

WHAI\_ARE\_SOME\_OF\_IHE\_BULES :

1/ The pitchers can pitch a full game.

2/ All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings.

3/ Tie breaker system will be announced in advance for who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition, most runs scored, least runs given up, most hits, least hits given up.

All of the examples can be given points. The team with the most points will play for 1st place. The team with second highest points will also play for 1st place game.

This system will give more boys an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict pitchers on amount of innings he can pitch in one day.

Coaches were picked by the Steering committee! They filled out an application that was found in the last newsletter.

If a coach fills out a player profile form that is found in this newsletter and sends it in, this player will have the same opportunity as a player on the All District Team. This system was necessary because of a number of good ball players being left off the All Star Squads, because a coach could not get enough votes for his player at the All District Selection meeting.





UNIFORM # ; NAME, POSITION, BATS, THROWS, HEIGHT, WEIGHT, CLASS, BIRTHDATE, HOME ADDRESS, PHONE # AND SCHOOL

All coaches should have a master roster filled out to hand to each coach and scout. Let's do it up right.

Coaches let's help curb the drug problem in our schools...

KIMBALL'S CORNER (Shawn Kimball is presently umpiring in the Class AAA International League. His umpiring career of seven years has seen him working the Gulf Coast, South Atlantic, Midwest, and Texas Leagues before his recent promotion to AAA, just one step below the Major Leagues. Raised in Augusta, Maine, Shawn now lives in North Liberty, Iowa and worked with the umpires in the 1984, 1985, and 1986 Coaches Association Clinics.)

In the next several Baseball Coaches Association newsletters, I will attempt to help fellow umpires improve themselves and also give coaches a better understanding of umpire philosophies and mechanics. It is probably best for me to start with the most basic aspects of umpiring and go onto the finer points at a later time. Some lessons will be taught through war stories, but mostly we'll discuss play situations and mechanics hoping that some ideas will be especially helpful to each of you.

Most important to our credibility as umpires is a thorough knowledge of the rules for the particular game at hand. We must be cautious not to be too technical because rules must be interpreted and common sense must be used. The IHSAA in Boone give you many interpretations specifically for the National Federation Rule Book. That office is always willing to give advice and instructions on ways to enforce certain rules. Obviously many things have to be handled differently in professional, and college, high school, and Little league baseball. Softball is another animal also.

In talking with various coaches, the most common complaints appear to be poor appearance, bad attitudes, arrival too close to game time, and a lack of hustle. Every umpire can prevent these things from being said about him. Let's not get coaches upset with us before we make our first call. If we give everybody a good initial impression, answer rules questions politely, and work hard, a coach is much more apt to believe us when a tough call occurs. When each of us decides to put on the uniform, we voluntarily take on all the responsibilities that go with the job. Primarily we are in charge of the welfare of the game of baseball and its players. We cannot compromise ourselves or our professionalism by letting coaches or athletic directors attempt to run our games. We must take charge from the first pitch so that both sides know that prior relationships have nothing to do with ball-strikes or safe-outs. Our integrity on and off the field is at stake. I personally believe that, at the high school level, discussions with coaches during the game should be kept brief and be conducted politely. Explain yourself calmly, allow for a fair response, and resume the game. politely.

The key to working hard and always giving our best effort is concentration. We cannot lapse and become a spectator. There are several ways to keep our concentration, most people have a routine which helps stop their minds from wandering. I go through a somewhat chronological order of call situations which might arise (i.e. balk, check swing, fair-foul,catch-no catch, obstruction-interference, and safe-out). It is also very good to imagine various play situations based on where a ball might be hit, then determining what your response will be and how your crew will cover the action. Going through these thought patterns will help you react to situations and improve your natural Any doubts or questions that arise are instincts. things which you and your partner(s) must discuss.

