1993 25th ANNUAL CLINIC: The Coaches Association announces the 25th annual Clinic, February 12-13-14, 1993, in Cedar Rapids at Washington High School and University of Iowa on Sunday. The coaching clinics will begin at 1:05 p.m. on Friday, February 12, and will continue to 4:30 p.m. on Saturday. Saturday evening will be the Award Banquet, highlighted by the Hall of Fame and Coach and Umpire of the Year Awards. Sunday the Clinic will move to the Iowa Bubble in Iowa City.

The Steering Committee and the Board of Directors will be meeting prior to the start of the Clinic. They will meet Thursday, starting at 7:30 p.m. We hope to have exhibitors that will display all the latest in baseball equipment and coaching aids. This Clinic promises to uphold the tradition of the past Clinics.

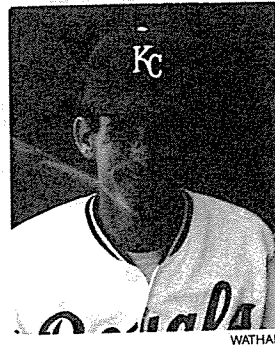

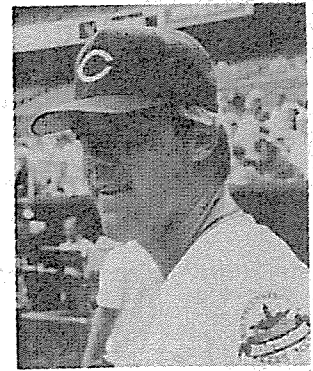
CLINIC SPEAKERS:

JOHN WATHAN: Former Manager of the Kansas City Royals and presently third base coach of the California Angels, brings us a wealth of experience as a player and manager of professional baseball. John started his career as a catcher, first baseman at San Diego University for Coach Cunningham, where he was an All-American, playing in the Pam-Am Series. He signed with the Royals in 1971 and played in the minor leagues for 5 years before joining the Royals in 1976. He has a life time average of .262 and played in 6 different league championships and two world series. John retired from playing in 1986 and became the manager of the Omaha Royals. Going to the big leagues as Manager in 1987. He managed the Royals for 4 years. Since then he has been the third base coach for the Angels and filled in for Buck Rodgers as manager for the Angels. He is being inducted into the Hall of Fame as a contributor!



WATHAN

BRUCE KIMM: Played his high school baseball in Norway and signed with the Chicago White Sox in 1969. Bruce played 7 years in the minors before going up to the majors as a catcher. He was traded to the Detroit Tigers, where he caught the "Bird" Fidrych. Bruce then was traded to the Cubs and then back to the White Sox in 1980. Bruce retired from baseball in 1981. Since then he has gone into managing in the Red's organization and became the third base coach for Pete Rose, and for the past 9 years he has coached in the major leagues. His last coaching job was with the San Diego Padres as a third base coach. Bruce was an All-Stater in High School. In 1993, Bruce will be the Double A manager in the Atlanta Braves organization.



BRUCE KIMM

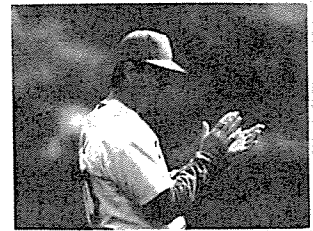
BOB OLDIS: Spent 21 years in professional baseball, 11 1/2 in major leagues, as a catcher for the Washington Senators, Pittsburgh and Philadelphia and spent the last five years as a coach on a major league teams; Phillies, Twins, Expos and is presently scouting for the Montreal Expos. He has been scouting supervisor for many years with the Expos. Bob comes from Iowa City.

DUANE BANKS: Head baseball coach at the University of Iowa since 1970. His overall record at Iowa is 685-445 (61.2%). Banks was inducted into the A.B.C.A. Hall of Fame last year and is a IHSBCA Hall of Famer. He has served as past president of the A.B.C.A. and is one of the leading college coaches in the country. Duane has been named both Big Ten Conference and District Coach-of-the-Year. Many of his former Hawkeyes have earned pro contracts and several have made it to the major leagues.

