KEVIN BURNS--FOURTH RECIPIENT OF THE VINCE MEYER AWARD: The fourth recipient of the Vince Meyer Award was Kevin Burns, Muscatine. This award is given in honor of long-time baseball coach at Bancroft St. John's, and is given to a player selected from the list of players who were nominated for the academic all-state team. This award is announced at the Recognition Banquet to the player who exhibits the high academic and athletic standards which Coach Meyer exemplified during his career as a coach and teacher.

A little bit about Kevin: He had an ACT score of 31; he ranked 13/358 in his graduating class. Kevin had a SAT score of 1250, with a GPA of 3.875. He was All-Conference in 1987, All-District 1986 and 87 and All-State in 1987. Other honors for Kevin were: President of F.C.A., member of Student Council and a member of the Baseball, Basketball and Golf teams at Muscatine High School. He hit .433 his Senior year with 6 HR and 45 RBI's. Kevin had a 2 and 0 record pitching in 3 games.

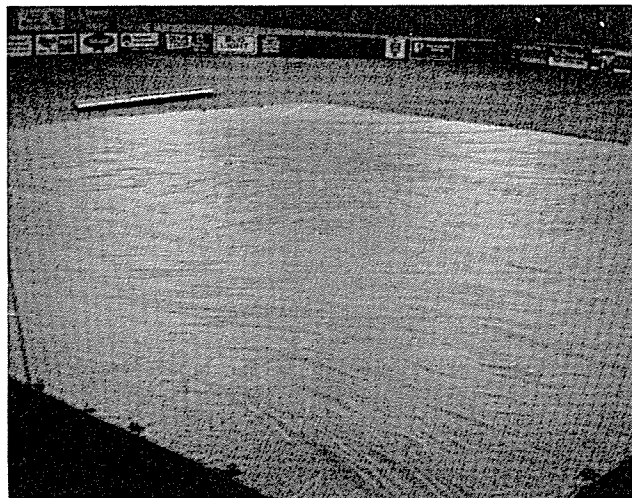

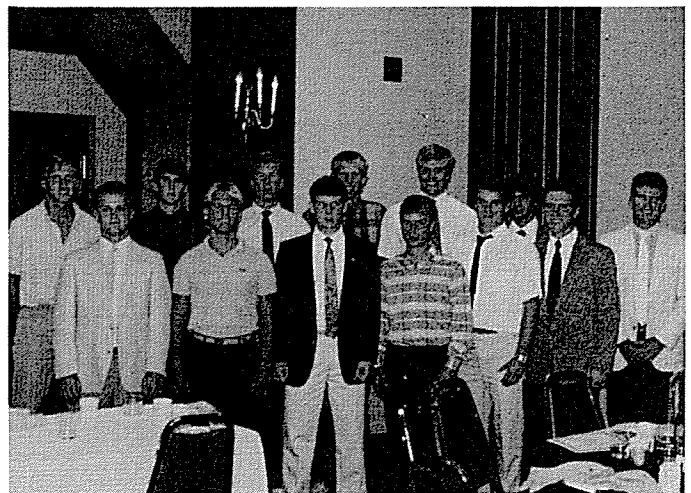
BASEBALL. A great deal of time was spent discussing the baseball program. Concern was expressed with regard to the baseball coaches not being in uniform while coaching in the coach's box. The wearing of shorts, leisure uniforms, etc., which does not comply with the rule that the coaches shall be in proper uniform. The Secretary was instructed to inform the coaches that the rule will be followed.

It was noted we have had an increase in coaches being ejected from games. In the discussion it was noted that perhaps a solution to the problem would be: (a) The first time a coach was ejected, his school would be fined \$50 and placed on probation. (b) The second time, the school would forfeit their rights to play in the summer tournament. The school would be placed on suspension until the school could convince the Board of Control that the situation had been corrected before being allowed to play any more contests.

Some coaches expressed their displeasure with the school administrators giving them the length of season they currently have. It was discussed that maybe there should be two types of baseball programs. One where the school could start baseball early, play as many games as they desire, and have one class. They could not play in any tournament with more than four teams in the tournament; not have more than one tournament a week and no more than two games per day. At the conclusion of their season they would have their State Championship. The remainder of the schools would be divided into classes and they would have their baseball programs as currently played which is reflected by the vote of three separate surveys, two by the Association and one by the baseball coaches. It was also noted the season could be extended one week if only the teams that have winning regular season records enter the Baseball Tournament Series. This generated a great deal of discussion. The Board desired the Baseball Coaches Advisory Committee have this information to discuss with those who would like to play one week longer. This might satisfy some of their desires.

KIMBALL'S CORNER

(Shawn Kimball is presently umpiring in the Class AAA International League. His umpiring career of eight years has seen him working the Gulf Coast, South Atlantic, Midwest, and Texas Leagues before his recent promotion to AAA, just one step below the Major Leagues. Raised in Augusta, Maine, Shawn now lives in North Liberty, Iowa and worked with the umpires in the 1984, 1985, and 1986 Coaches Association Clinics.)

Hello everybody! I trust that you all had a good baseball season. My first year in the International League was very enjoyable. Baseball itself seemed to be the same but the caliber of play in "Triple A" was better than I expected. It was fun working games with several Major League players (past, present, and future) participating. Every season is full of possible learning experiences and I hope we all took time to analyze our actions for future reference. We can always learn more about ourselves, those we work with, and the game of baseball itself.