Now that we know our rules, we're of good character, and we're in the game at all times, we must make correct decisions. The single most important thing when calling plays and pitches is "timing". Let the entire play or pitch happen, get the feel for the particular call, make sure that you've got all the information that you need, then call the play/pitch. Good timing is a delay of 1-1 1/2 seconds from the completion of the whole play or from the pop of the pitch in the catcher's mitt until your render your decision. Anticipation is the biggest culprit in There is a certain thought destroying good timing. process which occurs in that brief period of time between the play and the call. Don't anticipate! Anticipation pre-empts this thought pattern and generally causes us to call a play too quickly. Being surprised by a play situation can also effect timing. We must watch the ball at all times and react to anything that happens. Surprise, nervousness, and anxiety shoot adrenalin through your system which can disrupt your "good timing thought process". Use this extra energy to your benefit turning it into hustle and aggressiveness. Sell those calls and show confidence on the field. Remember that it is nothing until you call it, so relax and take the necessary time in making every call.

Here's some quick tips for base umpires. Watch the ball and glance at the runners. With more than one runner, split the distance between them and let the ball take you into the play. Be stationary for all calls. Make sure that fielders have the ball before calling a sliding player out. Plate umpires must call as many strikes as possible. Be set on pitches. Move quickly onto the foul lines to call foul/fair balls. Move up the first base line on ground balls to help on interference/obstruction calls. Keep the game moving. Most important-let's have fun doing what we claim to enjoy.

The clinics that I got to work gave me the opportunity to give something back to the game of baseball which has given me much happiness and many valued friendships. Hopefully these articles will help each of you in some way. Contact me with any questions or comments through Mr. Primrose or to me here in the Intertional League (P.O. Box 608, Grove City, OH 43123). If you have the chance, visit your nearest minor-League game, introduce yourselves to the umpires, and ask any questions that you may have. Much can be learned from watching and talking with these people.

Best wishes to all on and off the field. Let's hope that we don't have to learn the hard way. Remember that unfortunately we are judged to be only as good as our last call, so make it a good one.

Good luck and call them as you see them!





A clinic update was given concerning: the clinicians: pre-registration, which is around 300; door assignments: the District Reps Meeting which should determine locations for district meetings, which this year will be July 12th for 1A-2A and July 19th for 3A-4A at 1:00 P.M.; the exhibits, which this year will be around 20; the responsibilities of mini clinic hosts; the banquet awards program; FCA breakfast speaker is Jim Dimick; and the responsibilities of Vice President and Secretary concerning the introduction of speakers.

Committee chairmen are reminded to meet with their committees and be prepared to report at general meeting. Responsibilities of steering committes were reviewed.

Everything is in order and on schedule for All-Star Series which will be held in Memorial Stadium in Cedar Rapids. The players will stay at the Holiday Inn. A reminder that a player must be nominated to play in All-Star Series. All District is no longer #1 priority for All-Star Series. Nominations # 1; # 2 All District # 3 Coach a member of the Association.

The 2 year District Rep man should work with the Vice President elect to encourage membership.

The Hall of Fame committee needs to look at inducting more players and coaches. Lou Koenigsfeld has done an excellent job.

The Board of Directors meeting in the Fall will be at Iowa City. There was some discussion on who is invited.

Academic All-State Committee is going well. When you nominate a player you must put down actual GPA and ACT score.

The budget that will be presented is very workable. We are seeing a raise in printing and postage costs, but we can survive.

The Rating Committee will again be headed by Bob Watson.

An Awards Committee was established to evaluate present awards.

President's report was given by Don Miller. His report centered around the results of the baseball survey. The survey indicated that the coaches wanted a change; The Principals were lukewarm to any change; and the athletic directors were against a change. Discussion centered around where the Association should go from here. A motion was made by Zahn and seconded by Watson to have Don Miller, Jim Kloewer, Jim Mahoney, and Lanny Peterson draft a position paper for the Association and send to the Board of Directors for their approval. Upon approval, it will be sent to the Iowa High School Athletic Association. Motion approved.

Communications report was given by Pinky Primrose. Charter Oak-Ute would like to transfer to the Northwest District, from the Southwest, because most of the teams they play are in the Northwest District. Motion was made by Kloewer and seconded by Prange to allow the transfer. Motion carried. We have received many thank yous from those selected for Hall of Fame and those involved in the All Star Series.

