1997 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Six new members will be inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association at its annual clinic and awards banquet in Cedar Rapids, Saturday, February 8, 1997.

New inductees to be honored at the IHSBCA Twenty-Ninth Annual Banquet are: Father Craig Collison, Carroll (Ump); Loren "Pee Wee" Day, Mason City; Wendell Hill, Bettendorf; Gary Nyhus, Mason City Newman; John Smith, DMACC, Boone; and Dave Welter, Cedar Falls.

The six names bring to 158 the number of Hall of Fame members. The honor roll now includes 98 coaches, 28 players, 25 umpires, and 7 Contributors.

FATHER CRAIG COLLISON: a graduate of Ryan High School in Boone, Fr. Collison has been umpiring for 31 years, with a career high of 121 games in the years before entering the priesthood. Fr. Collison has been to the state tournament 13 times and has worked the Championship game in all 4 classes at one time or another. Fr. Craig has been a member of the Coaches Association for 26 years, serving on seven committee of the IHS-BCA and having chaired all but one. He was the second umpire in the history of the IHSBCA to be selected as an officer and proceeded through the chairs of the organization being its president in 1994-95. He is a past chairman of the steering committee. Fr. Collison has worked in all of the All-Star Series except for two, and has been the Supervisor of Umpires for the All Star Series for the past 15 years. He was named District Umpire of Year five times and was named State Umpire of the Year twice in 1982 and 1989, the only umpire to be given this award more than once. Fr. Collison played high school baseball. After high school Fr. Collison went to A.I.B. in Des Moines and entered the accounting field. In 1972, he entered Loras College in Dubuque to study for the priesthood, moving onto St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, MD before being ordained a priest in 1978. Fr. Collison was also named the recipient of the Marv Thelen Contributor of the Year Award in 1992. He currently teaches Theology at Kuemper High School in Carroll and is pastor at St. Mary's Church in Willey, IA.

LOREN "PEE WEE" DAY: attended Davenport High School from 1941-42 and then went to Mason City High School in 1943. He went on to Northwestern University, where he was an outstanding baseball player. Not only was "Pee Wee" an outstanding baseball player, but he also has been recognized as a Hall of Famer in Basketball (1971) and Football (1981). As a baseball player, he started on one of the great Davenport teams, winning the state championship and being an All-State Tournament players. After playing his High School career, he was offered a contract with the St. Louis Cardinals as a sophomore. At Mason City, "Pee Wee" led the football and basketball teams to undefeated state championships, in baseball, they lost one game to Corwith in the District championship. After serving in WW II, (where he played service ball), he went to Northwestern to play football and baseball. He was an outstanding Big Ten player in (1948-50). In the summers, he played in the Iowa State Baseball League for the Mason City Legionnaire. After college he signed a contract to

play in the Class "A" Quad City Quads in Davenport. He dropped out of baseball because of his football injuries and WW II injuries (Purple Heart). He coached in the Davenport youth league for many years. He is the first high school athletic to be inducted in three Hall of Fames. Today, he lives in Davenport as a retired business executive.

WENDELL HILL: former baseball coach and Athletic Director at Bettendorf High School, coached 18 years at Bettendorf. Wendell started his baseball career off at Cambridge High School where he pitched and played infield. He went to the University of Iowa and played for Otto Vogel. After playing at Iowa, Wendell spent time in the service, playing baseball at the San Diego Base Team. After getting out of the service, Wendell was offered a contract with the Chicago Cubs, but turned it down to go back to lowa to get his Masters Degree. He spent many summers playing baseball in the different leagues around lowa and surrounding states. He started his coaching career at Macomb High School, Macomb, ILL., then went to Central College in Pella, from Pella he went to Bettendorf in 1951, where he coached until 1965. Wendell became Athletic Director in 1955. He held that position until he retired in 1983. As an Athletic Administrator, Wendell had many teams that were very successful. During his tenure, Bettendorf received the Governors Trophy for Best Athletic/P.E. Program in the State. He was elected into the Iowa High School Athletic Directors Hall of Fame in 1981. He was the Iowa Athletic Director of the Year 1979, North Central Regional Athletic Director of the Year in 1979.

