

Twenty-Eighth Annual All-Star Games will be held in Iowa City at the University of Iowa Field, Aug. 5-6-7-8, 2004. Any coach who feels he has a player or two who should be playing in the All-Star Games should fill out the Player Recommendation sheet that is enclosed in this Newsletter. Please enclose a photo of your player (if available) with the recommendation sheet. The guidelines for the All-Star selection can be found on this sheet. All of the advance information we can get on the best ball players will help in the selection of the All-Stars.

The Board of Directors passed a policy that any player or coach selected to participate in the All-Star Series must have a minimum of \$150.00 of sponsors' fees. More would help to defray the cost of the All-Star Series. It will be the high school coach's responsibility to get sponsors for the player if he wishes him to play in the All-Star games. This policy is necessary in order to offset the high cost of putting on the All Star series. If you have any questions about this policy, contact any officer or director in your area; they will explain it to you. Sponsor names and fees must be paid to Executive Secretary no later than Saturday, July 31, if your player is selected.

2/ Players from Small Schools East will report by 10:30 a.m. Large Schools East players will report at 10:45 a.m.

3/ Players from Small Schools West will report at 11:00 a.m. and players from Large Schools West will report at 11:15 a.m.

4/ Practice for all teams will be 12:15 p.m.--2:45 p.m. Practice sites: Large East-West High Diamond; Large West-Mercer Diamond; Small West-University of Iowa Diamond; Small East-Regina High Diamond.

5/ First 7-inning games will be at 5:30 p.m., Thursday, Aug. 5, Small Schools West vs. Large Schools West, followed by Small Schools East vs. Large Schools East.

6/ Second 7-inning games will be at 5:30 p.m. Friday, Aug 6, Small Schools West vs. Large Schools East, followed by Small Schools East vs. Large Schools West.

7/ Saturday, Aug. 7, games will begin at 11:00 a.m., Small Schools West vs. Small Schools East followed by Large Schools West vs. Large Schools East.

8/ At 6:00 p.m. Saturday, the Honors Banquet will be held at the Sheraton Hotel in downtown lowa City.

9/ Sunday morning Church services may be provided at the Hotel.

10/ Sunday, Aug. 8, at 10:30 a.m., the two teams with poorest records will play for 3rd and 4th place. The two teams with best records will play for 1st and 2nd place following the first game.

All Star Squad Regulations:

1. Each squad will consist of 16 players (2 catchers, 4 pitchers, 5 infielders, 4 outfielders and 1 utility).

PLAYER SELECTION:

First priority: Coach's recommendation form

Second priority: All District Team

Third priority: Coach a member of the association.

Rules:

1/ All players chosen must play.

2/ The pitchers can pitch a full game.

3/ All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings are necessary.

4/ Tie breaker system will be announced in advance for who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition, most runs scored, least runs given up, most hits, least hits given up.

All of the examples can be given points. The two teams with the most points will play for 1st place.

This system will give more boys an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict a pitcher on amount of innings he can pitch in one day.

*****Players who do not make the All District Team will still be eligible to play in the All-Star Series. ****

If a coach fills out a player profile form that is found in this newsletter and sends it in, this player will have the same opportunity as a player on the All District Team. This system is necessary because a number of good ball players have been left off the All-Star squads because a coach could not get enough votes for his player at the All District Selection meetings. A reminder that each player must have \$150.00 worth of sponsor fees in order to play in the All-Star Series.

Please complete the form and return to Pinky Primrose if you haven't already done so. This is needed for the Hall of Fame Committee! This form can be found in the last newsletter or on the web at www.iowahsbca.com.

For other awards, please fill out the nomination forms and send them in as soon as possible. The committees will be working on them for the next awards banquet.

Guidelines For the Nomination To HALL OF **FAME FOR COACHES:**

1.Any IHSBCA member may nominate a qualified baseball person. Should have three letters of recommendation!

2. This must be done on the official two-page nomination form which may be obtained from the IHSBCA Office, 4211 High Ridge Rd. S.E., Cedar Rapids, IA. 52403 or off the web site. This form must be completed and returned to the IHSBCA office by September 1 of a given year in order to be eligible for selection the following year.

