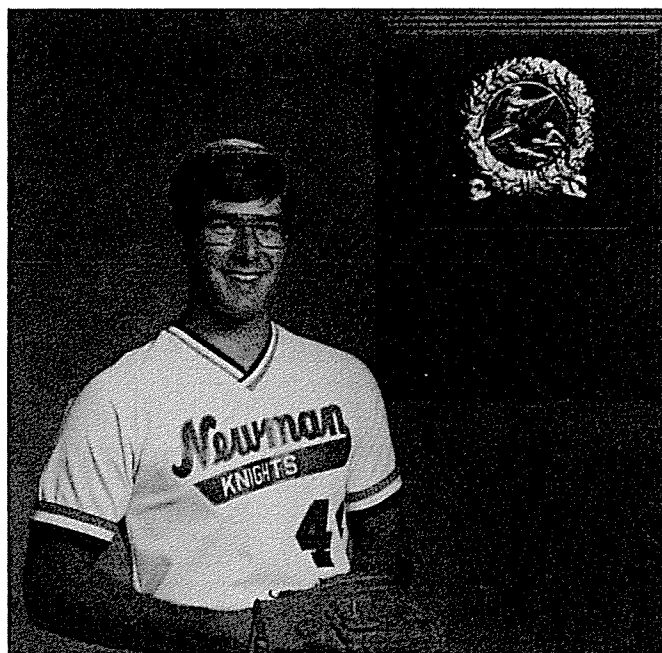

SCOTT CAHILL SECOND RECIPIENT OF THE VINCE MEYER AWARD: The second recipient of the late Vince Meyer Award was Scott Cahill of Mason City Newman High School. This award is given in honor of long-time baseball coach at Bancroft St. John's, and is given to a player selected from the list of players that were nominated for the academic all-state team. This award is announced at the Recognition Banquet to the player who exhibits the high academic and athletic standards which Coach Meyer exemplified during his career as a coach and teacher.

A little bit about Scott: He had an ACT score of 29, was in the top 2% of his graduating class, was All-Conference in 1984 and 85, All-District 1984 and 85 and All-State in 1984 and 85. Other honors for Scott were: Father Helas Award--Football Character and moral character Award. Al Connor Award--Highest honor bestowed a student-athlete at Newman High School. A member of the National Honor Society, Letterwinners Club, Basketball, Football, Baseball, Math Club and Science Club. Scott hit .380 with a fielding average of .995. He pitched in 56 innings and had a 6-1 record with a 1.75 ERA.

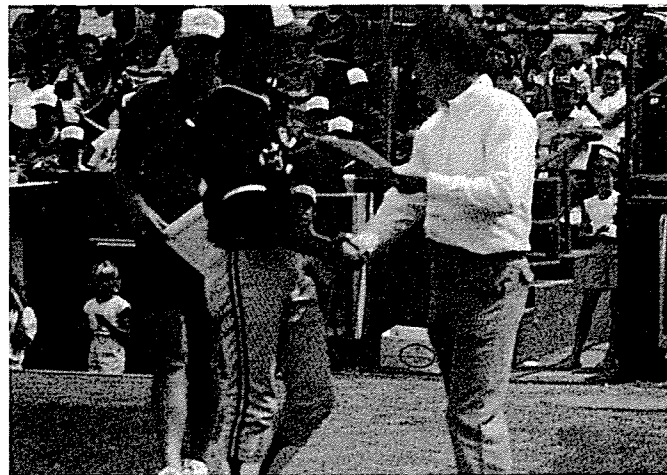

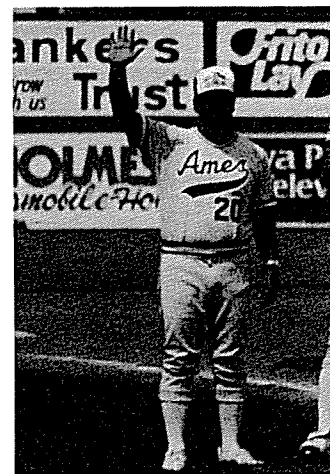

ACTION TAKEN BY BOARD:

1. Past Presidents who are active in IHSBCA will serve as consultants on various standing committees of IHSBCA.
2. Executive Secretary will prepare and mail an agenda to District Reps for them to follow for their District Meetings.
3. Vince Meyer Scholarship Award will be changed to "Vince Meyer Award."
4. Two media awards, one for print journalism and one for electronic journalism will be given beginning in 1986.
5. Print media award winner for 1986: Dearrel Bates, Davenport. Electronic media award winner for 1986: Dave Potratz, KICD-Spencer.
6. Contributor award winner for 1986: Pamida.
7. President's award winner for 1986: Will be announced.
8. Hall of Fame members selection for Hall of Fame, Clarence "Buzz" Zieser was approved.
9. Four-Year College Coach of the Year award winner: Lou Yacinich, Grand View, Des Moines.
10. All-Star Series for 1987 will be held in Cedar Rapids. (1986 Series to be in Iowa City.)

