1996 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Five new members will be inducted into the Hall of Fame of the lowa High School Baseball Coaches Association at its annual clinic and awards banquet in Cedar Rapids, Saturday, February 10, 1996.

New inductees to be honored at the IHSBCA Twenty-Eighth Annual Banquet are: Terry Fox, Colfax; Bill Hand, Hampton; Charles "Al" Huppert, Panora, (Ump); Eugene Meister, Algona Bishop Garrigan; Kevin Rhomberg, Dubuque.

The five names bring to 152 the number of Hall of Fame members. The honor roll now includes 94 coaches, 27 players, 24 umpires, and 7 Contributors.

TERRY FOX: is the head coach of Colfax-Mingo High School. He has been coaching for 26 years with an over-all record of 524-126. His teams have appeared in two state tournaments. He coached the All Stars in 1992 and 1995. Terry is a member of the 500 win club and a member of the Association for 25 years. He was the District Coach of the year in 1985. His son (Brad) coaches at Center Point.

BILL HAND: graduated from Collins High School, playing baskeball and baseball. He attended Simpson College and graduated in 1957. He coached at Wiota High School from 1952-61. He became Coach at Hampton in 1965 and coached there for 22 years. His won-loss record was 222-194. He won three Conference Championships and finished in the top half of the conference 15 out of 22 years. His team won the district championship in 1984. Bill is widely admired and respected by coaches and was a long-time member of the coaches association.

CHARLES "AL" HUPPERT: umpired for 41 years, mostly in Southwest and West Central Iowa. Final year of a full schedule was 1991. "Al" worked Football, Basketball, Track as well as baseball for many years. He is a member of the Guthrie County Officials Association. Some of the highlights of his career were working three Fall State Baseball Finals plus numerous spring and summer tournaments over the years. Al resides in Panora, lowa

EUGENE MEISTER: is the head coach at Bishop Garrigan, coming from Bancroft St. John's after it closed. He has been a head coach for twenty-two out of the twenty-six years he has coached. He has a composite record of 500 wins and 183 losses. Gene has served on various committees and is currently the secretary of the coaches organization. He also serves on the IHSAA Advisory Board. Gene's coaching record includes ten conference championships, eleven district championships, and eight state tournament appearances. His teams have won two state championships in 1985 and 86, finished second four other times. Gene's teams appeared in seven consecutive state tournaments.

KEVIN RHOMBERG: played his high school ball at Dubuque Hempstead from 1970-74. He played shortstop and had a career batting average of .442. Kevin also had a .505 season with 35 stolen bases and 54 hits. He was selected for All-State in 1974. evin played at Lewis University from 1974-76 and then on to the College of St. Francis from 1976-77. His college positions included shortstop, third base and left field. Kevin set six school records at St. Francis in runs scored, hits, RBI's, extra base hits, stolen bases and a .465 average. He also had a slugging average of .820. College honors included: NAIA All-Tournament Team-World Champions 1975, National Collegiate record for triples in a double-header, NAIA All-American Third Base in 1976, Worth Sports Co. 1977 Collegiate All-American Teams and Rawlings Big Stick Award 1977.

Kevin played professionally with the Cleveland Indians organization and the San Francisco Giants organization. He played at Batavia, Waterloo, Chattanooga, Tacoma, Charleston, Maine, Phoenix, Venezuela, Puerto Rico, and Cleveland. Kevin played 8 years of professional baseball, playing in the majors during the 1982, 83 and 84 seasons.

He was featured in an article in Sports Illustrated in 1981 and inducted into the Chattanooga Baseball Hall of Fame in 1990. He served as a scout for the Cleveland Indians from 1986-89. Kevin was named the head coach at Cleveland State University in 1991. He is currently the head baseball coach there. He is involved in many baseball organizations, has coached local teams in AAU, and is a speaker at numerous clinics.



CLINIC SPEAKERS:

JIM LEFEBVRE One of the nation's most popular and successful clinicians, played and managed in the major leagues for 15



years. He played with Dodgers from 1965 until 1972. He was Rookie of the Year in 1965. He has a lifetime .251 Avg., playing second base, third base and first base for the Dodgers. Jim played in two World Series in his first two years in the majors, hitting .400 in the 1965 Fall Classic. He played in Japan from 1973-76 and was named the manager of the Mariners in in 1988. He then went on to manage the Chicago Cubs. He has given many clinics through-out the country, and is regarded as one of the best!

