Twenty-Fifth Annual All-Star Games will be held in Carroll, Aug. 2-3-4-5, 2001. Any coach who feels he has a player or two who should be playing in the All-Star Games should fill out the Player Recommendation sheet that is enclosed in this Newsletter. Please enclose a photo of your player (if available) with the recommendation sheet. The guidelines for the All-Star selection can be found on this sheet. All of the advance information we can get on the best ball players will help in the selection of the All-Stars.

The Board of Directors passed a policy that any player or coach selected to participate in the All-Star Series must have a minimum of \$150.00 of sponsors' fees. More would help to defray the cost of the All-Star Series. It will be the high school coach's responsibility to get sponsors for the player if he wishes him to play in the All-Star games. This policy is necessary in order to offset the high cost of putting on the All Star series. If you have any questions about this policy, contact any officer or director in your area; they will explain it to you. Sponsor names and fees must be paid to Executive Secretary no later than Saturday, July 28, if your player is selected.

4/ Practice for all teams will be 12:15 p.m.--2:45 p.m. Practice sites: Large East-Carroll Stadium High Diamond; Large West-Carroll High Diamond; Small West-Coon Rapids Diamond; Small East-Carroll Kuemper High Diamond.

5/ First 7-inning games will be at 5:30 p.m., Thursday, Aug. 2, Small Schools East vs. Large Schools East, followed by Large Schools West vs. Small Schools West.

6/ Second-7 inning games will be at 1:00 p.m. Friday, Aug 3, Small Schools West vs. Large Schools East, followed by Large Schools West vs. Small Schools East.

All Star Squad Regulations:

1. Each squad will consist of 16 players (2 catchers, 4 pitchers, 5 infielders. 4 outfielders and 1 utility).

PLAYER SELECTION:

First priority: Coach's recommendation form

Second priority: All District Team

Third priority: Coach a member of the association.

Rules:

1/ All players chosen must play.

2/ The pitchers can pitch a full game.

3/ All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings are necessary.

4/ Tie breaker system will be announced in advance for who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition, most runs scored, least runs given up, most hits, least hits given

All of the examples can be given points. The two teams with the most points will play for 1st place.

This system will give more boys an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict a pitcher on amount of innings he can pitch in one day.

Coaches were picked by the Steering committee! They filled out an application that was found in the last newsletter.

*****Players who do not make the All District Team will still be eligible to play in the All-Star Series. ****

If a coach fills out a player profile form that is found in this newsletter and sends it in, this player will have the same opportunity as a player on the All District Team. This system is necessary because a number of good ball players have been left off the All Star Squads because a coach could not get enough votes for his player at the All District Selection meetings. A reminder that each player must have \$150.00 worth of sponsor fees in order to play in the Al I Star Series.

- 2. This must be done on the official two page nomination form which may be obtained from the IHSBCA Office, 4211 High Ridge Rd. S.E., Cedar Rapids, IA. 52403 or off the web site. This form must be completed and returned to the IHSBCA office by September 1 of a given year in order to be eligible for selection the following year.
- 3. Eligible nominees must meet the following prerequisites: a/Must have served as a head baseball coach of a high school, 2-year college, 4-year college, umpire, player or contributor to baseball (local/state/national level)
- b/Must have served a minimum of 20 years in the aforementioned nstitution(s).
- c/ Must have significantly contributed to the advancement and betterment of baseball in his area, district, state or nation.
- d/ Must have made major contributions to the IHSBCA (such as serving on committees, filling offices, All Star Series, attending clinics, encouraging membership.
- e/ Must be representative of:
 - i) high moral character and ethical standards
 - ii) excellence recognized beyond the local level
 - iii) demonstrated leadership

5/ After the September 1 deadline, the entire file is given a preliminary review by the Committee Chairman. The Committee Chairman will forward the file, containing his report, to the Hall of Fame Committee. His report will attest to the candidate's qualifications pertaining to # 4 a, b, c, and e, aforementioned.

Steering committee met this morning and recommended Paul Keitel as the new officer for next year. Jerry Kindall will be the speaker at the FCA breakfast as well as a the Awards Banquet. Pinky reported on the All Star series for this year as well as next years. He also gave out a new internet address---www.iowahsbca.com. Thanked those in attendance for the tremendous clinic turnout anticipated.
- 4. Officer and committee reports:
- a/ President Tom Souhrada gave his thanks to board members and coaches for making his term very enjoyable.
- b/ All District committee suggested that the selection procedure be followed at district meetings and to make sure each coach is a member, if not collect dues for (\$50). Be sure to select two coaches to go to the all state selection meeting which takes place at the All Star Series weekend.

