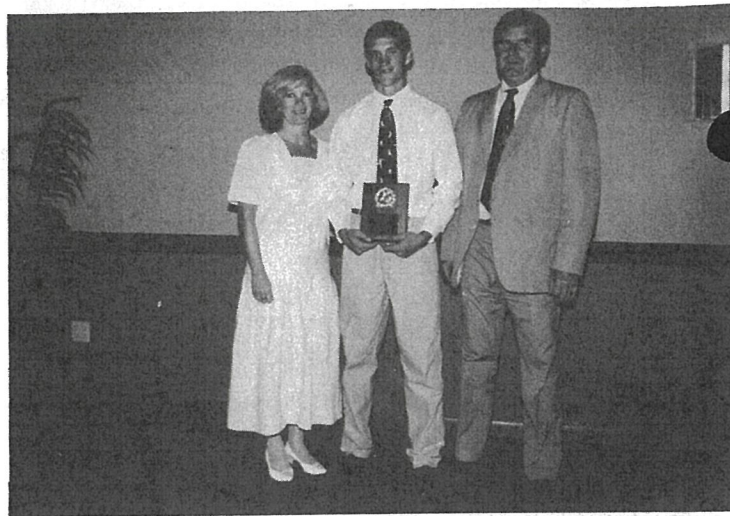

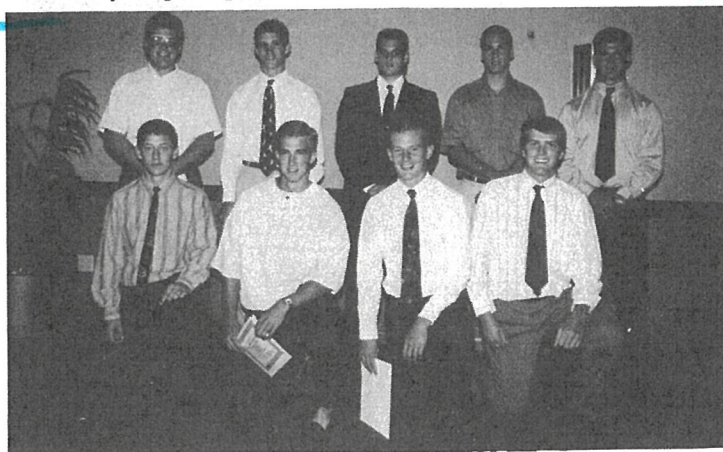

1992 NATIONAL FEDERATION BASEBALL RULE CHANGES:

Rule 1-1-5 Any runner who scores or who is put out is required to wear a batting helmet until reaching the bench/dugout while the ball is alive.

Rule 1-1-5 Beginning with the 1994 season, a manufacturer's logo that appears on the team's uniform shall not exceed 1 1/2" x 1 1/2".

Rule 1-1-5 Neither team's equipment shall be left within live ball area.

Rule 1-3-5A bat is limited to a length of 36".

Rule 1-3-5A bat shall not weight more than five units less the length of the bat.

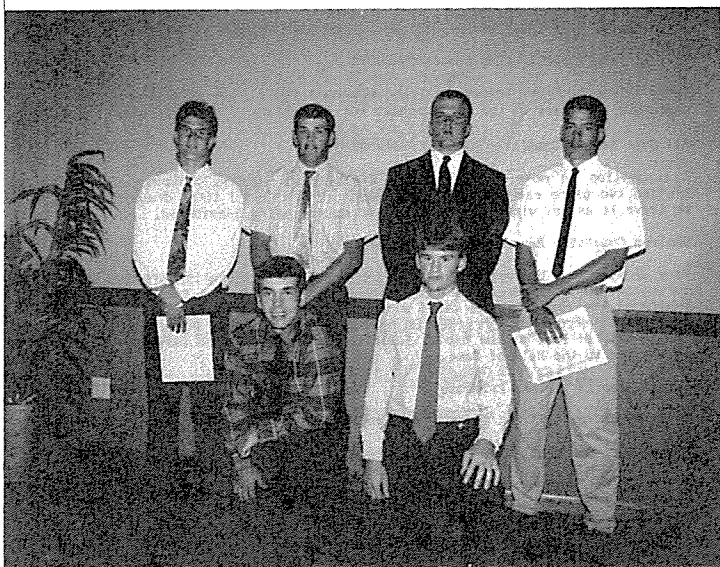
Rule 2-31 Legal slides are now defined.