GARY NYHUS: head baseball coach at Mason City Newman. After coaching at Ackley-Geneva and Iowa Falls, he started his coaching at Newman in 1979. He has been a head coach for 23 out of his 29 years in baseball. Over the course of his coaching career he has an over-all record of 558-157. He is currently the Vice-President and President elect of the IHSBCA after going through the chairs. Gary has served three terms on the Board, prior to going into the officer ranks. He has served on many committees and coached in the All-Star Series. Gary has had many young men receive honors at the All-District and All-State level. His teams have won 18 consecutive conference titles. He has been District Coach of the Year seven times and was named State Coach of the Year in 1990. His teams have appeared in the State Tournament three times, winning the District tournament 10 tiems. He has never had a losing season as a head coach in football, basketball, softball and baseball. Gary played his high school ball at Mason City High, playing for Elmer Starr. Gary has had his teams to three State Tournaments. Gary has been a member of the Association for 20 years.

JOHN SMITH: head coach at the Des Moines Area Community College of Boone. He has been coaching there for 22 years. His over-all record is 613-373. He has had over 40 players drafted and one just entering the Big Leagues is Paul Wilmet of the Brewers. He was named Junior College Coach of Year for 1989. He is very active in the Community College ranks of baseball coaches. John started his baseball career at Bonesteel High School, Bonesteel, S.D., went to Southern State College, Springfield, S.D. and received his Masters Degree from the Univ. of Northern Colorado. John was selected the State Coach of the year twice and District Coach of Year once. His teams have won titles in the State, Regional and National tournaments. They participed in the National Tournament once. He has been an active member of the Baseball Coaches Association for 23 years.

DAVE WELTER: head baseball coach at Cedar Falls High School for the past 19 years. Dave has an over-all record of 475-214. He started his baseball career at Waterloo Columbus high school where he was a catcher. He played his college baseball at Cornell College, going to Iowa State for his master work. He was an assistant coach there. He started his coaching career at Sioux City Heelan and then moved to Cedar Falls in 1979. He has produced many high school All-Staters and many All-District players. His teams have participated in three state tournaments, and were State runner-up once and third place once. He has won 8 District titles and three conference titles over the course of his baseball career. Dave has been an active coach in the coaches Association over his coaching career, serving on many committees, and coaching in two All-Star Series. Dave has had four players sign professional baseball contracts. He has been a member of the Baseball Coaches Association for 20 years.

CLINIC SPEAKERS:

TOM LAWLESS: He will be coming to our clinic for the first



time. He finished his third consecutive season managing the Cedar Rapids Kernels. He led the Kernels to a Midwest League Championship the first season and had them in the play-offs the last two. A veteran of eight Major League seasons with Cincinnati, Montreal, St. Louis and Toronto, he compiled a .207 lifetime average in 343 games. Tom played infield and played in the World Series

with the Cardinals. He may be remembered best for the dramatic three-run homer he hit off Frank Viola in the fourth inning of game 4 during the 1987 Series. Tom will be the third base coach for the Triple A Norfolk Tides this coming season.

JAY WARD: Jay has 15 years playing and many years manag-



ing in professional baseball. He has managed in the Phillies organization at Bend, Oregon and Spartanburg, S.C., and Cedar Rapids. Jay's first job at the helm was at Wisconsin Rapids in the Midwest League in 1972. Jay played second and third for the Twins and Reds. He has given many clinics around the country with Dick Birmingham. He is one of the best hitting instructors teaching hitting today.

MEL DIDIER: Mel is former Director of Minor League Clubs and Scouting for the Seattle Mariners and presently the Head



major league scout of the Los Angeles Dodgers. Mel is one of the nation's outstanding clinicians and dinner speakers. Mel has many years of teaching baseball; he has worked with the Indians, Expos, Dodgers, Mariners as well as being a former college coach. He was one of the speakers at the National Convention in San Francisco. He was here last year and spoke on the winning theory and baserunning.



