CLINIC MARCH 10-11-12: The 20th Annual Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association Clinic is rapidly approaching. We hope you are making your plans to attend and bring the team along, the assistant coach, softball coach, an umpire, and your wife. Enclosed you will find a tentative clinic line-up of the speakers, topics, times, etc. Show it to your A.D., Principal, and Superintendent, and make sure you get the day off to attend the weekend of baseball. They might want to come along! We will be having three clinics going on at once, one for umpires, one for softball coaches, and one for the baseball coaches. You can go to any of the sessions. Come join us March 10-11-12, 1988.

BANQUET TICKETS-MEALS: Enclosed you will find a card to return so we can make a reservation for you for the Friday night Awards Banquet, Saturday's McDonalds F.C.A. breakfast, and the Saturday noon lunch. Fill it out and mail it back with your check covering your clinic fees. Admission to the Clinic will be \$25.00 for members. It will include all your meals and the opportunity to hear many top-notch clinic speakers. If you are not a current member of the association, it will cost you \$40.00 in advance for the clinic. CLINIC SPEAKERS

RICK MATHEWS: Former coach at Eddyville, Marshalltown, Iowa Western Comm. College and then on to the Kansas City Royals as a field manager in their minor league system and then on to the front office as assistant farm director. Rick has distinguished himself and was an excellent field manager. He has many clinics for young pitchers and catchers throughout the state. Presently he is coaching at Indian Hills Community college and the Kansas City Royals short season rookie club in the summer.

BILL OLSON: is entering his 28th year of coaching, 18 at Northwest High in Omaha. Bill was named the National Coach of the Year in 1984 by the ABCA. In 1983, his team was proclaimed the Mythical National Champion by Easton Bat Company. Bill's teams are some of the best in the Nation. His over-all record is over 800 wins and less than 400 losses. He has spoken at many clinics throughout the Midwest. Bill also returns by popular request.

BOB SYMONDS: Triton College: Bob has established a diamond dynasty at Triton College in River Grove, Ill. In 18 years of Triton, Symonds has taken the Trojans to 15 straight conference championships, nine state titles and five trips to the NJCAA World Series in the past 10 years. During that time he has compiled a record of 647-180, averaging over 38 wins a year. His conference has honored him six times as the Coach of the Year and Triton has only been in the NAC for 13 years. Symonds' has the pro's coming every year, 72 of his players have been drafted and over 100 of his players have gone on to four years schools. He's developed 13 All-Americans, including two on his 1985 squad that went 58-8 and finished fourth in the JUCO World Series. Bob was raised at Cumberland, Iowa, and went to College at Wayne State.

LARRY BITTNER: Larry Bittner played High School Baseball at Pocahontas Catholic, graduating in 1964, attending Buena Vista College, playing for Jay Beekmann, graduating in 1968. Larry was drafted out of college by the Washington Senators, he played 2 years in the minors before going up to Washington. He spent 12 years in the Major Leagues, playing for the Senators, Rangers, Expos, Cubs, Reds and finished his career in 1983 back with the Rangers. His best year was in 1976 with the Expos, hitting .298. Larry's life time average was .273, with 310 runs, 861 hits, 144 doubles, playing in 1,217 games. His fielding average was .986, playing first base and the outfield. He presently lives in Chicago, working at the Commodities Trade Market, buying and selling.

RICK FOLKERS: Rick Folkers had an outstanding baseball career that culminated in a professional career that spanned 13 years, 6 in the minors and 7 in the majors. He helped his American Legion team (Waterloo, Ia.) to 2 State titles, 2 Regional appearances, and one Legion World Series appearance. He received 2 State MVP awards and one Regional MVP award from the Legion. He also led the Waterloo Merchants to 2 State titles, 1 Regional appearance, and 1 National tournament. In 1966 his Ellsworth J.C. team won the State, Regional, and a 3rd place in the JUCO World Series. He held three records in the tournament: most wins (3) ERA (0.00), and strikeouts (38). At Parsons College in 1967, he was 10-0, pitched two no-hitters, and led the nation in strikeout average with 18 per game. In 1967 he signed with the New York Mets. His A team won the Class A championship that year. In 1968 he made the Texas League All-Star team. He reached the Majors in 1970 with the Mets. In a major league career that spanned 7 years, he pitched with the Mets, St. Louis, San Diego, and the Milwaukee Brewers. He was both a starter and reliever. Best year was with the St. Louis Cards in 1974 when he appeared in 55 games (all in relief) and was 6-2 with 2 saves. He presently lives in Florida, where he runs his own business.

