Any coach who feels he has a player or two who should be playing in the All Star Games should fill out the Player Recommendation sheet that is enclosed in this Newsletter. Please enclose a photo of your player (if available) on the recommendation sheet. The guidelines for the All Star selection can be found on this sheet. All the advance information we can get on the best ball players in the state would help in the selection of the best All Stars.

The Board of Directors passed a policy that any player or coach selected to participate in the All Star Series must have a minimum of \$100.00 of Sponsors' fees. More would help to defray the cost of the All Star Series. If you nominate a player and he is chosen, it is the responsibility of the high school coach to get the player's sponsor. This policy is necessary in order to offset the high cost of putting on the All Star series. If you have any questions about this policy, contact any officer or director in your area; they will explain it to you. Sponsor names and fees and names must be paid to Executive Secretary no later than Saturday, July 29, if your player is selected.

DISTRICT COACHES AND COACHES OF YEAR

RULES FOR ALL-STAR SERIES (Adopted by Board of Directors):

1/All players chosen must play.

2/The pitchers can pitch a full game.

Il games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings are necessary.

4/Tie breaker system will be announced in advance for who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition, most runs scored, least runs given up, most hits, least hits given up.

All of the examples can be given points. The two teams with the most points will play for 1st place.

This system will give more boys an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict a pitcher on amount of innings he can pitch in one day.

Coaches were picked by the Steering committee! They filled out an application that was found in the last newsletter.

*****Players who do not make the All District Team will still be eligible to play in the All Star Series. ****

If a coach fills out a player profile form that is found in this newsletter and sends it in, this player will have the same opportunity as a player on the All District Team. This system was necessary because of a number of good ball players being left off the All Star Squads, because a coach could not get enough votes for his player at the All District Selection meeting.

ALL STAR SQUAD REGULATIONS:

Each squad will consist of 16 players (2 catchers, 5 pitchers, 5 infielders and 4 outfielders).





BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

IOWA HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION

STOUFFERS HOTEL, CEDAR RAPIDS

MARCH 9, 1989

President Lanny Peterson called the annual spring IHSBAC Board of Director's Meeting to order at 7:20 with twenty-seven directors present. Immediately our distinguished secretary was ignored as the minutes of the fall meeting were approved as written in our last newsletter. (I'd practiced reading them for the past three days!) Motion—Jim Gebhart, Seconded—John Zahn. Carried.

Pinky Primrose promptly took the floor and was allowed to read the treasurer's report. After the financial status was discussed, versatile utility player Lenny Weih was asked to go over the financial books with our accountant Jim Brems. The Treasuers's report was approved in the form of a motion by Ken James with a second coming from Dick Core. Carried.

The much anticipated president's report followed by our first umpire-president Lanny Peterson. Lanny was gracious in his appreciation of being able to serve our organization over the past year. He felt that some of the problems we now have are much more well known by all athletic groups in the state now. He addressed the plastic cleat rule and the need to document injuries that occur as a result of them and send them to I.H.S.A.A. in Boone. Lanny closed with words for the good of the unity of the organization.

Everyone then "nestled" in their seats as Pinky began his Executive Secretary's Report at 7:33 P.M. Roll call of the voting members was covered first. Pinky drew attention to the fact that if two meetings are missed by a director he should be dropped from his position. After a terrible joke about 3 bulls, Pinky addressed the following areas:

- 1)A clinic update which included a preregistration figure of around 300 with the hope that the number will hit 600. We have had only one speaker cancel.
- 2)Door assignments were reviewed with directors and the need for all to do a good job in this area.
- 3)District meetings for 1A-2A will be July 9th and 3A and 4A on July 16th. Sites will be determined at the district meetings. Coaches are reminded that All-District teams must be limited to 14 players.
- 4)The awards program was discussed with agenda covered in detail.
- 5) Exhibits are down this year but fifteen will be present for the clinic.
- 6)Mini-clinic hosts were given their responsibilities.
- 7)The steering committee was reminded of their responsibilities.
- 8)The All-Star series for 1990 were briefly discussed with the site being Ames or Des Moines.
- 9)Membership was discussed with two-year directors in charge of membership in their district.
- 10)The Hall of Fame Committee needs help in finding candidates for this award; we have many deserving of this award.
- 11)Our fall meeting will be at Iowa State on October 21st.
- 12) The rating poll committee needs to get much better responses in rating the small schools.
- 13)Next year's budget is very workable even though the rise in printing and postage has affected it.
- 14)A reminder to all in regard to All-Star player nominations that making an All-District team is no longer the # 1 priority.
- 15) All were encouraged to ask umpires to join our organization.
- 16) The awards committee was asked to review awards given.

