CLINIC MARCH 14-15-16: The 17th Annual Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association Clinic is rapidly approaching. We hope you have made your plans to attend and bring the team along, the assistant coach, softball coach, an umpire, and your wife. Enclosed you will find a tentative clinic line-up about the speakers, topics, times etc.. Show it to your A.D., Principal, and Superintendent, and make sure you get the day off to attend the weekend of baseball. They might want to come along! We will be having three clinics going on at once, one for umpires one for softball coaches and the baseball clinic. You can go to any of the sessions. Come join us!

BANQUET TICKETS MEALS: Enclosed you will find a card to return so we can make a reservation for you for the Friday night awards banquet, Saturday's McDonalds F.C.A. breakfast, and the Saturday noon lunch. Fill it out and mail it back with your check covering your clinic fees. Admission to the Clinic will be \$25.00 for members. 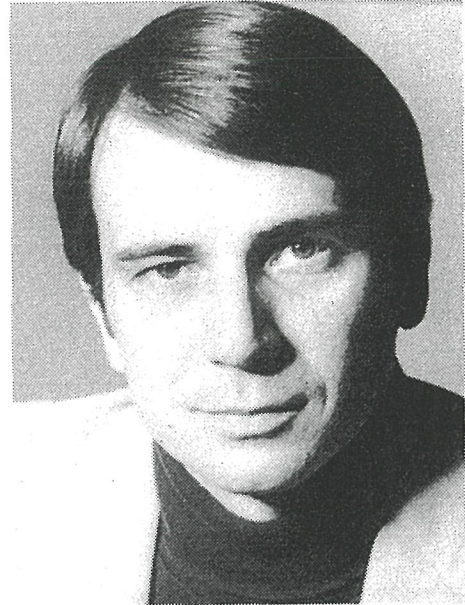

CHUCK OFFENBURGER, Iowa Boy, a 1965 graduate of Shenandoah High School and 1969 from Vanderbilt University. Chuck began writing at the age of 13 for the Shenandoah Evening Sentinel, covering local sports. While in college, he worked part time for the Nashville Tennessean newspaper and worked for the student newspaper the Hustler.

After college he returned to Shenandoah, working three years in all news positions for the Sentinel, eventually becoming managing editor. He joined the Des Moines Register in 1972, as a general assignment reporter. In 1977, began writing the Iowa Boy column, which appears three times a week. Co-leader, along with John Karras, of RAGBRAI.

Chuck is a winner of about 30 journalism awards. He was the grand marshal of 1981 Hoo Doo Day parade in Neola, Ia., and 1984 centennial parade in Fiscus, Ia., population of 7.

Honorable mention All-Southwest Iowa catcher in 1965; 3rd string catcher at Vanderbilt University in 1966-67; rated "no prospect" by scout Bill Clark of the Reds when Chuck sneaked into tryout camp at age 27 in 1974.

STIEVE RENKO: was born and raised in Kansas City, Ks., where he was a 3-sports (baseball-basketball and football) athlete...he also starred in 3 sports at the University of Kansas...where he quarterbacked a Kansas team that included Gale Sayers; and earned 2nd team Big Eight honors in 1964. He was the Oakland Raiders 15th round draft selection in 1966...He was selected by the New York Mets in June free agent draft. In 1969 he was obtained by Montreal Expos, in 1976 he was obtained by the White Sox and 78 by Oakland A's. In 1979 he signed with the Red Sox as a free agent. California Angels obtained him with Fred Lynn in 1981. He signed with the Royals in 1983 as a free agent. His over-all major league totals are: 128-135 with a 3.98 E.R.A.. Pitched in 426 games, starting 348 and completing 56. he struck out 1,401 batters.

RON HUNTI: Sixteen years in professional baseball, 12 of those years in the big leagues with the Mets, Dodgers, Giants, Expos, and St. Louis. Ron established a major league record for the most times hit by pitch in one season (50) in 1971. he led the league 7 straight years and has a lifetime record of 243 HP. He was named second baseman on the sporting News National League All-Star Team in 1964 and 1966 and had a life time batting average of .273 and a fielding average of .973. In his pro career Ron committed only 185 errors. Ron left baseball in 1975 and is presently living in Wentzville, Mo..

CHARLIE WILLIAMS: Entering his 7th season as a National League Umpire, will be back for the second year. Charlie was well received by the umpires in last years clinic. He was called up in 1978 after working in the California League, Texas League, Florida State League and the Pacific Coast League. Charlie was an instructor for the Bill Kennman Umpire Development School from 1975 thru 1979. he is considered one of the best umpires in the National League. Welcome back to Iowa Charlie.

