All-Star Games Schedule: The players, coaches, umpires and staff will be staying at the Sheraton Hotel in Iowa City. The Honors Banquet will be held at the Sheraton Hotel, Saturday night at 6:00 p.m. All games will be played at Univ. of Iowa diamond.

1/ Players will arrive Thursday, August 5th. Individual pictures for inclusion in the program will be taken after check in.

2/ Players from Small Schools East will report by 10:30 a.m. Large Schools East players will report at 10:45 a.m.

3/ Players from Small Schools West will report at 11:00 a.m. and players from Large Schools West will report at 11:15 a.m.

4/ Practice for all teams will be 12:15 p.m.--2:45 p.m. Practice sites: Large East-West High Diamond; Large West-Mercer Diamond; Small West-University of Iowa Diamond; Small East-Regina High Diamond.

5/ First 7-inning games will be at 5:30 p.m., Thursday, Aug. 5, Small Schools West vs. Large Schools West, followed by Small Schools East vs. Large Schools East.

6/ Second 7-inning games will be at 5:30 p.m. Friday, Aug 6, Small Schools West vs. Large Schools East, followed by Small Schools East vs. Large Schools West.

7/ Saturday, Aug. 7, games will begin at 10:30 a.m., Small Schools West vs. Small Schools East followed by Large Schools West vs. Large Schools East.

8/ At 6:00 p.m. Saturday, the Honors Banquet will be held at the Sheraton Hotel in downtown Iowa City.

9/ Sunday morning Church services may be provided at the Hotel.

10/ Sunday, Aug. 8, at 10:30 a.m., the two teams with poorest records will play for 3rd and 4th place. The two teams with best records will play for 1st and 2nd place following the first game.

11/ M.V.P. players will be announced after each game on Sunday.

All Star Squad Regulations:

1. Each squad will consist of 16 players (2 catchers, 4 pitchers, 5 infielders, 4 outfielders and 1 utility).

PLAYER SELECTION:

First priority: Coach's recommendation form

Second priority: All District Team

Third priority: Coach a member of the association.

Rules:

1/ All players chosen must play.

2/ The pitchers can pitch a full game.

3/ All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings are necessary.

4/ Tie breaker system will be announced in advance for who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition, most runs scored, least runs given up, most hits, least hits given up. All of the examples can be given points. The two teams with the most points will play for 1st place.

This system will give more players an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict a pitcher on amount of innings he can pitch in one day.

*****Players who do not make the All District Team will still be eligible to play in the All-Star Series. *****







Iowa to be part of Summer Baseball Rankings by BCA :
Iowa's baseball teams will be included in the Top 10 ranking of the three states playing high school summer baseball.

The top 10 poll will be conducted by the National High School Baseball Coaches Association. The Top 10 will be included in the BCA's newspaper EXTRA INNINGS. A pre-season Top 10 will be in the May 31 issue followed by regular season rankings in the June 12 and 27 issues and the final Top 10 in the August 7 publication.

"We believe the Top 10 rankings will give additional coverage of the outstanding baseball played during the summer in Iowa, Wisconsin and Illinois," said BCA national Ranking Committee Chair George Brumfield of Wayne (WV) High.

Lee Toole, Lewis Central High Coach, is the Iowa representative for the Top 10 summer rankings.
