Thirtieth Annual All-Star Games will be held in Clinton at the River View Stadium, Aug.3-4- 5-6, 2006. Any coach who feels he has a player or two who should be playing in the All-Star Games should fill out the Player Recommendation sheet that is enclosed in this Newsletter. Please enclose a photo of your player (if available) with the recommendation sheet. The guidelines for the All-Star selection can be found on that sheet. All of the advance information we can get on the best ball players will help in the selection of the All-Stars.

The Board of Directors passed a policy that any player or coach selected to participate in the All-Star Series must have a minimum of \$200.00 of sponsors' fees. More would help to defray the cost of the All-Star Series. It will be the high school coach's responsibility to get sponsors for the player if he wishes him to play in the All-Star games. This policy is necessary in order to offset the high cost of putting on the All Star series. If you have any questions about this policy, contact any officer or director in your area; they will explain it to you. Sponsor names and fees must be paid to Executive Secretary no later than Saturday, July 27, if your player is selected.

1/ Players will arrive Thursday, August 3rd. Individual pictures for inclusion in the program will be taken after check in.

2/ Players from Small Schools West will report by 10:30 a.m. Large Schools East players will report at 10:45 a.m.

3/ Players from Small Schools West will report at 11:00 a.m. and players from Large Schools West will report at 11:15 a.m.

4/ Practice for West teams will be 12:15 p.m.--2:45 p.m. Practice for the East teams will be from 2:45 p.m.--4:15 p.m. Small West and Small East-City Freshman Diamond near Stadium; Large West and Large East-Camanche High Diamond.

5/ First Round 7-inning games will be at 5:30 p.m., Thursday, Aug. 3, Small Schools West vs. Large Schools West, followed by Small Schools East vs. Large Schools East.

All Star Squad Regulations:

1. Each squad will consist of 16 players (2 catchers, 4 pitchers, 5 infielders, 4 outfielders and 1 utility).

PLAYER SELECTION:

First priority: Coach's recommendation form

Second priority: All District Team

Third priority: Coach a member of the association.

Rules:

1/ All players chosen must play.

2/ The pitchers can pitch a full game.

3/ All games will be 7 innings in length unless extra innings are necessary.

4/ Tie breaker system will be announced in advance for who will play for 1st and 2nd place. Example: Head to Head competition, most runs scored, least runs given up, most hits, least hits given up. All of the examples can be given points. The two teams with the most points will play for 1st place. This system will give more boys an opportunity to play and show what they can do. We will not restrict a pitcher on amount of innings he can pitch in one day.

******Players who do not make the All District Team will still be eligible to play in the All-Star Series. ****

If a coach fills out a player profile form that is found in this newsletter and sends it in, this player will have the same opportunity as a player on the All District Team. This system is necessary because a number of good ball players have been left off the All Star Squads because a coach could not get enough votes for his player at the All District Selection meetings. A reminder that each player must have \$200.00 worth of sponsor fees in order to play in the All Star Series.

ANNUAL MEETING

FEBRUARY 3, 2006

The meeting was called to order by President Jerry Roling at 10:30 am. There were 37 board members present, along with many other coaches and umpires interested in the betterment of the association. Jerry introduced the officers.

The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed and approved by Gary Paulsen, seconded by Gary Nyhus.

Executive Secretary Pinky Primrose gave an overview of the financial report, noting that profits were up nearly \$5000, with expenses up nearly \$4000 from the previous year, but costs are also rising on postage and supplies as well. A motion was made by Dan Pomeroy to approve the financial report, seconded by Bill Boyd.

Steering Committee Report was given by Paul Keitel. The following coaches have been selected to coach the 2006 All Star Series; LE - Dennis Knoop of Iowa City High, Casey Bryant of Western Dubuque and Trent Snowden of Clinton. LW - Monte Friestad of Waukee, George Callsen of Des Moines Dowling and Mark Hey of Ankeny. SE - Randy Chamberlin of Center Point Urbana, Chris Coffman of Grinnell and Daryl Cochran of Camanche. SW - Matt Zoske of Webster City, Eric Trudo of Van Meter and JR Gephart of Saydel.

