Seven Selected For '2003' Hall Of Fame: Three coaches, one umpire and three players have been selected for induction into the I.H.S.B.C.A.'s Hall of Fame.

The seven inductees are: Ken Ferris, Bettendorf; Jack Hamilton, Morningside; Jim Happel, Atkins; Pat Heiderscheit, Lansing Kee; Bob Leech, Muscatine; Dan Reid, Burlington; Tom Souhrada, Davenport West.

The seven will be inducted at the Awards Banquet, Saturday, February 8, 2003, in Cedar Rapids. They will join 190 other Hall of Fame members.

KEN FERRIS has been umpiring for 32 years at all levels. Prior to his high school umpiring, Ken worked in the professional leagues for 2 years. He has averaged between 60 and 65 games a year for 30 years. He has worked six All-Star Series. Ken has been a member of the Association for 30 years. He has worked in many state tournaments. He has been a presenter at the Clinic several times. He is regarded as one of the best high school umpires in eastern lowa.

JACK HAMILTON played high school baseball at Morning Sun, graduating in 1956. He played professional baseball 15 years, nine years in the Major Leagues. Jack played nine seasons with six different teams in the majors; they were the Phillies, Colt 45's, Tigers, Angels, White Sox and the Indians. He made his major league debut with the Phillies in 1962. His over-all Major League record was 32-40. He had a respectable 4.53 career earned-run average with 357 strikeouts in 612 innings of work. Jack retired from baseball in 1971. He presently resides in Ridgedale, Mo.

JIM HAPPEL was an outstanding southpaw pitcher, nicknamed the "fireman", for Atkins High School. While at Atkins he pitched 8 no-hitters. 7 1-hitters, and 3 2-hitters. He had 368 strike-outs in 192 innings pitched and a record of 27 wins and 5 losses. Jim also pitched for the Cedar Rapids Legion Team for two years; in 222 innings he had an earned run average of 1.08 per nine innings, striking out 196, allowing only 14 bases on balls, and 87 hits while winning 22 games and losing only 2. Happel was one of five players throughout the United States selected by the American Legion National Americanism Committee in 1956 to the Legion Hall of Fame. In 1957 Jim signed a contract with the Cleveland Indians. Jim currently lives in Cedar Rapids.

PAT HEIDERSCHEIT played high school baseball at Kee High of Lansing. He was a 5-year letterwinner, playing P/C/SS. His career high school record was .411 batting average, 15 home runs, 149 RBl's. His high school career pitching statistics were 39-11 record, with 2.25 ERA. He was voted MVP three times in 1982, 1983 and 1984. They won the summer state championship in 1980 and 1981. Pat went on to Iowa State University and lettered four years. He was selected two times MVP in 1987 and 1988. He was 2-time First-Team Academic All-American catcher and Big 8 Scholar-Athlete Medal Recipient in 1988. He signed with the Montreal Expos in 1988. He was the pitching coach for the Jamestown Expos and the Vermont Expos in 1993 and 1994.

BOB LEECH graduated from Muscatine High School in 1967 and played varsity baseball as a catcher for three years. He went to Muscatine CC and then on to lowa State University. Bob then went into coaching where he spent three years in Centerville, four years in Marshalltown and 18 years in Muscatine. As a coach his teams won 551 and lost 379. He won the State Championship and was a State participant four years. His teams won sixteen tournaments. Bob was an active member of the Coaches Association in his 25 years of coaching. He was a Board Member, chaired many District meetings and spoke at the Clinic. He coached in the All-Star Series four times. He was named Conference Coach of Year six times and District Coach of Year five times. Bob presently lives in Muscatine.

