BILL HUISMAN: Centerville baseball coach, the 3A State Champs. Bill has been coaching for 12 years with an over-all record of 284-119. His 1988 team record was 32-7, winning the State Championship and the South Central Conference. Bill played his college ball at Kansas State Univ., being named "All Big Eight" second baseman. He signed with the Cubs in 1970, playing 8 years in professional baseball. Bill played with San Antonio and the Midland Cubs. He had over 600 hits in the Texas League, being named MVP in 1974 of the Texan League. Played in the 1974 Texas League All-Stars. He has coached 10 conference championships out of the last 12 years.

SOFTBALL CLINIC SPEAKERS:

Four new members will be inducted into the Hall of Fame of the lowa High School Baseball Coaches Association at its annual clinic and awards banquet in Cedar Rapids March 10, 1989.

New inductees to be honored at the IHSBCA Twenty-First Annual Clinic Banquet are **Bob Locker**, **Slater** (Coach/Player); **Jim McAndrew**, Lost Nation (Player); **Larry Peterson**, Sioux Rapids (Umpire); and **Jim Van Scoyoc**, Norway (Coach). The four names bring to 105 the number of Hall of Fame members. The honor roll now includes 69 coaches, 18 players, 16 umpires, and 2 contributors.

BOB LOCKER: Bob Locker graduated from Slater High School in 1954, playing on the high school and legion teams as a catcher for four years. He played on the State Legion Tournament team in 1954, and the State Basketball Tournament in 1954. He graduated from ISU after playing three years for Coach Cap Timm. His senior year he captained the team. Bob played and managed semi-pro ball in Slater for 22 years, when his semi-pro teams won nine state semi-pro champion-ships. He coached at Radcliffe for 8 years and Des Moines Lincoln for 14 years. His overall record was 371 wins and 176 losses. His team finished fourth in the 1976 State Tournament. He coached in the first state All-Star Series. Bob has of-ficiated football and basketball for 19 years. Presently he is teaching a Lincoln High School in Des Moines.

JIM McANDREWS: Jim McAndrews graduated from Lost Nation High School, competed in baseball and basketball there, went on to the University of Iowa on scholarship. At the University he played for Dick Schultz and basketball for Sharm Scheuerman before graduating in 1965. He signed with the Mets and played minor league baseball in Auburn, N.Y. (A), Williamsport, Pa. (AA), and Jacksonville, Fla. (AAA). He joined the Mets in 1968. Played in New york until 1973. In December of '73, Jim was traded to the Padres. He reinjured his knee during spring training of 1974, had surgery at the end of the '74 season. In the majors, Jim was in 161 games, winning 37, lost 53, with his best season in 1972 with 11-8 record. Presently Jim works in Carbondale, Ill. He has three sons and one daughter. Jim's first two sons play for Florida State baseball team.

LARRY PETERSON: Larry Peterson graduated from Rembrandt High School, started his umpiring career in 1956, working Little League on up. He worked the lowa Conference and many N.A.I.A. Playoffs. He worked in the first All-Star Series and also worked the state tournament 14 consecutive years. He has presented state rules meeting for the I.H.S.A.A.. He has been District Umpire of the Year several times in North west Iowa.

JIM VAN SCOYOC: Jim Van Scoyoc graduated from HLV High School in Victor in 1961 and then attended William Penn College in 1965. In high school he was a four year letter winner in baseball and basketball, and earned All-Conference honors three years in baseball. At William Penn he earned four letters in baseball; he earned honors as an All-Conference pitcher in 1964; and he holds the school ERA record of 0.90. He played semi-pro ball for 21 years, and pitched and played in the AABC Nationals in 1972 and 1975. He won the AABC National batting title in 1975 with a .455 average. He has been coaching since 1965, assistant and head coach at Amana High School and assistant and head coach at Norway High School. His coaching record includes 784 wins and 234 losses. He has captured eleven conference championships and has taken his team to thirteen state tournaments and has captured ten state championships. He has been District Coach of the year five times and State Coach of the Year three times. In 1983 he was honored as National High School Coach of the Year, and is a member of the William Penn College Hall of Fame.



MEETING MINUTES

SYNOPSIS OF THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL OF THE IOWA HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

SUMMER BASERALL REGULAR SEASON AND STATE TOURNAMENT REPORT/APPROVED CONTINUED USE OF NONMETAL CLEATS. Mr. Hartv reviewed with members the progress of the summer baseball season and the tournament series, sectional, district, susbstate through the state tournament completed July 30, 1988 at Marshalltown. It was pointed out that 16 coach ejections were made during the 1988 summer season, none of which were second offenses. All have been dealt with administratively between the Association, umpires, and member schools. Discussion centered around a national rule change regarding a penalty for unsportsmanlike conduct by the coach that would restrict him to the dugout for the remainder of the game as an alternative to the policy currently enforced by the Association. The new national rule change as an alternative to ejecting a coach, rule 3.3.1, will now allow the umpire to restrict the coach to the dugout for unsportsmanlike conduct. The decision would be at the umpire's discretion and would be based on the severity of the coach's conduct. The intent of the change is to allow games to continue in those situations where the coach's conduct is not blatant. If a coach is ejected and there is not another adult sponsor or assistant coach at the game, it is forfeited. This rule change gives the umpire an option for less severe conduct by a coach, yet keeping in mind the flagrant violations the first offense would involve ejection. Discussion followed. Considerable discussion was generated with regard to another most recent national rule change reinstating the use of metal cleats after a five-year absence on an optional basis. Since 1984, only nonmetal cleats have been allowed at the high school level. It was pointed out that the rule was put in for nonmetal cleats to save severe injuries that take place when youngsters are 'spiked'. It appears to be rather ridiculous to expose our athletes to that type of injury which need not take place. Upon further discussion regarding the use of metal and nonmetal cleats, it was moved by Hoenshel and seconded by Pyle that the Iowa High School Athletic Association will continue with the nonmetal cleats for high school baseball. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Harty then followed-up with a report of the summer tournament series, sectional through State tournament, noting that very few postponements took place due to the dry weather. The State tournament was completed on schedule with excellent attendance. Marshalltown added to an already existing fine facility with a new backstop and a screen awning for the news media covering the tournament games. The 4A championship was won by West Des Moines, Dowling High School; 3A was won by Centerville; 2A was won by Sully, Lynnville-Sully; and 1A was won by Norway.