BOB RANDALL: Former Minnesota Twin second baseman, now coaching in his ninth year as Iowa State University head coach. Bob's 1992 team was one of the best in many years at Iowa State, with a 32-23 record, while posting the fewest losses of any Cyclone squad under the tutelage of Randall. The past four years the Cyclones have had winning campaigns. Bob has sent 12 players into the professional ranks, several going into the big leagues. Bob played his college baseball at Kansas State, signed his first professional contract after being selected an All-Big Eight shortstop. He was drafted by the Dodgers and spent six years in their minor league system before being traded to the Twins in 1975. His best years was 1978 when he hit .270.



Bobby Randall has led the Cyclones to three straight Big Eight Tournament appearances, becoming one of only two teams in the league since 1989 to accomplish that feat.

JIM DIMICK: Baseball Coach at St. Olaf College, Northfield, Minnesota. Jim has given many clinics throughout the U.S.. This year he is the President of the American Baseball Coaches Association. Jim's teams have won over 400 games. He was the recipient of the Dick Siebert Award in 1978 for contributions to baseball in Minnesota. He is one of the most respected speakers in America.

CAL ELDRED: Urbana native, now on the pitching staff of the Milwaukee Brewers, coming off a 11-2 record last year. Cal was a first round draft pick in 1989 with the Brewers, playing 3 years in the minors before being called up to the big leagues in 1991. Cal finished the 1992 season as one of the best young pitchers in baseball.

JACK ROEDER: General Manager of the Cedar Rapids Kernels (formerly the Red's), has been a General Manager in minor league baseball for 10 years, the past two with Cedar Rapids. Jack grew up in Goose Lake and went to Clinton Comm. College. He coached after graduating from college back at Clinton Comm. College. He went into professional baseball as an assistant GM and then took the head GM job at Wausau, WI. He came to Cedar Rapids in 1991. The past year he was named Midwest League General Manager of the Year. This was his second honor as GM of Year. Jack is one of the best in the minor league system.

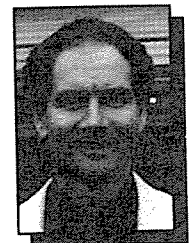
JIM VAN SCOYOC: Former coach at Norway High School, coached for 24 years with an over-all record of 850-275. His former team won more state championships than any team in Iowa. Jim is a member of the 500 win club and has received his 20 year longevity award. He has served on the Board of Directors and coached in two All-Star series. He is a Hall of Fame member and a charter member of the Association. Presently he is a pitching coach for a Detroit Tigers minor league team.

CEDARRAPIDS:

Seven new members will be inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association at its annual clinic and awards banquet in Cedar Rapids, Saturday, February 13, 1993.

New inductees to be honored at the IHSBCA Twenty-Fifth Annual Clinic Banquet are JAMES DENNER, Waverly-Shell Rock; BILL HUISMAN, Centerville; GARY PAULSEN, Ogden; DICK SCHULTZ, Humboldt; JOHN WATHAN, Kansas City; LENNY WEIH, Clinton; LOU YACINICH, Des Moines.

The seven names bring to 133 the number of Hall of Fame members. The honor roll now includes 84 coaches, 23 players, 21 umpires, and 5 contributors.

JAMES DENNER: graduated from Fredericksburg High School and attended Wartburg College and graduated in 1951. He began his teaching career in Montour. He moved to Shell Rock and then on to Waverly in 1960. His over-all record was 352 wins and 247 losses in 28 years of coaching. At Waverly his team won three conference championship titles, two districts and a trip to the State in 1977. He has been a member of the coaches association since 1970, serving on the All-State Coach, Hall of Fame and Membership Committees.

BILL HUISMAN: attended Goldfield High School and Kansas State University. In high school Bill lettered four years. As a coach, he led his team to the State Runner ups in the fall of 1966, and State Champions in 1988. He was a semi-pro player in Central Iowa playing at Eagle Grove, Rippey and Fort Dodge. He was named All-American (shortstop) in Wichita National Tournament. He was an "All Big Eight" second baseman in college. He signed with the Cubs in 1970 and played with San Antonio and the Midland Cubs. He had over 600 hits in the Texas League. He has coached 7 Conference championships over the past nine years.