DAN REID graduated from Burlington High School in 1969. He played high school and Legion baseball for Burlington. He attended Southeastern Comm. College and then the University of Northern Iowa. He has been a varsity baseball coach for 25 years--Burlington Notre Dame for 13 years and Burlington for 12 years. His over-all record is 487 wins and 311 losses. His team won the State Championship in 1982 and has been a State Participant four times, winning four sub-states, 9 District Titles and 8 Conference Titles at Notre Dame (Deerwood Conference) and 1 at Burlington (MAC) Dan has been very active in the Coaches Association for the past 21 years as a Board Member and coaching in All-Star Series. He has served on many committees. He is a member of the 400 Win Club and 20-Year Longevity Award.

TOM SOUHRADA coached high school baseball at Davenport West for 25 years, 20 as Varsity Coach. Tom grew up in Pekin, III. and lettered 4 years in baseball as an infielder. He played football at Illlinois State University in Normal and graduated in 1968. He played semi-pro baseball in the summers. As a coach his teams won the State Championship once and were State Tournament participants 5 times. His teams won 14 tournaments. His over-all record was 343-256. Tom has been a member of the Association for 27 years. Tom retired after going through the chairs of the Association, serving as President in 2000. He is a member of the Steering Committee. He served on many committees and chaired several. He coached in the All Stare series twice and served on the All-Star Commttee 6 years. He hosted the All-Star Series in 2000. He has printed notepads for the annual clinic the past several years. He was Conference Coach of Year 4 times. and nominated for district coach of the year 8 times. He was District coach of the year 3 times. Tom retired in 2001 and currently teaches at Davenport West.

2002 Baseball Player and Coach Ejection Report:


There were 104 player ejections in grades 7-12 during the 2002 baseball season. This is 6 more than in 2001. 7th grade-0; 8th grade-0; 9th grade-12; 10th grade-9; JV-10; and Varsity 73. Of these ejections: Throwing Equipment 18; Profanity 27; Unsportsmanlike Behavior 14; Malicious Contact 39; Talking Back to Umpire/Disputing Calls 13.

There were 19 coach ejections during the 2002 baseball season. 7th grade-0; 8th grade-0; 9th grade-1; 10th grade-3; JV-3; Varsity-12; Varsity Assistant-0. Reasons for ejections: Questioning/Arguing Calls 16; Profanity/Arguing 2; Arguing/Kicked Cooler 1.

As head coach of Hillcrest High School in Springfield, Mo. and former Head of Instruction of Mickey Owen, he is a nationally known clinician having spoken in 46 states plus Canada and many foreign countries. He was voted ABCA High School Coach of Year in 1979 and was the Head Coach of the North Team at the

PETE CALIENDO, Director of Baseball Operations of USA Athletic



International, has a great background of instruction. He spent 10 years instructing with the Mickey Owens School, two years with Baseball Schools USA. He has managed a summer college team and was Assistant Coach at the Univ. of Illinois/Chicago Circle. He has spoken at 100 plus coaching clinics throughout the country. Pete played four years of college baseball and played professional baseball in Italy. Pete coached in the Northern Professional Baseball League and was

Head Coach and Director of Baseball Development in the Belgium Baseball Federation from 1995 to present. He was the former Director of Development of Baseball Operations for the Schaumburg Flyers. He has published several articles.

MEL DIDIER, Special Assistant to Vice President of the Baltimore



Orioles Baseball Club, comes back by popular request. Mel is one of the nation's outstanding clinicians and motivational speakers. Mel has many years of teaching baseball; he has worked with the Indians, Expos, Dodgers, Mariners, Diamondbacks and now with the Orioles. Coach Didier served as athletic director and baseball coach at USL from 1981-82. He coached high school baseball and football for 15 years. Coach

Didier became the first person in Major League history to serve as an administrator for three expansion clubs.

RICK HELLER, enters his 17th season as the Head Baseball Coach



at the college level, presently his fourth year at University of Northern Iowa. A graudate of Upper Iowa University in 1986, Heller is the only Upper Iowa athlete to letter in three sports in the same year since 1961. Prior to arriving at UNI he spent 14 years at Upper Iowa. Rick's over-all record is 379-280. Six players have been drafted by Major League Baseball. He was an assistant baseball coach at North Fayette before taking the head

baseball position in Bakersfield, MO. He returned to Upper lowa as head coach in 1987. In the past 16 years, Rick has won four Conference Championships and has gone on to the NCAA Central region three times, and the College World Series two years ago. He has been a member of the Association for 18 years.