- c/ All State Coach committee has issued new forms for nominees to fill out. These should be completed at the all district meetings and turned into the district chairperson at the meeting
- d/ Hall of Fame selections are complete and we are in the process of going through next year's nominees.
 - e/ Constitution Committee no report.
- f/ Membership Committee encourages every coach and umpire to work on getting more members into the Association.
- g/ Rating Poll Committee is again going to be coordinated by Lee Toole and Radio Iowa and the Cedar Rapids Gazette. Get information as soon as you receive the forms.
- h/ All Star Committee reports that rooms are reserved at the Carrollton Inn in Carroll. The activities are set for the ball players, and the coaches have been selected.
- i/ Umpire Committee is going to contact every umpire who worked tournament games last year and try to get them to join the Association. Next year they feel a professional umpire from some level of Major League should be a clinician. They recommend a College Umpire of the year be recognized, so moved and passed. The committee is satisfied with the present selection process but feel the coaches need a list of member umpires to select from at the All District meetings.
- j/ Steering Committee selected Paul Keitel from the southeast district as new officer. The association has agreed to donate \$1000 to the Cedar Rapids Kernels new stadium. The selection process for selecting a new executive secretary was discussed, a sub-committee will be formed at that time. All Star coaches will be notified at the clinic.
- k/ Lanny Peterson Award reports that last year's winner was chosen from 25 Academic First Team All State performers. The team had a composite ACT of 29 and GPA of 3.95, and a composite BA of .380. The three finalists were Nathan Spanheimer of lowa City West, Josh Peterson of Wilton, and Matt Daeges of Harlan. The winner was Nathan Spanheimer. He is attending Duke University.
- I/ Awards committee reports that the Association spends approximately \$3,000 a year on awards in 48 categories. Win club members of 100, 200, 300, 400 receive certificates. 500 wins and you receive a plaque, 600 wins at retirement you will receive a clock-plaque. The Association also gives out service awards in five year increments. The committee is looking at ways to recycle awards that have not been claimed.
- m/ Academic All State Committee needs coaches to fill out nomination forms completely, especially note the players non-academic pursuits.
 - n/ Foundation Report tabled until Fall meeting.
- 5. Bernie Saggau again has supported the Association with a \$1,300 stipend to defray Costs of the clinic. Thank you's were received from the families of former members who have passed away in the past year.


All State Coach Committee Report: Chairman Steve Hanson and members present were: Eddie Mauro, Jim Gebhart, Dirk Dunbar and Will Azinger

ITEMS OF DISCUSSION

1. It remains our purpose to be sure coaches, nominated for State Coach of the year in their respective districts, return their information sheets in a speedy manner. In order to get forms submitted quickly, our recommendation is that this process be completed at the All District Meeting. Any information the coach doesn't know can be phoned or emailed or faxed to the District Chairman that evening or the following day. It would then become the Chairman's job to return completed forms to Pinky with the rest of his All District information.

We also would like to see a revised form used for the application process. This revamped form contains previously reported information in a more readable style.

- 2. Pinky was asked and agreed to put an updated list of all schools and their respective districts on the web site. The committee has been compiling and updating this list for the past three years. The updated list will be forwarded to Pinky.
- 3. The following rule was adopted at the general meeting. A coach who delays in paying his dues until the All District meeting in July will also have to include next year's dues with the payment. This would be a total of \$50.00 (\$25 for the current year and \$25 for the following year). The rationale behind the decision was to discourage coaches from only belonging to the association when they feel they have a player worthy of All District recognition. It was felt a coach should be willing to support the association and All District process on an annual basis.
- 4. The All District voting process was also discussed and the following items were points of emphasis for the upcoming July meetings.



- A. There shall be no ties for any position on an All District team. Continue voting until the tie is broken.
- B. Coaches are asked to vote for one extra player from the nominees in order to get the required number for an All District position. For example, if two catchers are need ed, each coach should vote for three from the nominees.
- C. In order to be placed on an All District team, each player must have a simple majority of votes from the attending coaches. If there are 20 voting coaches in attendance, a player would need to receive 11 votes before he could be placed on an All District team. This method will require some re-voting to take place. However, the process should be helped along if item B from above is followed.
- 4. Each district is encouraged to have two representatives at the All Star series to help in the selection of the All State teams for their respective class.
- 5. The All District committee was asked to develop an All State nomination form to be filled out at the conclusion of the All District meetings in July. This form would be given to any coach who feels their first or second team All District selection is also deserving of All State recognition. The form would be completed and returned immediately to the chairman in charge of the All District meeting. It will then be forwarded to Pinky and used at the All Star series during the selection of the All State teams. This information will be very helpful to the coaches who are trying to select the best players for the All State teams.

The All State Player Form is enclosed in this newsletter and on the web site.

Umpires Committee Written Report: The umpires committee wants an updated list of current umpire members sent out to the District Meetings. Coaches should only select nominees from the given list of umpire members. At next year's clinic the umpires want someone from the higher professional ranks. Contacts will be made soon.

Awards Committee Written Report: Suggested that 400 Win-Club receive a plaque. 15-20-25 years of service plaque will not have a name on it. There are 48 categories of awards and 137 individual awards were presented.

Changing Districts and Class: At the recent Board of Directors meeting the following guidelines were approved. 1/ A school may move up a class, but not down a class. 2/ In order to move into another district or up a class, the member school must apply in writing by January 15th. 3/ The school must stay in that district or classification for five years. The only exceptions would be if the school's classification changes (by the State) or their conference is realigned. 4/ Apply in writing to the President or Executive Secretary. 5/ A school could move down with approval if all schools in conference are of a lower class.

- G. Shall have made positive contributions to society--local or state or national communities (helping people, financial assistance, scholarships, academic or athletic, assisting through organization or government, etc.)


