The Twenty-Third Annual All-Star Games will be held in Sioux City City, Aug. 5-6-7-8, 1999. Any coach who feels he has a player or two who should be playing in the All-Star Games should fill out the Player Recommendation sheet that is enclosed in this Newsletter. Please enclose a photo of your player (if available) with the recommendation sheet. The guidelines for the All-Star selection can be found on this sheet. All of the advance information we can get on the best ball players will help in the selection of the All-Stars.

The Board of Directors passed a policy that any player or coach selected to participate in the All-Star Series must have a minimum of \$150.00 of sponsors' fees. More would help to defray the cost of the All-Star Series. **It will be the high school coach's responsibility to get sponsors for the player if he wishes him to play in the All-Star games.** This policy is necessary in order to offset the high cost of putting on the All Star series. If you have any questions about this policy, contact any officer or director in your area; they will explain it to you. Sponsor names and fees must be paid to Executive Secretary no later than Saturday, July 31, if your player is selected.

All Star Games Schedule: The players, coaches, umpires and staff will be staying at the Hilton Hotel in Sioux City. The Honors Banquet will be held at the Convention Center, Saturday night at 6:00 p.m. All games will be played at Lewis & Clark Stadium in Sioux City.

1/ Players will arrive Thursday, August 5th. Individual pictures for inclusion in the program will be taken after check in.

2/ Small Schools West will report by 10:30 a.m. Large Schools West will report at 10:45 a.m.

3/ Players from Small Schools East will report at 11:00 a.m. and players from Large Schools East will report at 11:15 a.m.

4/ Practice for all teams will be 12:15 p.m.--2:45 p.m. Practice sites: Large East-Heelan High Diamond; Large West-West High Diamond; Small West-East High Diamond; Small East-North High Diamond.

5/ First 7-inning games will be at 5:00 p.m., Thursday, Aug. 5, Small Schools East vs. Large Schools East, followed by Large Schools West vs. Small Schools West.

6/ Second-7 inning games will be at 5:00 p.m. Friday, Aug 6, Small Schools East vs. Large Schools West, followed by Large Schools East vs. Small Schools West.

7/ Saturday, Aug. 7, games will begin at 11:30 a.m., Small Schools West vs. Small Schools East followed by Large Schools East vs. Large Schools West

8/ At 6:00 p.m. Saturday, the Honors Banquet will be held at the Convention Center in Sioux City.

9/ Sunday morning Church services will be provided at Hotel.

10/ Sunday, Aug. 8, at 12:00 p.m., the two teams with poorest records will play for 3rd and 4th place. The two teams with best records will play for 1st and 2nd place following the first game.

11/ M.V.P. players will be announced after each game on Sunday.

All Star Squad Regulations:

1. Each squad will consist of 16 players (2 catchers, 4 pitchers, 5 infielders, 4 outfielders and 1 utility).

PLAYER SELECTION:

First priority: Coach's recommendation form

Second priority: All District Team

Third priority: Coach a member of the association.

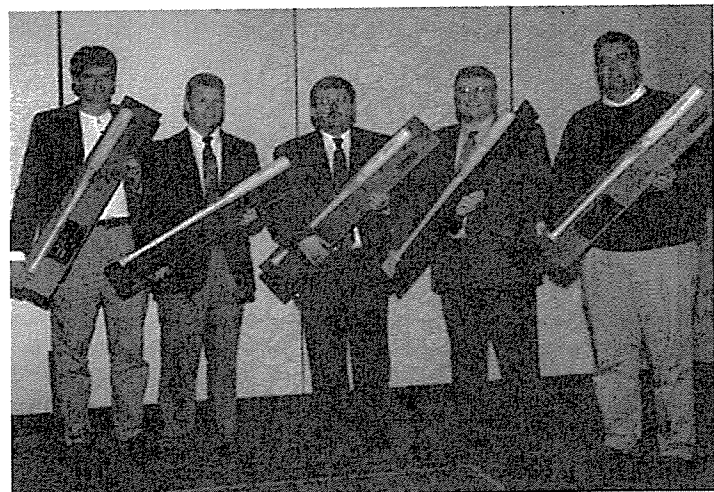
Rules:

1/ All players chosen must play.

2/ The pitchers can pitch a full game.

3/ All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings are necessary.

4/ Tie breaker system will be announced in advance for who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition, most runs scored, least runs given up, most hits, least hits given up.

All of the examples can be given points. The two teams with the most points will play for 1st place.

This system will give more boys an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict a pitcher on amount of innings he can pitch in one day.

