CLINIC SPEAKERS:

JACK PERCONTE: Jack played in the Big Leagues for 7 years', he was with the Los Angeles Dodgers, Cleveland Indians, Seattle Mariners, and the Chicago White Sox. Jack played second base! His best year was with Seattle when he hit .296, playing in 155 games. He retired from baseball in 1987. He presently is the President of the Jack Perconte sports academy in Chicago.

DENNIS LEONARD: Dennis played in the Big Leagues for 10 years, all with the Kansas City Royals. He established himself as the winningest righthander in the Major Leagues since he joined the Royals in 1975. He has pitched 21 shutouts and 10 games with less than four hits. His over-all pro ERA is 3.62, striking out over 1,200 batters. He pitched in four league championships and one World Series. Presently he is playing in the Senior League for Fort Meyers. He resides in Blue Springs, Mo.

KEN SCHREIBER: Ken has coached over 30 years in the LaPorte, In. Community Schools, with an over-all record of 781 wins and 165 losses. His teams have won one National Championship in 1957 and has won the Indiana State Tournament five times. They have been a State Tournament Finalist nine times. Ken is the founder and past president of the Indiana Coaches Association. He served on the National Federations Rules Committee for six years. He was named the National Coach of the Year in 1988. He has given many clinics through-out the mid west.

HAL DYER: A scholarship athlete at Florida State, Hal brings a wealth of coaching experience to our state clinic. Six years in minor league baseball as a catcher were followed by successful stints in high school (Cincinnati), amateur, and junior college coaching. In each of two seasons at Pratt, Kansas, Dyer's junior college baseball program produced state JC championships. Dyer then moved into coaching at the professional ranks as field manager of the Bristol Tigers in 1984. He presently substitutes in the Cincinnati schools and is the manager of the Priates short season A team.

DICK BIRMINGHAM: Dick is a veteran of over 30 years of player development placing over 100 players in college and professional baseball. As head coach at Hillcrest High School in Springfield, MO, and former Head of Instruction at Mickey Owen, he is a nationally known clinician having spoken in 20 states plus Canada and at the A.B.C.A. national convention. He was voted High School Coach of Year in 1979 and was the Head Coach of the North Team at the 1983 Sports Festival and the Worlds Games team in 1988. He was recently inducted into the A.B.C.A. Hall of Fame. Dick has spoken at our clinic many times, coming back by popular request.

JIM MAHONEY: Jim graduated from Dowling High School in Des Moines, and entered Iowa State University where he played baseball and received his BS degree. He started his coaching career in Johnston in 1969. His over-all record is 337-272 in the 20 years. He won the state championship in 1977 and was runner-up in 1979. He reached the finals in two other years. Jim has been an active member of the association, serving on many committees and is a past president of the Association. He was just named as a Hall of Famer for the Association.

JOIN YOUR ASSOCIATION

JOHN SMITH: John is the head coach at the Des Moines Area Community College of Boone. He has been coaching there for 16 years. His over-all record is 397-254, with his 1989 team record of 40-17, coming in second in the Junior College Play-offs last summer. He has had 39 players drafted and one just entering the Big Leagues in Paul Wilmet of the Brewers. He was named Junior College Coach of Year for 1989.

SOFTBALL CLINIC SPEAKERS:

AL RAUSCH: Former Kirkwood Community College Softball Coach. Al has been playing softball for 18 years in the Mid-West. He is known for his pitching records, pitching Collins Radio to third place in the National Championship Series in 1987. He was named All-American pitcher in 1983 and 87. He participated in the ASA All-Star Series in 1984 and in the National Sports Festival in 1985. He started the Kirkwood program in 1978 for two seasons, coming back into coaching in 1987. In his four seasons they have won the Regional two years and finishing fourth and fifth in the Country. Al is also a very successful softball coach, taking his Kirkwood girls to the National Tournament two out of three years.

GARY PAGE: Urbandale High School Softball Coach. Gary has been coaching for 23 years, with an over-all record of 948-198. His 1988 team record was 37-10. He was named the National High School Softball Coach of Year in 1988, by the National High School Athletic Coaches Association. Gary has won three state championships, and many conference championships. He has had 13 teams in the State Girls Softball Tournament. His teams have a state record of 68 straight wins. Presently he is still coaching at Urbandale and part owner of the Caps Athletic Products and Services Company.

UMPIRE'S CLINIC SPEAKERS:

DAVE HARTY: Assistant Executive Secretary of the I.H.S.A.A., in charge of the baseball program for the State of Iowa. Dave is a member of the Federation Rules Committee. He is a graduate of Buena Vista College and a former high school coach and teacher. He is the presenter of many rules meeting through-out the state.

