This system was necessary because of a number of good ball players being left off the All-Star Squad because a coach could not get enough votes for his player at the All-District Selection meetings. A reminder that each player must have \$150 worth of sponsor fees in order to play in the All-Star Series. This goes toward the hotel, food, shirts and other expenses that go along with the All-Star Series.

Each squad will consist of 16 players (2 catchers, 4 pitchers, 5 infielders, 4 outfielders and 1 utility).

First priority: Coach's recommendation form.

Second priority: All District Team.

Third priority: Coach a member of the Association.


Wartburg won the 6th consecutive IIAC Championship. 6th consecutive National Tournament appearance.

William Penn won 40 games to set a school record! Home Runs (69), Doubles (126). One of only two collegiate teams to ever have 2 pitchers throw back to back no-hit, shut-outs on the same day. Senior Eric Evans (Eddyville-Blakesburg) was one of the pitchers. Pitching staff threw five consecutive shut-outs to tie school record at one stretch.



Clark College and Coach Eric Frese had Jerry Zieser (Vinton-Shellsburg) on the All-Conference with a .379 batting average.

Mount Mercy's Jeremy Schlotterbeck (C.R.Jefferson) 3rd straight Year All-Conference! Josh Walters (Midland) and Travis Herert (Clear Creek-Amana) with Schlotterbeck were Tri-MVP.

Cornell's first year coach Frank Fishler set a school record for wins with 21 (old record was 17).

Dennis Rima (Univ. of Dubuque) won his 400th game this past spring.

Indian Hills won the Iowa Division I Juco Conference with a 50-16 record.

Upper Iowa had Wade Whitcher (North Fayette) 1st Team All-Conference; Aaron O'Neill, Waukon and Josh Carr (Grinnell) 2nd Team All-Conference.