GARY PAULSEN: graduated from Hills, Mn. High School and then attended Westmar College in LeMars. Gary started his teaching and coaching career at Floyd valley Schools and moved to Ogden in 1969, to become the Middle School principal and remains in that position today. Gary has been an umpire for 30 years, working numerous high school and college games yearly. He has worked twenty consecutive summer tournaments and many fall tournaments. He also worked in 11 All-Star series. He has been recognized as Central District Umpire of the year various times and was selected as State Umpire of the year in 1985. He also serves on the Membership Committee and the Umpires Committee for the Coaches Association.

DICK SCHULTZ: is a graduate of Kellogg High School and Central College. He was a four-year letter winner in baseball at both schools. Dick was the player-manager for several semi-pro teams: Kellogg Cardinals, Estherville, and Storm Lake Whitecaps. He was drafted by the St. Louis Browns in 1952 but decided not to report to spring training. He taught and coached at Humboldt High School from 1950-60 where he won over 75% of his games as a baseball coach. Dick was assistant baseball coach at the Univ. of Iowa from 1960-62, and was head coach from 1963-70. During his tenure as head coach he compiled a 129-106 record. Dick also served as a special scout for the Phillies from 1953-1960. He authored a baseball text that was used for the "Theory of Baseball Class" at the University of Iowa. He conducted baseball clinics throughout the state and he served as commissioner for a summer league for college players. Dick coached a number of major league player over his coaching career. Dick has also served as the Iowa Basketball Coach, A.D. at Cornell University and Univ. of Virginia. He is currently serving as the Executive Director of the NCAA.

JOHN WATHAN: born in Cedar Rapids and spent seven years in the off-seasons working in Cedar Rapids for his father and also officiated football and basketball in the area. He was a three-sport performer in high school--football, basketball, and baseball. He attended the University of San Diego and played basketball and baseball, earning the University's "Hustle Award" in both sports. He received 2nd team All-American honors, and he played on the 1970 U.S. World Amateur Team helping them to a 2nd place finish. John was drafted by the Kansas City Royals in 1971, and in 1975 he was the American Association All-Star Catcher. John came up to the Royals major league club in 1976 and was an active member of the club through 1985. His career batting average was .262 and he set the major league record for stolen bases with 36. John was a member of each of the Royals six A.L. West Championship teams and of two World Series squads. He was primarily a catcher but was valuable as a 1st baseman and outfielder, and was a key performer as a pinch hitter for the Royals. He was released as manager of the Royals after serving 4 years and presently is the bench coach for the California Angels after filling in as manager last year. He has been very instrumental in bringing in speakers to our clinic each year since 1973.

LENNY WEIH: a graduate of Durant High School and the University of Dubuque. He lettered in baseball three years at Durant and four years at the Univ. of Dubuque. He was captain of the baseball team in his junior and senior years at the Univ. of Dubuque. He began his coaching career at Durant High School where he coached for two years before moving to Clinton High School. He coached sixteen years as head coach at Clinton, where he collected 262 wins, five district titles, and one MAC conference title. In 1980, his team was 26-6. He had eight consecutive winning seasons from 1974 to 1980 in the tough MAC conference. Lenny coached in three All-Star series and served as the head coach in 1989. He has been a long time member of the Coaches Association. During this time, he has served on eight committees, and currently is serving a Chairman of the Steering Committee, after serving in all of the officers positions over the past five years.

LOU YACINICH: is currently a professor, Athletic Director, and head baseball coach at Grandview College in Des Moines. He attended Grandview and graduated from Drake University. He has been coaching a total of 25 years; eight at the high school level. During this time he has compiled a 523-365 record. His JUCO team was Iowa Juco champion in 1974 and 1975. He has been active in the NAIA where he serves on the Academic All-American Committee and on the Rules Committee. In 1992 he served as chairman of the NAIA world series held in Des Moines. He has been the Baseball Chair for District 15 and Baseball Chair for Area 4 of the NAIA. Lou has developed an outstanding program at Grandview. He regularly schedules the best competition including Division I schools and is successful. The base of his program is Iowa talent. Lou is especially proud of three of his players who achieved 1st Team Academic All-American status, and also that 97% of his players graduate.