DICK BIRMINGHAM: is a veteran of over 30 years of player development placing over 100 players in college and professional baseball. As head coach at Hillcrest High School in Springfield, Mo., and former Head of Instruction at Mickey Owen, he is a nationally known clinician having spoken in 15 states plus Canada. He was voted High School Coach of Year in 1979 and was the Head Coach of the North Team at the 1983 Sports Festival. Dick is a frequent speaker at our clinic. He comes back by popular request.

1987-88 COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENTS:

RON KLEIN: New Trier High School, Winnetka, Ill. has been coaching for 28 years winning over 700 games. His teams have won the State Championship in 1966-68 and 1974, and many District and Regional tournaments. Ron is a charter member of the Illinois Baseball Coaches Association. Ron has been District 4 chairman for 13 years. Past President of the Ill. coaches Association. He went into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1988-- The third high school coach to enter this Hall of Fame. He has been very active in the ABCA organization. Ron was named the National High School Coach of Year in 1977. He has sent many players on to professional baseball and numerous to colleges with scholarships. He received the Illinois Man of Year Award, the highest award from the Ill. High School Baseball Coaches Association.

PINKY PRIMROSE: Washington High School and Coe College, has been coaching for 33 years winning over 700 games. The 1986 season was his last as a high school coach. He coached at Lisbon, Norway, and C.R. Washington. He has been at Washington for 23 years as the head coach. Pinky was named High School Coach of the Year in 1980 at the State and National Level and in 1987 in San Diego he was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. He entered the IHSBCA Hall of Fame in 1972. He is a charter member of the Association and a past president and has been the Executive Secretary of the Association since its beginning.

MIKE REILLY: Battle Creek, Mich., 11 years veteran umpire of the American League. A native of Lincoln, Neb., Mike has worked in the All-Star game as well as the American League Championship Series. ***His appearance is tentative to his Spring Training assignment***

COMMITTEE MEMBERS: We would like for each committee member to check when his committee meeting will be held. It is important for the Chairman to take roll at this committee. QUESTIONS ANSWERED: Several letters have been received about the selection of the All-District Teams and the All-State Selections: I will attempt to answer these questions in this newsletter:

Questions from one letter: I find it hard to believe that not one player from the 3A State Championship team was on one of those All-State teams! To my way of thinking, it's incredible that a team who shut-out both opponents at the state level games, had five all-tournament players, but yet does not merit a single player's appointment on any of the All-State Teams.

Answer: The All-State selection committee is composed of 26 people--coaches, umpires, and college coaches from every section in the state. Many of them witness players from all over the state, in tournament play, conference play, all-star practices and yes the state tournament. A player had to get a minimum of 14 votes from the committee in order to make a team. Coaches from every section of the state nominated the best players in their district and defended them and gave some background on all who were nominated. It was a very difficult and long day picking the best in Iowa. But it is the fairest way of any way devised. No one tries to cheat anyone out of his recognition.

Question # 2: A tie vote came about on an All-District Team. A certificate was presented to one of the players, but his name was left off the Press-release of all the newspapers. Who removed his name from the list?...Several schools that our team plays did not attend the same district meeting, so therefore, they couldn't vote. Then a few coaches didn't show up that could have voted because they didn't feel they had anyone to put up.

Another real mystery is how the All-Star Players are selected. I'm sure that "word of mouth" about particular players can be used in a limited way, but certainly stats show the whole picture. So often the kids chosen do not play the position they've played through-out the regular season, so picking kids because of positions really has very little to do with selection except with pitchers and catchers. Also, how do two players from one school make the All-Star team and another school only has one but the stats of the player who didn't make it are better. In other words, are the very best players getting chosen?