JERRY TERRELL, was born in Waseca Minn. and graduated from Waterville, Minn. He went to Mankato State College where he made the NCAA All-American team. He signed with the Twins in 1968. He played 8 years in the major leagues with the Twins (1973-77) and the Royals (1977-80). Jerry played all nine positions in the major leagues. His lifetime average was .255 with his best year in 1975 with a .286 average. Presently Jerry lives in Kansas City where he is the advance scout for the Royals.

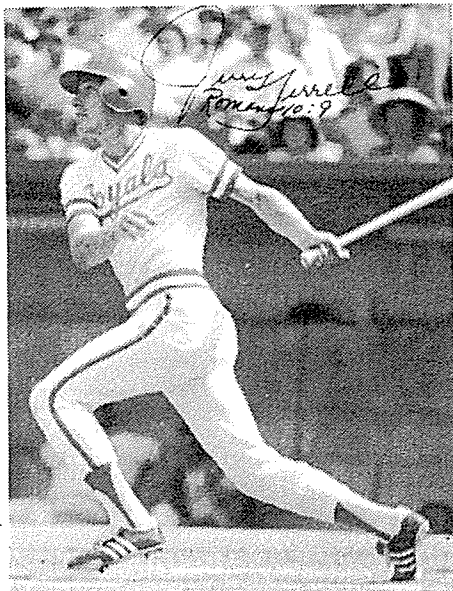
BILL DUNN has been working in the past six years. In 1981 season he worked in the Mid-West League, working the All-Star games and being selected to work in the Play-offs. In 1985, Ray has been assigned to the American Association Triple A league. In the off season Ray referees basketball in the Cedar Rapids Area. Presently he resides in Cedar Rapids.

SHAWN KIMBALL: Entering his 7th season a pro umpire, mainly in the Minor Leagues, Shawn has worked in the Gulf Coast League, South Atlantic League, Midwest League and the Texas League. Shawn worked the plate in the Midwest League All-Star Series and Championship game. He did an outstanding job teaching with Charlie Williams last year, and by popular demand, they are returning. Shawn is a graduate from the University of Maine. In the off-season Shawn referees basketball in the Cedar Rapids Area.

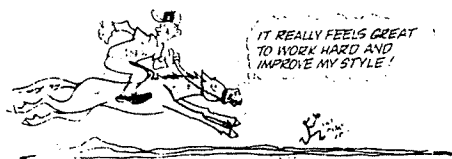
PATRICIA M. STOCKMAN: Assistant Softball Coach at the University of Iowa in charge of pitching, Patty has a great record for her softball background. A 1982 Hall of Famer in the I.H.S.G.A.U. for her outstanding career in high school at Clear Creek (Oxford) Iowa, where she had a career record 85-15, pitching her team to the state championship. She went on to U.N.I. and has coached at Crestwood High School. She is one of the best softball teachers in the State of Iowa. We welcome Patty Stockman back for the second year in a row.

BOB THURNNESS: Head Softball Coach at Coe College, is in his fourth year at Coe. Conference champs three years in a row. Over-all record is 51-19, with 1984 team record of 18-6. Bob coached one All-American, Kathy Becker, and three All Western Divisional girls. He spoke at the Clinic in 1983. He has developed 13 all-conference players.

BILL OLSON: is entering his 24th year of coaching, 14 at Northwest Omaha. Bill was named the National Coach of the Year in 1984 by the American Baseball Coaches Association. In 1983, his team was proclaimed the Mythical National Champions by Easton Bat Company. Bill's 1984 team record was 19-0, winning the Metro League, State Tournament and the Rolston Invitational Tournament. His over-all record is 776-358. He has spoken at many clinics throughout the midwest. Bill has been a member of the Coaches Association.

