The Twentieth Annual All Star Games will be held in Cedar Rapids/Iowa City, Aug. 8-9-10-11, 1996. Any coach who feels he has a player or two who should be playing in the All Star Games should fill out the Player Recommendation sheet that is enclosed in this Newsletter. Please enclose a photo of your player (if available) with the recommendation sheet. The guidelines for the All Star selection can be found on this sheet. All of the advance information we can get on the best ball players will help in the selection of the All-Stars.

The Board of Directors passed a policy that any player or coach selected to participate in the All Star Series must have a minimum of \$125.00 of sponsors' fees. More would help to defray the cost of the All Star Series. It will be the high school coach's responsibility to get the player's sponsors if he wishes him to play in the All Star games. This policy is necessary in order to offset the high cost of putting on the All Star series. If you have any questions about this policy, contact any officer or director in your area; they will explain it to you. Sponsor names and fees must be paid to Executive Secretary no later than Saturday, August 1, if your player is selected.

LOOKING FOR MEMBERS WHO ARE INTERESTED IN SELECTING ALL STATE TEAMS:

Each all state team will be selected by coaches of that class. Anyone interested in helping select the All State teams should return the application form in this newsletter. The teams will be selected on Saturday evening, Aug. 10, at 7:00 p.m. in Coralville.

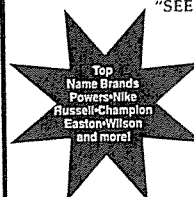

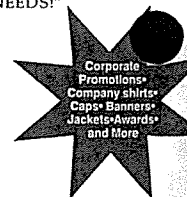

1/ Players will come in Thursday, August 8th. Individual pictures for inclusion in the program will be taken after check in.

2/ Large Schools East will report by 11:00 a.m. Small Schools East will report at 11:15 a.m.

3/ Players from Large Schools West will report at 11:30 noon and players from Small Schools West will report at 11:45 p.m.

4/ Practice for all teams will start at 12:30 p.m.

Practice sites: Large East-City High Diamond; Large West- West High; Small West-Regina High; Small East—West Branch High.

5/ First 7-inning games will be at 6:00 p.m., Thursday, Cedar Rapids Veterans Memorial Stadium, Small Schools West vs. Large Schools West, followed by Large Schools East vs. Small Schools East.

Second-7 inning games will be at 12:00 p.m. Friday, University of Iowa Stadium- Small Schools East vs. Large schools West, followed by Large Schools East vs. Small Schools West.

7/ At 7:00 p.m. Friday, the Honors Banquet will be held at the Best Western Westfield Motel in Coralville.

8/ Saturday games will begin at 12:00 p.m., University of Iowa Stadium-Small Schools West vs. Small Schools East followed by Large Schools East vs. Large Schools West

9/ Honors Banquet and Brunches will be served at the Best Western Westfield Motel and Church services will be provided at Motel.

10/ Sunday at 12:00 p.m. the two teams with poorest records will play for 3rd and 4th place.

The two teams with best records will play for 1st and 2nd place following the first game.

11/ M.V.P. players will be announced after each game on Sunday.

ALL STAR SQUAD REGULATIONS:

1. Each squad will consist of 16 players (2 catchers, 4 pitchers, 5 infielders, 4 outfielders and 1 utility).

PLAYER SELECTION:

First priority: Coach's recommendation form

Second priority: All District Team

Third priority: Coach a member of the association

All players chosen must play.

3/ The pitchers can pitch a full game.

4/ All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings are necessary.

5/ Tie breaker system will be announced in advance for who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition,

most runs scored, least runs given up, most hits, least hits given up.

All of the examples can be given points. The two teams with the most points will play for 1st place.

This system will give more boys an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict a pitcher on amount of innings he can pitch in one day.

Coaches were picked by the Steering committee! They filled out an application that was found in the last newsletter.