DAVE SCHRAGE: Dave is head baseball coach at the University of Northern Iowa since 1990. His overall record at UNI is 124-208. The 1996 record was 26-30. This team set 20 school records. The first-ever appearance in the MVC Tournament in 1996. Five Panthers have earned pro contracts in the past three

.HAL DYER: A scholarship athlete at Florida State, Hal brings



a wealth of coaching experience to our state clinic. This is Hal's fourth visit to the Clinic. Hal spent six years in minor league baseball as a catcher, followed by successful stints in high school (Cincinnati), amateur, and junior college coaching. In each of two seasons at Pratt, Kansas, Dyer's junior college baseball program produced state JC championships. Dyer then moved into coaching at the professional ranks as field manager of the Bristol Tigers in 1984. He is presently pitching coach for the Blue

Jays Class A Team and is running the Winter League program for Toronto.



BRUCE KIMM: Bruce played his high school baseball in Norway and signed with the White Sox in 1969. Bruce played 7 years in the minors before going up to the majors as a catcher. He was traded to the Tigers where he caught the "Bird" Fidrych. Bruce then was traded to the Cubs and then back to the White Sox in 1980. Bruce retired from baseball in 1981. Since then he has gone into managing in the Red's organiza-

tion and became the third base coach for Pete Rose, and for the past 11 years he has coached or managed in profesional baseball. His last coaching job was with the Padres as a third base coach. Bruce was an All-Stater in High School. In 1993 and 94, Bruce was a manager in the Braves organization. For the past two years Bruce was the manager of the Cub's Double A, Southern League, Orlando team. In 1997, Bruce will be with the Florida Marlins as a coach.



BOB BUCHANAN: Bob is the pitching coach for the Kirkwood Eagles. Bob comes to us with minor league and major league experience. He started his baseball career off with the Cincinnati Red's in 1985, being part of the Pete Rose's Season. Bob was voted the MVP of Triple A. Omaha Royals in the 1991 season. He pitched in the Major Leagues for the Royals in 1989. He has spent most of his time in pro ball at the Triple A Level, Denver, Tidewater,

Omaha, Syracuse and Tucson. Arm trouble developed and Bob dropped out of baseball in 1991. Bob has been doing an outstanding job with the Kirkwood JC baseball pitchers.

SAM SUPLIZIO: Sam has been a scout and outfield instructor



with Milwaukee since 1978, moving over to the Angels as an outfield instructor in the minor league system. Sam was a member of the New York Yankees' organization before a broken arm in 1957 ruined promising career. Sam grew up in DuBois, PA, played football and baseball at the University of New Mexico, becoming the school's first baseball All-American and later played summers for the Grand Junction Eagles. He managed the

Grand Junction Eagles for several years. Sam is involved in the National Junior College World Series in Grand Junction, now one of the city's main events of year. He was inducted into the JC Hall of Fame in 1985 and the Colorado Hall of Fame in 1992. Sam was co-chairman of Colorado Baseball Commission, helping Denver gain a major league franchise.

DAVE HARTY: Assistant Executive Secretary of the I.H.S.A.A.



Dave was a former high school coach and administrator. He is in charge of the baseball program in the state of lowa and also in charge of the umpires. Dave has received the President Award from the Association.

KIRK LEVINE: Kirk comes to us for the first time as a speaker



from Creston. He went to Al Somers Umpiring School and then into professional baseball. He spent six years in the minor leagues, working the Pacific Coast League and the Championship Series. Kirk works many college games throughout Iowa and the Big Ten, Missouri Valley and Big Twelve. Kirk has worked three Division I Regional tournaments. He will be working his fourth Regional this

spring. He has umpired for 20 years.

Congratulations to you coaches for the hard work of maintaining the diamonds, and running tournaments during the past year, especially with the rain.

