Social on Thursday night will be held at the Crowne Plaza Five Season. This is all baseball talk; come join us. This has been one of the highlights of the clinic.

Six Selected For 2007 Hall Of Fame: Three coaches, one umpire, one player and one contributor have been selected for induction into the I.H.S.B.C.A.'s Hall of Fame.

The six inductees are: Don Denkinger, Waterloo; Pete Hansen, Orange City; Jim Murphy, Davenport Assumption; Jack Mustapha, Boone; Ken Schreiber, C.B. St. Alberts and Gene Schultz, Lansing Kee.

The six will be inducted at the Awards Banquet, Saturday, February 3, 2007, in Cedar Rapids. They will join 208 other Hall of Fame members.

Don Denkinger umpired for 39 years with 30 years in the Major Leagues, American League. Don attended the Al Somers School for Professional Umpires in 1960 and spent the next nine years in the minor leagues, before going to the majors in 1969 season. He worked in the World Series four times, three All-Stars Series, twelve Division and League Championship Playoffs and was crew chief for 21 years. Don was a CBS Analyst for the American League Playoffs in 1990. Don spends his summers in Waterloo and winters in Arizona. Don has given many speeches to civic clubs in Eastern lowa and throughout the nation.

Pete Hansen, Orange City, has been umpiring for 37 years and has been a member of the IHSBCA for 23 years. He worked around 45 college games a year and another 40 high school games. He has worked the District through the State Tournament for many years. Pete works many conferences in the Northwest District such as Missouri River, Lakes, Siouxland and Corn Belt Conferences. Pete has served on the Umpires Committee and has worked in twelve All-Star Series. He was the District Umpire of the Year four times and State Umpire of the Year in 1987.

Jim Murphy played his high school baseball at Alleman High in Rock Island and went to St. Ambrose for his education. He returned to coach at Alleman from 1976-1983 and then at St. Ambrose College in 1984. He moved to Davenport Assumption to coach from 1986 until 1997 when he moved to Iowa State University. In 2000 Jim moved to Osceola High School in Florida where he is still the high school baseball coach. In high school he accumlated a 581-267 record with three State Titles, four Sub-State titles, and fourteen District titles. His team was in the Iowa State Tournament four times. Jim has conducted many clinics and spoke at the Iowa Baseball Coaches Clinic in 1998. He was named District Coach of Year four times, and State Coach of Year twice, 1992-93. Jim has served on several committees and been a member of the 500 Win Club and is a 20-Year Longevity Member.

Jack Mustapha graduated from Boone High School in 1965, where he played baseball as a pitcher and right fielder. As a pitcher he had a 31-2 record, striking out 430 batters in 243 innings. He averaged 13.4 K per game. He batted 4th in the lineup all 3 years of high school. He had 15 career no-hitters, seven no hitters his senior year, with 2 of them being perfect games. He was clocked at 94 mph. He signed a contract with St. Louis Cardinals, playing triple A. He was drafted in the U.S. Army in 1966 and was injured in Viet Nam. He never returned to baseball after the injury. In 1965 he pitched 3 consecutive no hitters as Boone won the State Title. He missed 3 weeks of early season with hepatitis. In Viet Nam he earned a Silver Star, a Bronze Star and 3 Purple Hearts.

Ken Schreiber played his high school baseball at St. Albert High as an outfielder and catcher. He went to Northwest Missouri State and played for four years as a Varsity outfielder. He has been a high school coach for 27 years, starting at Underwood High in 1980 and then moving to Cathedral High in Omaha for four years and then to St. Albert High in 1986 where he is still the head coach. His teams have won 2 State Championship titles, four sub-state titles, nine District titles and participated in four state tournaments. His over-all record is 448-298. He belongs to the 400 Win-Club and has the 25-Longevity Award. He coached the 1990 All-Stars. He was District Coach of the Year three times and State Coach of the Year twice.

Gene Schultz played his high school baseball in Minnesota, graduating from Winto State. He has been coaching for 37 years, with an over-all record of 1,447-312, the best record in lowa and the entire country. His team has won 10 State tournament titles, and has appeared in 19 State Tournaments. Gene is a member of the 500-Win club and has received the 35-Year Longevity Award. He has been a member of the Association for 25 years. Gene and his team have been listed 27 times in the national record book for their achievements. Many of his players have gone on to play college ball.