Meeting was called to order at 9:10 AM by Vice-President Don Miller. Twenty-three Board members were present.

Secretary's Report as printed in last newsletter was approved.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Jim Brems, IHSBCA accountant, reported \$944.81 in checking account and \$4,374.84 in interest bearing accounts. Discussion of All-Star series held in Des Moines showed that it should break even. Consensus was that breaking even was good, given the rent for Sec Taylor Stadium. Additional comment was that since all equipment (computer) was paid for, efforts towards building up the interest bearing accounts will be made.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

Jim Mahoney, recently appointed member to the State Baseball Advisory Committee, reported on concerns that arose from that group's meeting. Among those: State Association will video-tape State Tournament games for individuals/schools use. Because of recent poll sent to school athletic directors, no change in baseball limitations is forthcoming--however, IHSAA is aware of problems caused by athletes going to camps during the baseball season. Feeling is that plastic cleats are here to stay, and coaches' concerns would be better addressed to manufacturers so that better ones are made. Advisory Committee will meet again in March. Much discussion was held suggesting that the IHSBCA form a committee to formulate our positions and policies so that the IHSAA would be kept informed.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY REPORT:

BASEBALL TERMINOLOGY

- APPLE:** Ball. Also called Pill, Horsehide, Onion, Sphere, Bola.
- BALTIMORE CHOP:** Topped Ball which bounces near plate and goes very high in air.
- BENCH WARMER:** Player who rarely gets into a game.
- BUSHES:** Minor leagues. Also called Sticks.
- CHANGE UP:** Slow pitch thrown with same motion as fast one. Also called Pulling the String, Let-Up, Change of Pace.
- CRIPPLE:** Pitch following three-balls, one-strike count on batter.
- DRAG BUNT:** Lightly pushed hit so ball trickles to infielder too slowly for play on batter.
- FIELDER'S CHOICE:** Throwing to retire a base-runner forced at the next base.
- FUNGO:** Player throws ball few feet in air and bats it himself.
- GOAT:** Player whose error or oversight proves costly.
- GOPHER BALL:** Pitch which is hit for a homer.
- GRAND SLAM:** Home run with bases loaded.
- HIT-AND-RUN:** Play in which runner breaks from first, causing either second baseman or shortstop to leave normal position to take throw at second base, followed by batter driving ball through "hole" vacated by fielder.
- HOOKE:** Curve ball. Also applied to right-handed hitter "pulling" or hitting the ball into left field, or vice versa.
- JOCKEY:** Player who "rides" opposition team with taunts.
- LEATHER MAN:** Good fielder.
- ON DECK:** Player in circle near plate, waiting to follow current batter.
- PASS:** Base on balls. Also called walk, Annie Oakley, Stroll, etc.
- PAYOFF PITCH:** Pitch following three-balls, two-strikes count on the batter.
- PICKOFF:** Catch runner off base by sudden throw from pitcher of catcher.
- PITCHOUT:** Wide pitch to fail bunt or to enable catcher to throw out runner attempting to steal.
- PORTSIDER:** Lefthander pitcher. Also called Southpaw.
- PULL A ROCK:** Make a stupid play.
- ROLLER:** Slow ground ball which trickles toward infielder.
- RUN-AND-HIT:** Play in which runner breaks with the pitch and batter is committed to hit at the ball.
- SCREWBALL:** Zany. Also applied to pitch thrown with outward twist of the hand.
- SHUTOUT:** No runs. Also called Whitewash, Blank, Kalsomine, etc.
- SINKER:** Pitch which suddenly dips downward.
- SLICE:** Hit to right field by right-handed batter, or left field by lefthander.
- SQUEEZE PLAY:** Runner breaks from third with the pitch and batter bunts ball to enable runner to score.

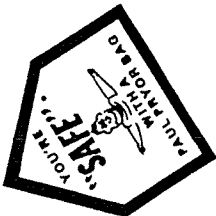