3. Eligible nominees must meet the following prerequisites: a/Must have served as a head baseball coach of a high school, 2-year college, 4-year college, umpire, player or contributor to baseball (local/state/national level)


b/Must have served a minimum of 20 years in the aforementioned institution(s).

c/ Must have significantly contributed to the advancement and betterment of baseball in his area, district, state or nation.

d/ Must have made major contributions to the IHSBCA (such as serving on committees, filling offices, All Star Series, attending clinics, encouraging membership.

e/ Must be representative of:

- i) high moral character and ethical standards
- ii) excellence recognized beyond the local level
- iii) demonstrated leadership
- 4. After the September 1 deadline, the entire file is given a preliminary review by the Committee Chairman. The Committee Chairman will forward the file, containing his report, to the Hall of Fame Committee. His report will attest to the candidate's qualifications pertaining to all prerequisites aforementioned.
- 5. The Hall of Fame candidates will be selected from nomination forms and will be notified by December before the February Banquet where they receive the award.
- 6. Those declared elected for that year will be inducted at a banquet at the IHSBCA convention/clinic in February.
- 7. Candidates not selected the initial year will remain in the "pool," and will automatically be considered for 5 consecutive years. If the candidate is not selected the fifth year, he will not be considered further until he is nominated another time.
- 8. Awards may be made posthumously.

IOWA HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING FEBRUARY 6, 2004

President Jim Gebhart called the general session to order at Washington High School in Cedar Rapids. Jim welcomed all members in attendance and introduced the officers: President-Elect - Paul Keitel, 1st Vice-President - Jerry Roling, and 2nd Vice-President - Lee Toole.

Pinky Primrose presented a shortened version of the Executive Secretary's report from Thursday nights meeting. The financial report was approved by Gary Paulsen, seconded by Jack Lynch, all were in favor. Items reviewed by Pinky for the weekend's clinic activities are as follows: Arrival of clinic speakers: weather has become a concern for travel of speakers and clinic attendees, umpire flying in from Ohio was still on time, lunch right after meeting for interested members in high school cafeteria, procedures for Saturday night's banquet, reviewed list of door assignments for two-year men on board of directors, district meetings at 12:20 pm on Friday, and FCA Breakfast reminder for Saturday morning.

The All-Star Series will be in lowa City this year. Charlie Stumpff and Jack Dahm are hosting and organizing the series. The Sheraton Hotel will be the host site for the series in lowa City.

Tom Souhrada will be contacting members towards filling those coaching positions for the all-star series. We are currently giving out over 60 awards at the Saturday night banquet. The association recognizes many coaches, umpires, and players for their dedication and commitment to and for lowa high school baseball.

Pinky also discussed ideas towards increasing the membership of our state's umpires. Overall, our association's membership numbers break down this way: Scouts 4; Coaches 250; Assistant Coaches 178; Umpires 71; Fans/Hall of Fame 177; College Coaches 24 with a 706 Total membership.

Pinky closed by "Thanking" all members for giving him the opportunity to serve as the association's executive secretary.

The minutes from the November meeting were approved at Thursday night's board meeting. All were in favor.

Individual Committee reports:

Steering Committee - (Jim Gebhart) Briefly commented on Pinky's report. Went over the rotation of officers and made mention to the new officer that had been selected to move up the chairs. That person will be mentioned in new business. Jim mentioned we need to consider a process that would train an individual or small group of people towards learning the job that Pinky performs for the association in case something would happen to Pinky. We need to be prepared and ready if that situation should occur.

Hall of Fame Committee - (Roger Hoel) Thirteen members were present. The new members for the 2005 Hall of Fame were chosen and will be announced at the board of directors meeting in the fall. Roger asked for more nominations from the association members for future considerations.

