
The Nineteenth Annual All Star Games will be held in Carroll, Aug. 3-4-5-6, 1995. Any coach who feels he has a player or two who should be playing in the All Star Games should fill out the Player Recommendation sheet that is enclosed in this Newsletter. Please enclose a photo of your player (if available) with the recommendation sheet. The guidelines for the All Star selection can be found on this sheet. All of the advance information we can get on the best ball players will help in the selection of the All-Stars

The Board of Directors passed a policy that any player or coach selected to participate in the All Star Series must have a minimum of \$125.00 of sponsors' fees. More would help to defray the cost of the All Star Series. It will be the high school coach's responsibility to get the player's sponsors if he wishes him to play in the All Star games. This policy is necessary in order to offset the high cost of putting on the All Star series. If you have any questions about this policy, contact any officer or director in your area; they will explain it to you. Sponsor names and fees must be paid to Executive Secretary no later than Saturday, July 29, if your player is selected.

If you don't like their work, don't hire them next year. Soon you will run out of umpires to work your games.

We are really in need of umpires. Talk to some of your past players and encourage them to get into umpiring. We need more young people coming into the game. Do your part and give them some freshman or sophomore games to gain experience.

1/ Players will come in Thursday, August 4th. Individual pictures for inclusion in the program will be taken after check in.

2/ Large Schools West will report by 11:00 a.m. Small Schools West will report at 11:15 a.m.

3/ Players from Large Schools East will report at 11:30 and players from Small Schools East will report at 11:45 p.m.

4/ Practice for all teams will start at 12:30 p.m .Practice sites: Large East-Carroll High Diamond; Large West-Carroll Park; Small East- Glidden-Ralston High; Small West-Coon Rapids High;

5/ First round 7-inning games will be at 5:00 p.m., Thursday, Carroll Stadium, Small Schools East vs. Large Schools East, followed by Large Schools West vs. Small Schools West.

6/ Second round 7-inning games will be at 12:00 p.m. Friday, Carroll Stadium, Small Schools East vs. Large schools West, followed by Large Schools East vs. Small Schools West.

7/ At 6:45 p.m. Friday, the Honors Banquet will be held at the Carrollton Inn in Carroll.

8/ Saturday games will begin at 12:00 p.m., Carroll Stadium Small Schools East vs. Small Schools West followed by Large Schools East vs. Large Schools West

9/ Meals will be served at the Carrollton Inn and Church services will be provided at Hotel on Sunday morning.

10/ Sunday at 12:00 p.m. the two teams with poorest records will play for 3rd and 4th place.

11/ The two teams with best records will play for lst and 2nd place following the first game.

12/ M.V.P. players will be announced after each game on Sunday.

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE RULES:

1/ All players chosen must play.

2/ The pitchers can pitch a full game. Each pitcher will start one game.

3/ All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings are necessary.

4/ Tie breaker system will be announced in advance for who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition, most runs scored, least runs given up, most hits, least hits given up.

All of the examples can be given points. The two teams with the most points will play for 1st place.

This system will give more boys an opportunity to play and

show what they can do. We will not restrict a pitcher on amount of innings he can pitch in one day.

Coaches were picked by the Steering committee! They filled out an application that was found in the last newsletter.

******Players who do not make the All District Team will still be eligible to play in the All Star Series. ****

If a coach fills out a player profile form that is found in this newsletter and sends it in, this player will have the same opportunity as a player on the All District Team. This system was necessary because of a number of good ball players being left off the All Star Squads because a coach could not get enough votes for his player at the All District Selection meetings. A reminder that each player must have \$125.00 worth of sponsor fees in order to play in the All-Star Series.

ALL-STAR SQUAD REGULATIONS:

Each squad will consist of 16 players (2 catchers, 4 pitchers, 5 infielders, 4 outfielders and 1 utility).

PLAYER SELECTION:

First priority: Coach's recommendation form

Second priority: All District Team

Third priority: Coach a member of the association

coaches with 20 years longevity who received a profile form are requested to complete the form and return to Roger Hoel if they haven't already done so. This is needed for the Hall of Fame Committee!

If a 20-Year Coach has not received a profile form, you may contact Pinky Primrose and he will send you one.

HALL OF FAME FORM GUIDELINES FOR THE NOMINATION OF HALL OF FAME:

- 1. Any IHSBCA member may nominate a qualified baseball person.
- 2. This must be done on the official two page nomination form which may be obtained from the IHSBCA Office, 4211 High Ridge Rd. S.E., Cedar Rapids, IA. 52403. The form may also be obtained from any Hall of Fame Committee member.
- 3. This form must be completed and returned to the IHSBCA

office by September 1 of a given year in order to be eligible for the selections for the following year.