NEW BUSINESS--A moition was made by Zahn and seconded by Nelson to approve budget. No discussion. Motion passed.

A motion was made by Meister and seconded by Nyhus to increase the players sponsor fee for the All Star Series to \$ 100.00. No discussion. Motion passed.

It was moved by Zahn and seconded by Collison to adjourn. No discussion. Motion passed.

Meeting adjourned at 9:00 P.M.

#### BOARD OF DIRECTORS ANNUAL MEETING

President Don Miller called the meeting to order at \*11:00 AM.

The officers and Board of Directors were introduced.

The minutes of the March 12, 1987 meeting were read by Andy McGaffin.

The Executive Secretary's report was given by Pinky Primrose. Financially, the Association's records are in order, with a little profit shown at the end of the year. A clinic update was given. Sponsors' fees for the All-Star game have been raised to \$100.00 per player, to cover expenses.

The All District Committee Report was given by Ken James. The ballot will be used as a nomination form for the selection of the All District first team. A player must have at least been named on two ballots in order to be nominated for first team. This is only for first team. Nominations will be taken from the floor for first team, only if there are not enough ballots sent in. Floor nominations will be used for second team. Each school has only one vote. Ballots must be received by the person in charge at least one day before the meeting. All umpires that are mentioned should be sent to Father Collison. A motion was made by Watson and seconded by Heald to accept the proposal. No discussion. Motion carried.

The All-Star Committee report was given by Pinky Primrose. Everything is on schedule. The games will be held at Memorial Stadium in Cedar Rapids. Kennedy, Linn-Mar, and Marion have agreed to serve as host schools. A Thursday night pizza party with the Reds ball team has been planned.

The Awards Committee Report was given by Andy McGaffin. There was a consensus of the members of that committee that they were satisfied with the awards being given. However, it was felt that we should look into the possibility of recognizing assistant coaches from each district and athletic directors. This might be done the same way All District Coaches are selected.

The Umpire Committee Report was given by Father Collison. In an effort to increase membership within its ranks of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association, the Umpires Committee proposes a new award, the Association Umpire's Newcomer of the Year Award. The new award would be given to umpires who join the Association in the previous clinic year, who have gotten a mention for nomination for District Umpire of the Year. This award would be given in certificate form only, and no trophy, ring, or anything of this nature would be given. Presentation of this award would be made at the clinic banquet. of the winners would be made at the Committee meeting held in conjunction owth the All-Star Series each year. A moition was made by Curtis and seconded by Taylor to accept the proposal. No discussion. Motion carried.

The Vince Meyer and Academic All State Team report was given by Dave Welter. When filling out the nomination form, the coaches have been asked to be more specific. The selection committee will meet on July 26th to decide on 2D players. The nominees will be narrowed down to five finalists that will be interviewed at the All Star game. Those nominated will be honorable mention.

The Steering Committee report was given by Jim Mahoney. The Committee nominated John Zahn to fill the office of Secretary. It was moved by James and seconded by Collison to accept Zahn as Secretary. No discussion. Motion carried.

The All-State Rating Poll Committee report was given by Bob Watson. The 3 district reps and one at-large person will help in the rating.

The Membership Committee report was given by Lanny Peterson. The 2 year district reps are to work with him on membership.

The Constitution Committee report was given by Eugene Meister. No changes.

The All-State Coach Committee report was given by Curt Nelson. The committee recommended that the Association selected a 4A Coach of the Year, 3A Coach of the Year, and 1A-2A Coach of the Year. When the membership of the coaches in 1A-2A reaches 50%, then a 1A coach and a 2A Coach of the Year would be selected. The motion was made by Antisdel and seconded by Paulsen to accept the recommendation. Some discussion. Motion carried.

It was moved by Watson and seconded by Collison to adjourn. No discussion.


Motion carried.

President Kloewer thanked Don Miller for serving and giving his time to the Association. A round of applause followed.


