CLINIC--MARCH--12-13-14: The 19th Annual Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association Clinic is rapidly approaching. We hope you have made your plans to attend and bring the team along, the assistant coach, softball coach, an umpire, and your wife. Enclosed you will find a tentative clinic line-up of the speakers, topics, times, etc. Show it to your A.D., Principal, and Superintendent, and make sure you get the day off to attend the weekend of baseball. They might want to come along! We will be having three clinics going on at once, one for umpires, one for softball coaches, and one for the baseball coaches. You can go to any of the sessions. Come join us March 12-13-14, 1987.

BANQUET TICKETS MEALS: Enclosed you will find a card to return so we can make a reservation for you for the Friday night Awards Banquet, Saturday's McDonalds F.C.A. breakfast, and the Saturday noon lunch. Fill it out and mail it back with your check covering your clinic fees. Admission to the Clinic will be \$25.00 for members. It will include all your meals and the opportunity to hear many top-notch clinic speakers. If you are not a current member of the association, it will cost you \$40.00 in advance for the clinic. This will include your membership.

Remember, if you are not a member of the coaches association by March 6, 1987 the clinic will cost you \$50.00. Make your check payable to the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association. We will only order as many meals and noon lunches as we have paid reservations.

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS: High School students are welcome. Their rates are \$10.00 for the full clinic. If they want to attend only one day, it will cost them \$6.00 per day. If they want to eat meals, it will cost the students \$25.00. The F.C.A. breakfast, sponsored by the McDonalds Co., is free to the students. Put up a sign in your school and bring a bus load of softball and baseball players.

HALL OF FAME ANNOUNCED: Enclosed you will find the press release of the 1987 HALL OF FAME. A brief history follows each man's name. Not only will we honor Hall of Famers, but coaches and umpires who have served over 10 years, College Coaches of Year, High School District Coaches of Year, Umpires of each District, and the Umpire and Coaches of the Year. We hope you will plan to attend to help honor these people.

CONFERENCE CHAMPION COACHES: Once again the Association will be honoring the Conference Championship Coaches. The CONFERENCE CHAMPION COACHES WHO PREREGISTER FOR THE CLINIC will be able to pick up a certificate of Conference championship. This is the eighth year for this award. RICK MATHEWS: Rick will speak on the topic High School to Professional baseball. Rick started his coaching career in Eddyville, Iowa and the past year was an assistant Farm Director of the Kansas City Royals. He is well known throughout Iowa for his baseball background.

PINKY PRIMROSE IOWA B.C.A. HALL OF FAME: (from Cedar Rapids GAZETTE, Jan. 15, 1987) Veteran Cedar Rapids Washington coach Harold "Pinky" Primrose was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame in San Diego, Ca.

Primrose, who has been coaching for 31 years, 22 at Washington, is only the second prep coach honored by the ABCA. The other was Jim Phipps of Niles, Ill., in 1984.

Primrose owns a lifetime coaching record of over 700 wins and was a 1980 State and National coach of the year winner.

Primrose is also a prep basketball and football official and head coach at Coe College. Other duties include being chairman of the high school division of the ABCA for All-American selection, and executive secretary of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association.

There are over 5,100 members in the ABCA.

CLINIC SPEAKERS

RICK MAHEWS: Former coach at Eddyville, Marshalltown, Iowa Western Comm. College and then on to the Kansas City Royals as a field manager in their minor league system and then on to the front office as assistant farm director. Rick has distinguished himself and was an excellent field manager. He has many clinics for young pitchers and catchers throughout the state. Presently he is coaching at Indian Hills Community college and the Kansas City Royals short season rookie club in the summer.

DEAN BOWYER: Baseball Coach at Mankato State University, is known for his baseball hitting tape. He has given many clinics in Minnesota and comes highly regarded as a clinician. He played for the Baltimore Orioles Organization. He has been coaching for 10 years.

BOB LEECH: Baseball coach at Muscatine High School, has been coaching for 13 years with an over-all record of 297-140. He started coaching at Marshalltown High School and then moved on to his home town of Muscatine. Bob was a Head coach in the 1976 All-Star Series and assisted in the 1986 series. He was a Conference Coach of Year in 1977-78 and 86. Bob has served on many committees of the Association. Played his baseball at Iowa State University as a catcher. Bob's 1986 team came in second in the State Tournament after tying for the Mississippi Eight Championship and a 30-4 season record.

BRAD CLEMENT: Marshalltown High School, Iowa's Four A State Champ Coach, has been coaching for six years with an over-all record of 144-75. His 1985 team record was 35-7, winning the Big Eight Conference and the State Championship. Brad presently serves on the Board of Directors, representing the Central District. He has been named Conference Coach of the Year in 1980, 81, and 85.

JIM DIMICK: Baseball coach at St. Olaf College, Northfield Minn., Jim has given many clinics throughout the U.S., this year at the national convention in San Diego, Ca. Jim's teams have won over 300 games. He was the recipient of the Dick Siebert Award in 1978 for contribution to baseball in Minnesota. He is presently on the ABCA Executive Committee representing Division III.

CHARLIE WILLIAMS: Entering his 8th season as a National League Umpire, Charlie Williams will be with us for the second time this year. Entering his 8th season as a National League Umpire, Charlie began his umpire career in 1975 after graduating number one in his class at the Kinnamn Umpire School. After spending three years in the minor leagues, his major league career has been highlighted as an umpire in the 1985 All-Star game. Charlie resides in Chicago and he and his wife Diana, have a son and daughter.