How did you coaches deal with your umpires this year? I hope that there were no violent situations. In an attempt to improve coach-umpire relations, I will present a few opinions. First of all, umpires are generally doing the best they can and arguments from coaches do not improve the quality of umpiring. Granted you will have games with less knowledgeable and less experienced umpires but further confusing, embarrassing, and humiliating these people will usually result in more debatable decisions. Often times fine prospective umpires leave the avocation entirely. As a coach you may know how to help an umpire but more often than not your advice during a game will not be graciously received. I believe that we can make the most of ourselves by looking back over games and being extra hard on ourselves instead of blaming or resenting others. Let's all work together and maintain an open line of communication.

In my first article I stressed to the umpires the importance of looking the part. An explanation of the most basic mechanics of umpiring ought to help. All calls must be made from a "set position"---never moving! There are two ways to be in a set position--hands on the knees or standing set. In both of these the feet are shoulder-width apart or wider with one foot slightly forward of the other. Be stable and well balanced ready to move in any direction. Shoulders should be squared off to the play and eyes fixed on the action. See the entire play and make sure the ball is held securely before making any decision. It is your choice whether

you wish to put your hands on your knees or stay upright with arms at your sides and knees slightly flexed. If you have any tendency to move during plays, I recommend the "hands-on-knees" position. Many umpires will find this set position will prevent anticipation and the calling of plays too quickly. The standing set is always used for calls not occurring at a base.

The basic mechanics of out and safe calls can be followed closely or used as a means to developing your own style. Remember all calls start from a set position. When calling an out, the right hand extends out (as if to shake hands) and continues upward to a right angle then closing and snapping a fist slightly forward of the body. You should be straight up with your weight moving aggressively forward. Coordinate your voice--"he's Out!" --with the closing of your fist. The safe call must be just as aggressive which can be difficult. From the set position, rise up and step into the play (one step only) with either foot and fully extend arms out to both sides yelling "Safe!" with the extension of arms. Don't look like a bird ready to fly away. To sell this call more, you may repeat it a second time without taking an additional step.

Fair and foul balls should be called from a standing set straddling the foul line. When you judge a ball fair, step in with the foot in fair territory and point in perpendicular to the foul line. Your wrist should be slightly above the elbow. No voice with this mechanic! In calling a ball foul, fully extend both arms with hands open overhead yelling "Foul!", then step out pointing opposite of the fair ball call. Repeating the step and pointing motion helps sell these calls. When judging a ball to be caught or not, the out mechanic should be used for a catch and the safe mechanic for a no-catch but this time yelling "No Catch". It is possible for three or more plays requiring calls to happen so quickly that they are all over before a single decision is rendered. Your first priority is fair-foul, second is catch-no catch, then comes force plays, tag plays, and live balls going into dead ball areas. Any other order can confuse and put one or both teams at a disadvantage.

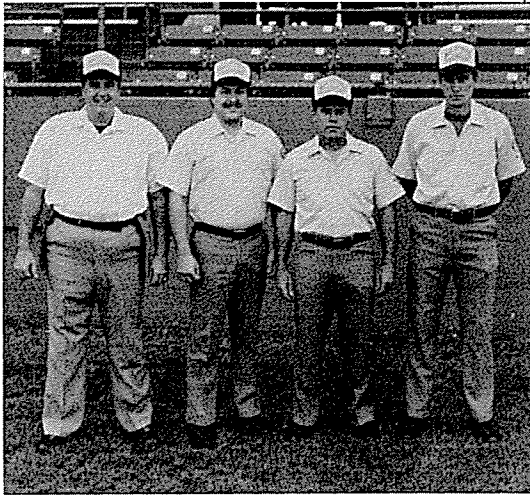
In my next article I will address the suggested ways to cover various play situations when working a two-man system with no runners on base. Also umpire jurisdictions on fair-foul balls, base touching, and catch-no catch situations will be included. Double calls are always embarrassing especially when the calls are different. 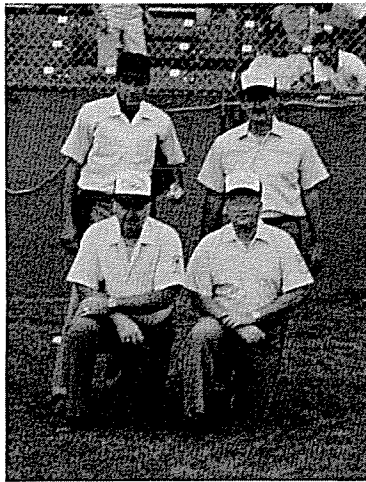

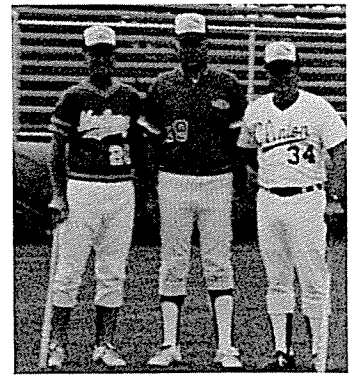

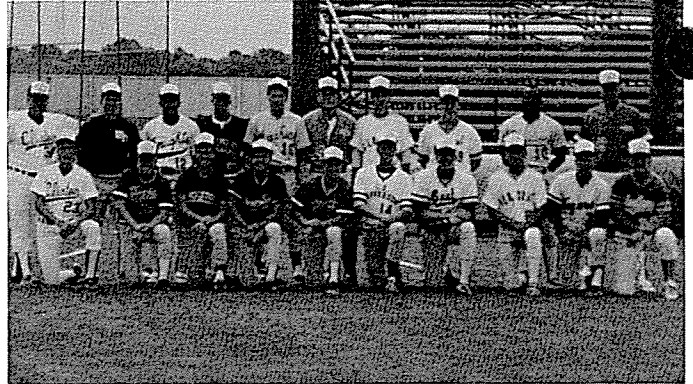