MEETING MINUTES

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING IOWA CITY, IOWA OCT. 18, 1992

The semi-annual meeting of the Board of Directors of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association was called to order by President Jim Donohue at 9:40 AM in the Big Ten room at Carver-Hawkeye Arena on the campus of the University of Iowa. Twenty-seven members were present. President Donohue welcomed everyone. After everyone introduced themselves to the group, President Donohue thanked Duane Banks for once again hosting the meeting and serving such a delicious brunch. Secretary Phil Lebo read the minutes of the previous meeting. The motion for acceptance was made by Gary Paulsen and seconded by Steve Westphal. Motion carried.

Executive Secretary Primrose gave the financial report with the following balances in the various accounts: Checking: \$638.24; S.C.I.: \$2,292.76; Savings Bank: \$147.07; Total cash on hand: \$3,078.07. The motion to accept the financial report was made by John Zahn and seconded by Rich Stoffer. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

President's Report (Jim Donohue):

President Donohue will select the state nominee for National Coach of the Year.

Executive Secretary's Report (Pinky Primrose):

1. The 1992 All-star Series was a success. Several comments were made about the series. The barbecue went well. The radio coverage was enjoyed. There were many good comments about the ball park and its fine condition. It was mentioned that each stadium hosting the series must have a tarp available so inclement weather would not interfere with the schedule. Many liked the idea of one series per day.

Discussion regarding the poor press coverage of the series ensued. Seventy-five press releases including team rosters were sent out to various media representatives across the state in an effort to bolster state-wide coverage of this series. But the series received little or no coverage. Discussion was held regarding how to improve this problem.

2. The All-star Series for 1993 will be in Council Bluffs and headed by Lee Toole. The Series will be in Iowa City in 1994 and in Ames in 1995.

3. There is a new format for the Clinic for 1993. It will be held in February on the 12, 13, and 14 (Friday through Sunday). In Cedar Rapids on Friday the 12th, the clinic will run from 1:00-5:30 PM. Committee meetings will be held Friday evening. On Saturday the 13th, the FCA breakfast will be held in the morning, and the clinic will last until 4:30 PM. The banquet will be held Saturday evening. On Sunday, the 14th, the clinic will move to Iowa City in the "Bubble" on the University of Iowa campus. Starting at 10:00 AM, Coach Duane Banks and his players will conduct a positions clinic which will involve coaches rotating between 9-10 stations for instruction.

Many excellent high school, college, and professional coaches are lined up to speak at the clinic.

4. There was some discussion regarding whether or not softball coaches should be offered a part in the clinic.

6. Due to the rising costs of clinic expenses, the association may have to consider increasing clinic fees.

7. Duane Banks will check with the NCAA to see if students may attend the positions clinic on Sunday at the University of Iowa.

8. Duane Banks introduced the University of Iowa Athletic Director Bob Bowsby. Bob welcomed the board members in attendance.

Hall of Fame Committee Report: (Roger Hoel):

More nominations are needed and new nominees were discussed.

Umpires Committee Report: (Gary Paulsen):

The Committee was working well. The umpires are undecided as to how they want to run their part of the clinic.

Umpire Bob Burns reported that the umpires committee nominated Gary Paulsen for the Umpires' Hall of Fame. The motion was made by Bob Burns and seconded by Bob Watson to induct Gary Paulsen into the Hall of Fame. Motion carried.

Clinic Report: (Pinky Primrose):

Pinky is going to proceed with setting up the clinic and will work closely with Duane Banks to finalize the line-up of speakers.

Vince Meyer Academic Report: (Ed Feyen):

Many good nominations were sent in for this award. Discussion was conducted about how to streamline the application for this award. Everything will remain the same except the PSAT will be omitted.

This committee will look into whether or not the recipient should be a member of one of the All-Star teams. This year only two nominees were on an All-star team. Then members discussed how the point system should be set up for determining how the recipient is selected. No final decision was made.

