2002 HOF-7

Seven Selected For '2002' Hall Of Fame: Three coaches, one umpire and three players have been selected for induction into the I.H.S.B.C.A.'s Hall of Fame.

The seven inductees are: Mace Brown, North English; Albert Epperly, Davenport; Dave Harty, Boone; Bill Krejci, Creston; Larry Milledge, Chariton; Steve Mohr, Valley West Des Moines and Don "Spin" Williams, Davenport.

The seven will be inducted at the Awards Banquet, Saturday, February 2, 2002, in Cedar Rapids. They will join 183 other Hall of Fame members.

Mace Brown played baseball at the University of Iowa from 1926-29. Mace was a Catcher and Pitcher. He would pitch in the first game and catch in the second. He played for the Pittsburgh Pirates from 1935-40, Brooklyn Dodgers in 1941 and the Boston Red Sox in 1945-46. He played professional baseball 14 years, with 10 years in the Major Leagues. His best record was 15-9 in 1938. He pitched 3 innings in the 1938 All-Star Game. He was in 387 games, started 55, completed 18 and pitched 1,075 innings. He saved 48 games. His ERA was 3.47. Mace's overall record

was 76-57. Iowa Coach Otto Vogel called Mace the best player he ever had. Mace is now 91 years of age.

Albert Epperly played high school baseball at Glidden where he pitched. His record was 35-6. He played for the Carroll semi-pro teams and had a 12-2 record. Al also played Legion baseball where he had a 22-6 record. He played professional baseball 17 years, with one year in the big leagues. His over-all record in professional baseball was 171-72, with a 2-0 record for the Chicago Cubs in 1938.

Dave Harty is a native of Iowa Falls and a graduate of Iowa State University. Dave coached baseball, football and wrestling at Postville and Eagle Grove. He became a school administrator at Eagle Grove and currently serves as the Assistant Executive Director of the I.H.S.A.A. He has been in charge of the Iowa high school baseball program for 31 years. He has given many State baseball rules meetings and is an interpreter of the rules for the state of Iowa. He has served on the Clinic staff for many years. Dave has served on the National rules committee three different times for a total of 12 years.

William Krejci is a native of Chicago and a graduate of St. Lawrence High School and Northwest Missouri State University where he received his bachelor's and master's degrees. He was a two-year letterman in baseball. He served as assistant baseball coach at Northwest for two years and helped lead the Bearcats to the NCAA Division II World Series in 1976. From 1977-78 he served as assistant coach at Thomas Jefferson High School. In 1978 Krejci became the head baseball coach at Southwestern Community College, where he coached for 21 years, recording 523 wins. In 1998 he served as assistant coach on the World Champion USA Baseball Youth National Team and became the head coach of the team in 1999, which won the gold medal at the PAL World Series. In 2000 Krejci guided the USA Baseball Junior National Team to the silver medal at the World Championships in Edmonton, Canada. Krejci is a member of the IHSBCA 500-Win Club and the 25-Year Longevity club. He was inducted into the Northwest Missouri State University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1996 and the St. Lawrence High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998. In 1999 he was named Development Baseball Coach of the Year by the USOC. Currently, Krejci is an instructor and Director of Athletics at Southwestern Community College.

Larry Milledge graduated from Tracy High School where he played baseball and basketball. Larry was a Catcher in high school and college where he had a batting average of .387 and 16 HR in college. He went to William Penn College in 1956 and was drafted and signed after his sophomore year by the Cleveland Indians. He played 3 years in the minor leagues. Larry has been an outstanding high school coach for 35 years at Fremont, Eddyville, Chariton and Osceola. Larry was Southeast Iowa Class 3A Coach of the Year in 1996 and selected for William Penn Hall of Fame in 1997. He is a member of the 400-Win Club and has the 30-Year Longevity Award.

Steve Mohr graduated from Cedar Rapids Washington High School and was on the first All-State Team selected in Iowa. At Washington, Steve played outfield and second base. He was a four-year starter at Iowa State at 2nd and 3rd. He has been the West Des Moines Valley Head Coach for over 20 years. At Valley, his teams have won 532 games, gone to the State Tournament 4 times, won 9 Conference Titles, seven District and four Sub-State Titles. He is a member of the 500-Win Club. Steve was 4-A Coach of Year in 1995. He has been a long time member of the IHSBCA. He is very active in the FCA.