Randy Chamberlin, Center Point-Urbana and John Waddle of Coon Rapids-Bayard won their 400th game this past summer. Congratulations


CLINIC SPEAKERS:

DICK CORE graduated from Iowa State University where he played first base on Coach Cap Timm's team. From Iowa State Dick went to Dubuque Senior High School where he coached baseball and assisted in basketball and football. Dick moved to Hempstead when it opened. Within a period of four years Dick took Hempstead to the Valley Championship and State Championship. He has served on the Board of Directors, going through the officer line and is a past president. He coached in several All-Star Series and is a member of the 500 Win Club. Presently Dick is Head Coach in East Dubuque. Dick is a Hall of Fame Member.

ORSINO HILL was a 1st Round selection out of Pasedena, CA. He played 13 years professionally. He was the Hitting Coach with the Chicago White Sox Organization. He also scouted with the Colorado Rockies. Presently, Orsino is a Partner and Lead Hitting Instructor--Sports Plex West and Pro Players Camp in Waukee, IA.

TOM JENK JR., Dyersville Beckman High School Coach, has been coaching for 32 years winning over 500 games. His 1986 team record was 23-9 winning the State Class 3A Tournament. Tom has worked in several All-Star Series. He is known to be a motivator of young men. He coached both basketball and baseball at Beckman for many years. Tom is a member of the 500 Win Club and has the 30 Longevity Award. He is a Hall of Fame member.

JIM MAHONEY graduated from Dowling High School in Des Moines and attended Iowa State University where he played baseball and received his BS degree. He started his coaching career in Johnston in 1969. His over-all recrod is 337-272 in the 20 years. He won the state championship in 1977 and was runner-up in 1979. He reached the finals two other years. Jim has been an active member of the association, serving on many committees and is a past president of the Association. He is a Hall of Fame Member.



MIKE MAHONEY played high school baseball at Dowling West Des Moines and then went to Creighton, converting to a catcher. After his college career, he signed with the Cubs and has spent 11 years as a catcher reaching the Major Leagues. He spent several years between Triple A and the Majors. Presently he is with the Toronto Blue Jays.. His best year was 2002 when he hit .304 with 14 doubles, 6 homers and 28 RBIs.

RICK MATHEWS was a former high school coach at Eddyville and Marshalltown and then moved to lowa Western C.C. From there he became the K.C. Royals minor league field and pitching coordinator. He is presently with the Colorado Rockies as the bull-pen coach. Rick holds many clinics for young pitchers and catchers throughout the state. Rick is a member of the IHSBCA Hall of Fame. He has given many clinics for the Association. He returns by popular request.

STEVE MOHR is a graduate of Washington High School and lowa State University in 1971. Steve was on the first All-State Team in Iowa. At Iowa State, he played for Hall of Fame member Cap Timm. Steve was a four-year starter when they won the Big Eight Conference twice in 1970 and 71. Prior to being head coach, Steve served as an assistant at Valley West Des Moines for 7 years. The next 25 years he was the head varsity coach at Valley. Steve's over-all record is 631-269. Many of his players have gone on to college and pro baseball. At Valley, Steve had 13 Conference Championships, three State Championships and one State Runner-up. He has been a member of the Association for 34 years. Steve is a Hall of Fame member.

DENNIS OLEJNICZAK is a graduate of the UNI where he played centerfield. He coached at Janesville before moving to Decorah High School, the winner of the 4A State Championship in 1990. Dennis is a charter member of the Coaches Association and has been very active in the Association. His record is 1,139-399, the second winningest high school coach in the country. He is one of the most respected coaches in the State of lowa. He has the 35 Year-Longevity Award and is a Hall of Famer member.

KEVIN RHOMBERG played high school baseball at Dubuque Hempstead from 1970-74. Kevin played shortstop, third base and left field at Lewis University and the College of St. Francis from 1976-77. His collegiate batting average was .465 and slugging average was .820. Kevin played 8 years professionally—3 years in the majors with the Cleveland Indians and the San Francisco Giants. He was featured in an article in Sports Illustrated in 1981 and inducted into the Chattanooga Baseball Hall of Fame in 1990. He is also a member of the ISHBCA Hall of Fame.

LEE TOOLE, C.B. Lewis Central High School, has been coaching for 24 years with an over-all record of 617-288. Lee was Conference Coach of Year in 1986 and 1993. He was State Coach of Year in 1993 and District Coach of Year six times. He has chaired the Rating Poll for many years and has served on other committees. Lee currently is President. He coached in six All-Star Series and hosted three. Lee is a member of the 500-Win Club and has the 20-Year Longevity Award. He has been a member of the Association for 24 years. Lee is a Hall of Fame member.