Rule 8-4-2-1 On force play if a runner slides, he must execute a legal slide or attempt to avoid the play.

Umpire Signals-The "Do Not Pitch" signal shall cause the ball to dead immediately.

MEETING MINUTES

SYNOPSIS OF THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL OF THE IOWA HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

BASEBALL REVIEWED. Issues of concern and proposed solutions of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association were shared with the Council as it relates to the summer high school baseball program. After considerable discussion about concerns facing baseball, the following general list of problems was recorded by the IHSBCA.

- A. Out of season camps/clinics
- B. Equi., of sports (starting/stopping - off season guidelines)
- C. All star contests
- D. Overlap of seasons
- E. Limitations on the use of facilities and equipment
- F. AAU sports
- G. Jobs
- H. Specialization of athletes

It was pointed out that these concerns are not new to anyone who has been dealing with summer baseball in Iowa, but it was agreed that rather than turning the meeting into a gripe session, the baseball coaches should focus on some possible solutions to these concerns. Alternatives to the summer baseball program were reviewed at this time. These alternatives included considering a spring baseball program.

The Council reviewed the schools participating in the spring, summer and fall programs from 1944 to the current date as well as prior summer baseball game/date limitation survey items. Members were asked to seriously consider the ramification of spring versus summer baseball and any modifications relative to same. Some discussion centered around compacting the season with a week earlier start and a week earlier ending or spring baseball consideration. Following discussion (MM-S Rood - Owens) to leave the summer baseball program as is with no changes. That is with the May 1 practice start and completing the state tournament series the last week of July or first of August, depending on the calendar. Motion carried.

Anytime a student-athlete is ejected from a game/meet, he/she does not participate the remainder of that day. The student is also suspended from the next scheduled, rescheduled, or contracted date at that level of competition and all games/meets in the interim at other levels of competition.

There were 137 ejections, grades 7-12, during the 1990-91 baseball season. The following charts will give you information relative to the ejections during the 1990-91 baseball season.

Two players were ejected twice. One player will be ineligible for the first game of the 1991-92 baseball season. One ejection occurred during the Iowa High School Athletic Association tournament series.

There were 31 more ejections in 1991 than in 1990--a 30% increase. This information has been compiled from the schools' and officials' reports during the 1990-91 baseball season.

MEETING MINUTES

IOWA HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

OCTOBER 5, 1991

MINUTES

The semi-annual meeting of the Board of Directors of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association was called to order by Mr. Lennis Welh, President at 9:30 A.M. in the Big Ten room at Carver-Hawkeye Arena on the campus of the University of Iowa. Roll was taken by Pinky Primrose, Executive Secretary.

President Welh welcomed everyone and thanked Duane Banks and his staff at the University of Iowa for their gracious hospitality.

All present introduced themselves. President Welh then suspended the business of the meeting for those present to meet in district groups to select nominees for District Coach of the Year, Media Awards, Contributor Awards, and nominees for the 4 year College Coach of the Year.

The meeting was brought back to order by President Welh at 10:23.

Those who came in late, introduced themselves at this time.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting were dispensed with a motion by Dick Core, second by Fr. Collison for their approval. Motion carried.

Executive Secretary Primrose gave the financial report with the following balances in the various accounts: Checking: \$1696.12, S.C.I.: \$2530.37, Savings Bank: \$142.29. Total Cash on hand: \$4368.78. Since the reports were prepared another \$310.00 has been received for memberships and a check for \$975.00 from the University of Iowa for concessions at the All Star Series has been received. Exec. Sec. Primrose also reviewed the accounting for the All Star Series and the year end report for the fiscal year. Motion by Terry Curtis, second by Gary Paulsen to accept the financial reports. Motion carried. It is noted that Treasurer Ed Feyen approved the financial reports of the Executive Secretary.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: (It is noted that some points of the some of the committee reports received immediate action; others were taken up in New Business).