JONTHAN MATHEWS graduated from Centerville High School in



1990 where he was a member of the 3A Champion baseball team in 1988. While attending Indian Hills Community College his team went to the Junior College World Series in 1992 and he was named an Academic All-American his sophomore year. He then to the University of New Orleans where he was a two-time Academic All-American. Mathews signed with the Colorado Rockies in 1994 and played two years in their minor league system. He went to the Univ. of Iowa as a volunteer assistant

while earning his Master's Degree in Athletic Administration. In 1996 Mathews was a Twins' minor league instructor. He coached in the Gulf Coach League in 1996 and the Florida State League in 1997. He then managed two years in Elizabethtown, TN, in the Appalachian League for Minnesota. He returned to become an assistant coach at Indian Hills. He has spent the last 3 years as the hitting coach for head coach Cam Walker.

PETE SEYFER is a former all-state high school third baseman/pitch-



er at Cedar Rapids Washington and then for the lowa State Cyclones. Pete is Vice President of Frank N. Magid Associates, the world leader in media research and consultation. Pete specializes in presentation issues whether it's in the boardroom or in front of a camera. Pete has shared his communication insight and expertise with individuals from politicians to professional athletes to ministers in the

pulpit. Pete also works in personal development and motivational training with some of the finest Fortune 500 companies. Pete holds a bachelor's degree in Broadcast Journalism from Iowa State University.

RON WOLFORD is the founder of PITCHING CENTRAL and CEO of the CAN AM Sports Academy in Houston. He was the Head Softball



Coach at the Univ. of Nebraska from 1986-91, where his teams twice competed in the College World Series. Wolforth's passion is drawn from the realization he had below average results as a college pitcher in spite of the fact that he had better than average velocity and far better than average desire and aptitude. His fifteen-year passion for uncovering and explaining the possible keys to performance has led him to writing and sharing the results on pitching. He speaks at dozens of clinics, workshops and seminars every year in the U.S.A. and Canada, including the ABCA's Atlanta conven-

tion in 1999.

- A. An infield pop fly will be all infielders' responsibility, and they must try for the ball until one fielder takes charge by calling for the play.
 - 1. When calling, yell loudly three or four times.
- B. As designated in the diagram, each infielder has his area, but he may take the play out of his area if he has taken charge of the play. NOTE: Especially on windy days, do not call for play too soon.
- C. WHEN PITCHER HELPS: On questionable pop flies around the mound area, and after one or more infielders have called for the play, the pitcher then calls the last name of the fielder he thinks is in the best position to make the play.
- D. The catcher must not give up on pop flies too quickly.
- E. All pop flies directly behind the 1st and 3rd basemen will be the responsibility of the 2nd baseman and the shortstop.

- A reminder to all district representatives and committee members to attend our district meetings at the clinic.
- The Awards Banquet will be the same as last year with an emphasis on keeping things moving. \$3700 is spent on awards for this evening. We'd like to see all recipients there to receive their awards. This is what it's all about.
- 5) Conference reps. should send in Conference Champions.
- 6) Pinky recommended that Fr. Craig Collison receive the President's Award, Paul Keitel the Bill & Sherry Freese Award and Wayne Cooley the Pinky Primrose Award. Gary Paulsen make the motion to accept the recommendation and Mike Droll seconded it. All were in favor.
- Pinky also recommended Sen. Grassley receive the Pinky Primrose Award in 2004.
- Coaches and umpires that are up for awards should complete the ques tionnaires that are given them. You should not have to be reminded.
- 9) Jim Gebhart's group did a great job in their selection of the Academic Award winner. Mike Mogard of Marshalltown was the winner. Jeff Clement of Marshalltown was the Player of the Year which was another great choice.
- High School coaches should be accurate in giving their coaching records. Only varsity records count.
- Coaches should send in possible player records to Boone. Make sure you have verification of the record.