Answer: The rules established say: Only 14 positions shall be chosen at the All-District Meeting. In case of tie, vote until the tie is broken. This was not followed by the District chairman in this case. However, as in the past situations, the names that fill the position blanks on the form sent out, will be the ones used in the press release. Only the first name list can be used since there are only 14 positions.

It is true some conferences play teams from another district. However, it does not stop the coaches from voting for any player from another district if he feels they deserve recognition. These ballots are photo copied and passed on to the District the players plays in. If any player gets a lot of nominations, he will get his recognition.

The coaches Association can not legislate that a coach must attend these meetings. It is wise that a coach does attend if he wants his players or conference to get the recognition due. This has been a problem and always will be a problem. Some coaches really don't care!

The All-Star coaches pick the All-Star teams from the nominations that the coaches send in from around the state. The first priority of selection is the nomination form sent in by the head coach. If a coach only nominates one player, only one player can be selected from that school. No school can have more than 2 players on the All-Star team. It is entirely up to the All-Star Coaches who they pick to represent their team on the field.

I agree, it very important that coaches attend the All-District meetings and attend the Clinic Convention. If they show interest in the Association, the Association can continue to have the Clinic, All-Star Series, All-District Teams, All-State Teams, recognition for Coaches, players, fans, and umpires, Hall of Fame and many other positive things.

THREE HALL OF FAMERS DIE: The Association is deeply saddened by the deaths of three of our Hall of Famers. Bob Bowers, Center Point; Cap Timm, Iowa State University; and Marv Thelen, Remsen St. Mary's.

Bob Bowers entered the Hall of Fame in 1975 after having many successful seasons at Center Point High School.

Cap Timm, the man behind the Coaches Association, entered the Hall of Fame in 1970, after having many successful years at Iowa State. He coached many of our present day members who played ball for Cap and others who went to many of his clinics.

Marv Thelen, Past President, and Coach of the Year, entered the Hall of Fame in 1975, after many successful seasons at Remsen St. Mary's. Marv died a sudden death after hitting a train in Northwest Iowa.

We all will miss these great baseball men, for all the work they have done for Iowa High School baseball.

God bless them and thank God for them!

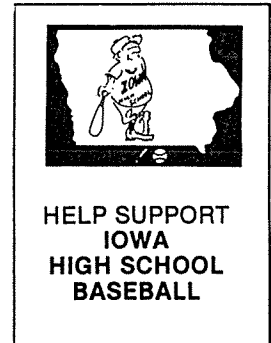

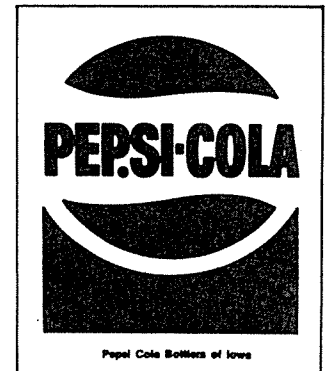
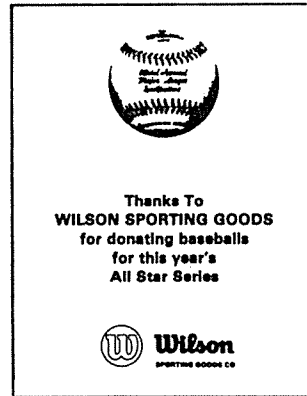

Five new members will be inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association at its annual clinic and banquet in Cedar Rapids March 11, 1988.

New inductees to be honored at the IHSBCA Twentieth Annual Clinic Banquet are Jack Anderson, umpire from Grand Junction, Iowa; Larry Biittner, player from Pocahontas, Iowa; Richard Folkers, player from Waterloo, Iowa; Terry Heald, coach from Marion, Iowa; and George Long, contributor from Muscatine, Iowa.

The five names bring to 106 the number of Hall of Fame members. The honor roll now includes 67 coaches, 17 players, 15 umpires, and 7 contributors.

JACK ANDERSON---has been an umpire for 30 years. He has worked over 55 games a year plus the state tournament series for 18 consecutive years. Jack started umpiring in college, going from college to Menlo, East Greene, Marble Rock, becoming principal at Jefferson and Superintendent at Stuart-Menlo and East Green of Grand Junction. Jack has a certified classification. He has worked in five All-Star series. Nominated for District umpire of the year 7 times. He presently is the Superintendent of Schools at Grand Junction.