Steering Committee (Lenny Weih):

Lenny reported that selecting the All-Star coaches was exciting.

Lenny would like to target keeping more past presidents involved in an active role in the association's work.

It is difficult to get large school candidates for All-star coaches. A question was raised about the feasibility of bringing back some past presidents to fill in as the assistant coaches.

There have been difficulties in selecting players to fill the large-school all-star rosters. Perhaps having the application form state that coaches may make unlimited nominations could help. Then All-star coaches could choose two players from a school.

1993 All-star Committee Report: (Lee Toole):

Lee stated that Council Bluffs is honored to be able to host the 1993 All-star Series. Lee reported that many tentative arrangements have already been made. Several local businesses are willing to sponsor or contribute money to take care of programs, television coverage, and additional food for the players. The Chamber of Commerce has offered to help organize outside entertainment activities for the players. The teams will be staying at the Best Western on 24th Street which is located one and one-half miles from the stadium. He also handed out baseball hats and T-shirts to help promote the series which will be held August 5, 6, 7, and 8.

A recommendation to increase the sponsor fee from \$100.00 to \$125.00 per participant was discussed.

Awards Committee Report: (Ed Feyen):

The Committee would like to establish a Distinguished Person Award which would recognize a former high school baseball player who has gone on to distinguish himself later in life. Coaches will nominate this person by filling out an application similar to the contributor form. The award winner will receive a plaque.

Communications: (Pinky Primrose):

Many thank-you's were received from coaches and players who participated in the 1992 All-star Series.

Advisory Committee: (Jim Mahoney):

This committee met during the first week in October. The two main areas of emphasis were sportsmanship and ejections from games. It was stated that the summer sports are not policed like the sports during the rest of the year. A suggestion was made that perhaps coaches should be granted a "time-out" to approach the umpire about a decision. There have been some misunderstandings of the pitching limitations in regards to when the new week starts. One clarification could be to list the unavailable pitchers on the line-up card. Another matter for discussion was the open-gym policy.

OLD BUSINESS: None

NEW BUSINESS:

Two four-year college coaches were nominated for the Coach of the Year ballot.

Pinky recommended that the \$100.00 sponsor fee for participants in the All-star Series be raised to \$125.00 in order to help defray the rising costs. Following discussion, the motion was made by John Zahn and seconded by Jim Kloewer to increase the fee. Motion carried.

A decision was made to keep the format for scheduling that was used in the 1992 series. Each team played one game per day during the four-day series.

A motion was made by Larry Barr and seconded by Terry Heald to accept the nominees for the Hall of Fame. Motion carried.

A discussion regarding the association membership fee was held. A motion was made by Jim Kloewer and seconded by Joel Johnson that two coaches from one school will pay \$20.00 each and any additional coaches from the same school will pay \$10.00 each. For example, if three coaches from one school join the association at the same time, their membership dues will total \$50.00. Motion carried.

Nominations for National Coach of the Year were accepted, and the final nominee will be selected by President Jim Donohue.

Nominations for the Cap Timm President's Award and the Marv Thelen Contributor's Award were accepted and voted on.

The members in attendance broke into district groups to select the candidates for District Coaches and Umpires of the Year. The group reconvened following these selections.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Larry Barr and seconded by Gary Paulsen. The meeting was adjourned.

1992 COLLEGE SEASON

The following coaches sent us information about their 1992 season. We hope sharing this with you, you will have a better idea about College Coach of Year.

FOUR YEAR SCHOOLS:

University of Iowa: Duane Banks has been coaching at Iowa for 26 years with an over-all record of 776-457. His 1992 season record was 26-28, finishing 7th in the Big Ten. He had 5 players drafted from the 1992 team.

Iowa State University: Bob Randall has been coaching at Iowa State for 8 years. His 1992 season record was 33-24, finishing 3rd in the Big Eight with a 11-13 record. ISU capped the season by joining Oklahoma State as one of just two teams to qualify for the Big Eight Tournament for the fourth straight year. Out of 20 of the Iowa players on his roster, 4 made second team All-Big Eight. They were John Camelin of Boone; Mark Elsinger of Beckman Dyersville; Kent Cesler of Davenport West and Don Wengert of Sioux City Heelan.