Presidents Report: (Lennis Welh)

1) All Star Series observations:

-- Problems this year with the selection of Legion players. One player selected for the All Star Series called at the very last minute and said that he would not be coming to play. It became impossible to replace him at that time. One player left the All Star Series during the weekend to play Legion ball and did not return.

-- Should we restrict the number of players selected from any one school? Should we limit the number of players any all-star coach (head or assistant) can select from his own team? These questions were stimulated through fans concerns during the All Star Series.

-- Was the better quality cap used in the All-Star Series received well in lieu of the medallion?

-- Considering the "long day" (4 games on Saturday), should we go to playing on Thursday, hence playing two games each of Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday? The possibility of eliminating two of the games?

-- Do more for the parents of the players. Ideas included a Parents Welcome, A Parents Welcome Center, an informational meeting for all the parents if they were interested.

Executive Secretary's Report: (Pinky Primrose)

1. All Star Series - one of the best ever this year financially. Beautiful diamond, credit to Duane Banks and staff. Food was poor at the Westfield Inn. Concerns have been expressed to the Motel staff. The series went like clockwork this year. The coaches did a good job. Concern expressed about the rules not being adhered to by some coaches. Problem taken care of during the series.

2. Umpires - the Association lost \$100.00 on meals ordered by the umpires but never used. The Association was still liable for them. Suggested by the executive secretary that an umpire send a check to cover the cost of meals ordered (\$10.00 per meal). The check would be held until the banquet. If the umpire showed, the check would be returned to him, if not it would be cashed. Much discussion centered on the pros and cons of such an action. In the end Fr. Collison made the observation that we had the best turnout of umpires ever for the banquet with 15 out a possible 17 showing up. The problem probably was in the second ticket ordered for a spouse or guest; and the spouse or guest did not show up. Fr. Collison agreed to make it very clear to the nominees what the procedure for the banquet as far as meals was concerned and ask the umpires not to order the second ticket or any ticket if it was not going to be used. No other action on this item.

3) The program for the All Star Series was beautiful this year. It cost \$2700.00 total with commissions figured in. There were 100 programs sold at \$3.00 per program. The program was 36 pages in length. The association lost \$1000.00 on the program this year. Suggestion to cut back to a 12 page program without selling advertising. The inside of the front cover could be sold and the inside and backside of the back cover could be sold. This would cost the Association \$1000.00 instead of \$2700.00 thus cutting our losses. All seemed in agreement without taking a formal vote.

4) Clinic. The results of the survey sent out in regards to changing the dates of the Clinic were inconclusive. Suggested to bring this item up again at the March meeting as to whether to move the clinic to February, or move to a Saturday/Sunday; or to a Sunday/Monday. This item was sent to committee to study and make a proposal at the March meeting.

5) Membership. Phil Lebo is in charge. Would like the help of the two year board of directors members to assist in recruiting. The dues are now \$20.00. Observation that there were only 70 coaching changes in Baseball this past year.

6) Awards. In regards to the names of some of the awards, a suggestion to drop the name i.e. "Capp Timm" from the president's award after 10 years, and not rename it until a deserving name is submitted. After much discussion on this item, it was sent to the Awards Committee for further discussion and possible action at a later date.

7) Submits the following names for consideration of Association Awards:

-- The Capp Timm Presidents Award: Dick Schultz
Wayne Duke
Dave Harty

Discussion ensued on each of the names submitted by the Executive Secretary. In the end, motion by Terry Heald, second by Don Miller that Dave Harty be named the winner of the Capp Timm President's Award. Motion carried.

-- Marv Thelen Contributor Award: Fr. Craig A. Collison
Motion by Lanny Peterson, second by Terry Curtis that Fr. Collison be named the winner of the Marv Thelen Contributor Award. Motion carried.

8) Newsletter. Advertising is welcome for the newsletter from outside sources. Postage for the newsletter is now \$250.00 per issue. Asked if any changes were necessary?