Don "Spin" Williams played high school baseball at Davenport West, graduating in 1975. He was a 1st baseman and pitcher, hitting over .300 in his high school career. He went on to Muscatine JC and graduated from Winona State in 1979. At Winona State University he was an all-conference first baseman. Spin signed a professional contract with the Pittsburgh Pirates. He pitched for 3 years in the minor leagues before becoming pitching coach or bullpen coach for the Pirates. He presently is the Pitching coach for the Major League Pirates. The 2001 season was Spin's 23rd as a member of the Pittsburgh organization. Spin has conducted several Clinics in Davenport.

DAVE ASPELMEIER: was named University of Iowa Athletic Department Compliance Assistance in 1998. He is a 1993 graduate of Coe College, where he received a bachelor of arts degree in psychology. He received his Master of Arts Degree in Post-Secondary Education from the University of Northern Iowa in 1996. Aspelmeier was a three-year track letterman and record holder at Coe College. He also helped coach the Coe track team in 1996.



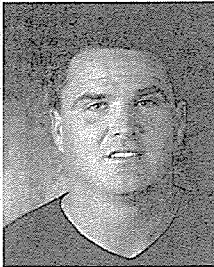
DUANE BANKS: Former head coach at the University of Iowa where he coached from 1970 until 1997. Duane's overall record at Iowa was 810-575. Banks was inducted into the ABCA Hall of Fame and also the IHSBCA Hall of Fame. He is a past president of the ABCA. Duane has been named both Big Ten Conference and District Coach-of-the-Year. Many of his former Hawkeyes have earned pro contracts and several have made it to the major leagues.



SCOTT BROGHAMER: University of Iowa head baseball coach. Scott played high school baseball at Decorah and graduated from Luther College. He started his coaching career at Urbana before going to the University as a grad assistant and then became an assistant coach to Duane Banks. He became the head coach upon the retirement of Coach Banks. Scott has been the head coach at Iowa for four years with an over-all record of 79-125. He has been a member of the Association for 22 years.



TIM EVANS: Former Prairie High School All-Star Player and Kirkwood player is now the hitting and outfield coach for the University of Iowa. Tim played four years in the minor leagues before joining the coaching ranks, starting at Kirkwood as hitting coach before moving to Iowa State as the hitting coach and Offensive Coordinator. Tim was an outstanding player at Prairie and Kirkwood and All-American at Southern Arkansas (NAIA). He played briefly in the major leagues during the 1994 season.



NATE FRESE: Former Benton Community and University of Iowa player and now on the 40-man roster of the Chicago Cubs. In the minor leagues, Nate has played four years, most recently at West Tennessee. Nate was named one of the top ten prospects in the Cubs organization by Baseball America. He made only 14 errors in 183 games. His life time hitting in the minors is .240. His best year was at Daytona Beach with a .296 average.



JAKE MOLINA: Coached 25 years at the collegiate level--14 years at University of San Diego, plus stops at San Diego City College and Santa Monica Junior College. Molina was the manager of the Spanish Olympic Team in the 1992 Summer Games and coached in the World Tournament and the European Championships games in France. Jake presently is the hitting coach for the San Diego Padres short season baseball team in Idaho Falls and managed Idaho Falls last summer.



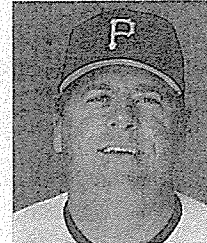
KEVIN RHOMBERG: Played high school baseball at Dubuque Hempstead from 1970-74. Kevin played short-stop, third base and left field at Lewis University and the College of St. Francis from 1976-77. His collegiate batting average was .465 and slugging average was .820. Kevin played 8 years professionally--3 years in the majors with the Cleveland Indians and the San Francisco Giants organization. He was featured in an article in Sports Illustrated in 1981 and inducted into the Chattanooga Baseball Hall of Fame in 1990. He is also a member of the IHSBCA Hall of Fame.