At 8:09 Pinky concluded his report. He was given a standing ovation by President Lanny and Secretary Lenny!

The executive secretary's report was followed by the various committee chairmen:

Hall of Fame -- A plea was made for assistance in helping secure candidates for this award. A candidate put on a ballot and not receiving taward should be put back on the ballot after five years for reconsideration.

All-District -- The problem of ballots were discussed and if we even need them anymore.

Awards -- Awards criteria was in our last newsletter. Also discussion centered around the coach of the year receiving \$ 100 instead of a ring if he wins it a second time.

All-Star -- The series planning is going well with Stouffers being the host for players and coaches.

Umpires - The newcomer award was discussed as well as the umpires clinic program.

Steering -- No report.

Audit -- Our accountant Jim Brems will receive a plaque for his many years of service.

- 7)Pinky's Executive Secretary's salary-\$6,300. Motion-Core, 2nd Watson, Approved with the steering committee reviewing annually.



BOARD OF DIRECTORS ANNUAL MEETING



MARCH 10, 1989

Our Annual IHSBCA meeting was called to order by President Lanny Peterson at 10:55 A.M. on March 10, 1989 at Washington High School. Secretary Lenny Weih briefly reported on the minutes of the board meeting of March 9th which were moved for approval by Father Collison and seconded by Lou Koenigfeld. A brief financial report was then given by our Executive Secretary Pinky Primrose. A motion to approve the report was made by Dick Core and seconded by Ken James. The remainder of the meeting was spent on committee reports which are summarized below.

Executive Secretary's Report -- Pinky Primrose--Pinky gave a quick preview of the clinic. The only changes revolved around Bill Freese and Jim McAndrews filling in for George Frazier who could not attend. We are down on displayers for the booths this year. Membership figures reflect that 20% of 1A coaches belong, 50% of 2A coaches 80% of 3A coaches and 95% of 4A coaches belong to our Association. Membership Committee Report--Phil Lebo- Membership drive information is now being communicated to all baseball coaches twice a year-in February and July. Conference representatives need to continue to work hard in this area to improve our membership numbers.

All-State Rating Poll Committee Report--Bob Watson- The process of rating teams will be very similar to last year. District representatives will be getting the necessary information needed for the upcoming summer in May.

All-Star Committee Report- Pinky Primrose- Everything is going smoothly for the All-Star game at Cedar Rapids. Four games will be played on Friday with two games played on Saturday and Sunday. The awards brunch will be held Saturday morning. Stouffers will be the All-Star head-quarters for the teams and families. Coaches were reminded that attendance to the games is free with your membership card.

<u>Umpire Committee Report</u>--Gary Paulson- All members were reminded of the rules meeting later during the clinic. The general feeling as umpires was that an umpire could only win the state award once. Father Collison will be arranging the umpires for the All-Star Series from the list of district nominees. This year will be the first time for the Newcomer of the Year Award.

<u>Steering Committee Report</u>—Jim Kloewer- It was agreed that Jim Donahue would serve as the new secretary for this group. Motion by Nelson, seconded by Feyen to Approve. Carried.

<u>Vince Meyer Scholarship Report</u>--Andy McGaffin- The selection format will continue to be the same. Coaches were urged to complete their forms entirely.

Awards Committee Report--Ed Feyen- The proposal made here was-that if a coach won the Coach of The Year Award a second time he would not receive a ring but instead receive a \$ 100 gift. It was seconded by Ken James and passed. Also discussion was held in regard to an assistant coach of the year award. It was decided criteria for the award to be decided first.

A motion for adjournment at noon was made by Bob Watson and seconded by Terry Heald. Carried.



POP FLIES TO THE INFIELD



- A. An infield pop fly will be all infielders' responsibility, and they must try for the ball until one fielder takes charge by calling for the play.
 - 1. When calling, yell loudly three or four times.
- B. As designated in the diagram, each infielder has his area, but he may take the play out of his area if he has taken charge of the play.

NOTE: Especially on windy days, do not call for play too soon.

- C. WHEN PITCHER HELPS: On questionable pop flies around the mound area, and after one or more infielders have called for the play, the pitcher then calls the last name of the fielder he thinks is in the best position to make the play.
- D. The catcher must not give up on pop flies too quickly.
- E. All pop flies directly behind the 1st and 3rd basemen will be the responsibility of the 2nd baseman and the shortstop.
