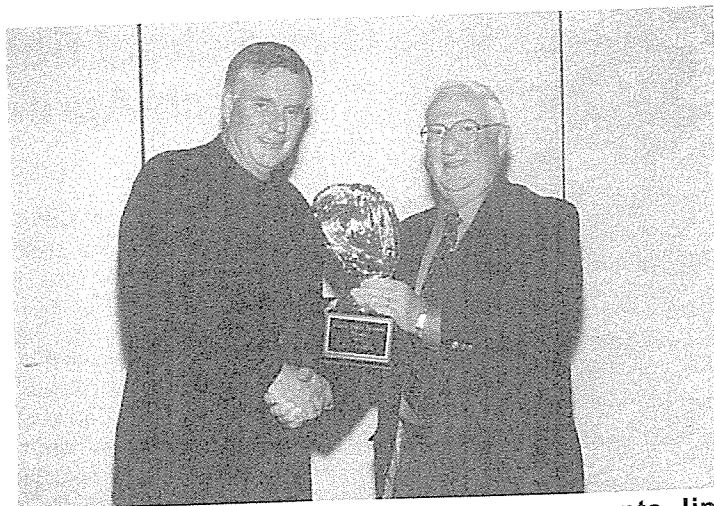

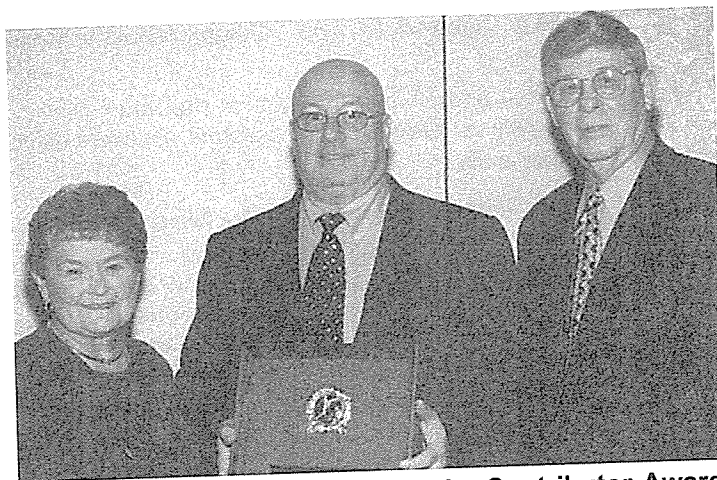

The Twenty-Sixth Annual All-Star Games will be held in Cedar Rapids, Aug. 1-2-3-4, 2002. Any coach who feels he has a player or two who should be playing in the All-Star Games should fill out the Player Recommendation sheet that is enclosed in this Newsletter. Please enclose a photo of your player (if available) with the recommendation sheet. The guidelines for the All-Star selection can be found on this sheet. All of the advance information we can get on the best ball players will help in the selection of the All-Stars.

The Board of Directors passed a policy that any player or coach selected to participate in the All-Star Series must have a minimum of \$150.00 of sponsors' fees. More would help to defray the cost of the All-Star Series. **It will be the high school coach's responsibility to get sponsors for the player if he wishes him to play in the All-Star games.** This policy is necessary in order to offset the high cost of putting on the All Star series. If you have any questions about this policy, contact any officer or director in your area; they will explain it to you. Sponsor names and fees must be paid to Executive Secretary no later than Saturday, July 27, if your player is selected.

All-Star Games Schedule: The players, coaches, umpires and staff will be staying at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Cedar Rapids. The Honors Banquet will be held at the Crowne Plaza Hotel, Saturday night at 6:00 p.m. All games will be played at the new Cedar Rapids Veterans Stadium.

1/ Players will arrive Thursday, August 1st. Individual pictures for inclusion in the program will be taken after check in.

2/ Players from Small Schools East will report by 10:30 a.m. Large Schools East players will report at 10:45 a.m.