STEVE BOROS: Presently the Philadelphia Phillies thrid base coach, Steve comes to the clinic for the second time. His background consists of time in the Minor and Major Leagues as a player and manager. He started off in the Tiger organization in 1957. He signed a bonus contract with the Tigers in 1957....



played professionally for 13 seasons, including portions of 7 years at hte big league level with stops with the Tigers, Cubs and Reds. His best year came in 1961 when he hit .270 with 62 RBI's in 116 games for the Tigers. He logged a streak of 50 consecutive errorless games at 3rd base with the Reds in 1964. Steve has managed in the Big Leagues and Minors since 1970. His major league team was the Oakland A's in 1983-84 and the San Diego Padres in 1986. He has had coaching stints with

Montreal, San Diego, Los Angeles, Royals besides the Phillies. Steve graduated from the University of Michigan. His son, Steve, is playing baseball at the Univ. of Iowa.

PETE LaCOCK: Pete played for the Chicago Cubs and then



moved on to the Royals in 1977. He was an outfielder and first baseman. Pete has a life time average of .257 His best year was in 1977 with the Royals hitting .303. He had 444 lifetime hits and 224 RBI. As a Royal, Pete played in the 1980 World Series and three League Championships.

MEL DIDIER: Former Director of Minor League Clubs and Scouting for the Seattle Mariners and presently the Head major league scout of the Los Angeles Dodgers. Mel is one of the nation outstanding clinic and dinner speakers. M has many years of teaching baseball; he has worked with the Indians, Expos, Dodgers, Mariners as well as being a former college coach. He was one of the speakers at the National Convention in San Francisco.

AL FITZMORRIS: Former Kansas City Royal and Cleveland



Indian, spent 10 years in the big leagues. He had a pitching record of 77-59, with a lifetime ERA of 3.65. He pitched in 2188 games, completing 159. He pitched 11 shouts in his major league career. Al is the head of the Kansas City Royal Alumni Association in Kansas City.

DUANE BANKS: Head baseball coach at the University of Iowa



since 1970. His overall record at Iowa is 855-524. The 1995 record was 25-24. Banks was inducted into the ABCA Hall of Fame three years ago and is an IHSBCA Hall of Famer. He has served as past president of the ABCA and is one of the leading college coaches i the country. Duane has been named both Bl Ten Conference and District Coach-of-the-Year. Many of his former Hawkeyes have earned pro contracts and several have made it

to the major leagues.

LYLE SMITH: Head Baseball Coach at Iowa State and for last



11 seasons an assistant there. He has served as pitching coach and recruiting Coordinator at ISU for ten years. Prior to Iowa Sate, Smith served as the Head Baseball Coach at Indian Hills Community College in Centerville, IA. During his fourteen years in collegiate baseball, he has coached 33 pitchers who were professional draftees. Twelve Cyclone pitchers who have received recognition on All-Conference teams and one Olympic Team tryout invitee;

Eleven Big 8 Pitchers of the Week and four Major League pitchers. In 1994, four Cyclones pitchers were selected in the June Draft for a total of ten fomer Cyclones in professional baseball. In 1995, eight former Cyclones were pitching in professional baseball with two attaining the Major Leagues. Lyle Co-authored a booklet in 1994 for the IHSAA entitled "PItching Mechanics", as well as an article in ABCA Digest concerning "Defensing the Steal at Second Base.

PETE BIRMINGHAM: has experienced coaching success at many levels. He has nine years of head coaching experience at the high school level with a career record of 152-59 and si league championships. His teams won two AABC New York State titles. Pete was selected to coach at the U.S. Olympic Festival in 1981 and has been both a head coach and and an assistant for U.S. of America teams competing abroad. He has spoken at coaching clinics in many parts of the U.S. including being a featured speaker at the Little League Baseball's National Coaching Clinic in Williamsport. Pete holds a doctorate degree in Physical Education and Teacher Education from Syracuse University.

JOE "SPANKY" McFARLAND: Head coach at Northern Illinois University, starting the program from scratch. Joe developed the team, facility, alumni relations, fund-raising, staff, media guide, promotions, etc. In 1995, his team won 29 wins which is a new NIU season record, finished 3rd in the Midwestern Collegiate Conference. Before coming to Northern Illinois, Joe was an Assistant Coach at Florida State, Associate Head Coach at Georgia Tech and Assistant Head Coach at Univ. of South Florida. His over-all record is 126-165. Fifty-five former pithcers have signed professional contracts during the last 18 seasons, with seven pitchers pitching in the big leagues. He has spoken at many clinics throughout the Country.

BOYD MURRAY: University of Iowa Athletic Trainer for base-



ball. Boyd has been with the University for the past seven years. He comes from Council Bluffs. Boyd heads up the trainers for the All-Star series. He has been doing this for the past five years. Boyd is the recipient of the Contributor Award.