Also, Bret Hoyer of Cedar Rapids Kennedy was chosen as the Northeast officer to go through the chairs, replacing outgoing President Jerry Roling of Dubuque Wahlert.

The steering committee approved raising the All-Star sponsorship fees for players and coaches to \$200.00 per person. Also, approved the IHSBCA to have a suite on Championship Saturday at the 2006 State Tournament. Included will be 10 tickets with an option to purchase 10 additional tickets. A spending cap of \$500.00 was placed on this.

Executive Secretary Report was given by Pinky Primrose.

- A) Clinic update information listing speakers and noting that nearly 400 coaches and umpires pre-registered before the clinic. Reviewed door assignments.
- B) District meetings will decide the sites for the 2006 All District Team selections. Dates will be July 9 (1A & 2A) and July 16 (3A &4A) at 1:00 p.m.
- C) Reviewed procedures for the awards banquet trying to keep the banquet moving along. There will be 6 Hall of Fame inductees.
- D) The need for more nominations of players, umpires and contributors for possible selection to the Hall of Fame.
- E) The first and second vice-presidents will introduce speakers (Barton and Rock).
- F) The FCA breakfast sponsored by McDonalds will be Saturday morning.
- G) Need to encourage more umpires to join the association.
- **H)** The awards committee should review the awards and come in with some ideas for new people. Service or membership to the association will be recognized. The plaque bill last year was approximately \$5,000.00 and going up.
- 1) Membership for calendar year 2005-2006 broken down as follows: Head coaches 237, Assistant coaches 221, Fans 76, Umpires 67, College Coaches 34 and Scouts 2, for a total of 632 paid members of the association as of 2/2/2006.

Hall of Fame Committee Report was given by Roger Hoel. The committee is composed of 15 members who meet in a closed session for the selection process. The nominees for induction in 2007 have been chosen, pending approval of the Steering Committee and Board of Directors. Also, the committee is looking for more candidates to choose from.

All District Committee Report was given by John Waddle. It was approved that the All District format for player selection will be amended as follows: The number of players selected will be based on the number of schools represented in attendance at the meeting. Seven schools or less = 12 players; 8 or 9 sch = 13 players; 10 or 11 sch = 14 players; 12 or 13 sch = 15 players; 14 or 15 sch = 16 players; 16 or 17 sch = 17 players and 18 or more sch = 18 players. Also, a sign in sheet with the coaches attending will be signed and sent to Pinky for posting on the IHSBCA web site.

Eric Trudo of Van Meter is the contact for nominees of the Bob Feller Pitcher of the Year Award.

Also, contact the IHSAA after each contest with results and send Bud Legg team stats. They would like to track scores, stats, records and conference races throughout the season and encourage coaches to take advantage of the free Stats-&-Go service.

Awards Committee Report. Phil Katz reported that nearly \$5,000.00 was spent on awards last season, but the committee is disappointed that many award recipients

are not claiming their plaques. Though recycled after one year, it is an inconvenience to store such items. The committee is also pursuing a sponsor for the Diamond of the Year Award.

All Star Committee Report was given by Dave Rock. The 2006 committee is happy with their progress and preparation for the All Star Series. The host city is Clinton, lowa with players and staff staying at the Frontier Inn, and games being held at Riverview Stadium, home of the Clinton Lumberkings, Class A affiliate of the Texas Rangers. Next year's games (2007) will be hosted by Rick Heller in Waterloo, with host for 2008 still needed.

Umpires Committee Report was given by Gary Paulsen. The committee is already planning the 2007 Umpires clinic. The All Star Series umpires were contacted during the 2006 clinic, based upon district umpire nominees.

The committee designed a flyer to be made available at all IHSAA rules meetings to promote umpire membership in our association.