SPIN WILLIAMS played high school baseball at Davenport West, graduating in 1975. He was a 1st baseman and pitcher, hitting over .300 in his high school career. He went on to Muscatine JC and graduated from Winona State in 1979. At Winona State he was an all-conference first baseman. Spin signed a professional contract with the Pittsburg Pirates. He pitched for 3 years in the minor leagues before becoming pitching/bullpen coach for the Pirates. After 25 years as a member of the Pittsburgh organization he went to the Washington Nationals where he is a pitching coordinator/scouting and trade advisor. He is a Hall of Fame members.

JIM VAN SCOYOC graduated from William Penn College in 1965. At Penn he pitched. He started his coaching career at Amana Community and then moved to Norway High School and coached for 24 years with an over-all record of 850-275. His teams won more state championships than any team in lowa other than Kee High. Jim is a member of the 500 Win Club and has received his 25-Year Longevity award. He has served on the Board of Directors and coached in two All-Star series. He is a Hall of Fame member and a charter member of the Association. Presently he is working with Perfect Game as a pitching instructor.

LOU YACINICH is currently a professor, Athletic Director and head baseball coach at Grand View College in Des Moines. He attended Grand View and graduated from Drake University. He has been coaching for 41 years, eight at the high school level. During this time he has compiled a 972-688 record. His 2005 team record was 28-33. His teams have won 5 conference titles. Lou is a IHS-BCA Hall of Fame member. He has been active in the NAIA in many levels. He hosted the NAIA World Series in 1992-93-94. He served on the rules committee, tournament procedures and Hall of Fame committees. Lou has been District 15 Coach of the Year 8 times, Area Coach of Year 4 times and Mid-West Classic Conference 3 years. He participated in three World Series. He was National Coach of Year in 1999. His teams have a 97% graduation rate.



Committee Work: President-elect, Denny Barton, will be assigning members to the different committees. If you are interested, please contact him. Get involved, it's your association.





Selected by ballot of All State Committee, District Board of Directors and Steering Committee members.

DISTRICT UMPIRE OF THE YEAR: (Four districts)

CRITERIA: Four association member umpires are selected at each district meeting by association coaches. Umpires' All District Committee selects three umpires for the final ballot. Ballots are sent to all association members with the top vote-getter in each district the winner.

STATE UMPIRE OF THE YEAR:

CRITERIA: Winner of District Umpire of the Year

Selected by ballot of All State Umpire Committee, District Board of Directors and Steering Committee members.

IOWA COLLEGE COACH OF THE YEAR:

CRITERIA: Nominated by association coaches at district meetings. Selected by vote of District Board of Directors and Steering Committee members.

100-200-300-400-500 CAREER VICTORIES:

CRITERIA: Any association member who has the required number of varsity coaching victories may submit his name for recognition. 100 through 300 are certificates—400 and 500 and above receive a plaque.

MEDIA AWARD: (Two awards are given—print & electronic) **CRITERIA:** Nominated by association coaches at district meetings. Have helped promote high school baseball in their area. Selected by vote of District Board of Directors and Steering Committee members.

CRITERIA: Anyone who has contributed to the coaches association may be nominated.

Nomination and selection is made by the Association President, District Board of Directors and Steering Committee members.

ACADEMIC ALL STATE TEAM: (1st Team and Honorable Mention)

CRITERIA: Nominated by association coach.

Senior.

ACT 24 plus.

Top 25% of senior class.

Outstanding moral character.

Grade point of 3.30

Starter or in pitching rotation

Selected by a panel of coaches.

LANNY PETERSON AWARD: (Captain of Academic All State Team)

CRITERIA: Selected to All State Academic team.

Ranks at or near the top in requirements for Academic All State. Selected by panel of coaches and chairman of Lanny Peterson Committee.

HAROLD "PINKY" PRIMROSE AWARD:

CRITERIA: Anyone who played high school baseball in the State of lowa who went on in his career to distinguish himself in his community, district, state or nation. Did not have to be an outstanding baseball player.

ALL DISTRICT TEAMS: (5 Districts, 4 Classes, 1 st and 2nd Team)

CRITERIA: Nominated on ballot by association members. Selected by vote of association head coaches at district meetings.

ALL STATE TEAMS: (A Super Class, 4 classes, 1st and 2nd Team each class)

CRITERIA: Selected on All District Team and nominated by his

IHSBCA Fall meeting: 11/11/2006; Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, Iowa



President Lee Toole called the meeting to order at 8:28 a.m., CST. Special thanks to the University of Iowa and head baseball coach Jack Dahm for hosting the annual Fall meeting.