CEDAR RAPIDS:

Six new members will be inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association at its annual clinic and awards banquet in Cedar Rapids March 9, 1990.

New inductees to be honored at the IHSBCA Twenty-Second Annual Clinic Banquet are **Marvin Bell**, Van Horne (Umpire); **Jerry Eimers**, Dike (Coach); **Joe Kenney**, Cedar Rapids Jefferson (Coach); **Jim Mahoney**, Johnston (Coach); **James McElliott**, Ryan (Umpire/Contributor); **Eddie Watt**, Iowa City (Player).

The six names bring to 111 the number of Hall of Fame members. The honor roll now includes 72 coaches, 19 players, 18 umpires, and 2 contributors.

MARVIN BELL: Marvin Bell graduated from Maryville, Mo. High School in 1961 and then attended Northwest Mo. State University, graduating with a BS degree in 1965 and received his Masters degree in 1970 from the same University. Marv started his teaching career in Northwest Missouri before moving to Wilton, Ia. in 1966. He moved to Benton Community in 1969 where he teaches English and head boys basketball coach. Marv has been an umpire for 29 years, working over 100 games a year. He has worked in 19 state tournament. He also has worked in 9 All-Star series. He works a full slate of College games in the Big Ten, Big Eight, Iowa Conference and Junior College Leagues. Marv has been recognized as District Umpire of Year twice and Umpire of the Year in 1983. He has served on the Umpires Committee several times.

JERRY EIMERS: Jerry Eimers graduated from Burt High School and then from Upper Iowa University. He lettered in baseball for four years at Burt and two at Upper Iowa as a catcher. He played a lot of semi-pro baseball in Iowa. Jerry has coached 34 years of high school baseball in Iowa, with an over-all record of 300 plus wins and 170 losses. His coaching stops took him to Onslow, Clarksville, Greene, and Dike. In the summer he ran the Little League Program plus Babe Ruth and Local League baseball programs. He is a member of many professional organizations.

JOE KENNEY: Joe Kenney graduated from St. Patrick's High School in Cedar Rapids in 1942. He attended the University of Iowa for one year, and then served in the Air Force in the Pacific during W.W. II. He graduated from the University in 1949. Kenney coached and taught at St. Pat's from 1950-1963. He then moved to LaSalle High for two years, and then served as an assistant to Pinky Primrose at Washington for 10 years. He then became the head coach at Jefferson High School in Cedar Rapids where he is currently coaching. Joe played baseball at the University of Iowa during his freshman year, and played a lot of amateur ball in the Cedar Rapids area. His over-all record is 570 wins in his 38 years of coaching. He was selected Conference Coach of the Year in 1988 and 89.

JIM MAHONEY: Jim Mahoney graduated from Dowling High School in 1961. He graduated from Iowa State University in 1966 with a BS degree, and received his master's degree in 1974 from Drake University. He played four years for Dowling High School, and three years, 1963-65, for Iowa State. He played on the Des Moines Semi-Pro team that won the state championship in 1962. In 1963 and 64 he played for the Slater state champs. Jim started coaching in 1969 at Johnston and has compiled a over-all record of 337-272 in 20 years of coaching. His team was state champs in 1977, runner-up in 1979, and reached the final four in 1984 and 1985. His teams captured nine conference championships, and he took an AAU team to a 2nd place national finish in 1988. Jim has been an active member in the Coaches Association, including membership on various committees and holding all the chairs of leadership.

JAMES McELLIOTT: James McElliott graduated from Ryan High School. He attended Columbia College in Dubuque, Iowa, for 2 years. He coached Little League Baseball for 12 years, and played baseball with the Ryan semi-pro team for 10 years. He has umpired college, high school, and semi-pro baseball for over fifty years. He organized the Eastern Iowa Umpires Association in 1936 and served as secretary-treasurer for thirty-eight years. He was inducted into the Iowa Officials Hall of Fame in 1988. James McElliott is known in Eastern Iowa as "Mr. Cub", arranging many trips in to Chicago to see his favorite team. He has been and still is an outstanding contributor to baseball in the State of Iowa.

EDDIE WATT: Eddie Watt graduated from Iowa City High school, where he took the Little Hawks on to a State Tournament championship. He then went on to U.N.I. University to play college baseball. He signed a pro contract with the Baltimore Orioles, reaching the Major Leagues in 1966. He played 9 years in the majors compiling a record of 38-36 as a relief pitcher. Ed appeared in 411 games, striking out 462 and walking 254. His major league ERA was 2.91. Ed pitched in three play-offs and two world series. He was traded to the Phillies in 1974 and then to the Cubs in 1975. Since out of baseball, Ed has been a pitching coaching for several major league teams. Currently he is working for the Atlanta Braves organization as a minor league pitching coach.