All-District Committee - (John Waddle) John reviewed the proposal for the re-balancing of the 3A districts. Áll members in attendance received a copy of the proposal. It was decided that both central districts, (the north central district and south central district in Class 4A), will give a separate district coach of the year award. When coaches are nominated to represent each district for the all-state player selection during the all-star series, the all-star coaches may count as one of their two districts representatives if needed. A recommendation was made towards the all-district meetings

towards looking at selecting the media/contributor/college coach/assistant coaches part of the agenda first, before the selection of the players begins. In some district meetings, as soon as the players are selected, coaches are leaving and not bothering to finish with the rest of the business at hand. A recommendation was made to reduce the number of all-district players selected in 3A from 18 players to 16 players, and in 4A West reduce the number of players selected from 14 to 11 selected. The rational for the 4A West was because of the small number of 4A schools in that district.

Awards Committee - (John Zahn, Jr.) Phil Katz was unable to attend this meeting, John spoke on his behalf. A big "Thank you" to Pinky for all the time and effort he puts into the association. Awards are held for one year if not picked-up at the banquet. At that point, they are recycled. Over \$5,000 is spent on awards during the year on players, coaches, umpires, fans, and Hall of Fame inductees. The committee wanted to look at how the contributors/media award is being selected. Are names just thrown out to fill that award spot or are we really thinking through the nomination process? Do we need a better process?

All-Star Committee - (Charlie Stumpff) Everything is going well. The Sheraton Hotel in downtown Iowa City will be used. Games will be played at night at the University of Iowa - Duane Banks Field.

Umpire Committee - (Gary Paulsen) Gary reviewed the selection process for the umpire awards and the Hall of Fame nominations. Reviewed agenda for the weekend's umpire clinics. Discussed ideas for future nomination considerations for the Umpire Hall of Fame.

Membership Committee - (Brad Rose) No Report. Pinky mentioned that letters go out to all schools towards getting coaches to join. Reminded that those who pay at the district meeting need to pay for a two-year membership--the current year's membership and the next year's membership.

Rating Poll Committee - (Lee Toole) Everything is ready for this year. Will be sending out information sheets the first week in May. Everyone is urged to continue to report records and conference standings on Saturday or Sundays. Todd Kimm from Radio lowa and the Associated Press will again be working with us this summer.

Constitution Committee - (Will Azinger) No Report - President Jim Gebhart mentioned it is time to review the constitution and see what needs up-dated and make needed changes.

All-State Coach Committee - (Steve Hanson) No Report Pinky reviewed how all-district coaches are selected at fall meeting.

President's Report - (Jim Gebhart) It has been a good year for the association. Thank you for the opportunity. We have had some disagreements this year, but the outcomes have been in the best interest of our high school players and for the association. The committees have made some very good changes. Acknowledgement went to John Waddle and his committee for the long hours and hard work put into re-balancing the 3A districts.

Old Business - The association members in attendance gave Jim Gebhart a hand for his service as president.

Communications - Special Thanks to Bernie Saggau and the IHSAA for their contribution of \$1,300 to offset costs at this year's clinic. Pinky gave a rundown of how coaches are selected to speak at the clinic each year. He also gave a breakdown on the rational of how each speaker is paid. College Coach - \$100, Non-College Coach/Pro - \$250, High School Coach - \$50, plus food, hotel, and travel expenses. Pinky mentioned the line-up of speakers he is working on for the 2005 clinic.

New Business - The election of a new officer was named towards rotating through the chairs. Denny Barton from Urbandale was nominated for the position. Motion to accept made by Dave Middleton, second by Jim Donohue. All were in favor.

Meeting was adjourned - motion made by Jack Lynch, second by Tim O'Neill. All were in favor.







ADDITIONAL NOTES:

- 1. MEMBER SCHOOLS WILL BE ALLOWED TO PETITION OUT OF AN ASSIGNED DISTRICT. HOWEVER, NO DIS TRICT WILL BE ALLOWED TO END-UP WITH MORE THAN 18 TEAMS OR LESS THAN 14 TEAMS IN IT. ALL PETITIONS FOR THE SUMMER OF 2004 MUST BE SUBMITTED PRIOR TO FEBRUARY 5, 2004. YOUR REQUEST SHOULD BE MADE TO PINKY PRIMROSE (SEE OPTIONS BELOW).