The minutes in the Fall newsletter were discussed. Gary Paulson, Ogden, motioned to accept the minutes and Jack Lynch, Lawler, seconded. Minutes were approved by the board.

Pinky read the financial report. Charlie Stumpff, Iowa City West, motioned to approve the report, Roger Hoel, Iowa City High, seconded. The financial report was approved by the board.

President Toole gave his report, thanking Coon Rapids-Bayard Head baseball Coach, John Waddle, for his efforts on the All District team selection protocol. President Toole didn't receive any complaints about the new format. Coach Toole also noted that the All Star series 2007 is to be held in Waterloo and the committee is spearheaded by Waterloo West coach Jeremy Langner. It was noted that NCAA rules prohibit UNI's Head baseball coach, Rick Heller, from being on the committee. The board welcomed the arrival of Phil Katz at this time (8:35 a.m. CST)

Pinky presented the Executive Secretary's report. He noted that there would only be 2 contributors of the year recognized from across the state of Iowa. After some discussion, Dan Pomeroy motioned and Dave Middleton seconded that the two most deserving contributors of the year in the state of Iowa be recognized with an award. The motion was approved.

Pinky reminded coaches to select two 4 year college coaches of the year for the final ballet and two 2 year college coaches to be placed on the final ballot in the winter newsletter.

He noted that the 3A and 4A membership numbers are very strong and have been so for some time. Efforts are being made by Dave Middleton's membership committee to strengthen the numbers at the 1A and 2A levels. Coach Middleton, North Polk, has addressed this issue by sending letters to school administrators of schools who have traditionally been absent from membership in the IHSBCA. He noted that following these letters, several schools became members. He will continue the letter writing campaign and encouraged coaches to spread the word to the 1A and 2A coaches about the benefits of membership in the association.

Roger Hoel gave the Hall of Fame committee report. He noted that it helps to have 2 or 3 letters of recommendation in addition to the nomination form. He noted that once a person is nominated, his nomination will be considered for a period of 5 years. At the end of the 5-year period, he must be re-nominated and appropriate paperwork filled out. The committee recommended that the following people be inducted into the Hall of Fame at the 2007 Awards banquet: Don Denkinger, Contributor; Jack Mustapha, Boone, Iowa, player; Ken Schreiber, Council Bluffs St. Albert, coach; Gene Schultz, Lansing Kee, coach; Jim Murphy, former Davenport Assumption, coach. Gary Paulson reported that the umpire committee recommended Pete Hansen, Orange City, for induction as an umpire into the Hall of Fame. Paulson motioned that all recommendations for Hall of Fame be accepted, Steve Hanson, Marshalltown, seconded. Motion was approved. Steve Westphal and Jim Donohue were welcomed by the board to the meeting at 8:45 a.m.

Pinky stated that he didn't hear any complaints about the new protocol to select members of the All district teams. Coach Waddle was praised for his efforts. Pinky noted that the bills for the awards continue to increase. He recognized the terrific efforts by Paul Keitel, Dewitt, Dave Rock, Calamus-Wheatland, and Lenny Weih, Clinton, for the tremendous work during this years All Star Series in Clinton.

Lenny reported that a study was conducted to record the economic impact of hosting the All Star Series in Clinton. The study reported that the four day event brought in \$900,000 to the community. The IHSBCA profited nearly \$10,000 from the event. The next all star game will be held in 2007 in Waterloo. The 2008 location was recommended to be held in Des Moines. Vice-President Denny Barton, Urbandale, and coach Tim O'Neil, Dowling Catholic, noted that Principal Park would not be available that weekend due to the Iowa Cubs agreeing to reserve the stadium for 12 days for the IHSAA state tournament the week prior to the all star series. Cedar Rapids was tentatively assigned the 2008 All Star Series. No formal motion was made for the 2008 All Star Series host.

Lenny noted that they were able to secure rooms for the players at a rate of \$75 per night and that price included breakfast each day for each athlete/coach. The Clinton Lumberkings did not charge the IHSBCA for the use of their newly renovated stadium. The committee, headed by Lenny, Dave Rock, and Paul Keitel, raised advertising prices to \$50, \$100, and \$200 per ad, depending upon the size. Lenny noted only one business saying "no" to advertising in the All Star program. Lenny presented the newspaper coverage given by the Clinton Herald. It was tremendous and unprecedented. Support was also unprecedented as evidenced by the \$10,000 profit. He noted another stream of income came from writing letters to former Clinton area "All-Stars" soliciting donations in return for their names being printed in the newspaper and the program. They raised an additional \$750 from this fundraiser. A dentist from the Cedar Rapids area also contributed \$750 at the conclusion of the event. It was also noted by Dan Pomeroy that the venue for the awards banquet was spectacular. Jack Lynch thanked Gary Paulsen for his efforts in se-

curing umpires and the treatment they received upon their arrival and stay in Clinton.