LARRY BIITNER---played High School baseball at Pocahontas Catholic, graduating in 1964, attended Buena Vista College playing for Jay Beekmann, graduating in 1968. Larry was drafted out of college by the Washington Senators. He played 2 years in the minors before going up to Washington. At Parsons College in 1967, he was 10-0, pitched two no-hitters, and led the nation in strikeout average with 18 per game. He reached the Majors in 1970 with the Mets. In a major league career that spanned 7 years, he pitched with the Mets, St. Louis, San Diego, and Milwaukee. He was both a starter and reliever. Best year was with St. Louis in 1974 when he appeared in 55 games (all in relief) and was 6-2 with 2 saves.

TERRY HEALD---Graduated from Franklin High School, Cedar Rapids in 1957 and Coe College in Cedar Rapids in 1962. Terry played semi-pro ball in the old M & J league in Cedar Rapids. Terry started his coaching career at MFL of Monona, where he stayed for 16 years. Edgewood-Colesburg for 1 year and at Marion for 8 years. He coached baseball, football, basketball, golf on the high school level and football, track, wrestling on the junior high level. Overall baseball record of 460 wins and 207 losses winning 15 conference championships and has been to the state tournament 3 times, winning the Class A State Championship in 1976 and finished third in 1977. Coached in the first All-Star series in 1977 and the 1983 series with a 6-0 record. Served on many association committees, was a director and served as president in 1981.


GEORGE LONG---A native of Buffalo, N.Y., George has spent more than 76 years since he picked up his first baseball, but you can still find him out along third base on a hot summer night, swatting mosquitos and sending runners into home plate. George Long holds perhaps the world's record for managing a semi-pro baseball team, logging an unforgettable 57 years with the Muscatine Red Sox. His longevity earned him an award from the United States Baseball Federation, plus many other honors, such as Certificate of Merit from the State of Iowa. Today, George is known from small towns to major league stadiums for both his showmanship and businesslike methods. During the winters he promotes exhibition basketball games and professional wrestling matches. George and his wife Ella still live in Muscatine and they have two sons, George Jr., who is Athletic Director at Urbandale and Tom, a businessman in Atlanta, Ga.

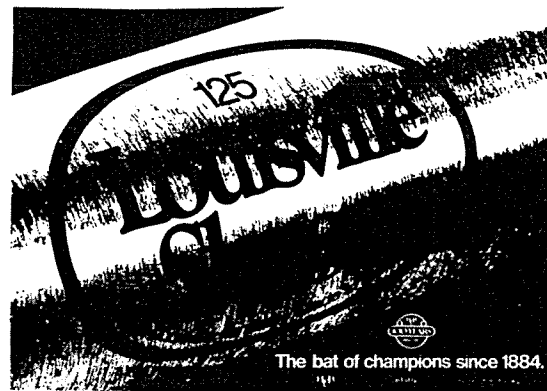

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
I.H.S.B.C.A.
Carver Arena, Iowa City
October 31, 1987

President Jim Kloewer called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM.

All present introduced themselves.

It was moved by Lenny Weih and seconded by Ken James to approve the minutes of the previous meeting. Motion carried.

Financial Report: Pinky Primrose indicated that there is a check balance of \$2852.27 and an interest bearing balance of \$4541.37 for the fiscal year which began on April 1, 1987. There were no questions. Moved by Bob Watson and seconded by Dick Core to accept. Motion carried.

President's Comments: 1. A big thank you for those responsible for the success of the All-Star Series. 2. Many parents felt that the coaches deserve a pat on the back for the treatment that their player-sons received at the All-Star Series. 3. Some coaches desire an earlier start for the high school season as well as a longer season or a separate tournament.

Executive Secretary Report: 1. The IHSAA is beginning to entertain thoughts of a spring season. See the minutes from the state association on page 3 of the September-October Newsletter.

