11, 1996: The Twentieth Annual All Star Games will be held in Cedar Rapids/lowa City, Aug. 8-9-10-11, 1996. Any coach who feels he has a player or two who should be playing in the All Star Games should fill out the Player Recommendation sheet that is enclosed in this Newsletter. Please enclose a photo of your player (if available) with the recommendation sheet. The guidelines for the All Star selection can be found on this sheet. All of the advance information we can get on the best ball players will help in the selection of the All-Stars.

The Board of Directors passed a policy that any player or coach selected to participate in the All Star Series must have a minimum of \$125.00 of sponsors' fees. More would help to defray the cost of the All Star Series. It will be the high school coach's responsibility to get the player's sponsors if he wishes him to play in the All Star games. This policy is necessary in order to offset the high cost of putting on the All Star series. If you have any questions about this policy, contact any officer or director in your area; they will explain it to you. Sponsor names and fees must be paid to Executive Secretary no later than Saturday, August 1, if your player is selected.

LOOKING FOR MEMBERS WHO ARE INTER-ESTED IN SELECTING ALL STATE TEAMS:

Each all state team will be selected by coaches of that class. Anyone interested in helping select the All State teams should return the application form in this newsletter. The teams will be selected on Saturday evening, Aug. 10, at 7:00 p.m. in Coralville.

2/ Large Schools East will report by 11:00 a.m. Small Schools East will report at 11:15 a.m.

3/ Players from Large Schools West will report at 11:30 noon and players from Small Schools West will report at 11:45 p.m.

4/ Practice for all teams will start at 12:30 p.m.

Practice sites: Large East-City High Diamond; Large West- West High; Small West-Regina High; Small East—West Branch High.

5/ First 7-inning games will be at 6:00 p.m., Thursday, Cedar Rapids Veterans Memorial Stadium, Small Schools West vs. Large Schools West, followed by Large Schools East vs. Small Schools East.

Second-7 inning games will be at 12:00 p.m. Friday, University of Iowa Stadium- Small Schools East vs. Large schools West, followed by Large Schools East vs. Small Schools West.

ALL STAR SQUAD REGULATIONS:

1. Each squad will consist of 16 players (2 catchers, 4 pitchers, 5 infielders, 4 outfielders and 1 utility).

PLAYER SELECTION:

First priority: Coach's recommendation form

Second priority: All District Team

Third priority: Coach a member of the association

All players chosen must play.

If the pitchers can pitch a full game.

4/ All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings are

necessary.

5/ Tie breaker system will be announced in advance for who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition,

most runs scored, least runs given up, most hits, least hits given up.

All of the examples can be given points. The two teams with the most points will play for 1st place.

This system will give more boys an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict a pitcher on amount of innings he can pitch in one day.

Coaches were picked by the Steering committee! They filled out an application that was found in the last newsletter.

******Players who do not make the All District Team will still be eligible to play in the All Star Series. ****

If a coach fills out a player profile form that is found in this newsletter and sends it in, this player will have the same opportunity as a player on the All District Team. This system was necessary because of a number of good ball players being left off the All Star Squads because a coach could not get enough votes for his player at the All District Selection meetings. A reminder that each player must have \$125.00 worth of sponsor fees in order to play in the All Star Series.

If a 20-Year Coach has not received a profile form, you may contact Pinky Primrose and he will send you one.

GUIDELINES FOR THE NOMINATION TO HALL OF FAME:

1.Any IHSBCA member may nominate a qualified baseball person.

2. This must be done on the official two-page nomination form which may be obtained from the IHSBCA Office, 4211 High Ridge Rd. S.E., Cedar Rapids, IA. 52403. The form may also be obtained from any Hall of Fame Committee member. 3. This form must be completed and returned to the IHSBCA office by September 1 of a given year in order to be eligible for the selection the following year.

4. Eligible nominees must have the following prerequisites:

a/Must have served as a head baseball coach of a high school, 2-year college, 4-year college, umpire, player or contributor to baseball (local/state/national level)

b/Must have served a minimum of 20 years in the aforementioned insitution(s).

c/ Must have significantly contributed to the advancement and betterment of baseball.

d/ Must have made major contributions to the IHSBCA (such as serving on committees, filling offices, all star series, attending clinics, encouraging membership.

e/ Must be representative of:

- i) high moral character and ethical standards
- ii) excellence recognized beyond the local level
- iii) demonstrated leadership

5/ After the September 1 deadline, the entire file is given a preliminary review by the Committee Chairman. The Committee Chairman will forward the file, containing his report to the Hall of Fame Committee, by October 1. His report will attest to the candidate's qualifications pertaining to # 4 a, b, c, and e, aforementioned.
