CLINIC SPEAKERS:

DICK BIRMINGHAM, Dick is a veteran of over 30 years of player development placing over 100 players in college and professional baseball. As head coach at Hillcrest High School in Springfield, MO, and former Head of Instruction at Mickey Owen, he is a nationally known clinician having spoken in 17 states plus Canada. He was voted High School Coach of Year in 1979 and was the Head Coach of the North Team at the 1983 Sports Festival. Dick is a frequent speaker at our clinic. Last year we he was inducted into the Hall of Fame of the A.B.C.A. and the I.H.S.B.C.A. He comes back by popular request.

JERRY MILES, former NCAA director of men's championships and Executive Secretary of the ABCA and presently the Executive Secretary of the National High School Baseball Coaches Association. Jerry brings to our Clinic a tremendous amount of experience in baseball organization. He and his wife, Elaine reside in Omaha, NE, and the state of the Association of the National Research of the National R where he is running the office of the National High School Baseball Coaches Associa-

AL FITZMORRIS, former Kansas City Royal and Cleveland Indian, spent 10 years in the big leagues. He had a pitching record of 77-59, with an lifetime ERA of 3.65. He pitched in 288 games completing 159. He pitched 11 shutouts in his career.

New inductees to be honored at the IHSBCA Twenty-Fourth Annual Clinic Banquet are WILLIS "BILL" CURELL, Boone; WAYNE DUKE, Burlington; JOE HOERNER, Dubuque; ROBERT MILLER, Rock Valley; RAY PETREZELKA, Cedar Rapids; JIM SCHOLTEN, Morningside College; BUD SPERAW, Sioux City;

The seven names bring to 126 the number of Hall of Fame members. The honor roll now includes 79 coaches, 23 players, 20 umpires, and 4 contributors.

WILLIS "BILL" CURELL: a long-time central lowa umpire, spent many years umpiring high school and college baseball in lowa. He worked many state tournaments. Bill's last year of umpiring was 1978. He was a very knowledgeable rules person, an interpreter for the IHSAA at rules meetings throughout the state. Bill was an excellent umpire, who not only knew the rules but umpired within the spirit and framework of those rules, well received by the coaches and players. He is now retired and lives in Boone, Ia.

WAYNE DUKE: graduated from Burlington High School, where he competed in baseball on the Burlington High State Champion Team as a catcher in 1946. He lettered three years at Burlington, his senior year being elected captain of the team. Wayne graduated from the Univ. of Iowa and then became the Sports Information Director at U.N.I. and then on to Colorado as the SID. He was named the head coach of Morningside College in 1984, where his teams have finished in the top four of the ten-team North Central Conference the past six seasons.

BUD SPERAW: a graduate of Roosevelt High School in Cedar Rapids, where he played Legion ball and amateur baseball. He attended the University of Iowa before transferring to Upper Iowa University. He played baseball for both schools as a pitcher. Bud's first coaching experience was as an American Legion coach in Malta, Montana. He then coached a Legion team in Sioux City. Bud started the baseball program at Sioux City North in 1972 and was the only coach until his death in 1989. His record was 311-277. He served as both an assistant and as head coach in the IHSBCA All-Star series. He was a charter member of the Coaches Association. He was instrumental in founding the Western High School League, and it was during the Western League tournament that Bud died while coaching 3rd base on May 26, 1989.



MEETING MINUTES

REVIEWED BASEBALL EJECTION REPORT SUMMER 1991. Members reviewed the 1991 summer baseball ejection report submitted as it pertains to number of ejections by level, junior varsity, varsity, sophomore and reasons for ejections. A greater number of ejections resulted from "malicious contact" when sliding into a base. (Thirty-three (33) of them were sliding into the catcher.) Mr. Harty explained that a new rules change at the national level on sliding and heavy emphasis at rules meetings next spring, would help clean up much of the activity related to malicious contact, the result of not sliding. It was pointed out that a base runner has two options to avoid being put out on a tag and that is to go around the fielder, or to slide. If they should bowl the fielder over and it is interpreted as malicious contact, then it is an automatic ejection from the ball game as malicious contact is an unsportsmanlike violation. Discussion followed with ejections for profanity, throwing bats, helmets, and other forms of unsportsmanlike conduct, etc.

The Baseball Coaches Advisory Committee will be reviewing the ejection report in detail at their Monday, September 30, 1991, meeting likewise.

BUNT SITUATIONS


- A. Man on 1st base:
 - a. When you are anticipating the sacrifice bunt, charge in when the pitcher throws the ball.
 - If the ball is bunted hard to you, make the play to 2nd base. (The catcher will call this play.)
 - c. If play at 2nd base is doubtful, make sure you get one out by throwing to lst base.
- B. Runners on 1st and 2nd:
 - a. The 3rd baseman's judgment is the key to this play, and he is in full charge of the play.
 - Position is just inside of the line and four steps in front of the bag, and stationary.
 - c. Tell the pitcher he must field the ball. IMPORTANT: Know your pitcher's fielding ability.

NOTE: ONE OUT MUST BE MADE IN THIS SITUATION.

- The bunted ball the pitcher can handle easily. The 3rd baseman will cover the base without taking his eyes off the ball. Tag the base with your right foot for better balance, to be in position to make the throw to lst base.
- On balls bunted down the line, the 3rd baseman charges the ball and runs the pitcher off.
- If your judgment is to go for the ball, run the pitcher off at all times. The play to lat base is much easier for the 3rd baseman in this situation.
- C. Runners on 1st and 2nd:
 - Situation #3 is an option and must be controlled by a sign. The pitcher, lst baseman and 3rd baseman charge toward the batter. The shortstop bluffs the runner back to 2nd, then races to 3rd.