EUGENE MEISIER: Bancroft St. John's High School, has been coaching for 17 years winning over 250 games. His 1986 team won the State Championship for the second year in a row. Eugene is a member of the 200 win club and named Conference Coach of the Year in 1982. He has served on the Board of Directors for the past four years. He is known for his hard work as a baseball coach in Northwestern Iowa.

TOM JENK JR.: Dyersville Beckman High School coach, has been coaching for 12 years winning over 230 games. His 1986 team record was 23-9, winning the State Class 3A Tournament. Tom has been an Assistant Coach and Head Coach in the All Star Series in 1983 and 85. He is known to be a motivator of young men. Presently he is coaching basketball and baseball at Beckman. Tom is a member of the 200 win club and has been named his Conference Coach of Year three times.

JOHN SCHWIEBERT: Cornell College baseball coach has been coaching for 11 years. He started his coaching career at New Sharon and Iowa Valley. John dropped out of education to join the F.B.I. for five years. He came back into education as a superintendent of Schools at Center Point. John joined the Cornell coaching staff in 1982, becoming head baseball coach in 1984. He also assists in basketball and football.

RANDY BRUNS: Former professional baseball umpire in the American Association will be back with us for the second year. Randy came to us very highly regarded as an umpire. He was a professional umpire for 8 years before retiring last year. Presently Randy lives in Waverly, working for an insurance company and is the area supervisor for umpire development in the midwest. He presently is umpiring college and high school games in Eastern Iowa.

PATRICIA M. STOCKMAN: Former assistant Coach at the University of Iowa in charge of pitching, Patty has a great record for her softball background. A 1982 Hall of Famer in the I.H.S.G.A.U. for her outstanding career in high school at Clear Creek (Oxford), Iowa, where she had a career record 85-15, pitching her team to the state championship. She went on to U.N.I. and has coached at Crestwood High School. She is one of the best softball teachers in the state of Iowa. We welcome Patty Stockman back for the third time. She currently is selling sporting goods for Creative Sports of Des Moines.

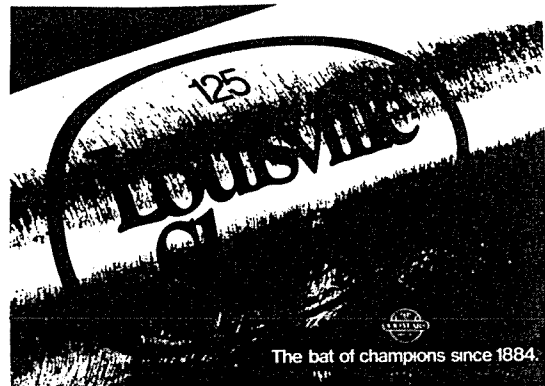

Permit coaches to work with the maximum of four (4) players a school day (Monday - Friday) beginning April 14 until the official starting date, on a one-year trial basis. This means any four players the coach desires to work with Monday thru Friday, (not Saturday or Sunday). Any combination of four players on a given day but not more than four (4).

The official starting for all players is May 11, 1987.

History Of Baseball

Baseball developed from the game of cricket and an old English sport called rounders. Boston youngsters in colonial times played games called one-o-cat and two-o-cat, using one or two bases. Later, they developed a game called town ball that has four bases and a batter's box between home base and first base. Cricket enthusiasts in New York City developed a similar game called the New York game.

Abner Doubleday, who later became a noted Army officer, laid out a diamond-shaped field with four bases 60 feet apart in 1839 in Cooperstown, N.Y., and named the game baseball. The National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum opened in Cooperstown 100 years later.

Alexander J. Cartwright, a New York City surveyor, designed the game almost exactly as it is played today. He established standard rules about 1845, and laid out the diamond with most of the distances used today. He also organized the New York Knickerbockers team. The New York Nine beat the Knickerbockers 23 to 1 in the first matched baseball game, a four-inning contest on June 19, 1846, in Hoboken, N.J.

The National League was organized in 1876, with teams in Boston, Chicago, Cincinnati, Hartford, Louisville, New York City, Philadelphia, and St. Louis. The American Association and the Union Association tried to compete with it, but the National League stood as the only major league in 1900. One of the first great baseball heroes was Charles "Old Hoss" Radbourne. He pitched 72 games in 1884 for Providence, 36 of them in succession, and won 60.

The American League was formed in 1900 by Byron B. "Ban" Johnson, who had been president of the Western League. He asked the National League to recognize his league as a major league. The National League refused, and the American League clubs "raided" National League teams for players. They signed 111 players from National League teams in 1901. The two leagues settled their dispute in 1903, and the American League became a major league. It had teams in Boston, Chicago, Cleveland, Detroit, New York City, Philadelphia, St. Louis, and Washington, D.C. The National League is often called "The Senior Circuit," and the American League "The Junior Circuit."

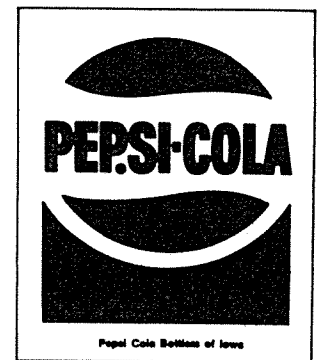
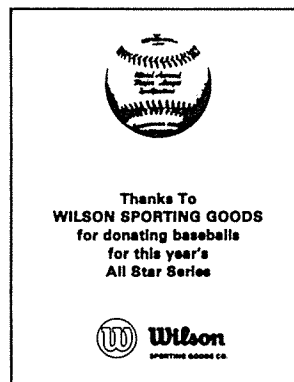