3/ Players from Small Schools West will report at 11:00 a.m. and players from Large Schools West will report at 11:15 a.m.

4/ Practice for all teams will be 12:15 p.m.--2:45 p.m. Practice sites: Large East-Washington High Diamond; Large West-Jefferson Diamond; Small West-Prairie High Diamond; Small East-Kennedy High Diamond.

5/ First 7-inning games will be at 5:30 p.m., Thursday, Aug. 1, Small Schools West vs. Large Schools West, followed by Small Schools East vs. Large Schools East.

6/ Second 7-inning games will be at 5:30 p.m. Friday, Aug 2, Small Schools East vs. Large Schools West, followed by Large Schools East vs. Small Schools West.

7/ Saturday, Aug. 3, games will begin at 11:00 a.m., Small

Schools West vs. Small Schools East followed by Large Schools West vs. Large Schools East.

8/ At 6:00 p.m. Saturday, the Honors Banquet will be held at the Five Seasons Crowne Plaza Hotel.

9/ Sunday morning Church services will be provided at Hotel.

10/ Sunday, Aug. 4, at 11:00 a.m., the two teams with poorest records will play for 3rd and 4th place. The two teams with best records will play for 1st and 2nd place following the first game.

11/ M.V.P. players will be announced after each game on Sunday.

All Star Squad Regulations:

1. Each squad will consist of 16 players (2 catchers, 4 pitchers, 5 infielders, 4 outfielders and 1 utility).

PLAYER SELECTION:

First priority: Coach's recommendation form

Second priority: All District Team

Third priority: Coach a member of the association.

Rules:

1/ All players chosen must play.

2/ The pitchers can pitch a full game.

3/ All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings are necessary.

4/ Tie breaker system will be announced in advance for who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition, most runs scored, least runs given up, most hits, least hits given up.

All of the examples can be given points. The two teams with the most points will play for 1st place.

This system will give more boys an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict a pitcher on amount of innings he can pitch in one day.

If a coach fills out a player profile form that is found in this newsletter and sends it in, this player will have the same opportunity as a player on the All District Team. This system is necessary because a number of good ball players have been left off the All Star Squads because a coach could not get enough votes for his player at the All District Selection meetings. A reminder that each player must have \$150.00 worth of sponsor fees in order to play in the All Star Series.

Please complete the form and return to Pinky Primrose if you haven't already done so. This is needed for the Hall of Fame Committee! This form can be found in the last newsletter or on the web at www.iowahsbca.com.

For other awards, please fill out the nomination forms and send them in as soon as possible. The committees will be working on them for the next awards banquet.

Guidelines For the Nomination To HALL OF FAME FOR COACHES:

1. Any IHSBCA member may nominate a qualified baseball person. **Should have three letters of recommendation!**

2. This must be done on the official two-page nomination form which may be obtained from the IHSBCA Office, 4211 High Ridge Rd. S.E., Cedar Rapids, IA. 52403 or off the web site. This form must be completed and returned to the IHSBCA office by September 1 of a given year in order to be eligible for selection the following year.

3. Eligible nominees must meet the following prerequisites:

a/ Must have served as a head baseball coach of a high school, 2-year college, 4-year college, umpire, player or contributor to baseball (local/state/national level)

b/ Must have served a minimum of 20 years in the aforementioned institution(s).

c/ Must have significantly contributed to the advancement and betterment of baseball in his area, district, state or nation.

d/ Must have made major contributions to the IHSBCA (such as serving on committees, filling offices, All Star Series, attending clinics, encouraging membership.

e/ Must be representative of:

- i) high moral character and ethical standards
- ii) excellence recognized beyond the local level
- iii) demonstrated leadership