2. Pinky apologized that Kevin Burns' name had inadvertently been left off of the All-America Team. Any coach who has a candidate for this team, do not be afraid to push the player. If you do not know how, contact Pinky for advice.

3. There are still some unreported conference champions.

4. Coaches of All District players will be getting a letter for their kids.

5. All State Certificates and Academic All State Certificates are being made available.

6. The All Star Series was very successful, once again. However, if the players bills are not paid, Pinky recommends that the players from any school involved not be allowed to participate in any future series until said bill is paid.

7. Jim Mahoney suggested that the high school coaches who are presenting miniclinics not be scheduled opposite the good head-liners as a means of increasing attendance. Should we do away with the last session of the mini-clinics? Start with an earlier one?

8. The American Association clinic in Atlanta, Georgia is recommended.

9. It was suggested that we have district contributors of the year as well as state contributors.

10. It was suggested that those people who regularly miss board or committee meetings be dropped from said board or committee.

11. The Rodeway Inn was recommended for lodging for the teams at the next All-Star Series because it costs less.

12. A question as to what should be done about players who are selected for the All Star Series and either do not show or leave early. A suggestion was made to get a prior commitment from the player before selection.

13. Is it advisable to combine both western districts for selection of coach of the year and all-district players in 3A-4A?

Hall of Fame Report: Only one nominee was submitted to Pinky by mail, although there are some 5-year carry-overs.

All-Star Report: none at this time.

Umpires Report: Gary Paulsen reported that four Newcomer of the Year Awards were given for the year. It was moved by Gary Paulsen and seconded by Don Miller that Jack Anderson be nominated for the Hall of Fame.

Vince Meyer Award: Lanny Peterson reported that nominations for the All-Academic Team had been received with Kevin Burns from Muscatine being selected for the Meyer award. Lanny felt that this number of nominees was not an overly abundant number, but coaches should be careful to make good nominations, which, thus far, has been the case. Only the first teamers are invited to the banquet.

Steering Committee: no report

Advisory Board: Jim Mahoney outlined Bernie Saggau's possible proposals for changing Iowa baseball; 1. Play like spring ball wa played before, with a limited number of dates; 2. Create a seeding procedure to be initiated in mid-season with only the winning teams to be eligible for play-offs; 3. Create a special class of teams who wish to start early and have no limit on the number of games.

In order to expose more coaches to the association, promote the organization, attempt to increase membership, involve association members in presenting clinics, and attempt to entice more coaches to attend the March clinic, it was recommended by Andy McGaffin that the association help sponsor a mini clinic in Northwest Iowa. Gene Meister moved that \$100 financial support be given. Seconded by Vic Belger and passed. The mini clinic is to be at Spencer on February 6, 1988.

Media Nominees: Radio and T.V.-Pete Seyfer moved by Lenny Weih and seconded by Ken James. Carried. Print-Bob Brown moved by Terry Heald and seconded by Brad Clement. Carried.

Contributor Award: Bill and Sherry Freese moved by Lenny Weih and seconded by Ken James. Carried.

President's Award: Duane Banks moved by Bill Freese and seconded by Gary Paulsen. Carried.

Four Year College Coach: John Sirianni and Duane Banks moved by Ken James and seconded by Bob Watson. Carried.

After discussion, it was decided that the site of the future All Star Series will be chosen at the March meeting.

It was moved by Vic Belger that the association write a letter to IHSAA in support of separate game limitations for players as opposed to teams. He felt that players should be allowed to play more than the twenty games limited to teams. Seconded by Brad Clement and passed. Jim Mahoney with Jim Kloewer volunteered to see Bernie Saggau about this and other matters.

Upon Marv Thelen's sudden death, Pinky, representing the association, called Marv's sister. Fr. Criag Collison represented the association at the funeral. Flowers were sent. Given that Marv's contribution to baseball, kids, and the association was considerable, the Awards Committee was asked to investigate what association might do by way of honoring him. minute of silence was observed.

Meeting adjourned at 10:49 A.M. by President Jim Kloewer.