9) Game Tickets for the All Star Series. 2 items. 1) The cost is \$4.00 now. Should we alter the cost? The membership agreed that the cost should be kept at what the State Tournament is charging for tickets. 2) Should we continue with the "Souvenir" type of ticket or go to a simple "tear off" type of ticket? After weighing the value of the "Souvenir" type of ticket and it's cost to produce, the membership overwhelmingly approved the simple "tear off" type of ticket to be used at the All Star Series.

10) All District team problems. Some Districts turn in too many players. Much discussion on the item and the item was tabled.

11) All State Team selection. Many letters and phone calls of complaint this year about the teams selected. The executive secretary welcomed the complainants to become part of the selection process. Suggestion to continue to strive from a lack of favoritism. One wise observation was noted: "Any time you put the word "All" in from of any list of people there are going to be complaints and upset people."

12) Announcement of upcoming public meetings relating to changes in the Department of Education rules regarding the participation of teammates upon a non-school team. Proposed rules would limit the participation to only two high school teammates on any one team. Members were asked by the association to attend the meeting in their area, at association expense, to voice concerns. The Ames meeting will be attended by Gary Paulsen, Jim Mahoney, Dave Posegate and Brad Clement. The Iowa City meeting will be attended by Don Miller, Lennis Welh, and Terry Curtis. The Council Bluffs meeting will be attended by Jim Donahue, Fr. Collison, Lee Toale and Jim Kloever.

13) Asked for a report on the meeting held last spring in Boone considering the move of baseball from the summer to the spring. Rich Collison reported that it was a very negative meeting. All ideas presented were shot down by the IHSAA. Jim Mahoney, speaking as a member of the advisory council for Baseball, stated that we need to decide what we want to do. There is going to be a vote coming down by the member schools as to when the baseball season will be and when that takes place it will not be acted upon again for a very long time. He feels that Dave Harty is on our side and wants to work with us, but his hands are tied at times. In the end a special committee will be appointed by the president to study the issue further.

14) Expression of thanks to Duane Banks for securing the tickets for the Iowa/Michigan game. It was pointed out that some members of the Board abuse the request of a limit of 2 tickets and ask for and expect more. Board members are to only ask for two tickets maximum and only one if that be the case.

15) Propose that the 1994 All Star Series be back in Iowa City.

Hall of Fame Report: (Lou Koenigsfeld)

There are 4 carryover names from the previous year. Lou submitted a list to the Executive Secretary of the new nominees for this year.

All Star Series Committee Report: (Don Taylor)

A suggestion to move the Series to a Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday format playing two games each day. The consensus of the Board after discussion seemed to be leave it as is, with no formal vote or motion being considered.

Umpires Committee Report: (Gary Paulsen)

Gary thanked the University of Iowa for the kind hospitality offered the umpires during the All Star Series. He submitted to the Executive Secretary the District Umpire of the Year nominees along with the slate of Newcomers of the Year. Motion by Paulsen, second by Terry Curtis that Bill Currell from Boone be elected to the IHSBCA Hall of Fame as the Umpire Inductee for 1992. Motion carried. Bill Currell is elected to the Hall of Fame.

Clinic Report: (Pinky Primrose)

Pinky asked that all get ideas to him concerning speakers for the Clinic.

Vince Meyer Coaching Award Report: (Jim Donahue)

Reported that three young men playing in the All Star Game were interviewed for the Vince Meyer award. All were men of great quality. Mike Mahoney of Dowling, West Des Moines was the winner of the award.

Steering Committee: (John Zahn)

No report

1992 All Star Committee Report: (Pinky Primrose)

Reported that the series is set and the stadium is reserved in Cedar Rapids for August 6, 7, 8, 9. A question arose about the stadium being reserved for the fourth date (August 6) this year. Pinky assured the board that the stadium was ours for the fourth date. Discussion centered around trying the new format since we had the fourth date reserved. In the end, a motion by Phil Lebo, second by Don Taylor to play two games each of the four days, Thursday through Sunday. Motion carried with one "no" vote.

