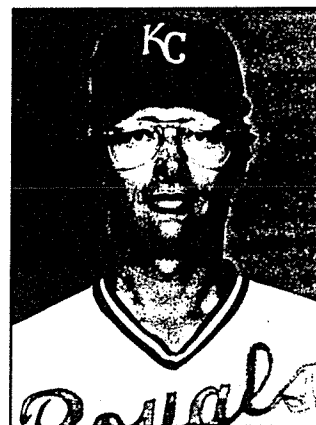
**HAROLD "GUS" SCHRADER:** Gus is best known for his Red Pepper Sports column in the Cedar Rapids Gazette. He has been a sports writer, Editor and Columnist for the Gazette for 38 years. A graduate of St. Ansgar High School and the University of Iowa, Gus started his sportswriting career as sports editor of the Iowa City Press-Citizen in 1941. He started with the Cedar Rapids Gazette in 1948 and became The Gazette sports editor in 1951. For more than 30 years, he has authored the highly-popular Red Peppers column which appears in the Gazette five times a week. He is a multiple winner of the Iowa Sportswriter of the Year Award. For many years, he covered the Cedar Rapids minor league team and now is on its board of directors.

**PAUL SPLITTORFF:** was born in Evansville, In. and played High School baseball in Arlington Heights, Ill...graduated from Morningside College in Sioux City. He pitched for the U.S. team in the Pan-American Games in 1967. Paul has spent his entire career in the KC organization and is the club career leader in wins with 168-143, innings over 2,500 and games 420, starts of 390. The highlight of Paul's career was the 1973 season when he became KC 1st 20-game winner...He was the 1st player originally signed by the Royals to make it onto the major league roster. He was involved in 4 League Championship Series and the 1980 World Series. He won 168 pro games and struck out over 1,000 hitters. Paul retired from baseball in 1984. Last year he was the Royals color man for T.V. on the Royal Baseball Network. He is married to Lynn and has a son and daughter.

## CLINIC SPEAKERS

**JACK KAISER:** National High School Baseball Coach of the Year, 1985, has been coaching for 33 years with an over-all record of 896-419. His 1985 team record was 75-6, winning the Illinois State Championship. His team ranked 5th in the National U.S.A. poll. Jack is from Oak Park-River Forest High School, in Oak Park, Ill.

**BILL McDONALD:** District Five, 1985 Baseball Coach of the Year, Shawnee Mission South High School, Kansas, has been coaching for 13 years, with an over-all record 198-64. His 1985 team record was 20-5, winning the Kansas State Championship. In 1979 he was named Kansas Coach of Year. He has won the Kansas State Championship four of the past 12 years.

**BRAD CLEMENT:** Marshalltown High School, Iowa's Four A State Champ Coach, has been coaching for six years with an over-all record of 144-75. His 1985 team record was 35-7, winning the Big Eight Conference and the State Championship. Brad presently serves on the Board of Directors, representing the Central District. He has been named Conference Coach of the Year in 1980, 81, and 85.

**HAL DYER:** A scholarship athlete at Florida State, Hal Dyer brings a wealth of coaching experience to our state clinic. Six years in minor league baseball as a catcher were followed by successful stints in high school (Cincinnati), amateur, and junior college coaching. In each of two seasons at Pratt, Kansas Dyer's junior college baseball program produced state JC championships. Dyer then moved into coaching at the professional ranks as field manager of the Bristol Tigers in 1984. His successes continued there as his 1984 team produced Bristol's best record in seven previous seasons. Dyer's Bristol accomplishment stands taller considering that his success occurred with only 3 players drafted above the 15th round.

**CHARLIE WILLIAMS:** Entering his 8th season as a National League Umpire, Charlie Williams will be with us for the second time this year. Entering his 8th season as a National League Umpire, Charlie began his umpire career in 1975 after graduating number one in his class at the Kinnamn Umpire School. After spending three years in the minor leagues, his major league career has been highlighted as an umpire in the 1985 All-Star game. Charlie resides in Chicago and he and his wife Diana, have a son and daughter.

**JOYCE BILOW:** Kirkwood Softball Coach, will be the featured speaker for the softball sessions. Joyce, in her 8th season as a coach, comes to us from New York, via Baker College and Green Mountain College in Vermont. She has been very successful at all the coaching positions. At Baker College she took them to the National Tournament and was runner-up, going on to Green Mountain College where her squad had a 16-2 record, and then on to Kirkwood, where her squad finished third in the National Tournament. She is assisted by Jacelyn Drabelle, a former William Penn standout.

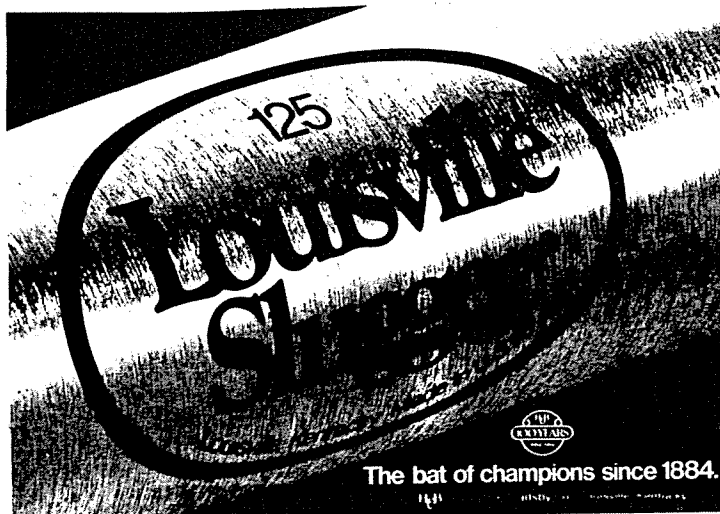

**CHANGES IN SUMMER BASEBALL PROGRAM:** Changes to take place in 1986: 1. Permit coaches to work with the maximum of four (4) players a school day (Monday - Friday) beginning April 15 until the official starting date, on a one-year trial basis. This means any four players the coach desires to work with Monday thru Friday, (not Saturday or Sunday). Any combination of four players on a given day but not more than four (4).