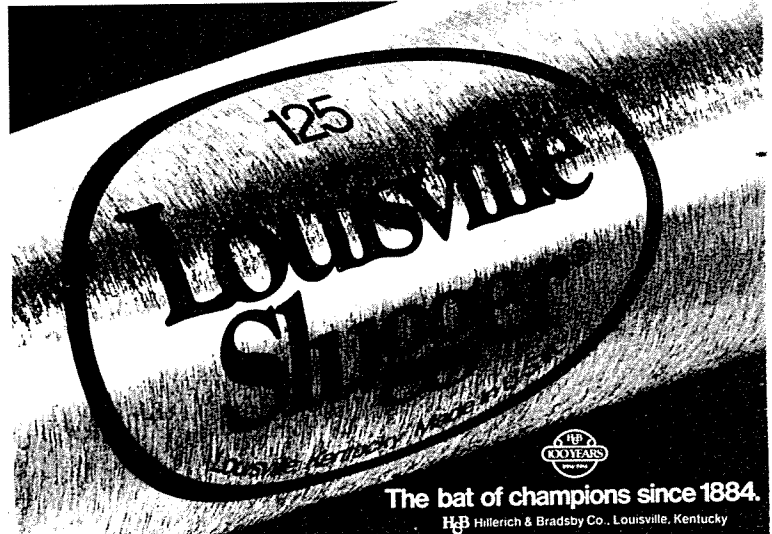

CEDAR RAPIDS:

Five new members will be inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association at its annual clinic and banquet in Cedar Rapids March 15, 1985.

New inductees to be honored at the IHSBCA Seventeenth Annual Clinic Banquet are Al Christiansen, contributor from Nora Springs, Iowa; Kenneth (Casey) Hines, contributor from Greenfield, Iowa; Lanny Peterson, umpire from Cedar Rapids, Iowa; Byron Rhodes, coach from Conrad, Iowa; and Clair Rierson, coach from Farmington, New Mexico.

The five names bring to 94 the number of Hall of Fame members. The honor roll now includes 62 coaches, 12 players, 13 umpires, and 7 contributors.

AL CHRISTIANSEN--has been an avid baseball man for over 60 years. Known to his friends as "Casey," Al has probably been the major reason amateur baseball has flourished in North Central Iowa.

A native of Nora Springs, Iowa, Al began his playing career in 1918. After playing baseball for 10 years, he became a manager and has managed some type of baseball team for over 50 years. He continues to manage the Osage North Stars. He also is a State Commissioner for the Iowa Amateur Baseball League for Eastern Iowa.

A feature article in the MASON CITY GLOBE GAZETTE describes Al, "A love affair with baseball," and "farming is his livelihood, but baseball is his passion."

KENNETH C. (CASEY) HINES-- has been a baseball fan for 67 years. Living in Greenfield, Iowa, "Casey" Hines is probably best known for his years as sports editor for the ADAIR COUNTY FREE PRESS. Author of "Sport Shine" and "Casey's Column," he has been labelled "the ball-nosed historian of Hawkeye baseball."

Through 67 years of associations with baseball, as a player, as a kid-league manager, as a pro scout, as a sports writer--Kenneth Hines has been a most ardent fan and contributor to the game of baseball.

LANNY PETERSON-- has been responsible for umpires' involvement in the IHSBCA. As a IHSBCA member for 14 years, Lanny was the Umpires Committee Chairman for 7 years before being elected to the Board of Directors. He has planned the Umpires Clinic since its beginning. And he served as Chairman of the 1984 All-Star Series at Iowa City.

A registered umpire for 19 years, Lanny was selected by the IHSBCA as the 1981 State Umpire of the Year. He has worked the IHSAA State Tournament for 10 years. He has worked the Big Ten, the Iowa Conference, the Midwest Conference, and the State Junior College conferences. During the summer he works the Mississippi Valley, the ECIC, the WAMAC, the Big Eight, and the Mississippi Eight high school conferences.

A respected official, Lanny is one who consistently devotes many hours to the IHSBCA.

BYRON RHODES--, has been a most successful coach since 1965. He is a graduate of Zearing High School, Ellsworth Junior College, and Northwest Missouri State. Having coached at Starmont and BCL, Byron is nearing his 400th win.

Byron's enthusiasm for baseball was demonstrated very well as he spearheaded the drive to build and light the baseball diamond at BCL, a facility which now bears his name.

Byron is a charter member of the IHSBCA. He has served on the Board of Directors and numerous committees. He also is Past-President of the association.

CLAIR RIERSON--is a person whose name is synonymous with Iowa baseball during the 1960's and 1970's. As a player, Clair played for Jewell High School until 1956, for Radcliffe until 1957, for Ellsworth Junior College until 1959, and for Iowa State until 1962. In 1959 he was named the Junior College Athlete of the Year.

As a coach, Clair is best remembered as the Iowa State head coach from 1975-1980. Prior to that, he coached at Story City and Danville high schools and assisted Cap Timm at Iowa State.

Since moving to New Mexico, Clair has remained active in coaching baseball. A charter member of the IHSBCA, he has been involved in or with baseball most of his life. Clair's philosophy is summed up this way: "the game is baseball, but baseball is more than a game."
