PINKY PRIMROSE RECIPIENT OF '95 GOMEZ

Harold "Pinky" Primrose

1995 Left Gomez Award Recipient

Harold "Pinky" Primrose, considered a principal player in the successful efforts to bring high school coaches into what was then known as the American Association of College Baseball Coaches, has been named the 1995 recipient of the Lefty Gomez Award.

A native Iowan, Primrose coached at Lisbon, Norway and Washington High School in Cedar Rapids for 34 years, winning over 700 games, and still teaches American Government and physical education classes. He also coached at Coe College for eight years, and his activities with professional baseball included a current role as an associate scout for the Kansas City Royals. Primrose is one of the co-founders and a past president of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches, for which he continues to serve as Executive Secretary.

In 1974, Primrose became the High School Chairman of the A.A.C.B.C., the forerunner of the ABCA, and served on the Association's Executive Board until 1988. At the beginning of his service, high school coaches were not full-fledged members of the Association. Primrose's position on the board was an advisory one, and it proved to be highly influential; in 1982 the membership of the ABCA voted to accept high school coches with full membership status. The name of the organization was changed to the American Baseball Coaches Association.

Primrose was named AACBC High School Coach of the Year in 1980, and he was inducted into the ABCA Hall of Fame in 1987. He is also a member of the I.H.S.B.C.A. Hall of Fame, and has received several district and conference coaching honors for his coaching abilities. But it is the fact that his capabilities extended off-the-field which led to the dynamic growth of what is today known as the ABCA.

The Lefty Gomez Award, sponsored by Wilson Sporting Goods Company, is presented annually to someone who has made exceptional contributions to amateur baseball, as selected by the ABCA Lefty Gomez Award Committee. Wilson will donate \$1,000 in Harold "Pinky" Primrose's name to an amateur baseball program of his choice.

IOWA HIGH SCHOOL BASEBAL COACHES ASSOCIAITON NEW RELEASE

TO BE RELEASED ANYTIME 1995 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Seven new members will be inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association at its annual clinic and awards banquet in Cedar Rapids, Saturday, February 11, 1995.

New inductees to be honored at the IHSBCA Twenty-Seventh Annual Banquet are: Larry Barr, Scranton; Vic Belger, Creston; Dick Bertel, Ames; Gene Hannon, Bedford, (Deceased); Mel Murken, Ankeny; Flo Primrose, Cedar Rapids; Ron Reifert, Muscatine.

The seven names bring to 147 the number of Hall of Fame members. The honor roll now includes 91 coaches, 26 players, 23 umpires, and 7 Contributors.

LARRY BARR: has umpired baseball since 1970. Before he became an umpire, he played High School and Semi-Pro Town Team baseball. He accidentally got into umpiring by attending a Babe Ruth tournament one day and was asked to umpire when the umpires failed to show up for the game. He has worked in eleven State High School Baseball Tournaments and in seven All-Star Series. Larry has been Southwest District Umpire of the Year three times. He enjoys umpiring because it keeps him around young people and the game he loves.

VIC BELGER: is the head coach at Creston High School. He has been coaching for 27 years with an over-all record of 709-202. He has coached prior to Creston at Bayler Central, in Rockford, IL; OLGC Fonda; rockwell City; Rodykford, Colorado.. He attended Iowa City High School lettering 4 years; earned a freshman letter at the University of Iowa, and lettered three years at Upper Iowa. Vic played amateur ball in Iowa City, Stanwood and Watkins, playing in the NBC National Tournament twice. he has served on numerous association committees and served on the Board of Directors for many years. Vic has won numerous District Coach of the Year awards and is a member of the 500 Win Club; he was an All-Star Coach. His 1969 OLGC Fall team won a State Fall Championship and his 1990 Creston team was a State runner-up. His teams have made numerous state tournament appearances and won district and sectional titles. Vic is a real student of the game and his teams are always well prepared and know the game of baseball.

DICK BERTEL: played his college baseball for Coach Cap Timm at Iowa State University and became an All-American catcher. He signed after college with the Chicago Cubs, making the major league team in 1960. Dick played in the majors for 7 years, having a life-time batting average of .244. He caught in 444 games, getting 327 hits. Dick was traded to the Giants in 1965 and then came back to the Cubs in 1966. He retired from baseball after the 1966 season.