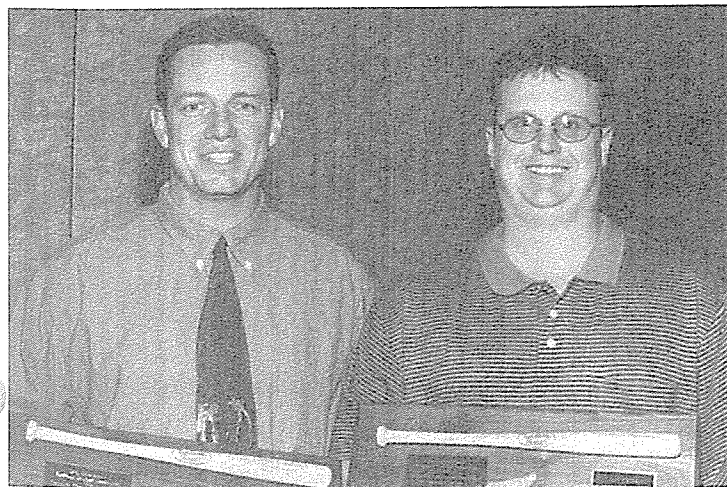
4/ After the September 1 deadline, the entire file is given a preliminary review by the Committee Chairman. The Committee Chairman will forward the file, containing his report, to the Hall of Fame Committee. His report will attest to the candidate's qualifications pertaining to # 4 a, b, c, and e, aforementioned.

5/ The Hall of Fame candidates will be selected from nomination forms and will be notified by December before the February Banquet, where they receive the award.

6/ Those declared elected for that year will be inducted at a banquet at the IHSBCA convention/clinic in February.

7/ Candidates not selected the initial year will remain in the "pool," and will automatically be considered for 5 consecutive years. If the candidate is not selected the fifth year, he will not be considered further until he is nominated another time.

8/ Awards may be made posthumously.

Umpires Committee Written Report: The umpires committee wants an updated list of current umpire members sent out to the District Meetings. Constitution Committee Written Report: Recommended updating the names of the officers to: President, President Elect, First Vice-President and Second Vice-President. All-District Committee Written Report: Coaches chairing the All-District Meeting should take care of the reminders before the meeting begins. All District packets will have forms in them for All-District player nominations and All-State Selection. infield positions. Also, 2 corner positions would replace the current third base and first base positions. Class 3A will review their current 4 district setup. 3A District teams will have 18 players per team. 1A-2A-4A will have 14 players per team because there will be 5 districts. All-Star coaches are automatic nominees for that district All-State selection committee.

Changing Districts and Class: At the recent Board of Directors meeting the following guidelines were approved. 1/ A school may move up a class, but not down a class. 2/ In order to move into another district or up a class, the member school must apply in writing by January 15th. 3/ The school must stay in that district or classification for five years. The only exceptions would be if the school's classification changes (by the State) or their conference is realigned. 4/ Apply in writing to the President or Executive Secretary. 5/ A school could move down with approval if all schools in conference are of a lower class.

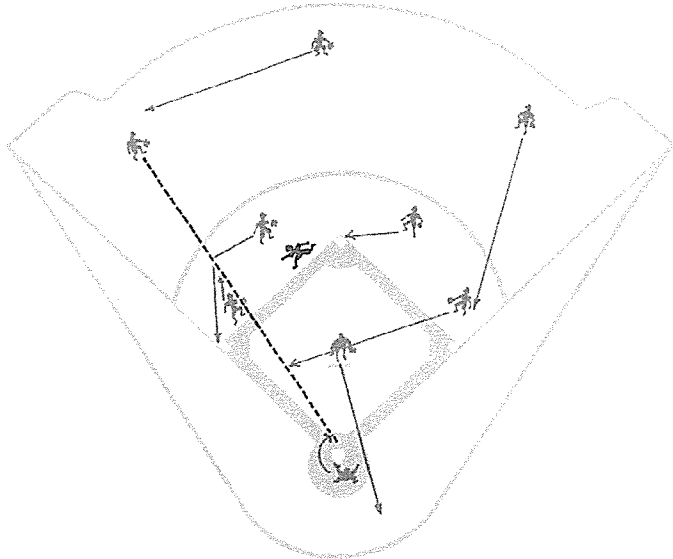