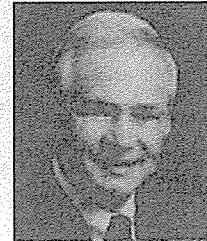

2001 Baseball Player and Coach Ejection Report:

There were 98 player ejections in grades 7-12 during the 2001 baseball season. This is 9 less than in 2000. 7th grade-0; 8th grade-1; 9th grade-10; 10th grade-9; 9/10th grade-1; JV-16; and Varsity 61. Of these ejections: Throwing Equipment 23; Profanity 22; Unsportsmanlike Behavior 8; Malicious Contact 36; Talking Back to Umpire/Disputing Calls 13; Chewing Tobacco 1.

There were 30 coach ejections during the 2001 baseball season. 7th grade-0; 8th grade-0; 9th grade-1; 10th grade-1; JV-4; Varsity-24; Varsity Assistant-0. Reasons for ejections: Questioning/Arguing Calls 22; Verbal Misconduct 2; Profanity 1; Profanity/Bumping Official 1; Unsportsmanlike Conduct 3; Left Dugout/Arguing 1.

**MINUTES OF IHSBCA FALL MEETING
NOVEMBER 17, 2001**

The Board of Directors, Steering Committee and Committee Chairmen of IHSBCA met on Saturday, November 17, 2001, in Iowa City. Board members present were: "Pinky" Primrose, Charles Stumpff, Bret Hoyer, Dick Core, Marlowe Van Ginkel, Dan Pomeroy, Jerry Roling, Bill Boyd, Tim O'Neill, Steve Hanson, Dennis Barton, Dave Middleton, Gary Paulsen, Troy Plummer, Emory Stewart, Mike Droll, John Waddle, Tom Souhrada, Don Taylor, Ed Feyen, Lenny Weih, Andy McGaffin, Jim Mahoney, Terry Heald, Bill Freese, Jim Gebhart, Roger Hoel, Lee Toole, Brad Rose, Jim Henrich and Paul Keitel.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved with a motion by Steve Hansen and seconded by Bret Hoyer.

A financial report was given by "Pinky". There being no questions, the report was approved on a motion by Dick Core and seconded by Marlowe Van Ginkel.

Report of Officers and Committees

- a. No new items to discuss on the President's report.
- b. "Pinky" reported on the upcoming clinic. Clinic speakers were discussed.
Discussion was held on the need to get new members. He then introduced Scott Broghamer, University of Iowa baseball coach, and recommended that a thank you letter be sent to Bob Bowlsby, Athletic Director, for hosting our fall meeting. District meetings were discussed and "Pinky" stressed that the information on nominees needed to be returned or they would not be eligible for awards.
- c. Hall of Fame report was given by Roger Hoel. Nominees for induction were named and approved on motion by Brad Rose and a second by Terry Heald.
- d. John Waddle presented the All District report. A suggestion of expanding the 4A Central district from 20 teams to two 10-team divisions was made. Three plans were then submitted by Steven Hanson on which teams would make up a northern and southern district. This would make five 4A districts. A motion was made to accept the "B" plan, by Bret Hoyer and seconded by Tom Souhrada. Discussion was held on reducing all district teams from 18 players to 14 players. It was decided to table this suggestion until the February meeting.
- e. No information was available on the Awards Committee.
- f. Dan presented a report on the All Star Series held at Carroll. Everything went well; the teams had a great time and a lot of donations were made.
- g. Gary presented the Umpires report. Nominees for district umpires were presented and on motion by Gary Paulsen and second by Dan Pomeroy, were approved. The Hall of Fame inductee was also approved under the same motion.
- h. Dan gave input on how the selection of the Lanny Peterson award is done. Deadline for submissions is prior to the All Star Series.
- i. Dan discussed the Academic All State report.
- j. The All State Rating report was given by Lee Toole. He has graciously volunteered to continue heading this committee.
- k. Brad Rose presented the membership report. He gave

several different ideas on how to get new people to come to the clinic. No reductions in clinic fees will be done at this time.

- l. Steve Hanson presented the All State Coach report.
- m. Tom presented the Advisory report. Tom suggested that the Player of the Year should be present at the All Star series.

A copy of the minutes from the IHSAA Advisory Committee meeting held on October 15th were handed out and discussed. The use of the Spalding ball was decided to be used in all tournament play.

A copy of the minutes from the Iowa Athletic Council Meeting held on October 17th were presented by Jim Gebhart. Highlights included stressing of sportsmanship, academic uniformity among all sports and having a representative present at this meeting.

