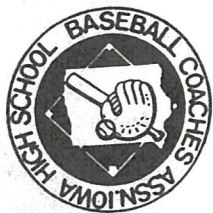

SUCCESSFUL CLINIC: The Twenty-Second Annual Clinic Convention was very successful. Total attendance was 550 coaches, umpires, players and fans of baseball and softball.

COACHES OF YEAR--1989: Ed McNeil, Fort Dodge; Larry Avery of Central Lee; and Steve Westphal of Lenox, were named as the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association "Coach of the Year" at the 22nd Annual Awards Banquet. McNeil received the Class 4A honor with Avery taking the Class 3A and Westphal taking the Class 1A-2A award. Bob Randall, of Iowa State, received the four year college Coach-of-the-Year award. John Smith, of Des Moines Area Community College of Boone, was the junior college coach of the Year. Congratulations to these men.

Fr. Craig Collison, of Struble, was named Umpire-of-the-Year. He has been an umpire for 24 years, working 69 plus varsity contests in 1989. He has a Superior Classification. He has worked in ten All-Star Series during his 24 years as a member of the association. Fr. Craig was District umpire 3 times and State Umpire of the Year in 1982. He was the former chairman of the Umpires Committee.

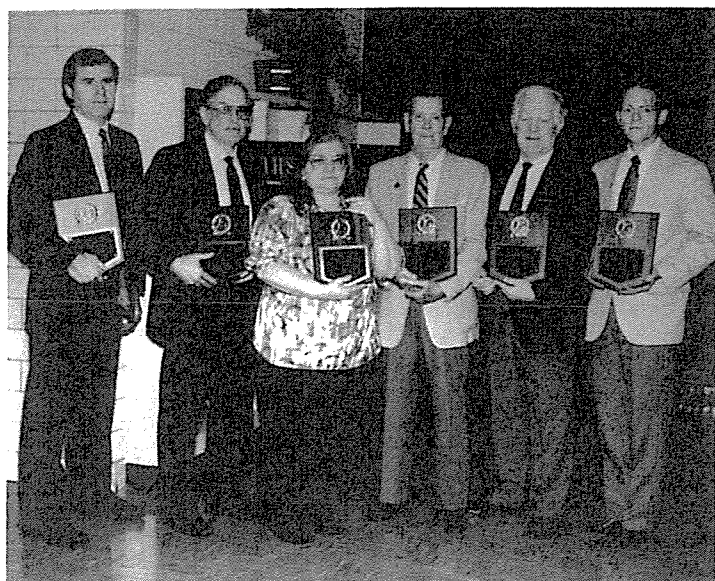

ANNOUNCE THE 1990 ALL STAR SERIES AT IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY, AUGUST 3-4-5, 1990: The Fourteenth Annual All Star Games will be held in Ames, Aug. 3-4-5, 1990. Any coach who feels he has a player or two who should be playing in the All Star Games should fill out the Player Recommendation sheet that is enclosed in this Newsletter. Please enclose a photo of your player (if available) on the recommendation sheet. The guidelines for the All Star selection can be found on this sheet. All the advance information we can get on the best ball players in the state would help in the selection of the best All Stars.

The Board of Directors passed a policy that any player or coach selected to participate in the All Star Series must have a minimum of \$100.00 of sponsors' fees. More would help to defray the cost of the All Star Series. It will be the high school coach's responsibility to get the player's sponsors if he wishes him to play in the All Star games. This policy is necessary in order to offset the high cost of putting on the All Star series. If you have any questions about this policy, contact any officer or director in your area; they will explain it to you. Sponsor names and fees and names must be paid to Executive Secretary no later than Monday, July 30, if your player is selected.

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE RULES:

1/ All players chosen must play.

2/ The pitchers can pitch a full game.

3/ All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings are necessary.

4/ Tie breaker system will be announced in advance for who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition, most runs scored, least runs given up, most hits, least hits given up.

All of the examples can be given points. The two teams with the most points will play for 1st place.

This system will give more boys an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict a pitcher on amount of innings he can pitch in one day. Coaches were picked by the Steering committee! They filled out an application that was found in the last newsletter.

*****Players who do not make the All District Team will still be eligible to play in the All Star Series. *****

If a coach fills out a player profile form that is found in this newsletter and sends it in, this player will have the same opportunity as a player on the All District Team. This system was necessary because of a number of good ball players being left off the All Star Squads, because a coach could not get enough votes for his player at the All District Selection meeting.

ALL STAR SQUAD REGULATIONS:

Each squad will consist of 16 players (2 catchers, 5 pitchers, 5 infielders and 4 outfielders).