Awards Committee: (Ed Feyen)

Asked if there were any problems with the new Assistant Coach of the Year Award. A question regarding the membership status of an assistant coach was voiced. It was determined that the Assistant Coach must be a member of the Association to be considered for the award.

OLD BUSINESS:

There was discussion concerning the Banquet at the clinic. It was decided in the effort to shorten the length of the banquet to recognize publically those with 300 wins or more; and longevity of 15 years or more. All others will not be mentioned as their names are listed in the banquet program for all to read.

NEW BUSINESS:

After the district group meetings earlier in the morning the 4 year College Coach of the Year Nominees will be Ed Feyen of Clarke College, Dubuque and John Sirlanni of Simpson College, Indianola. The District Coach of the Year nominees were accepted from all districts and approved along with district Contributors of the year and District Media Award winners.

Motion by Primrose, second by Taylor to have the 1994 All Star Series at the University of Iowa. Discussion ensued. Motion by Mahoney, second by Paulsen to table the decision until more is known as to the availability of the new Sec Taylor Stadium in Des Moines. More discussion. Vote to table the decision failed. Miller moves the question on the first motion. Motion carried. The 1994 All Star Series will be at the University of Iowa.

SUGGESTIONS FOR THE GOOD OF THE ASSOCIATION:

The president asked for opinions about his suggestions given in his report. The membership was in strong agreement that the better quality caps were an excellent addition this year. The membership was in strong agreement that something should be done for the parents of the All Star players. Several members volunteered to work on this for the 1992 All Star Series.

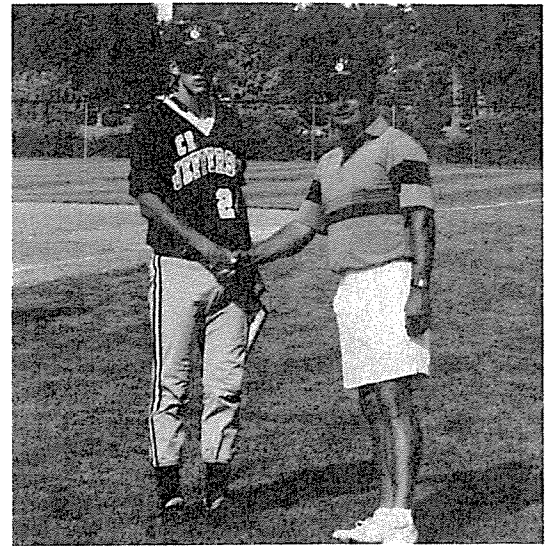
On the question of one player per high school team for the All Star Series the consensus of the members was not to limit the number nor make a coach limit to one the number of players from his own team. A suggestion to appoint a committee to do the All Star Team selections died for lack of support. In the end the membership seemed to want the process left as it currently is and leave selection to the integrity of the coaches selected.

On the question of legion players and the All Star Series no action was taken. Several suggestions were made but none implemented, moved, or voted upon. Some seemed to wonder if the fact that the All Star Series was a week later this year had an effect.

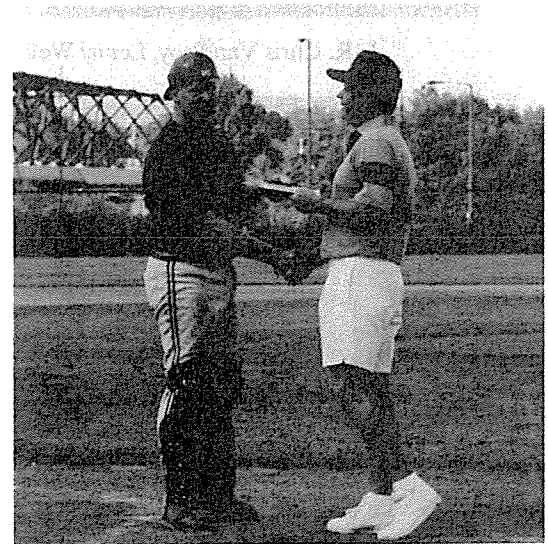