"Pinky" presented the communications report. Several thank you letters were received by the committee concerning the All Star Series. Discussion was held on whether to consider continuing the Sunday clinic at the Iowa Bubble. At this time, it will remain as is. Discussion was also held on the new Hall of Fame building being built in Boone. A \$1,000 donation for the building was approved from a previous meeting. Several ideas were discussed on possible plans for the booth at the building. Bronco Base submitted a plan for endorsement at the clinic. It was discussed and decided to not get involved in endorsements at this time.

New business was discussed concerning the award winners for the upcoming clinic and banquet. Brad Rose presented a handout on the Junior Select Team that he took to Barrington, Illinois for a tournament. Only juniors in high school are allowed to play. Discussion was held whether the IHSBCA should get involved with sponsoring a team for such tournaments. A committee was formed to look into this further. The committee members are: Brad Rose, Jim Mahoney, Jim Gebhart, Dave Middleton, Andy McGaffin and Emory Stewart. They will report at the February meeting on their findings. Brad Rose incurred expenses during this tournament and it was decided that the IHSBCA would reimburse him for those expenses. A motion was made by Dan Pomeroy and seconded by Troy Plummer.

A motion was made by Roger Hoel and seconded by Jim Henrich to proceed into the selection of the District Coach Nominees meetings.

The next meeting of this group will be held on January 31, 2002 at the Five Seasons Center in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

Function of Committee: There shall be an All-Star Committee of the Board of Directors composed of 2 members of the Board and other members appointed by the President. The President will appoint the Chairman.

DUTIES:

8. Shall help in transportation to ball park.
9. Shall help in securing equipment.
10. Shall help in providing and serving meals.

Executive Secretary's Responsibility at All-Star Series:

1. Shall send out material to All-Star Coaches in early July.
Material: a/ Medical Form b/ Insurance releases c/ Other information necessary for running series.
2. Shall handle all monies from the: a/ program b/ ticket sales c/ banquet d/ sponsors e/ etc.
3. Will be in charge of the Games: a/ Times b/ Setting up Series c/ Umpires
4. Overseer of Banquet, Meals, Total operation
5. Shall instruct the coaches about duties of All-Star Series and rules to live by.
7. Shall secure housing--food, etc.

President's Responsibility:

- 1/ Evaluate series 2/ Hand out medals 3/ Help in any area necessary.

HALL OF FAME COMMITTEE:

Function of Committee: There shall be a Hall of Fame Committee of the Board of Directors composed of present Hall of Fame members and two members of the board, appointed by the President. The President will appoint the Chairman.

DUTIES:

1. Shall have the power to select Hall of Fame members each year.
2. Shall set up the selection process for other Hall of Fame members.
3. Shall set up a meeting of the Hall of Fame members at the annual clinic meeting for the selection and discussion of future Hall of Fame members.
4. Shall send out a note to present Hall of Fame members to encourage them to continue to be active in the Association.
5. Shall present to Board of Directors at their Fall meeting the Hall of Fame members for the up-coming year.
6. Shall recommend after evaluation of the Hall of Fame Award methods to improve the program of the Hall of Fame induction.

Executive Secretary's Responsibility:

1. Shall send out letters to the nominees of the Hall of Fame.

STEERING COMMITTEE:

Function of Committee: There shall be a Steering Committee of the Board of Directors composed of the (dues paying) Past Presidents. The past immediate president will serve as chairman.

All recommendations of the Committee shall be reported in full to the Board of Directors. All transactions of the Committee shall be reported to the Board and acted upon the next regular meeting of the Board of Directors.

The Steering committee shall have two meetings annually.

DUTIES:

1. Shall have the power to select the All-Star coaching staff.
2. Shall be the nominating committee.
3. Shall study long-range needs of the Association and make recommendations to the Board.
4. Shall serve as a screening committee, arrange interviews and make recommendations to the Board of Directors in the selection of the Executive Secretary.
5. Shall serve the President in any capacity deemed necessary by the President
6. Shall evaluate the Executive Secretary's work annually.

AUDITING COMMITTEE:

Function of Committee: There shall be an Auditing Committee of the Board of Directors. The Committee shall consist of 1 member of the Board and other members appointed by the President. The President will appoint the Chairman.

All recommendations of the Committee shall be in full to the Board of Directors. All transactions of the Committee shall be reported to the Board for action upon.