Member umpires of the IHSBCA have the opportunity to purchase equipment from Gerry Davis Sports at a 8% discount, with the association receiving a 2.5% dividend back in October based on what has been purchased.

Joe Nelson of West Des Moines has been appointed to represent the Central District Umpires for the remainder of the present term replacing Ken Hutcheson who resigned due to job conflicts.

The umpires committee is looking for Hall of Fame Candidates, and the next committee meeting will be held in Clinton at the All Star Series.

The Lanny Petersen Award and All Academic Reports were given by Lee Toole. John Lee of Mason City was the Lanny Petersen award winner and is attending the University of Nebraska. Also, nearly all of the All Academic Award winners were in attendance at the All Star Series to be honored.

Audit Committee Report. Bret Hoyer reported that he had met with the accountant and all was in order.

Ratings Poll Committee chairman Lee Toole noted that all four number 1 ranked teams won the state championship last season. Pre-season info sheets will be sent to all schools. Please fill out and return. Please report to your area reps. during the season to help with the ratings.

Membership Committee Report was given by Dave Middleton. Noted were the 632 paid members, with more likely after the clinic registration. Also, membership forms would be sent to all non-member schools encouraging their coaches to join the association.

All State Coach Committee Report was given by Steve Hanson. The committee set forth the following guidelines for All State selection. A "no leap frog" rule states that a second team All District player cannot bypass a first team All District player for selection to an All State team. Additionally it was recommended that the number of votes each player receives at the All District meetings be noted on the All District Form (ie 13-15) which provides more data for the All State Selection Committee. This will give a better understanding of how these players ranked within their own district. These recommendations were made after concerns by members as to what/if any guidelines were being followed at the meetings.

Also, the criteria for years of service by an assistant coach have been removed. Upon inspection of this year's nominees, 5 of the 11 nominees have been assistants for less than the required 5 years. The committee sees no distinction between a first year assistant and a 5-year assistant. In fact many small schools are lucky to have the same assistant for a total of 5-years.

President's Report. Jerry Roling thanked the association and its members for allowing him to serve as President, especially Pinky for all he has done.

Board of Directors Meeting

February 2, 2006

President Jerry Roling called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. There were 37 members of the Board of Directors and Steering Committee present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed. Charlie Stumpff moved to approve the minutes as noted, seconded by Bret Hoyer.

Pinky Primrose gave an overview of the Financial Report. Comparisons were made between the last fiscal year and this past one, with a favorable showing of profits. The association had a total income of \$69,254 and \$42,100 in expenses dating from April 1, 2005 through Feb. 1, 2006. Motion to approve the Financial Report was made by Gary Paulsen, seconded by Dan Pomeroy.

Steering Committee Chairman Paul Keitel announced that the 2006 All Star coaches had been selected and would be introduced at the clinic, pending acceptance by the selections. Bret Hoyer of Cedar Rapids Kennedy was selected by the committee to go through the chairs, replacing outgoing President Jerry Roling while representing the Northeast District. The committee also approved the raising of All Star sponsorship fees to \$200 for players and coaches. This was done to help offset the rising costs of hotel and banquet fees. Approved by the committee to host a suite at the State Tournament on Championship Saturday, as well as 10 tickets with an option to purchase 10 more. A spending cap of \$500 was placed on this. Also, Don Taylor of Cedar Rapids Prairie was accepted back onto the committee after an absence of a couple of years.

Executive Secretary Report was given by Pinky. Points of note are as follows.

- A) All clinicians are coming with the exception of Rick Heller who had emergency surgery. His clinic time will be filled by a representative of the Turface Company, who will discuss field maintenance.
- B) Reviewed door assignments for the district reps.
- C) Reviewed procedures for the Awards Banquet. Lenny Weih will emcee, with Lanny Petersen giving the invocation.
- D) There will be 25 exhibitors at the clinic. Take time to look over their products and services, and thank them for attending and supporting the IHSBCA.
- E) The mini clinic hosts were reminded of their responsibilities.
- F) The new budget was reviewed and noted that it is attainable as presented.
- G) Reminded the coaches and umpires of the F.C.A. Breakfast on Saturday morning, hosted by McDonalds.
- H) Committee chairmen were reminded to hold their respective meetings prior to the General Meeting and be prepared to make their presentations at that time. Also, roll was to be taken, with absentees noted and relayed to Lee Toole. Coaches absent for 2 consecutive meetings will be removed and replaced by coaches who wish to be more active in the association.