PLAYER SELECTION:

First priority: Coach's recommendation form

Second priority: All District Team

Third priority: Coach a member of the association

HALL OF FAME NOMINATION FORM:

You will find a Hall of Fame nomination form. Please fill out this form for the person you feel is deserving of this high honor. Send them to Chairman Lou Koenigsfeld, Charles City. Players-Umpires-Coaches-Promoters of baseball.

SCOUTING INFORMATION: A standard roster form should be used for scouts, and college coaches, and visiting teams, the roster form under 12 headings, supplies the following info:

Board of Directors' Meeting
IOWA HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION

STOUFFERS HOTEL, CEDAR RAPIDS
March 8, 1990

The Spring 1990 Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association Meeting of March 8 was called to order by President Andy McGaffin.

I. Introduction of all present

II. October 1989 meeting minutes were read. Motion by Steve Westphal, Lenox, to accept minutes. 2nd by Phil Lebo, Grundy Center, carried.

III. Treasurer's report presented by Pinky Primrose. Pinky passed out handout explaining checking account, interest bearing account (budget) Little discussion on total of \$ 73,000.

Pinky explained proposed budget-- no discussion.

Question raised by McGaffin on clinic speakers expenses of \$ 4,500 for next year as opposed to \$ 1,020.34 for 1989-90. Pinky explained that it was cheaper this year since speakers all drove instead of flying.

Question raised by Bob Leech about dates for clinic. Pinky explained that if we move it up we lose coaches that coach winter sports also. If we move it back it's harder to get speakers.

Jim Brems, CPA, explained our budget system. Motion by Jack Lebo to accept budget, 2nd by Fr. Craig Collison, carried.

IV. Committee reports were read by the respective chairmen with the major points as follows:

A. Steering Committee (Lanny Peterson)

1. The committee has decided on Ed Feyen to be placed in the chairs for office. All-Star coaches not yet finalized. They are thinking of changing clinic days to Saturday and Sunday.

B. Executive Secretary Report (Pinky Primrose)

All speakers are contacted and coming. Three hundred fifty banquet meals ordered, 275 lunches. Door assignments at the clinic, district rep. meetings, awards program at the banquet, exhibitors, and operations of mini clinics were discussed by Pinky. 1990 All-Star series will be in Ames, players staying at the Starlite Motel, but no rooms available for parents. Pinky explained some of the duties of the various committees and how they were doing. The Fall meeting will be in Iowa City, Banks hosting. Pinky also discussed honoring ball players who went on to become distinguished persons and that we should review the qualifications for district contributors.

C. Hall of Fame Committee (Lou Koenigsfeld). No report

D. All-District Committee (Eugene Meister). It was good to have nominations from the floor last year.

E. Awards Committee (Ed Feyen). Discussion on selection of assistant coach of the year award.

F. All-Star Committee (Pinky Primrose). Forty rooms at Starlite in Ames. Looking for someone to do All-Star Program.

G. Umpire Committee (Terry Curtis). No report.

H. Vince Meyer Award Committee (John Zahn). They are going to write out a selection method. Only 38 nominated last year.

I. Audit Committee (Lenny Weih). Books in order, money accounted for.

VI. New Business:

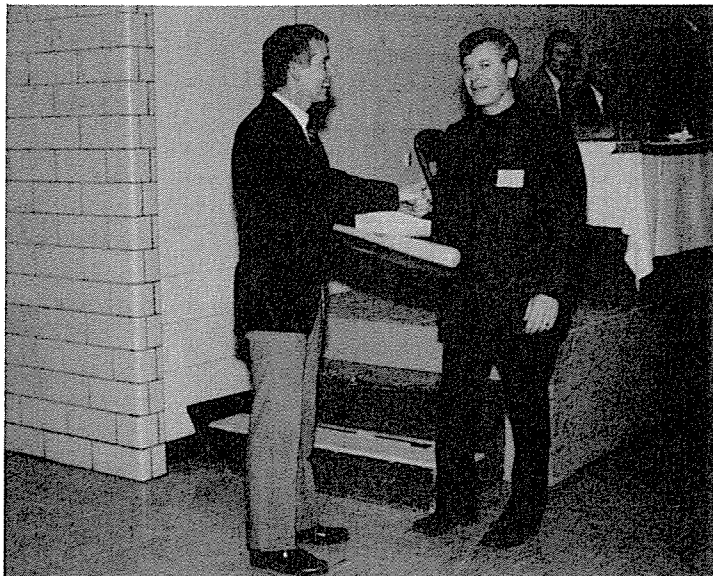