Coaches were picked by the Steering committee! They filled out an application that was found in the last newsletter.

******Players who do not make the All District Team will still be eligible to play in the All-Star Series. ******

If a coach fills out a player profile form that is found in this newsletter and sends it in, this player will have the same opportunity as a player on the All District Team. This system is necessary because a number of good ball players have been left off the All Star Squads because a coach could not get enough votes for his player at the All District Selection meetings. A reminder that each player must have \$150.00 worth of sponsor fees in order to play in the All Star Series.

Future All-Star Games: The following locations have been set for future Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association All-Star series. 1999 series will be held in Sioux City, the 2000 All-Star Series will be held in Davenport. 2001 series will be held in Carroll. 2002 series will be held in Cedar Rapids/Iowa City. 2003 series will be held in Council Bluffs/Omaha.

Looking for Members who are Interested in Selecting All State Teams: Each all state team will be selected by coaches of that class. Anyone interested in helping select the All State teams should return the application form in this newsletter. The teams will be selected on Friday morning, Aug. 7, at 10:00 a.m. at the Hilton Hotel, in Sioux City.

A committee from each class will be selected by the President from the people who fill out the enclosed form.

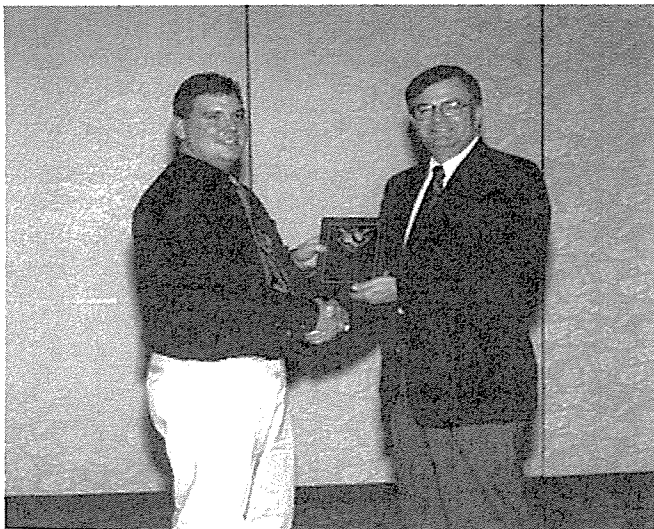

Guidelines For the Nomination To HALL OF FAME FOR COACHES:

2. This must be done on the official two page nomination form which may be obtained from the IHSBCA Office, 4211 High Ridge Rd. S.E., Cedar Rapids, IA. 52403. The form may also be obtained from any Hall of Fame Committee member.
3. This form must be completed and returned to the IHSBCA office by September 1 of a given year in order to be eligible for selection the following year.

4. Eligible nominees must meet the following prerequisites:
- a/ Must have served as a head baseball coach of a high school, 2-year college, 4-year college, umpire, player or contributor to baseball (local/state/national level)
 - b/ Must have served a minimum of 20 years in the aforementioned institution(s).
 - c/ Must have significantly contributed to the advancement and betterment of baseball.
 - d/ Must have made major contributions to the IHSBCA (such as serving on committees, filling offices, All Star Series, attending clinics, encouraging membership.
 - e/ Must be representative of:
 - i) high moral character and ethical standards
 - ii) excellence recognized beyond the local level
 - iii) demonstrated leadership
- 5/ After the September 1 deadline, the entire file is given a preliminary review by the Committee Chairman. The Committee Chairman will forward the file, containing his report, to the Hall of Fame Committee. His report will attest to the candidate's qualifications pertaining to # 4 a, b, c, and e, aforementioned.
- 6/ The Hall of Fame candidates will be selected by ballot and notified by January of the year receive the award.
- 7/ Those declared elected for that year will be inducted at a banquet at the IHSBCA convention/clinic in February.
- 8/ Candidates not selected the initial year will remain in the "pool," and will automatically be considered for 5 consecutive years. If the candidate is not selected the fifth year, he will not be considered further until he is nominated another time.
- 9/ Awards may be made posthumously.

This year's All-Star series will mark the beginning of the Baseball Olympics Competition. This could become an annual event associated with are All-Star series.
- I. Umpire Committee Report by Gary Paulsen. This year the Umpires of the Association will be presenting at the clinic. This saves the Association a few dollars in speaking fees and with the savings the Umpires offered six scholarships to umpires who have never attended the clinic. A. It was moved Gary Nyhus and seconded by Don Taylor that Dan Pomeroy be the new officer from the West District. The motion carried.