*****Players who do not make the All District Team will still be eligible to play in the All Star Series. ****

If a coach fills out a player profile form that is found in this newsletter and sends it in, this player will have the same opportunity as a player on the All District Team. This system was necessary because of a number of good ball players being left off the All Star Squads because a coach could not get enough votes for his player at the All District Selection meetings. A reminder that each player must have \$125.00 worth of sponsor fees in order to play in the All Star Series.

GUIDELINES FOR THE NOMINATION TO HALL OF FAME:

1. Any IHSBCA member may nominate a qualified baseball person.
2. This must be done on the official two-page nomination form which may be obtained from the IHSBCA Office, 4211 High Ridge Rd. S.E., Cedar Rapids, IA. 52403. The form may also be obtained from any Hall of Fame Committee member.
3. This form must be completed and returned to the IHSBCA office by September 1 of a given year in order to be eligible for the selection the following year.
4. Eligible nominees must have the following prerequisites:
 - a/ Must have served as a head baseball coach of a high school, 2-year college, 4-year college, umpire, player or contributor to baseball (local/state/national level)
 - b/ Must have served a minimum of 20 years in the aforementioned insitution(s).
 - c/ Must have significantly contributed to the advancement and betterment of baseball.
 - d/ Must have made major contributions to the IHSBCA (such as serving on committees, filling offices, all star series, attending clinics, encouraging membership.
 - e/ Must be representative of:
 - i) high moral character and ethical standards
 - ii) excellence recognized beyond the local level
 - iii) demonstrated leadership
- 5/ After the September 1 deadline, the entire file is given a preliminary review by the Committee Chairman. The Committee Chairman will forward the file, containing his report to the Hall of Fame Committee, by October 1. His report will attest to the candidate's qualifications pertaining to # 4 a, b, c, and e, aforementioned.
- 6/ After a preliminary review by the Chairman, everything in the file, the reports by the Chair and Executive Secretary, will be condensed and forwarded to all Board members and to each dues paying Hall of Fame member by December 1, who will vote on the candidates.
- 7/ The candidates will be selected by ballot and notified by January of the year receiving the award.
- 8/ Those declared elected for that year will be inducted during a banquet at the IHSBCA convention/clinic the in February.
- 9/ Candidates not selected the initial year will remain in the "pool," and will automatically be considered for 5 consecutive years. If the candidate is not selected the fifth year, he will not be considered further until he is nominated another time.
- 10/ Awards may be made posthumously.

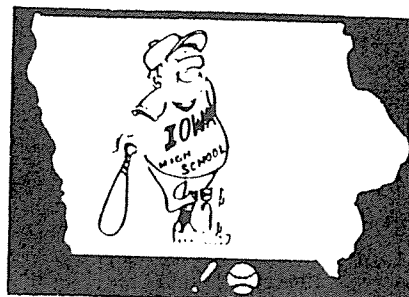

1996 MAJOR BASEBALL RULE REVISIONS:

- 1-1-1 Name and shirt number of eligible substitutes required on lineup card to be submitted to umpire (no penalty if not done)
- 3-4-3,4 Time frames for determining when charged conferences are concluded were established.
- 7-3-1 Batter required to keep one foot in batter's box throughout his time at bat (some exceptions) to avoid unnecessary delays.
- 2-4-3, It is not spectator interference if a spectator interferes with a fielder who reaches into the stands or other dead ball areas to make a catch.
- 7-4-c, 8-3-3e
- 10-1-2 Umpires jurisdiction begins when arriving at the field and ends upon leaving the field.

Speed-Up-Rule A Courtesy runner for the pitcher or catcher may be used at any time once the pitcher or catcher reaches base.

CHANGING DISTRICTS AND CLASS: At the recent Board of Directors meeting the following guidelines were approved. 1/ A school may move up a class, but not down a class. 2/ In order to move into another district or up a class, the member school must apply in writing by January 15th. 3/ The school must stay in that district or classification for five years. The only exceptions would be if the school's classification changes (by the State) or their conference is realigned. 4/ Apply in writing to the President or Executive Secretary. 5/ A school could move down with approval if all schools in conference are of a lower class.
