

AWARD: The recipient of the Vince Meyer Award was Chris Crome of Davenport North. This award is given in memory of long-time baseball coach at Bancroft
St. John's, and is given to a player selected from the list of players who were
nominated for the academic all-state team. This award is announced at the Recognition Brunch and presented to the player who exhibits the high academic and
athletic standards which Coach Meyer exemplified during his career as a coach and
teacher.

Chris Crome had an ACT score of 31; he ranked 14th in his graduating class of 238. He participated in Basketball where he was Captain and point guard. He was on the Varsity Track Team. He was a member of the National Honor Society. He had a 4.0 GPA, while taking AP chemistry, calculus, and English, and advanced biology. He was Employee of the Year & Month (K-Mart); Junior Rotarian; Science Club; and voted most likely to succeed by classmates. He was team Captain of the baseball Team and was selected to play in the Iowa AAU Select Baseball Team tour of Japan. Chris won many scholarships his senior year. In baseball, he hit .457, with 48 hits, 12 doubles, 3 triples and 3 Homeruns. Driving in 27 runs, striking out only 5 times.

LARGE SCHOOL EAST--CHAMPS

1993 NATIONAL FEDERATION BASEBALL RULE CHANGES:

Beginning with the 1993 season, Rule 1-1-5 requires all non-adult bat/ball shag to wear batting helmets while in live ball area, even when the ball is dead.

Another rule change concerning safety, Rule 1-2-3, prohibits media representatives covering the game from being in live ball area.

Rule 1-3-5, a bat shall not weigh five units less than its length, as expressed in the ratio of its weight in ounces to its length in inches.. (For example, a 35-inch bat may weight 30 ounces, but if a bat of the same length weights 29 ounces, it is considered illegal.)

Rule 3-3-1-f, which states that members of the team at bat shall remain in the area of the on-deck circles while pitchers are warming up.

Rule 8-2-6 would be considered the most significant. This rule stipulates that when interference occurs, runners return to bases occupied at the time of interference.

Rule 6-2-1-g prohibits a pitcher from wearing tape or other foreign material on the fingers or palm of his pitching hand.

Rule 10-2-3-j requires the umpire-in-chief to record all team warnings.

Rule 10-2-3-i requires that a protest of the last play of the game be made before the umpires leave the field.

The Committee also amended the following rules interpretations:

Rule 5-1-1-e The ball remains alive and the runner is not out when hit by a fair batted ball (i.e., ball caroms off third base) while in foul territory.

Rule 6-1-2 While in the windup position and in contact with the pitcher's plate, once the pitcher separates his hands or brings his hands together, the pitcher shall continue his pitching motion.

Rule 8-2 Penalty In all instances, when the ball is dead and the runner touches a succeeding base after missing a base or leaving a base too soon on a caught fly ball, the umpire shall wait until the end of playing action to call the runner out, instead of when the runner touches the next succeeding base.

SYNOPSIS OF THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING
, OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL
OF THE IOWA HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

REQUEST OF CARROLL PUBLIC AND CARROLL, KUEMPER CATHO-LIC SCHOOLS TO COHOST THE SUMMER STATE BASEBALL TOURNA-MENT. Request has been made by Carroll Public and Kuemper Catholic to cohost the

MENT. Request has been made by Carroll Funite and Rueinjer Candida to summer state baseball tournament as a consideration when the current contract expires with Marshalltown. Marshalltown has been the site for several years and has done an outstanding job. Following review the Director will visit Carroll and the physical facilities for further review and study.