MEETING MINUTES

SUMMER BASEBALL REPORT. David Harty summarized the summer baseball season and tournament series, noting very few problems during regular season competition. It was pointed out there were fifteen coach ejections with no repeat performances and no coach ejections during the tournament series, sectional through state. That figure was very similar to that of the 1988 summer season. There are 426 schools playing summer baseball, 25 in whole grade and 27 in cooperative programs - probably averaging somewhere between 20 to 25 games each - a lot of ball games played and not very many coach ejections when considering the number of games played. This is a compliment to the coaching profession and the school administration for keeping good sportsmanship in proper perspective. Most of the inquiries during the regular season dealt with rule coverage by umpires, coaches and administrators. There were very few problems that surfaced during the tournament series other than rainouts causing delays at lower level district and substate ball. This caused for reassignment of officials and occasional movement of a site and/or delay of games. The state tournament went exceptionally well with excellent officiating, however, the final day there was a rain delay of two to three hours with the four championship games getting underway after approximately a two to three hour delay, finishing the 4-A championship approximately midnight. It was felt this was better than postponing until Monday, recognizing the travel involved with fans, schools, maintenance of facilities, etc. Mr. Harty reviewed some recommendations for consideration by the Board of Control at their next regular scheduled meeting. (a) Sunday as a rain date during State Tournament. (b) Predetermine substate sites. (c) Eliminating sectional tournament play at the Class 1-A level and start with district level competition as in all other classes. (d) Pitching limitation rule review by Advisory Committee.

The attendance figures for 1989 State Baseball Tournament were reviewed.

REVIEWED BASEBALL ADVISORY COMMITTEE MINUTES. Members were informed of the Baseball Coaches Advisory Committee meeting held in the Association Office, Monday, October 9, 1989, and disseminated minutes of same. Members will have the opportunity to review more thoroughly the contents of the Advisory Committee minutes and recommendations of the prior Board of Control meeting involving (a) Sunday as a raindate during State Tournament; (b) predetermine substate sites; and (c) eliminating sectional tournament play at the Class 1-A level and start with district level competition as in all other classes until the next regular scheduled Board of Control meeting.

1990 BASEBALL RULE CHANGES

- Rule 1-3-5** 18" encircling mark on bats not required.
- Rule 1-3-5** Graphite composite bats are legal.
- Rule *2-8-1** Delete reference to imaginary line between first and third.
- Rule 2-12-4** Reinstatement of force situation is defined.
- Rule 3-3-1n** Hitting infield practice after the game starts is prohibited.
- Rule *3-3-2** Assess coach charged conference if he stops play to question umpire's call.
- Rule 3-4-1** The pitcher shall be removed as pitcher for the duration of the game for each charged conference after three during a seven-inning game.
- Rule 4-4-1f** Most recent batter not on base is allowed to run for a player who becomes injured, ill, or ejected if substitutes are not available.
- Rule 6-1-5** Note: All state associations are required to have a pitching limitation rule.
- Rule 6-2-2c** Exception: A starting pitcher is allowed eight warm-up throws.
- Rule 7-3-5** Penalty: Runner is out when batter interferes with catcher on third strike.