DUTIES:

1. Shall serve no more than two terms.
2. Shall complete the audit by the Annual Convention Clinic meeting of the total membership.
3. Shall report their findings to the membership.
4. Shall give a written report of their findings to the Third Vice-President to be recorded in the minutes.
5. Shall visit with the accountant of the organization and recommend changes that are necessary with Board approval.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE:

Function of Membership Committee: The committee shall consist of the two-year voted members of the Board of Directors from each district. The President will appoint the Chairman.

DUTIES:

1. Shall develop and execute plans for increasing the membership of the Association.
2. Membership shall be chosen to represent the various geographic sections of the state.
3. It will devise ways and means of cooperation with Umpires in securing members and in methods of organization for making such membership effective.
4. Such action shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Directors.
5. Shall work closely with Conference Representatives in their respective Districts.
6. Shall work to get 100% membership in each conference in the State.
7. Shall make a written annual report to the Board.

UMPIRE COMMITTEE:

Function of Umpires Committee: There shall be an umpire committee of the Board of Directors composed of one 2-year umpire from each District and one alternate from each district. Two at-large umpires appointed by the 5-member committee. This committee selects its chairman. The two highest vote-getters will serve as the 2-year representatives and 1 alternate to serve on the Board of Directors of I.H.S.B.C.A.

All recommendations of the committee shall be reported in full to the Board of Directors. All transactions of the committee shall be reported to the Board and acted upon at the meeting or next regular meeting of the Board of Directors.

Elected committee members may serve 2 three-year terms and then should drop off for 1 term. Appointed members are appointed for a 1-year term and may be reappointed at the wish of the committee chairman.

DUTIES:

1. Shall have the power to select one Hall of Fame member each year.
2. Shall set up the Clinic for umpires. This shall be completed by November 15.
3. Shall set up the process of nomination and selection of District Umpire of the Year along with the Board of Directors.
4. Shall serve as evaluators of the District nominees and State Umpire of the Year along with the Board of Directors.
5. Shall serve, plan, organize and implement program of information about Umpire of the Year.
6. Obtain names of umpires who will serve on this committee from different districts.
7. Complete reports from district on problems, possible solutions and changes.
8. Shall make a written annual report of committee to the Board of Directors at the annual Clinic/Convention.
9. Each District Representative is responsible for membership for the District.
10. Other duties set out by the President.

DUTIES FOR ALL-STAR GAMES

- 1/ Umpires nominated for District Umpire of the Year are to be invited to work All-Star games. If not enough umpires from this source are available, the Chairman of the Umpires Committee or his designee is to appoint other umpires to work.
2. Chairman of Umpires Committee or his designee makes assignments based upon responses from above.
3. Umpires who work All-Star games receive the following:
 - 1/ 2 tickets for banquet
 - 2/ \$40.00 cash to defray other expenses involved such as transportation and /or lodging.
 - 3/ Other mementos as deemed appropriate by Executive Secretary.
4. Each umpire who works will sign a waiver of injury form before working any games.

LONGEVITY AWARDS FOR UMPIRES

Awards to be presented:

- 10-Year Certificate of Service
- 15 Years, 20 Years, 25 Years , 30 Years of Service Plaques

Requirements for Above:

- 1/ must be an active umpire
- 2/ must have at least 3 consecutive years of membership in IHSBCA for certificate.
3. Must have a least 5 consecutive years of membership in IHSBCA for a plaque.
4. years as umpire certified by IHSAA

Further Stipulations:

1. Awards to be presented at banquet.
2. Umpires eligible for more than one award will be given the award for the longest number of years; however, he may purchase additional awards for earlier years.
3. Announcements of awards to be made in winter newsletter and umpires responses to be received by deadline as stated in newsletter.
4. All awards will be given on 5-year anniversary.

RATING POLL COMMITTEE:

Function of Rating Poll Committee: There shall be a Rating Poll Committee of the Board of Directors. This Committee shall consist of the Directors from each district plus one at-large member. All members must be a member of the Association.

DUTIES:

1. Shall set up the rating poll members by district.
2. Shall send out material to committee members to help evaluate the teams in their district, such as cards, telephone #, key coaches, etc.
3. Shall try to work through the Conference representatives as much as possible.
4. Shall study needs of this committee and make recommendations to the Board of Directors.
5. All transactions of the committee shall be reported to the board in writing and acted upon at the regular scheduled meeting.