GENE HANNON:Gene died at the age of 59 in 1984. He coached baseball and taught P.E. for 30 years at Bedford. The high school baseball field is dedicated Hannon Memorial Field in memory of him. In 1982, Gene was named AD of the Year in Southwest lowa. He loved baseball and lived it every day of his life. His overall record was 372 wins with 10 or more conference titles. Thirty of his former students are teachers and 21 are coaching.

MEL MURKEN: is the head coach at Ankeny High School. He has been coaching for 28 years with an over-all record of 492-315. He has had five conference championships, 5 second place conference finishes, four district championships, four sub-state appearances and four sub-state championships, four state tournament appearances and the 1993 State Championship title. Many of Mel's players have been selected for All-District/All -State honors, All-Star games, and have contintued playing baseball at the college level. He is a member of the 400 win club, and the 25 Year Longevity Club. He was named State Coach of Year in 1993.

FLO PRIMROSE: Flo has been active in the lowa High Scool Baseball Coaches Association since the beginning of the organization. She is the wife of Executive Secretary Pinky Primrose. Flo has worked with the organization in many capacities: helping with the All-Star Series; helping with the annual clinic; helping in writing the association newsletter; helping in the day-to-day work of keeping the IHSBCA a great and successful organization. Flo is a full-time teacher in the Cedar Rapids district and has been presented the President's Award by the association. Her hard work for the past 26 years has contributed to maintaining a quality organization. The behind-the-scenes work Flo has done has helped the IHSBCA become one of the best high school baseball coaches' associations in the country.

RON REIFERT: attended Muscatine High School from 1955-58. He was an outstanding player on an outstanding baseball team. He was a pitcher on the baseball team for four years and during that time his record was 36-1. Among his 36 wins were four nohitters. Also during this time, the Muscatine baseball team won three state championship titles. The team record over these four years was an amazing 60 wins and only 4 losses. There was also a stretch of 40 consecutive wins. Following high school, Reifert attended the University of Iowa and was a member of the baseball team for three years.. His pitching record with the Hawkeyes was 11 wins and 7 losses. Following college, Reifert coached high school teams at Calamus, Belle Plaine, and Muscatine. His over-all coaching record was over .500 and he brought winning seasons to all the schools. As a semi-pro player, he pitched for the Muscatine team and helped them win a state amateur championship.



CLINIC SPEAKERS:

RICHARD "ITCH" JONES: One of the nation's most popular



and successful coaches enters his 25th season, coaching 21 years at Southern Illinois and the past four at the University of Illinois. "Itch" has over 885 career victories, one of the nations leaders in this department. He has taken ten teams into the NCAA tournament with three appearances at the World Series. Jones has sent seven Illini players into professional baseball in the past four years, with 13 reaching the major leagues in his coaching career. Itch has coached several USA national teams over the years, serving twice

as head coach in international competition. In college he played second base, earning the MVP award for the Salukis in 1957. He is one of the nation's top clinicians, doing ten clinics already this year.

GENE McARTOR: who has coached the University of Missouri



baseball team to more than 700 victories over the last 21 years, comes to us for the first time. Gene compiled a 709-407 record as head coach of the Tigers since 1974, winning two Big Eight Conference championships and advanced to the NCAA play six times. Fifteen of his clubs have won 30-ormore games, including six 40-victory seasons. He was inducted into the ABCA Hall of Fame in January, 1993.

McArtor starred as a first baseman for the Tigers, leading the team to Big Eight Conference and NCAA District Championships in 1962 and 63. As a senior he was the team captain, and an all Big Eight selection. Presently, Gene is Assistant Athletic Director at the University of Missouri.

DICK BIRMINGHAM: Dick is a veteran of over 30 years of player development placing over 100 players in college and pro-



fessional baseball. As head coach at Hillcrest High School in Springfield, MO, and former head of Instruction at Mickey Owen, he is a nationally known clinican having spoken in 17 states plus Canada. He was voted High School Coach of Year in 1979 and was the head Coach of the North

Team at the 1983 Sports Festival. Dick is a frequent speaker at our clinic. He is a member of the ABCA and the IHSBCA Hall of Fame. He comes back by popular request.

BRUCE KIMM: Played his high school baseball in Norway and



signed with the Chicago White Sox in 1969. Bruce played 7 years in the minors before going up to the majors as a catcher. He was traded to the Detroit Tigers, where he caught the "Bird" Fidrych. Bruce then was traded to the Cubs and then back to the White Sox in 1980. Bruce retired from baseball in 1981. Since then he has gone into managing in the Red's organization and became the third base coach for Pete Rose, and for the past 9 years

he has coached in the major leagues. His last coaching job was with the San Diego Padres as a third base coach. Bruce was an All-Stater in High School. In 1993 and 1994, Bruce was a manager in the Atlanta Braves organization. In 1995, Bruce will be the manager with the Cub's Double A, Southern League, Orlando team.

