Thompson: The Fourth Annual Harold "Pinky" Primrose Award was presented to Gary Thompson of Ames. This award is given to a former lowa High School Baseball player who went on to distinguish himself outside of baseball at the local, state or national level. Gary is a legend on the lowa athletic scene. He's been more than successful at everything from "Horseshoe Pitching to Baseball to Basketball". As a baseball player he has pitched six career no-hitters and had a career batting average over .450 and won a 3rd team All America at Shortstop at lowa State. He played semi-pro ball for such teams as the Mason City Legionnaires, Marshalltown Ansons, and the always dangerous Slater Nite-Hawks. Gary was an All-American basketball player at lowa State and went on to play and coach for the Phillips 66'ers. He grew up at Roland High School and was an All-State basketball player.



Twenty-Fourth Annual All-Star Games will be held in Davenport, Aug. 3-4-5-6, 2000. Any coach who feels he has a player or two who should be playing in the All-Star Games should fill out the Player Recommendation sheet that is enclosed in this Newsletter. Please enclose a photo of your player (if available) with the recommendation sheet. The guidelines for the All-Star selection can be found on this sheet. All of the advance information we can get on the best ball players will help in the selection of the All-Stars.

The Board of Directors passed a policy that any player or coach selected to participate in the All-Star Series must have a minimum of \$150.00 of sponsors' fees. More would help to defray the cost of the All-Star Series. It will be the high school coach's responsibility to get sponsors for the player if he wishes him to play in the All-Star games. This policy is necessary in order to offset the high cost of putting on the All Star series. If you have any questions about this policy, contact any officer or director in your area; they will explain it to you. Sponsor names and fees must be paid to Executive Secretary no later than Saturday, July 29, if your player is selected.

All Star Squad Regulations:

1. Each squad will consist of 16 players (2 catchers, 4 pitchers, 5 infielders, 4 outfielders and 1 utility).

PLAYER SELECTION:

First priority: Coach's recommendation form

Second priority: All District Team

Third priority: Coach a member of the association.

Rules:

1/ All players chosen must play.

2/ Every player must start a/ pitchers-1game; b/ catchers-2 games; c/ infielders & outfielders-3 games; d/ utility 1-game

3/ Utility player must play in every game.

4/ The pitchers can pitch a full game.

5/ All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings are necessary.

6/ Tie breaker system will be announced in advance for who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition, most runs scored, least runs given up, most hits, least hits given up.

All of the examples can be given points. The two teams with the most points will play for 1st place.

This system will give more boys an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict a pitcher on amount of innings he can pitch in one day.

Coaches were picked by the Steering committee! They filled out an application that was found in the last newsletter.

******Players who do not make the All District Team will still be eligible to play in the All-Star Series. ****

If a coach fills out a player profile form that is found in this newsletter and sends it in, this player will have the same opportunity as a player on the All District Team. This system is necessary because a number of good ball players have been left off the All-Star Squads because a coach could not get enough votes for his player at the All District Selection meetings. A reminder that each player must have \$150.00 worth of sponsor fees in order to play in the All Star Series.

Guidelines For the Nomination To HALL OF FAME FOR COACHES:

- 1. Any IHSBCA member may nominate a qualified baseball person.
- 2. This can be done on the official two-page nomination form which may be obtained from the IHSBCA Office, 4211 High Ridge Rd. S.E., Cedar Rapids, IA. 52403. The form may also be obtained from any Hall of Fame Committee member.
- 3. This form must be completed and returned to the IHSBCA office by September 1 of a given year in order to be eligible for selection the following year.
- 4. Eligible nominees must meet the following prerequisites:
- a/Must have served as a head baseball coach of a high school, 2-year college, 4-year college, umpire, player or contributor to baseball (local/state/national level)
- b/Must have served a minimum of 20 years in the aforementioned institution(s).
- c/ Must have significantly contributed to the advancement and betterment of baseball.
- d/ Must have made major contributions to the IHSBCA (such as serving on committees, filling offices, All-Star Series, attending clinics, encouraging membership.
- e/ Must be representative of:
 - i) high moral character and ethical standards
 - ii) excellence recognized beyond the local level
 - iii) demonstrated leadership
- 5/ After the September 1 deadline, the entire file is given a preliminary review by the Committee Chairman. The Committee Chairman will forward the file, containing his report, to the Hall of

Fame Committee. His report will attest to the candidate's qualifications pertaining to # 4 a, b, c, and e, aforementioned.

- 6/ The Hall of Fame candidates will be selected by ballot and notified by January of the year receive the award.
- 7/ Those declared elected for that year will be inducted at a banquet at the IHSBCA convention/clinic in February.
- 8/ Candidates not selected the initial year will remain in the "pool," and will automatically be considered for 5 consecutive years. If the candidate is not selected the fifth year, he will not be considered further until he is nominated another time.



ITEMS OF DISCUSSION

- 1. Pinky was asked and agreed to put an updated list of all schools and their respective districts on the web site. The committee has been compiling and updating this list for the past three years. The updated list will be forwarded to Pinky.
- 2. The following rule was adopted at the general meeting on Friday morning. A coach who delays in paying his dues until the All District meeting in July will also have to include next years dues with the payment. This would be a total of \$50.00 (\$25 for the current year and \$25 for the following year). The rationale behind the decision was to discourage coaches from only belonging to the association when they feel they have a player worthy of All District recognition. It was felt a coach should be willing to support the association and All District process on an annual basis.
- 3. The All District voting process was also discussed and the following items were points of emphasis for the upcoming July meetings.

- A. There shall be no ties for any position on an All District team. Continue voting until the tie is broken.
- B. Coaches are asked to vote for one extra player from the nominees in order to get the required number for an All District position. For example, if two catchers are needed, each coach should vote for three from the nominees.
- C. In order to be placed on an All District team, each player must have a simple majority of votes from the attending coaches. If there are 20 voting coaches in attendance, a player would need to receive 11 votes before he could be placed on an All District team. This method will require some re-voting to take place. However, the process should be helped along if item B from above is followed.
- 4. Each district is encouraged to have a representative at the All Star series to help in the selection of the All State teams for their respective class.
- 5. The All District committee was asked to develop an All State nomination form to be filled out at the conclusion of the All District meetings in July. This form would be given to any coach who feels his first or second team All District selection is also deserving of All State recognition. The form would be completed and returned immediately to the chairman in charge of the All District meeting. It will then be forwarded to Pinky and used at the All-Star series during the selection of the All State teams. This information will be very helpful to the coaches who are trying to select the best players for All State teams.

The All State Player Form is enclosed in this newsletter and on the web site.



Changing Districts and Class: At the recent Board of Directors meeting the following guidelines were approved. 1/ A school may move up a class, but not down a class. 2/ In order to move into another district or up a class, the member school must apply in writing by January 15th. 3/ The school must stay in that district or classification for five years. The only exceptions would be if the school's classification changes (by the State) or their conference is realigned. 4/ Apply in writing to the President or Executive Secretary. 5/ A school could move down with approval if all schools in conference are of a lower class.