The official starting for all players is May 12, 1986.

2. **SAFE-BASE.** The safe-base (double first base) will be mandatory effective summer, 1986. Some schools already have the safe-base and have been using it the past three years. This action was approved in the interest of safety.

### CEDAR RAPIDS:

Three new members will be inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association at its annual clinic and banquet in Cedar Rapids March 14, 1986.

New inductees to be honored at the IHSBCA Eighteenth Annual Clinic/Banquet are Dick Core, coach from Dubuque, Iowa; Tom Jenk Sr., player from Dyersville, Iowa; and Clarence "Buzz" Zieser, player from Center Point, Iowa.

These three inductees bring to 97 the number of Hall of Fame members. The honor roll now includes 63 coaches, 14 players, 13 umpires, and 7 contributors.

### 1986 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

DICK CORE, Dubuque, Iowa, Charter Member of the IHSBCA, has been a most successful high school baseball coach for 21 years. He has been the coach at Dubuque Hempstead since 1970. His overall record is 378 wins and 150 losses. During this time his teams have won four State Championships; 1974, 1978, 1983, and 1984. His teams are 9-0 at the State Tournament.

Dick has also been honored numerous times by his peers. He has been the Iowa State Coach of the Year three times. His conference, the Mississippi Valley, has voted him the Conference Coach of the Year seven times.

As a member of the Association, Dick is a Past President, a member of the Board of Directors, Committee Chairman, Clinic Speaker, and a promoter of high school baseball in Eastern Iowa and throughout the State.

TOM JENK SR., presently an attorney from Dyersville, Iowa, has been actively involved with baseball throughout his life. His playing career includes his playing at the University of Iowa, Drake University, and many years of semi-pro ball for the Dyersville Whitehawks.

Among his many honors is his playing left field for the Pan American games held in Sau Paulo, hitting .353, and helping his team with the Silver Medal in 1963.

In addition, Tom has been a coach since 1955, from the Dyersville Little League to the Legion Team to the Semi-pro team. Tom also umpired from 1958 through 1969 at the high school and college levels.

His interest in baseball also served him well as a past member of the U.S. Olympic Baseball Committee and a former director and Attorney for the U.S. Baseball Federation.

CLARENCE "BUZZ" ZIESER, native of Center Point, Iowa, currently residing in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, is being recognized as one of the outstanding right-hand pitchers of his era.

During his high school career at Center Point, "Buzz" compiled a 42-7 record. He averaged two strike-outs per inning, and the total number of actual runs scored against him was fewer than two.

His professional baseball career began in 1947 with the Cincinnati Red farm organization. He reached the AAA level in the International League before retiring in 1956. During this time he played in 46 of the 48 United States, as well as in Canada, Cuba, and South America. In 1953 he was honored as the Best Right-hand Pitcher in Class A minor-league baseball.

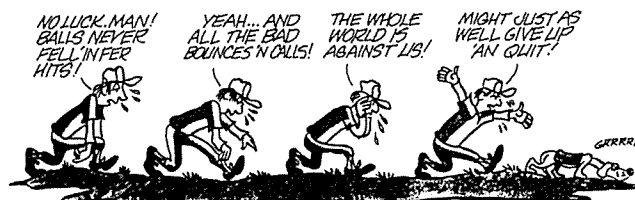

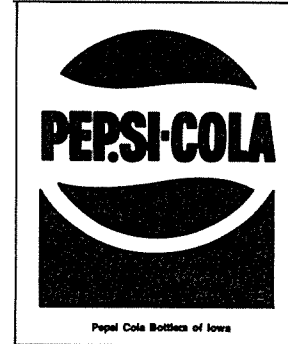

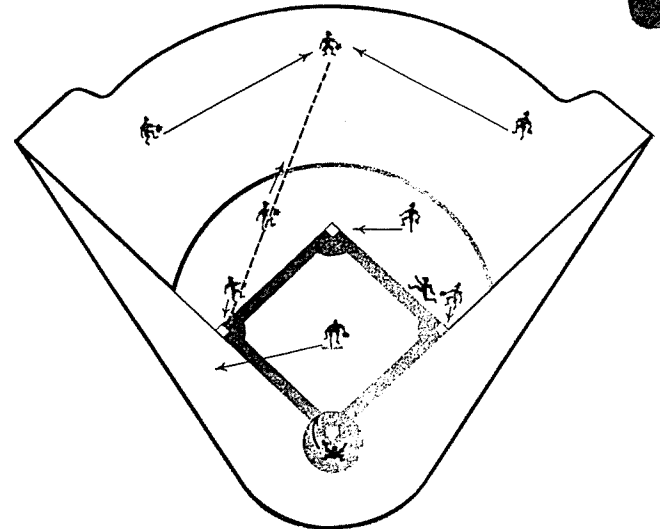