1995-96 BASEBALL PLAYER AND COACH EJECTION REPORT. There were 112 player ejections in grades 7-12, during the 1995-96 baseball season: 8th grade-2; 9th grade-16; 10th grade-35; 11th grade 29; and 12th grade-30. Of these ejections: malicious contact/not sliding 50; profanity-13; throwing equipment-25; unsportsmanlike conduct/shoving-9; throwing equipment and profanity-1; fighting-2; arguing calls-8; faking a tag-2; taunting-1; out of dugout-1. In 1990-106 ejections; 1991-137 ejections; 1992-155 ejections; 1993-108 ejections; 1994-111 ejections; 1995-107 ejections; and 1996-112 ejections. One player will be ineligible for the first contest of the 1997 season. Thirty schools were sent reminder notices for failure to file ejection reports. Eight schools were sent second reminder notices for failure to file ejection reports. Seventeen officials were sent reprimands for failure to call/report ejections to the IHSAA. Seven officials were sent second reprimands for failure to call/report ejections to the IHSAA.





Special note: The University of Iowa sent a check for \$700.00 to the Coaches Association from the concession stand proceeds. It was moved by Jim Mahoney and seconded by Nick Archer to accept the financial report. Motion carried.

a/ President's report. Don Taylor emphasized that the association seems to be running very smoothly. Don is honored to be this associations president and thanked all members for their support and cooperation.

b/ Executive Secretary's report and c/ All-District report by Pinky.

- 1. All-star sponsorship fees all paid.
- 2. Lost Pepsi-Cola and Midwest Bottlers as sponsors. Picked up Lanny Petersen as a new sponsor. Big concern is finding new sponsors.
- 3. Without new sponsors the recommendation would be to raise player's all-star sponsorship fee from \$125.00 to \$150.00 in the future.
- 4. All Star series at Council Bluffs in 1997. 1998 back in Cedar Rapids/Iowa City. 1999 Sioux City has applied. 2000 Davenport very interested. 2001 Carroll very interested.
- 5. Concerned about one of our Districts where only 5 schools were represented on the All-District 1st and 2nd teams (total of 24 players)
- 6. Association membership percentages by classification. 1A coaches up to 44% (from 36%). 2A-68%. 3A-89%. 4A-96%. (A reminder that membership runs from Sept. 1st to Aug. 31st).
- 7. All-State team selection went very well and coaches involved were very thorough and very fair. Representation was excellent as shown below: Super team--13 schools represented. 4A--17 schools. 3A-24 schools. 2A--16 schools. 1A-22 schools.
- 8. We are committed to getting more umpires involved in the association as Gary Paulsen and Father Collison head that effort.
 9. All-State academic team is tremendously competitive.

- e/ All-Star Series report by Lee Toole. Rosenblatt Stadium has not been officially confirmed at this time. Creighton U. is available if a conflict. Iowa Radio Broadcast with Todd Kimm looks very promising; IPTV says no. Coach Toole has done it again as he has most everything already donated.

f/ Umpires Committee report by Gary Paulsen. District umpire of the year nominees and newcomer of the year nominees were noted. The Umpires Hall of Fame candidate is Father Craig Collison from Willey. The nominees will be contacted first for All-Star series work. It was motioned by Gary Paulsen and seconded by Steve Westphal to accept the Umpire Committee recommendations. The motion carried.

g/ Lanny Peterson Award and h/ Academic All-State reports by Gary Nyhus. Top three players interviewed and Luke Moines was selected for the Lanny Peterson Award. Coaches are reminded that there is a point system and that filling out the questionnaire completely is critical including listing the athlete's other activities section.

i/ All-State rating poll committee by Lee Toole. Lee emphasized the need for communication across the state and that Jeff Johnson from Cedar Rapids Gazette would be working with him again this summer.

- j/ Membership committee by Ken Bahrke. Will be a letter sent to each high school in the state again this fall about joining the Coaches association. Ken felt that dividing the 1A and 2A districts and Coach of the year awards was very much appreciated by the 1A and 2A coaches and that membership is up.
- k/ Constitution committee report by Steve Westphal. Committee is talking to a John Pierce about revisions of the constitution.
- I/ All-state Coach committee report by Merle Olberding. Just a reminder that there are four classes and four state coach of the year awards given out.

m/ Hall of Fame committee report by Roger Hoel. Committee is soliciting for more active participation on this committee and would like to see 10-12 members involved. Need more nominations for the contributor and player categories. Meeting was adjourned at 12:45 p.m.