STATE BASEBALL TOURNAMENT REVIEWED. Mr. Harty reviewed briefly the culmination of the state series of baseball tournaments culminating with the state summer high school baseball tournament in Marshalltown. The district and substate tournament series were plagued with a lot of postponements due to inclement weather and the state tournament delayed by one day due to rain. The state tournament semifinal games began Friday, July 31, 1992, with the 1-A and 2-A schools and then on Saturday, August 1, 1992, with the 3-A and 4-A schools, following with the state championships in all four classes Monday, August 3, 1992. It was pointed out that the state tournament manager George Funk, Athletic Director, Marshalltown High School, and his staff did an excellent job in field preparation for tournament play. It takes a large core of personnel to put on a tournament of that magnitude with maintenance of facilities, ticket selling and taking, concessions, etc. The Marshalltown staff did an excellent job, as usual. Mr. Harty indicated the attendance at the three days of state tournament play was excellent considering the inclement weather that leadup to state tournament play.

BASEBALL ADDED TO THE LIST OF SPORT PROGRAMS RATED BY

SCHOOLS. A thorough review was made by the Board of Control of the ejection reports submitted for the summer high school baseball program. There were 155 ejections, grades 7-12, during the 1991-92 baseball season. The ejection rule dictates that any student disqualified from an interscholastic athletic contest by game officials for flagrant, violent or verbal misconduct will be ineligible for the next regular scheduled game/meet at that level of competition and all other games/meets in the interim at any level in addition to any other penalties the IHSAA or school may assess. There were 18 more ejections in the 1991-92 than in 1990-91, which means an increase of 13%. In 1989-90 there were 106 ejections; in 1990-91 there were 137 ejections; and in 1991-92 there were 155. Rationale for ejections stems from malicious contact, profanity, failure to slide, verbal unsportsmanlike conduct, throwing equipment, flagrant misconduct, faking a tag, and hurdling the catcher. There were 21 coach ejections, grades 7-12, during the 1991-92 baseball season. Twelve of these were at the varsity level, five at the assistant varsity level, two junior varsity, one sophomore, and one freshman coach. Reasons for ejections stemmed from arguing judgment/verbal misconduct, profanity, removing team from field, and bumping an umpire. A complete copy of the 1991-92 baseball player coach ejection report follows.

Members continued to discuss the ramifications of the ejection report and the accountability of schools in reference to the ejections. It was suggested that the Coaches Advisory Committee have an opportunity to review the matter with recommended input to the Board of Control. It was also suggested that consideration be given to the rating of the baseball schools, the same as is done in football, basketball and wrestling. The officials rate the schools based upon conduct, sportsmanship, and general behavior of the coaches, players and spectators. Iowa has long been a leader in good sportsmanship, ethics and integrity. With the difficulties that are being encountered in baseball, the rating system be considered as implementation for the program such as is the case with the other sports. Through the rating system the Association hopes to promote good sportsmanship and more pleasant relations between member schools and communities and that good sportsmanship is paramount to a sound interscholastic athletic program. In specific, baseball is experiencing too many ejections, the result of poor conduct. Following a thorough review, (MM-S) Pierce - Flege that effective with the 1993 baseball season, the rating system be implemented as in football, basketball, and wrestling and that the Executive Director correspond with the school administration and coaches with reference to a resolve for improved conduct. In addition, Mr. Harty will place said item on the Coach's Advisory Committee's agenda, with recommended input from that group back to the Board of Control as well as to review with the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches as a group. Said item will be placed on the Representative Council's agenda for their March meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

CLASSIFICATION COMMITTEE REPORT REVIEWED. Members briefly reviewed the sports Classification Committee's report and recommendations as it affects the sport programs of basketball, baseball, track, and golf. The sports Classification Committee is recommending the following with said recommendations to be first shared with the Representative Council at their Monday, June 15, 1992, meeting, prior to official action of the Board of Control.

1)Classification basketball be: 4-A, 3-A; 2-A and 1-A. This would be as follows:

4-A - 48 schools
3-A - 64 schools
1-A - remaining

Likewise, if and when there are 150 or less schools in the 1-A the 2-A will become 96 rather than 128 and the remaining schools will be Class 1-A.

2)The same classifications of baseball and track was recommended, with the same 150 figure being used for the bottom class.

3)A second report would be presented to the Council. A minority indicated that for basketball and baseball the 32 largest schools qualify 4 for the state tournament; the next