I) Reviewed procedures of player selections for the All Star Series. #1 priority is nomination by a coach, #2 is coach membership in the IHSBCA, and #3 All-District honoree.

Hall of Fame Report was made by chairman Roger Hoel. The committee is always looking for more nominations to review for possible selection. Also, the procedures for committee members was reviewed. The committee will be meeting at 8 am on Friday.

All District Report was given by John Waddle. The committee presented a proposal for restructuring the All District teams based on the number of schools represented at the meeting. After lengthy discussion, this proposal was approved for acceptance, and will be implemented for the 2006 meetings in July. A detailed explanation of this proposal is included in the General Meeting minutes. The committee, and especially John, was praised for the countless hours of hard work and preseverance put forth on this proposal.

Phil Katz gave the Awards Committee Report. The committee is actively pursuing a sponsor for the Diamond of the Year Award. The total spent on awards is over \$5,000. This year's honorees are as follows: Pinky Primrose Award-Colonel Neil Kacena, Bill and Sherry Freese Award-Jack Roeder of the C.R. Kernels, President's Award-Lenny and Sue Weih.

All Star Series chairman Dave Rock reported that everything is going as planned, and the committee is now beginning the process of gathering donations and finalizing meals and beverages.

Gary Paulsen presented the Umpires Committee Report, stating that Joe Nelson of West Des Moines has been chosen to replace Ken Hutcheson for the remainder of the current term. Ken resigned due to work conflicts. Also, Gerry Davis Sports is giving an 8% discount to umpires on supplies, with a dividend of 2.5% being paid to the IHSBCA in October on all purchased goods.

Lanny Peterson Award chairman, Lee Toole, reported that the 2005 selection John Lee, of Mason City is attending the University of Nebraska. Also, nearly all of the 2005 All Academic Award winners were present to be honored at the All Star Series.

The Audit Committee Report was given by Bret Hoyer, noting that he had met with the accountant and auditor, and all was in very good order.

Lee Toole gave the report for the Rating Poll Committee. The top ranked teams at the end of the regular season were crowned as State Champions in 2005. Lee also praised the work of Todd Kimm of Radio lowa for his help, and asked that every coach fill out and return the preseason questionnaires provided.

Membership Committee chairman Dave Middleton reported that a letter and application form explaining the benefits of joining our association, would be sent to all non-member schools, encouraging their coaches to join the IHSBCA.

All State Committee Report was given by Steve Hanson. The committee was asked by Charlie Stumpff, with the support of many members, to form a set of guidelines for the All State Team selection committees to follow. The guidelines are noted in the All State Committee report in the minutes for the General Meeting, and are being implemented at the 2006 meetings in August.

President Jerry Roling thanked everyone for being involved in the association, and for the cooperation, dedication, and hard work. He gave special thanks to Pinky for all he has done, and has considered it an honor to represent the IHSBCA.

Communications. Rick Wulkow was recognized for his kind letter praising our association, and also for the donation of \$1,300 from the IHSAA in helping to offset the cost of putting on the clinic.

The Board of Directors recommended a pay raise of \$500 for the Executive Secretary. Motion by Gary Nyhus to approve, seconded by Jeff Frese. Motion passed.

Motion to approve the budget as proposed by Pinky by Tom Souhrada, seconded by Paul Keitel. Motion passed.

Motion to adjourn by Mike Pauly, seconded by Jack Lynch.

Meting adjourned by President Jerry Roling at 9:40 pm.