Hall of Fame Committee requested a private room for their discussion & selection process. Class of 2003 Coaches inductees: Bob Leech - Muscatine, Dan Read -Burlington and Tom Souhrada - Davenport West, Class of 2003 Player Inductees: Bill Happel - Atkins, Pat Heiderscheit - Lansing and Jack Hamilton - Morning Sun. A motion to accept these into the Hall was made by Terry Hamilton and seconded by Lee O'Toole.

The All-District Committee thought the present number of districts and players were good, There was overwhelming support to keep separate infield positions for the All-District teams.

The Awards Committee is very satisfied with the present award system. They feel they are doing a good job of recognizing accomplishments.

The All-Star Series was held this past summer in Cedar Rapids at Vets Stadium. They did a great job hosting the event. Thanks to the Cedar Rapids coaches for doing a great job organizing. There was a \$1200 dollar loss due to the extra night's stay for the Western teams and getting out of the dry goods business. Next year's Series will be hosted by Lee Toole of Council Bluffs. The games will be played at Creighton University rather than Rosenblatt Stadium due to conflicts, Coaches are reminded to encourage players chosen to accept their selections because of all the time and effort put into the process. A list of rules was drawn up for the Olympics held at the Series.

The Umpires Committee selected Ken Ferris to go into the Hall of Fame. Terry Heald made the motion to accept and Phil Katz seconded it. All were in favor. They"ve also decided on the candidates for Umpires of the Year and Newcomer of the Year.

The Lanny Peterson Academic Award Committee mentioned that they had narrowed the field to 4 candidates before selecting Mike Mogard of Marshalltown. The candidates were outstanding with great credentials. Coaches are reminded to get information in early for Academic All-State and make sure you mention all accomplishments and anything special for the nominee.

The All-State Rating Poll went very well this past summer. Coaches were very helpful as well as newspapers. They ask for continued help next summer. Keep up the good work.

A letter was sent to all schools to encourage all coaches to become members of the lowa High School Baseball Coaches Assn. Fees will remain the same. Coaches are encouraged to only hire umpires who are members.

All-State nomination forms have been helpful in selecting All-State teams. Coaches are reminded to send them to Pinky. District representatives are reminded to attend the All-State selection meetings at the All-State selection meetings at the All-Star Series weekend.

The Advisory Committee met with IHSAA officials in October. They are taking a look at the byes in the Class 4A tournament. The teams who receive the byes should not always be the same ones. The catcher's mask and helmet have to be 1-piece from the same company. Scores should be called in to Bud Lake. There was discussion on the heat index and lightning factor during ball games., They now have measuring devices to protect the safety of the players. Aluminum bats are still legal. Some states are questioning their safety.

The main responsibility for the Steering Committee is to find a replacement for Dan Pomeroy. (to go through the chairs)

New Business:

- There was discussion about allowing coaches to work with their players all year round, since baseball is in the summer when other coaches are allowed to work with their players. It was decided that there will be a committee formed to hopefully meet with Dave Harty at the Spring Clinic to discuss this matter. The committee should have ideas and proposals in place. Pinky or Dan will call Mr. Harty to arrange this. A concern was that sometimes baseball will be the 3rd activity that kids are nvolved in on game day.
- 2) Brad Rose gave a summary on last summer's Junior Select team. There was discussion on possibly replacing this team with the top juniors dis playing their talents on Thursday of the All-Star Series week. Ouestions have come up about awareness, selection, involvement of the IHSBCA and college recruiting. Brad & Charlie will check out possibilities with other states and come back with ideas. A thank you should be sent to Rick Powell for donating a van for the team this past summer.
- It was mentioned to send a thank you to Bernie Saggau for giving \$1200 for speakers at the clinic and to wish him well with his recovery.
- The next Board of Directors meeting will be at the Crowne Plaza in Cedar Rapids on Feb. 6.

