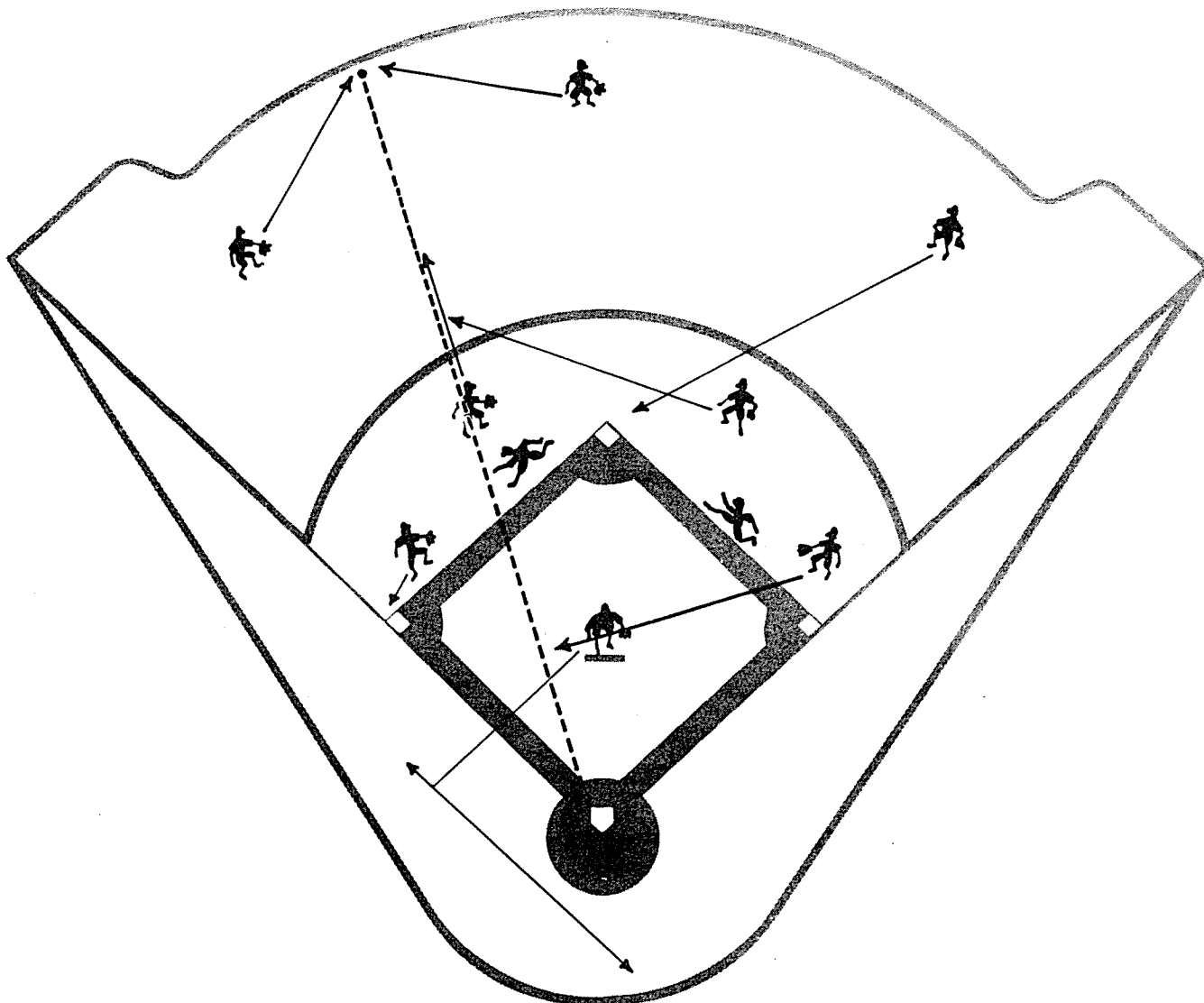

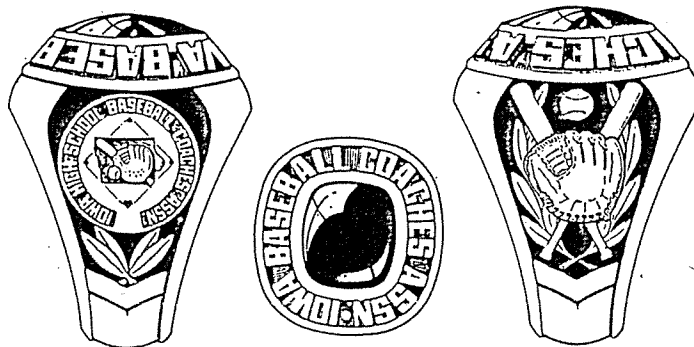