DUANE BANKS: Head baseball coach at the University of Iowa



since 1970. His overall record at lowa is 830-496 (62.2%). The 1994 record was 22-32. Banks was inducted into the ABCA Hall of Fame three years ago and is an IHSBCA Hall of Famer. He has served as past president of the ABCA and is one of the leading college coaches in the country. Duane has been named both Big Ten Conference and District Coach-of-the-Year. Many of his former

Hawkeyes have earned pro contracts and several have made it to the major leagues.

BOB RANDALL: Former Minnesota Twin second baseman,



now in his tenth year as lowa State University head coach. Bob's 1994 team record was 30-28 record. The past five years the Cyclones have had winning campaigns. Bob has sent 12 players into the professional ranks, several going into the big leagues. Bob's overall record is 281-287. Bob played his college baseball at Kansas as a shortstop. He was drafted by the Dodgers and spent six years in

their minor league system before being traded to the Twins in 1975. His best year was 1978 when he hit .270.

JACK ROEDER: General Manager of the Cedar Rapids



Kernels, has been a General Manager in minor league baseball for 11 years, the past three with Cedar Rapids. Jack grew up in Goose Lake and went to Clinton Comm. College. He coached after graduating from college at Clinton Comm. College. He went into professional baseball as an assistant GM and then took the head GM job

at Wausua, WI. He came to Cedar Rapids in 1991.

MIKE ANDRESEN: Iowa Cubs head groundskeeper. Mike has a tremendous background in field maintenance. He graduated from Guthrie Center High School and went to Grand View Jr. College where he played baseball and got a degree in Commercial Horticulture. He went with a landscape company. for a number of years before becoming Supt. of Grounds at Des Moines Area Community College. He has been the head

groundskeeper at the Cubs for 4 years. In 1993, Mike was named American Association Groundkeeper of the Year.

MIKE HENDERSON: Mike will begin his second year in 1995 as Varsity Baseball Coach at Mt. Pleasant High School. In his first season at Mt. Pleasant, the Panthers recorded a mark of 19-13, second most victories in the school history.

Henderson, a native of Southern California, played collegiate baseball at Arizona State University from 1974-77. During his four years as ASU, the Sun Devils participated in three College World Series, finishing 3rd twice, and winning the National Championship in 1977, when Henderson served as Captain of Coach Jim Brock's first National Title team. During his Senior year, Henderson received All-WAC Conference, All District, and Academic All-American honors as a shortstop.

Drafted in the 11th round of the 1977 Major League draft by the Milwaukee Brewers, Henderson played 5 sesaons in the Brewers organization. He made stops in single-A at Burlington, Iowa in the Midwest league, double-A at Holyoke, Massachusetts in the Eastern League, and Vancouver, British Columbia in the Pacific Coast League. Henderson was on the 40-man winter roster of the Major League Milwaukee club in 1980, attending and playing in Spring Training with the Brewers that year.

Henderson now lives and works as a Securities Broker with Edward D. Jones and Co. in Mt. Pleasant, Iowa. He is married and has 3 children, ages 10, 8 and 6.

KIM JOHNSON: baseball coach at McHenry County College in Crystal Lake, Ill, where he has been coaching for three years. Prior to McHenry College, Kim was working with the U.S. of A Baseball Partnerships as a Regional Director, with responsibilities in organizing and operating player ability evaluation camps for athletes ages 10-18. He went to Union Whitten High School and the on to Ellsworth Community College and then graduated from William Penn College with a BA in Physical Education/Social Studies.

JIM VAN SCOYOC: former Norway High baseball coach,



presently Cedar Rapids Prairie High Coach, comes to us after spending three years with the Detroit Tigers minor leagues as a pitching coach. Jim was a very successfull coach at Norway, winning more State Championships than any other coach in Iowa. He is recognized as one of the top pitching coaches in the area. Jim is a 500 Win Club member and a 25

Year Longevity Winner. He has been a member of the Association for 25 years.