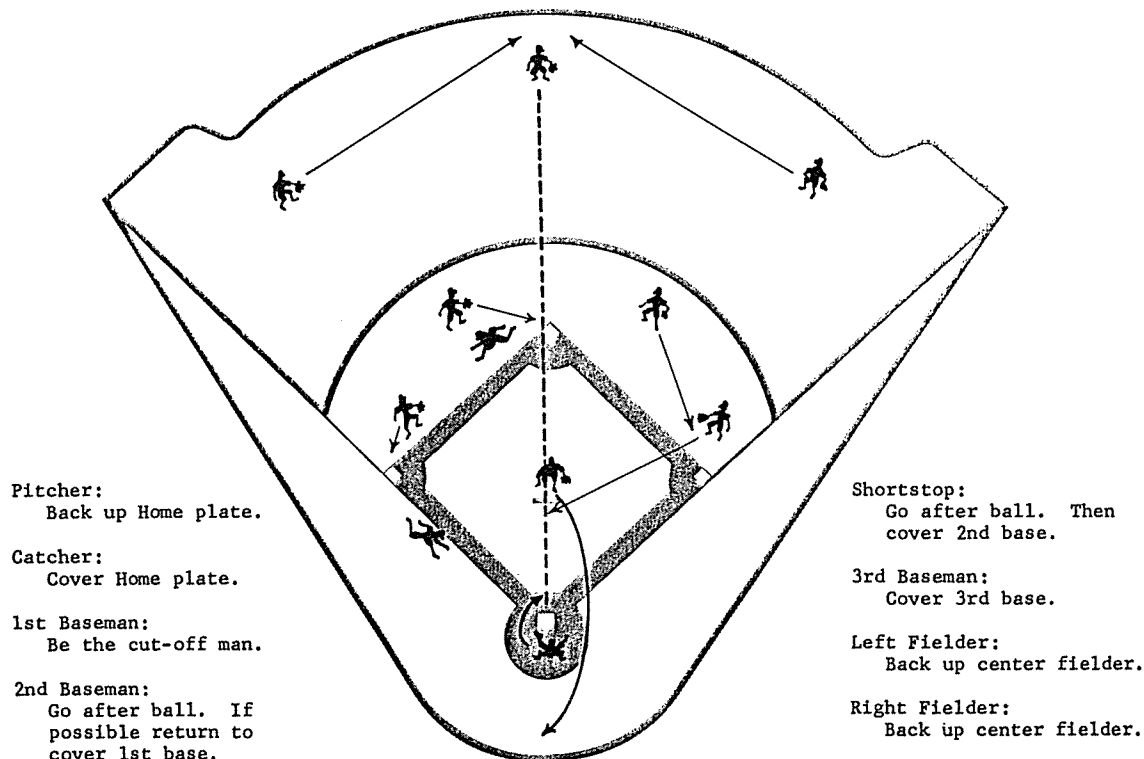
Other Award winners are: Bill and Sherry Freese of Davenport, for their contribution to the All-Star Series.

During the Awards banquet the Coaches of the Year and Umpire of the Year, Hall of Fame honors, as well as District Coaches and District Umpires Awards will be announced.