- 12)A new printer (Laser Jet) was purchased for the low price of \$1,500.00
- 13) There should be No ties on All-District team selections

- 15)The two Vince Meyer recipients were excellent selections
- 16)The ABCA Clinic will be held in Nashville, Tennessee Jan. 4-5-6.
- 17)A never-ending need for Conference reps
- 18) Duane Banks is President Elect for the ABCA--give him your support

As a result of Pinky's report, discussion and motions followed. Also our president, Lanny Peterson, recorded this year's executive secretary's report at one hour and twelve minutes—a new record! It was approved. Fourth, the board responded to the request by lowa State of hosting the 1990 All-Star series at Ames or at Sec Taylor Stadium in Des Moines. Jim Mahoney moved and Andy McGaffin seconded the motion to grant the request. It was approved.

<u>Umpire Committee Report</u>--Terry Curtis: A written report was handed out listing the nominees for district umpires of the year, Hall of Fame nominee and newcomer of the year awards.

<u>Vince Meyer Scholarship Report</u>--Andy McGaffin: Things went well last year with 58 nominees listed.

<u>Awards Committee Report</u>--Lanny Peterson: Ed Feyen has compiled a written list of awards with established criteria and it will appear in the next newsletter.

There was no old business. Under new business the board divided up into their district groups and selected nominees for the various awards to be presented at our March banquet. Jim Mahoney moved and Jim Kloewer seconded the motion that Mid-West Janitorial Service receive the President's Award while Don Bergman and Cliff Brees receive the Contributors Award. It was approved.

With Hayden and the Hawks "waiting in the tunnel for Bo," this year's fall meeting was abruptly adjourned!





Pitcher:

Go half way between 3rd and the plate to see where the throw is coming, and then back up either base.

Catcher:

Cover Home plate.

lst Baseman:
 Be the cut-off man.

2nd Baseman: Become relay man.

3rd Baseman: Cover 3rd base.

Shortstop:

Be trailer relay man, then return and cover 2nd base.

Left Fielder:

Move into area behind 3rd base.

Right Fielder and Center Fielder: Go after ball.

BASEBALL TERMINOLOGY

APPLE: Ball. Also called Pill, Horsehide, Onion, Sphere, Bola.

BALTIMORE CHOP: Topped Ball which bounces near plate and goes very high in air.

BENCH WARMER: Player who rarely gets into a game.

BUSHES: Minor leagues. Also called Sticks.

CHANGE UP: Slow pitch thrown with same motion as fast one. Also called Pulling the String, Let-Up, Change of Pace.

CRIPPLE: Pitch following three-balls, one-strike count on batter

DRAG BUNT: Lightly pushed hit so ball trickles to infielder too slowly for play on batter.

FIELDER'S CHOICE: Throwing to retire a base-runner forced at the next base.

FUNGO: Player throws ball few feet in air and bats it himself.

GOAT: Player whose error or oversight proves costly.

GOPHER BALL: Pitch which is hit for a homer.

GRAND SLAM: Home run with bases loaded.

HIT-AND-RUN: Play in which runner breaks from first, causing either second baseman or shortstop to leave normal position to take throw at second base, followed by batter driving ball through "hole" vacated by fielder.

HOOK: Curve ball. Also applied to right-handed hitter "pulling" or hitting the ball into left field, or vice versa.

JOCKEY: Player who "rides" opposition team with taunts. LEATHER MAN: Good fielder.

ON DECK: Player in circle near plate, waiting to follow current batter.

PASS: Base on balls. Also called walk, Annie Oakley, Stroll, etc.

PAYOFF PITCH: Pitch following three-balls, two-strikes count on the batter.

PICKOFF: Catch runner off base by sudden throw from pitcher of catcher.

PITCHOUT: Wide pitch to foil bunt or to enable catcher to throw out runner attempting to steal.

PORTSIDER: Lefthander pitcher. Also called Southpaw.

PULL A ROCK: Make a stupid play.

ROLLER: Slow ground ball which trickles toward infielder.
RUN-AND-HIT: Play in which runner breaks with the pitch and batter is committed to hit at the ball.

SCREWBALL: Zany. Also applied to pitch thrown with outward twist of the hand.

SHUTOUT: No runs. Also called Whitewash, Blank, Kalsomine, etc.


SINKER: Pitch which suddenly dips downward.

SLICE: Hit to right field by right-handed batter, or left field by lefthander.

SQUEEZE PLAY: Runner breaks from third with the pitch and batter bunts ball to enable runner to score.