Pinky recommended Ralph Plagman, principal for 23 years at CR Washington H.S. – the host of the IHSBCA clinic, for the President's Award; Dr. Bradley Hammer, Des Moines, for the Contributor Award; and Sam Bernabe, Des Moines – Iowa Cubs General Manager, for the Harold, "Pinky" Primrose Award. Coach Middleton motioned to accept these nominees, Coach Waddle seconded the motion, the motion carried.

Pinky clarified the designation of Diamond of the Year awards. There will be 4 diamonds/schools from each district that will make the final ballot in the winter newsletter. Each district will have one diamond of the year award winner. From those district award winners, one diamond will win the state diamond of the year award. Coach Phil Katz, retired – Linn-Mar, will pursue sponsorship for this award. He has contacted Turface and True Pitch but has not heard anything back. He will continue to pursue this at the ABCA convention in January.

Coach Waddle presented the All District Committee report. He distributed copies of several e-mails supporting the changes he implemented in selecting the All District teams. The newly adopted protocol will continue. It was noted by many that Coach Waddle is remarkable.

Jeff Westendorf, umpire, Des Moines, presented a very thorough and impressive study on umpire membership from across the state and tournament assignment ratios. He noted that out of roughly 1200 state certified umpires, only 121 were assigned district and sub state tournament assignments. Of those 121, 48 were asked to work the state championship series. Discussion followed on how to get more umpires involved in the association as well as more tournament assignments for a larger percentage of the state certified umpires. It is the belief of the umpires and many coaches that there are several very deserving umpires across the state who are not receiving tournament assignments. Jeff recommended that re-districting for umpire of the year selection take place by moving Des Moines to the Southwest district. The new districts for umpire of the year consideration would be the Northeast, Southeast, Southwest (including Des Moines), and Northwest. A recommendation was made that Steve Hansen and Dave Rock (members of the baseball advisory committee) meet with Rick Wulkow, executive secretary of the IHSAA, and Roger Barr to discuss the issue of 121/1200 umpires receiving tournament assignments. Gary Paulson motioned to accept Westendorf's redistricting for selection of umpire of the year purposes, effective in 2008. Denny Barton seconded the motion. The motion was approved. Westendorf will draft the formal language and it will be presented at the clinic in February.

Lee Toole indicated that the All State rating committee didn't receive any complaints this year and he has been getting a lot of help to identify the most deserving teams in the polls.

Steve Hanson indicated that the All State committee is alive and well. He continued to report that the Advisory committee has successfully collaborated with Roger Barr, Rick Wulkow, and the IHSAA to implement a 2 year seeding trial for Class 4A sub states beginning in 2008. The IHSAA will conduct a "dry run" in 2007. If coaches and administrators fail to communicate effectively, expediently, and accurately in 2007, then the seeding "pilot" will never get implemented. The IHSAA noted that they have a very difficult time acquiring seeding information from member schools for the seeding of basket ball sub-states; and this is DURING the school year. Coach Hanson presented a "3-strike" plan to the board. If a coach/school fails 3 times to communicate necessary results to the IHSAA by each deadline, then that school will receive the #6 seed in the sub state.

Pinky asked the Advisory committee to ask the IHSAA if a seat can be reserved on that committee for the current President of the IHSBCA. Hanson and Rock said they would take his request to the IHSAA next fall when they meet again.

Gary Paulson presented Iowa Sports Council information regarding character, sportsmanship, and a survey asking schools for their procedure in presenting teams just prior to the national anthem. He indicated that there is an organization looking into developing National Coaching Certification and a Code of Ethics for coaches.

Pinky indicated that he had received numerous Thank -you's for all that the IHSBCA does for high school baseball players from across the state.

In new business, South Tama has requested to move to another district since they have moved to a difference conference. They were granted this request by Coach Waddle. Pinky indicated that the clinic should be called the "Hall of Fame Clinic" as all the speakers are IHSBCA Hall of Fame members.

The meeting was adjourned and board members moved to their respective district meetings.

The next meeting will be held at the Five Seasons Crowne Plaza Hotel in Cedar Rapids, Iowa on Thursday, February 1, 2007.