CLINIC COMMITTEE:

Functions of Clinic Committee: There shall be a Clinic Committee of the Board of Directors composed of the Executive Secretary, Umpire Chairman, President and College advisory.

The Executive Secretary will serve as chairman.

Recommendations of the committee shall be reported to the full Board of Directors and acted upon at the next meeting of the Board of Directors.

DUTIES:

- 1/ Shall set up and run the Annual clinic.
- 2/ Shall secure speakers for Annual clinic.
- 3/ Shall set up program for Annual clinic.
- 4/ Shall mail out press releases for Annual clinic.
- 5/ The site (city & school) will be selected by the Board of Directors after invitation has been tendered.
- 6/ The convention shall be scheduled at such a time, location at such a site and housed in such property which shall maximize convention attendance, administrative efficiency, organization independence, membership convenience and the association image and prestige.

CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE:

Function of Constitution Committee: There shall be a constitution Committee of the Board of Directors composed of two Board of Directors and other members appointed by the Chairman. The President shall appoint the chairman of this committee. They shall serve no more than two terms.

DUTIES:

1. Shall report any recommendations of the committee to the Board of Directors.
 - a/ These recommendations shall then be voted by the Board and then sent out in the newsletter for action at the next regular meeting.

- b/ They shall study the Constitution and By-Laws of the organization/ Association and continually up-date.
- 2. If any Constitution changes are recommended they shall be put into proper language before submitting to vote of the Board of Directors.
- 3. Shall conduct annual Committee meeting prior to Clinic/ Convention meeting.
- 4. Shall make a written annual report of Committee to the Board of Directors.

ALL DISTRICT COMMITTEE:

Function of All-District Committee: There shall be an All-District Committee of the Board of Directors composed of two members of the Board of Directors and other members appointed by the Chairman. The chairman shall be appointed by the President.

They may not serve more than two terms on committee.

DUTIES:

- 1. Should develop and execute plans to review the All-District selection process.
- 2. Make recommendations to the Board on problems, possible solutions and purpose changes.
- 3. Serve as evaluators of All-District meetings and selection process.
- 4. Make a written annual report of Committee to the Board.

ALL STATE COACH COMMITTEE:

Function of All-State Coach Committee: There shall be an All-State Coach Committee of the Board of Directors composed of two members from the Board of Directors and 3 appointed by the Chairman. The President shall appoint the chairman. They may not serve more than two terms.

DUTIES:

- 1. Evaluate the Association All-State Coach Awards program and recommend methods of improving the program.
- 2. Make recommendations to improve the process of electing All-State Coach of the Year and District Coach of Year.
- 3. Plan, organize, and implement program of information about All-State Coach to be announced in the newsletter.
- 4. Make a written annual report of Committee to the Board of Directors at the February meeting.
- 5. Serve as evaluators of District nominees and State Coach of the Year along with the Board of Directors.
- 6. Conduct an annual committee meeting prior to clinic/convention.
- 7. Obtain names of coaches who will serve on this committee from different districts.
- 8. Complete reports from district on problems, possible solution and purpose changes.

LANNY PETERSON ACADEMIC COMMITTEE:

FUNCTION OF ACADEMIC COMMITTEE: To review and evaluate the process of choosing academic award winners and report to the Board any of their findings. Members of the committee shall serve at the request of the president until the end of each annual clinic/Convention or until their successor are appointed.

Committee chairman shall be the Vice-President, who shall call the committee together at the clinic/convention. This meeting should be held in the a.m. on Friday. The chairman shall report on their committee's direction at the Thursday night meeting and also at the general session. They should call as many meetings as necessary in order to get the job done.

DUTIES:

- 1. Select the First Team and Honorable Mention All-Academic.
- 2. Interview the candidates for the Lanny Peterson Award.
- 3. Evaluate the criteria for selection of candidates.
- 4. Report to the Board in writing an annual report of the Committee.
- 5. If any changes shall be necessary, they should be in writing and presented to the Board at the next regular meeting.

AWARDS COMMITTEE:

Function of the Awards Committee: There shall be an Awards Committee of the Board of Directors composed of two members of the Board of Directors and other members appointed by the Chairman. The Chairman shall be appointed by the President.