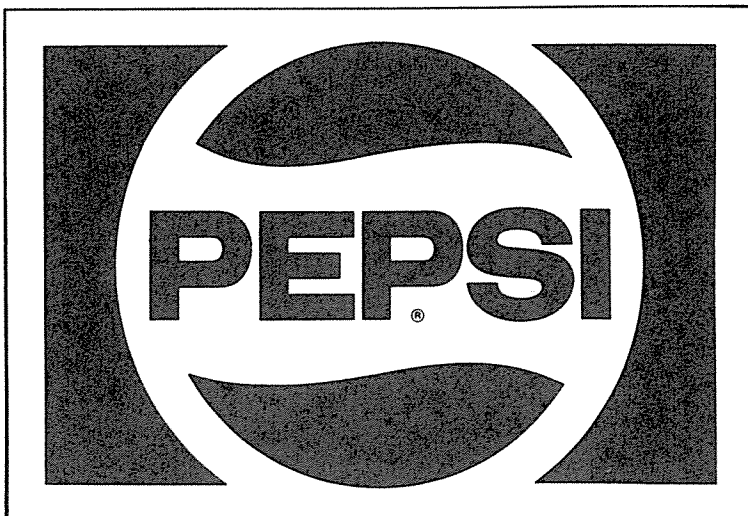

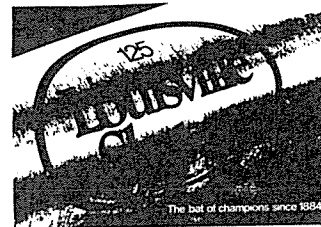

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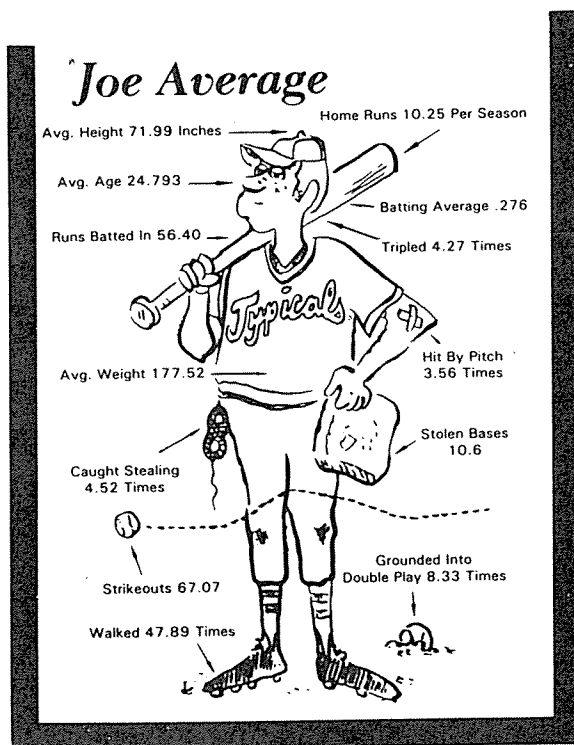
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SOUTHWEST DISTRICT

BASEBALL TERMINOLOGY

APPLE: Ball. Also called Pill, Horsehide, Onion, Sphere, Bola.

BALTIMORE CHOP: Topped Ball which bounces near plate and goes very high in air.

BENCH WARMER: Player who rarely gets into a game.

BUSHES: Minor leagues. Also called Sticks.

CHANGE UP: Slow pitch thrown with same motion as fast one. Also called Pulling the String, Let-Up, Change of Pace.

CRIPPLE: Pitch following three-balls, one-strike count on batter.

DRAG BUNT: Lightly pushed hit so ball trickles to infielder too slowly for play on batter.

FIELDER'S CHOICE: Throwing to retire a base-runner forced at the next base.

FUNGO: Player throws ball few feet in air and bats it himself.

GOAT: Player whose error or oversight proves costly.

GOPHER BALL: Pitch which is hit for a homer.

GRAND SLAM: Home run with bases loaded.

HIT-AND-RUN: Play in which runner breaks from first, causing either second baseman or shortstop to leave normal position to take throw at second base, followed by batter driving ball through "hole" vacated by fielder.

HOOK: Curve ball. Also applied to right-handed hitter "pulling" or hitting the ball into left field, or vice versa.

JOCKEY: Player who "rides" opposition team with taunts.

LEATHER MAN: Good fielder.

ON DECK: Player in circle near plate, waiting to follow current batter.

PASS: Base on balls. Also called walk, Annie Oakley, Stroll, etc.

PAYOFF PITCH: Pitch following three-balls, two-strikes count on the batter.

PICKOFF: Catch runner off base by sudden throw from pitcher or catcher.

PITCHOUT: Wide pitch to foil bunt or to enable catcher to throw out runner attempting to steal.

PORTSIDER: Lefthander pitcher. Also called Southpaw.

PULL A ROCK: Make a stupid play.

ROLLER: Slow ground ball which trickles toward infielder.

RUN-AND-HIT: Play in which runner breaks with the pitch and batter is committed to hit at the ball.

SCREWBALL: Zany. Also applied to pitch thrown with outward twist of the hand.

SHUTOUT: No runs. Also called Whitewash, Blank, Kalsomine, etc.

SINKER: Pitch which suddenly dips downward.

SLICE: Hit to right field by right-handed batter, or left field by lefthander.

SQUEEZE PLAY: Runner breaks from third with the pitch and batter bunts ball to enable runner to score.

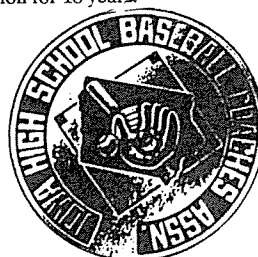