The motion was made to adjourn to District Meetings by Jim Donohue and seconded by Mike Droll.

Questions frequently asked: (Repeat from 1999 letter)

- 1. How can I get involved with the Association? All that is necessary is to attend the clinic and All-Star series. Volunteer to work or coach at the All-Star series and/or at the clinic. Serve on committees!
- 2. How can I coach in the All-Star Series? Fill out the form in this newsletter. The Steering Committee selects the All-Star coaches. They try to get a balance of coaches in each District, hoping to be able to cover the state. Your nomination form stays on file for two years.
- 3. How can I umpire in the All-Star games? An umpire in the All-Star Series must have been a member of the Association for at least three years. He must be nominated at the District meetings held in July. All the nominations from these meetings go to the Umpires Committee, which meets at the All-Star site. The nominees are narrowed down to three per district. The umpire chairman and committee will then select four additional umpires from the area to fill in the other four spots. Sixteen umpires are selected to work each year. If you are interested, fill out a nomination form that will be in the next newsletter. This form will be forwarded to the Umpire Committee chairman. All the umpires are selected by the Umpire committee.
- 4. How can I get on the Board of Directors? All a coach or umpire must do is get nominated by fellow coaches or umpires. The nomination form is in the Sept.-Oct.-Nov. Newsletter. The nominees who receive the most votes go on the ballot. The one-year representative and alternate stay on the ballot, but must win the votes to go on the Board.
- 5. Who makes the committee assignments? The Vice-President (President-elect) always makes the committee assignments for the coming year. A coach may request a certain committee. The president-elect will try to spread the committee assignments around so all sections of the state are represented. The chairmen of the committees are usually Board of Directors.
- 6. How are the district nominees selected? The district nominees are selected in the July meetings. Any coach who takes his team to the State tournament becomes an automatic nominee. The coaches who are nominated in the July All-District meeting and the State tournament are then narrowed down to three for each class at the fall meeting of the Board of Directors. The District Representatives (Two-Year, One-Year and 2-Year Umpire Reps) select the three nominees who go on the ballot. It is very important that a coach fill out the nomination form that is sent to him.
- 7. Who selects the officers? The steering committee, which is made up of dues-paying past presidents, selects the officers. The office of President moves around the state by each district. It is in this rotation: Northeast, West, Central, Southeast. The past president is chairman of the steering committee.
- 8. Who selects the award winners? The award winners are all selected by the Board of Directors. The Hall of Fame is selected by the Hall of Fame committee. All Hall of Fame nominations go to the Hall of Fame committee. This committee is made up of Hall of Fame members of the Board of Directors, Steering Committee and Hall of Famers.
- 9. Who selects the President's Award? The Board of Directors upon the recommendation of the Executive Secretary.

- 10. Who selects the Bill & Sherry Freese Award? The Board of Directors upon the recommendation of the Executive Secretary.
- 11. Who selects the Harold "Pinky" Primrose Award? The Board of Directors upon the recommendation of the Executive Secretary.
- 12. Who selects the District Media and Contributors Winners? The District chairman of each district with the help of the other representatives selects the winners at the fall meeting.
- 13. How can a coach or umpire speak at the Annual Clinic? Very easy. Volunteer, give the Clinic chairman your topic, expertise and topic. That committee meets in November and puts the clinic together with the speakers.
- 14. How can I get my good ball player on the All-Star Team? Fill out the profile form in the newsletter or on the web site and submit to the Executive Secretary. The forms are then forwarded to the Head Coach of each team. Each coaching staff then selects the team that they feel can win the Series. They also must have a balance on their team; not everyone can play short-stop. After you submit the form, please let the coaches know that your player has been doing the job for you all year. Make sure you try to get the player exposure. Have other coaches recommend him.

If you have questions that you want answered, please forward them to the Executive Secretary or President of the Association. This is your organization; it needs you and you need it in order to get better and improve. Our business is to help improve high school baseball in the state of lowa and also honor the coaches and players each year who have done an outstanding job in their district.