DUTIES:

- 1. To evaluate all awards presented by Association.
- 2. To evaluate a named award after 5 years, and recommend to the Board to continue the name or change the name of the award.
- 3. Shall make a written annual report of the Committee to the Board of Directors.
- 4. These recommendations shall then be voted upon by the Board of Directors.

The Association needs good committee workers. If you are interested in serving on a committee, please contact the Vice-President of the Association, who makes all committee assignments.

Questions frequently asked: (Repeat from 1999 letter)

1. How can I get involved with the Association? All that is necessary is to attend the clinic and All-Star series. Volunteer to work or coach at the All-Star series and/or at the clinic. Serve on committees!
2. How can I coach in the All-Star Series? Fill out the form in this newsletter and the Steering Committee selects the All-Star coaches. They try to get a balance of coaches in each District, hoping to be able to cover the state. Your nomination form stays on file for two years.
3. How can I umpire in the All-Star games? An umpire in the All-Star Series must have been a member of the Association for at least three years. He must be nominated at the District meetings held in July. All the nominations from these meetings go to the Umpires Committee, which meets at the All-Star site. The umpire chairman and committee will then select four additional umpires from the area to fill in the other four spots. Sixteen umpires are selected to work each year. If you are interested, fill out a nomination form that will be in the next newsletter. This form will be forwarded to the Umpire Committee chairman. All the umpires are selected by the Umpire's committee.
4. How can I get on the Board of Directors? All a coach or umpire must do is get nominated by fellow coaches or umpires. The nomination form is in the Sept.-Oct.-Nov. Newsletter. The nominees who receive the most votes go on the ballot. The one-year representative and alternate stay on the ballot, but must win the votes to go on the Board.
5. Who makes the committee assignments? The Vice-President (President-elect) always makes the committee assignments for the coming year. A coach may request a certain committee. The president-elect will try to spread the committee assignments around so all sections of the state are represented. The chairmen of the committees are usually Board of Directors.
6. How are the district nominees selected? The district nominees are selected in the July meetings. Any coach who takes his team to the State tournament becomes an automatic nominee. The coaches who are nominated in the July All-District meeting and the State tournament are then narrowed down to three for each class at the Fall meeting of the Board of Directors. The District Representatives (Two-Year, One-Year and 2-Year Umpire Reps) select the three nominees that go on the ballot. It is very important that a coach fill out the nomination form that is sent to him.
7. Who selects the officers? The steering committee, which is made up of dues-paying past presidents, selects the officers. The office of President moves around the state by each district. It is in this rotation: Northeast, West, Central, Southeast. The past president is chairman of the steering committee.
8. Who selects the award winners? The award winners are all selected by the Board of Directors. The Hall of Fame is selected by the Hall of Fame committee. All Hall of Fame nominations go to the Hall of Fame committee. This committee is made up of Hall of Fame members of the Board of Directors, Steering Committee and Hall of Famers.
9. Who selects the President's Award? The Board of Directors upon the recommendation of the Executive Secretary.

10. Who selects the Bill & Sherry Freese Award? The Board of Directors upon the recommendation of the Executive Secretary.

11. Who selects the Harold "Pinky" Primrose Award? The Board of Directors upon the recommendation of the Executive Secretary.

12. Who selects the District Media and Contributors Winners? The District chairman of each district with the help of the other representatives selects the winners at the Fall meeting.

13. How can a coach or umpire speak at the Annual Clinic? Very easy. Volunteer, give the Clinic chairman your topic, expertise and topic. That committee meets in November and puts the clinic together with the speakers.

14. How can I get my good ball player on the All-Star Team? Fill out the profile form in the newsletter or on the web site and submit to the Executive Secretary. The forms are then forwarded to the Head Coach of each team. Each coaching staff then selects the team that they feel can win the Series. They also must have a balance on their team; not everyone can play short-stop. After you submit the form, please let the coaches know that your player has been doing the job for you all year. Make sure you try to get the player exposure. Have other coaches recommend him.

If you have questions that you want answered, please forward them to the Executive Secretary or President of the Association. This is your organization; it needs you and you need it in order to get better and improve. Our business is to help improve high school baseball in the state of Iowa and also honor the coaches and players each year who have done an outstanding job in their district.