UMPIRE SPEAKERS:

CARL CHILDRESS: Carl Childress resides in Edinburg, Texas and is an active High School and College Baseball Umpire. He is the Coordinator of Independent Studies at Donna High School in Donna, Texas. A former English teacher Mr. Childress has some Iowa roots. From 1968-71 he was an instructor of English at the University of Northern Iowa. In addition to being the chief baseball rules columnist for REFEREE magazine, Carl has authored and published numerous books on baseball umpiring. His book, Baseball Rules, A comparison Guide is the "bible" for umpires who work the 3 different levels of baseball. Says Tom Hammill Editor of REFEREE magazine: "When it comes to knowledge of baseball rules and procedures, Carl Childress is without peers: He is the foremost authority of baseball rules in the U.S. today".

A frequent presenter at the annual NASO Convention the IHSB-CA is honored to have this humorous and supreme baseball man, Carl Childress at our Annual Clinic.

DAVE HARTY: Assistant Executive Secretary of the I.H.S.B.C.A. Dave was a former high school coach and administrator. He is in charge of the baseball program in the state of lowa and also in charge of the umpires.

DINNER SPEAKER BOB BOWLSBY: Athletic Director at the University of Iowa, comes as one of the top young Athletic Directors in the country. Bob, a Waterloo native, became Iowa's tenth athletic director in June 1991 after serving in the same role at the University of Northern Iowa since 1984. Bowlsby received a bachlor's degree from Moorhead State University in Minnesota in 1975 and a master's degree from the University of Iowa in 1978. Bob is chair of the Big Ten Championships and Awards Committee and a member of the league's Conference and National Structure Committee. He has managed five NCAA Wrestling Championships as chair of the Wrestling Committee and has served on NCAA committees.





A past head coach must sit out four to five years before he can coach again. An assistant coach must sit out one year before he can reapply. The committee also tries to get a balance in the state -north, central, south, etc. and also try to get coaches from the different classes. Give it a try if you haven't done it before.

BASEBALL ITEMS TAKEN FROM THE DECEMBER BULLETIN OF THE I.H.S.A.A.

STATE BASEBALL TOURNAMENT REVIEWED. Mr. Harty reviewed with members the recently completed baseball tournament held at Marshalltown High School, July 28, 29, 30, 1994. A comparative review of the attendance figures from 1986 to 1994 was made and this year was the best since 1986. It was pointed out that weather elements at the district level caused from some postponements, however, substate and state tournament ball had excellent weather in which to conduct the series.

1994 BASEBALL PLAYER EJECTION REPORT. There were 111 baseball ejections, grades 7-12 during the 1993-94 baseball season as follows: junior high - 2; 9th grade - 3; 10th grade -10; junior varsity -15; and varsity 81. Reasons for these ejections were: malicious conatct/not sliding -46; throwing equipment -16; profanity/verbals -34; throwing equipment and profanity/verbals -7; unsportsmanlike conduct -8. A comparison of ejections by year were: 1990 - 106; 1993 - 137; 1993 - 155; 1993 - 108; and 1994 - 111. No baseball athlete will be ineligible for the first game of the 1994-95 seasons. Forty-two schools were sent second notices for failure to file ejection reports. Nine schools were sent a third notice for failure to file ejection reports. Sixteen officials were sent reprimands for failure to report ejections. Two officials were

sent reprimands for failure to report ejecitons and were found out to be non-licensed officials resulting in forfeitures.

1994 BASEBALL COACH EJECTION REPORT: There were 22 baseball coach ejections, grades 7-12, during the 1993-94 seasons. These ejections were: Junior high -1; 9th grade -1; 10th grade -1; 9-10 grades -1; junior varsity -1; varsity -17. Reaons for ejections were: arguing/disputing calls -16; offensive language -1; unsportsmanklike conduct -5. Two baseball coaches will be ineligible for the first game of the 1994-95 season. Five schools were sent second notices for failure to file ejection reports. One school was sent a thrid notice for failure to file an ejection report. One official was sent a reprimand for failure to report an ejection.

1994 BASEBALL SPORTSMANSHIP RATINGS FOR MEMBER SCHOOLS. Members were informed that the 1994 summer baseball sportsmanship ratings for the member schools, coaches, players and spectators were mailed August 15, 1994. The Board and Council had previously passed a ruling stating that a school must have eight ratings or more in all categories before they would be listed in the IHSAA Bulleting. The rating scale is a follows: 1 -superior, 2 -above average, 3 -average, 4 -below average, 5 -unsatisfactory. The 1994 state average for baseball in each category is: coach -1.54; players -1.50; and spectators 1.73. That is a record that all can be proud as it relates to sportsmanship ratings of the member schools. Member schools are encouraged to use the rating information in a positive manner to improve the interscholastic program.