SCOTT PARCHER: Parks supervisor for the community of Carroll the past 16 years. He has an associate degree in horticulture from Kirkwood Community College. Besides maintaining the basebball field, he works in golf course maintenance and construction. His sessions will deal with managing the field surface under various lowa conditions, surface compsition, equipment, and general tips in manicuring techniques. Carroll's diamond is considered one of the best surface in lowa.

UMPIRE SPEAKERS:

RICK RODER: American Association Umpire, will be coming to us from Jim Brinkman School of Umpiring as a former instructor. He was a high school graduate of Remsen St. Mary's and played his baseball under the Hall of Famer Marv Thelen. Rick got his college degree from Kansas Newman in 1986. From Newman he went to Brinkman School of Umpiring. He entered professional umpiring in 1987, working the Pioneer League, moving in 1988 to the Mid-West League and then on to the Texas League in 1990-92. Rick worked in the Pacific Coast League in 1993, the International League in 1994 and the Americian Association in 1995. Rick was a clinician two years ago and did an outstanding job teaching the umpires the new ideas in umpiring.

DAVE HARTY: Assistant Executive Secretary of the I.H.S.B.C.A. Dave was a former high school coach and administrator. He is in charge of the baseball program in the state of lowa and also in charge of the umpires. Dave has received the President Award from the Association.



MEETING MINUTES

APPROVED POLICY REGARDING MEMBERSHIP ON SPORTS ADVISORY COMMITTEES. (MM-S) Williams - Pyle the following policy regarding membership on sports advisory committees be approved and implemented beginning with the 1995-96 sports advisory committees. Motion carried unanimously.

 Coaches serving on a sports advisory committee must be an active head varsity in the sport of that committee.

- All members of the advisory committee shall serve a term of three years. Committee members may be appointed to a second term. If a coach retires during a term, that coach will be replaced on the committee. The individual replacing that member will complete the unexpired term with the opportunity for a second term of three years.
- Current committee members' names will be drawn for terms of either one, two or three years. Committee members who have served longer than three years will be drawn for their second term.
- New members will be appointed by the Board of Control.

APPROVED SUMMER BASEBALL POLICY REVISION AS IT PERTAINS TO FINAL DISTRICT AND SUBSTATE TOURNAMENT GAMES AND ESTABLISH POLICY FOR SUMMER STATE BASEBALL TOURNAMENT RAIN DELAYS. (MM-S) Pyle - Rentschler to approve the following policies as it relates to final district and substate tournament games, postponements and rain delays for the state baseball tournament. Motion carried unanimously.

The current policy with reference to postponed tournament games is as follows:

Item 7, Spring Manual: When necessary to postpone district, substate, and/or are tournament games it shall be the responsibility of the tournament manager to reschedule game on consecutive dates, except Sundays, until said tournament regains its original schedule.

Item 8: The host school as well as all participating schools should be cognizant there are subsequent series of tournaments scheduled to commence on a definite date and postponements in your tournament might later cause a team to play on consecutive days.

Recommend adding the following to the above policy (#7):

In the event a district or substate final game site is not playable due to weather elements, etc., an alternate site will be selected by the host school. In the event the host school is not able to acquire an alternate site, the IHSAA will do so. If it is then not possible to play the game(s), the game(s) will be played on the consecutive day format, as stated above.

State Tournament: The summer state baseball tournament will always be played on schedule and makeup games due to rain delays will be played on an adjustable schedule. Example: (a) Wednesday afternoon games rained out. The evening games will be played on schedule with the makeup games to be played on an adjustable schedule. Wednesday 12 noon and 2 p.m. ball games will be played at 10 a.m. and 12 noon Thursday and the 12 noon and 2 p.m. ball games will be played at 2 and 4 p.m. respectively with the evening session on schedule, 6 and 8 p.m. Example: (b) If. for some reason, we lose an entire day due to rain delay, the tournament format will be moved back one day.

APPROVED THREE-YEAR CONTRACT TO CARROLL FOR HOSTING STATE BASEBALL TOURNAMENT. Members reviewed the past summer's state baseball tournament series held at Marshalltown and Carroll, the 2-A and 4-A classes were held at Marshalltown; the 1-A and 3-A classes held at Carroll. At their August 12, 13, 1995 meeting, the Board reviewed a more detailed report as it pertains to the state baseball tournament. Members were informed that Carroll is most interested in continuing to host the state baseball tournament. (MM-S) Rentschler - Van Hecke to approve a three-year contract (1996, 1997, and 1998) with Carroll as host of the class 1-A and 3-A state baseball tournament. Motion carried unanimously.