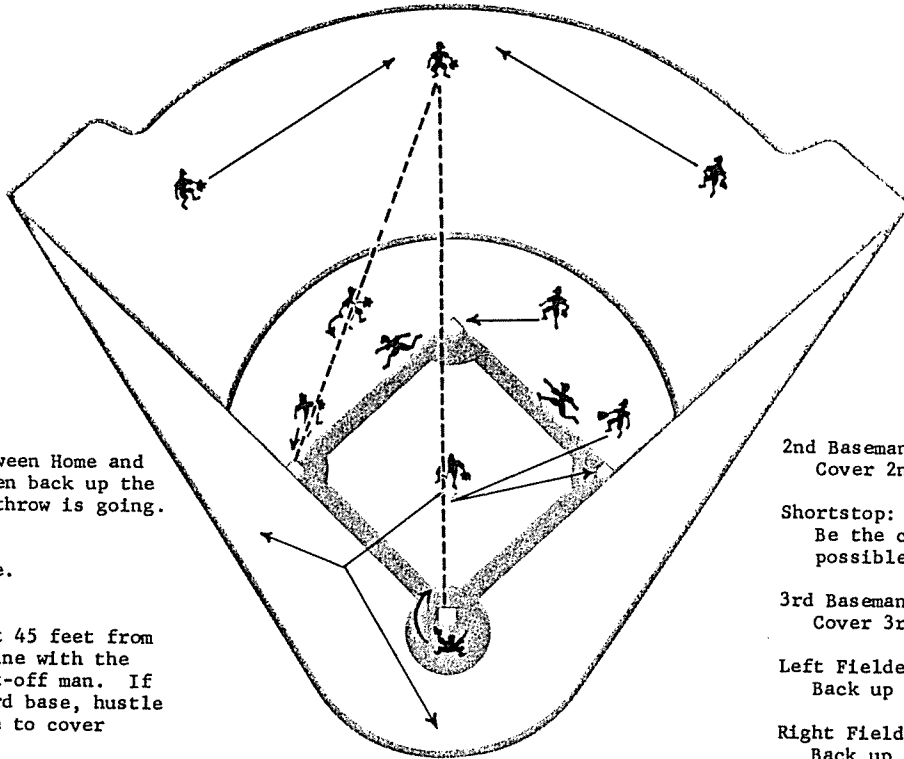

Pitcher:
Go half way between Home and 3rd base and then back up the base where the throw is going.

Catcher:
Cover Home plate.

1st Baseman:
Move into a spot 45 feet from Home plate in line with the throw, to be cut-off man. If throw goes to 3rd base, hustle back to 1st base to cover that bag.

2nd Baseman:
Cover 2nd base.

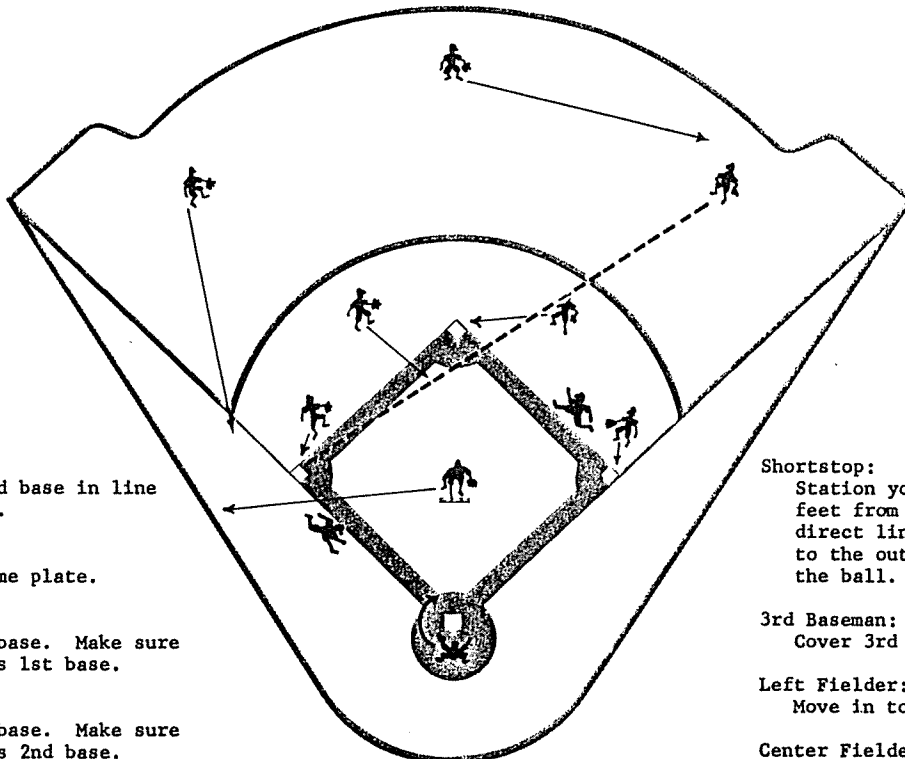
Shortstop:
Be the cut-off man for a possible throw to 3rd base.

3rd Baseman:
Cover 3rd base.

Left Fielder:
Back up center fielder.

Right Fielder:
Back up center fielder.

Single to Right Field

Pitcher:
Back up 3rd base in line with throw.

Catcher:
Protect Home plate.