Simpson College: John Siranni has been coaching at Simpson for 10 years. Four of his players were recognized by the Conference. Barry Stein of Ankeny, 1st team All-Conference and 2nd team All-Region; Joe Blake, Indianola, 1st team All-conference and 1st Team All-Region; Ben Blake, Indianola, 1st team All-Region and 2nd team All-Conference; Troy Plummer, Saydel, 2nd Team All-Conference.

Grinnell College: Patt Foster has been coaching at Grinnell for 5 years. His 1992 record was 3-20, finishing 6th in the Midwest Collegiate Conference. Justin Hupfer of C.R. Prairie was named to the 2nd team All-Conference and 1st team Academic. He was the team's leading hitter with a .424 average.

Buena Vista College: Lanny Grigsby has been coaching at BV for 3 years after being an assistant for 20 years. His 1992 team record was 15-17, finishing 4th in the Iowa Conference. His over-all college record is 34-64.

Coe College: Damon Walker has been coaching at Coe for 1 year. His team finished with a 12-12 record, coming in 4th in the Midwest Athletic Conference.

Upper Iowa: Rick Heller has been coaching at Upper Iowa for 5 years. His 1992 team record was 23-16, coming in 3rd in the Iowa Conference. Rick's over-all record is 81-99. His team set a school record for wins in a season.

Dubuque University: Dennis Rima has been coaching at Dubuque for 3 years. His 1992 team record was 17-20, finishing 4th in the Iowa Conference. His over-all college record is 36-65. Highlight of the season was winning 9 out of the last 12 games to finish 4th.

Central College: John Edwards has been coaching at Central for 16 years. His 1992 team record was 10-20, finishing 8th in the Iowa Conference. His over-all record is 196-265. He had a very young team that played very well at the end of the season.

St. Ambrose: Todd Becker has been coaching at St. Ambrose for 2 years. His 1992 team record was 25-23, finishing 2nd in the Midwest Classic Conference. His over-all record is 42-53. 1992 was the first winning season since 1986.

Grand View College: Lou Yacinich has been coaching at Grand View for 29 years. His 1992 team record was 39-22, finishing 3rd in the Midwest Classic Conference. Lou's over-all record is 562-414. His 1992 team tied a season win record of 39 wins. Pitcher Joe Barbeln signed by the Los Angeles Dodgers. Grand View hosted the NAIA World Series.

Northwestern College: Mark Bloemendaal has been coaching for 1 year at Northwest. His 1992 team record was 16-30. This was the first year in the Nebr-Iowa Conference. Mark TeGrotenhuis of Sioux Center set a school record with 11 home runs. He was named All-NAIA Dist. 15.

Clark College: Ed Feyen has been coaching for 2 years at Clarke College. His 1992 team record was 8-23. The 1992 team had a lot of Iowa players on it. Michael Duenser will be the 1993 head coach.

Univ. of Northern Iowa: David Schrage has been coaching for 9 years, moving from Waldorf College to U.N.I.. His 1992 team record was 22-34, finishing 8th in the Missouri Valley Conf.. David's over-all record is 96-145. Highlight of the 1992 was the fifth time in school history that they won 20 games. They return 22 players for the 1993 season. Tom Bach of Center Point and Chad Rezac, Lincoln Central were Honorable Mention M.V. C..

JUNIOR COLLEGES:

North Iowa Area Comm. College: Jerry Dunbar has been coaching for 9 years at NIAC. His 1992 team record was 13-22. Jerry's over-all record was 135-150. Highlight of the 1992 season was their spring trip to Harrison, Arkansas.

Southeastern Comm. College: Jeff Bloomer has been coaching for 4 years. His 1992 team record was 26-11. Jeff's over-all record is 62-71. The 26-11 record was best in the school history! Kurt Featheringill of Fort Madison; Tim Goodwin, Burlington; and Scott Mason, Burlington, made All-Southeast Sub Region Team.

Southwestern Comm. College: Bill Krejci has been coaching for 14 years. His 1992 team record was 28-22.