4 .Eligible nominees must have the following prerequisites:

a/Must have served as a head baseball coach of a high school, 2-year college, 4-year college, umpire, player or contributor to baseball (local/state/national level)

b/Must have served a minimum of 20 years in the aforementioned institution(s).

c/Must have significantly contributed to the advancement and betterment of baseball.

d/Must have made major contributions to the IHSBCA (such as serving on committees, filling offices, all-star series, attending clinics, encouraging membership).

e/Must be representative of:

- i) high moral character and ethical standards
- ii) excellence recognized beyond the local level
- iii) demonstrated leadership

5/ After the September 1 deadline, the entire file is given a preliminary review by the Committee Chairman. The Committee Chairman will forward the file, containing his report to the Hall of Fame Committee, by October 1. His report will attest to the candidate's qualifications pertaining to # 4 a, b, c, and e, aforementioned.

6/ After a preliminary review by the Chairman, everything in the file, the reports by the Chair and Executive Secretary, will be condensed and forwarded to all Board members and to each dues paying Hall of Fame member by December 1, who will vote on the candidates.

7/ The candidates will be selected by ballot and notified by January of the year receiving the award.

8/ Those declared elected for that year will be inducted during a banquet at the IHSBCA convention/clinic the following February.

9/ Candidates not selected the initial year will remain in the "pool," and will automatically be considered for 5 consecutive additional years. If the candidate is not selected the fifth year, he will not be considered further until he is nominated another time.

10 /Awards may be made posthumously.





IOWA HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING FEBRUARY 10, 1995

The meeting was called to order by President Father Craig Collison at 10:45 A.M. and he promptly introduced the officers. Each coach in attendance was asked to give his name and school as introductions were concluded.

Minutes of the February 9 Board of Directors meeting were read by Secretary Gary Nyhus. Gary Paulsen moved and seconded by Ken Bahrke to approve the minutes as read. Motion carried.

The financial report was read by Executive Secretary, Pinky Primrose. It was moved by Gene Meister and seconded by Ev Petersen to accept the financial report. Motion carried.

Executive Secretary reported on the logistics of the clinic. Activities for Friday evening, speakers, banquet information, benefits of memberhip, duties of directors, door assignments and mini-clinic hosting. Special mention was made of the jeopardy that the lowa State University baseball program has been put in. The IHSBCA will direct a letter to be sent to President Jischke stating that the entire organization is behind Coach Bobby Randall and his baseball program. Pinky also mentioned that a life-long friend of the IHSBCA, Lou Koenigsfeld, the Charles City head baseball coach is retiring.

ent out to all coaches later this spring requesting returning team nformation (phone number included) 1A through 4A. Also needed is to establish a time for coaches to contact Lee so that he can get the information to these newspapers on Saturdays or Sundays. The committee emphasized the need for conference reps and district reps to call to help getting this information out... The calls declined in number as the season progressed. The committee have made many options open to all towards calling on a weekly basis.

Umpire Committee chairman Gary Paulsen reported that they will have a very successful clinic this year with Dave Harty (IHSAA) presenting the rules clinic and Carl Childress the guest clinician. Next year the entire clinic will attend the rules meeting on Friday at 1:00 p.m. Gary mentioned that they had many new umpire award nominees presented from the coaches district meetings. The "newcomer of the year award" will now be known as the "Bob Vrbicek Award." A major concern of the committee is that the younger members of the association aren't staving in umpiring very many years. Awards Committee Report: Chairman Terry Heald recommended that the Jack Ogden/Chuck Burdick Media Award; The Marv Thelen Copntributor Award; the Cap Timm President's Award; and the Vince Meyer Award have name changes to be determined by the steering committee with approval of the board and brought to the general meeting to be voted on. This will be done every 10 years.

Communications: Lee Toole encouraged members of the association to join the national association also.

New Business: Ed Feyen nominated Eugene Meister to the chairs, it was seconded by Terry Heald and carried.

Discussion was held on recommendation of the All-State Coach Committee. They would like to separate the 1A-2A award, therefore allowing 4 classes of "Coach of the Year" Awards similar to the 4 classes of state championships. Curt Nelson recommended survey take place and would like to organize it. It was suggested that we give Curt feedback from our All-District meetings to be held next July.

A team could move down with the approval if all its conference schools are lower. The motion was seconded by Dave Welter and passed.

Andy McGaffin moved and Rick Stoffers seconded that the meeting be adjourned. Motion carried.














