Six Selected For 2008 Hall Of Fame: Three coaches, one umpire and two players have been selected for induction into the I.H.S.B.C.A.'s Hall of Fame.

The six inductees are: Stan Bahnsen, Council Bluffs; Cal Eldred, Urbana; Rick Heller, University of Northern Iowa; Phil Katz, Marion; Don Lyons, Denison; and Marlow Van Ginkel, Rock Rapids.

The six will be inducted at the Awards Banquet, Saturday, February 2, 2008, in Cedar Rapids. They will join 214 other Hall of Fame members.

Stan Bahnsen played high school baseball in Council Bluffs at Abe Lincoln. After graduation he went on to Univ. of Nebraska where he was an All-American, All-Conference and MVP. He signed with the Yankees in 1966. He played 16 years in the big leagues. He was with the Yankees, White Sox, Oakland, Montreal, Angels, and finished with the Phillies. He pitched in 574 games, starting 327 with 73 complete games and 16 shutouts. His over-all record was 146-149. He struck out 1,359 hitters and had a lifetime ERA of 3.60. His best year was in 1972 with the White Sox with a 21-16 record. During his playing days, Stan was the Rookie Pitcher of the Year in 1968.

Cal Eldred played high school baseball in Urbana for Scott Broghamer, playing shortstop and pitching. He was All-State, All-District and All-Conference at Urbana. He went on to play baseball at the University of Iowa for Coach Banks. He was a three-year starter at Iowa, signing a contract with the Brewers his junior year. He played three years in the minors and then the next 15 in the Big Leagues. Cal played for the Brewers, White Sox and Cardinals. His best year was in 1993 with a 16-16 record. Cal played in 341 games as a starter and reliefer. His overall record is 86-74. He struck out 939 batters and had an ERA of 4.42.

Rick Heller played high school baseball at Cardinal of Eldon graduating in 1982. He played college ball at Upper lowa for four years as a starting shortstop, graduating in 1986. He lettered in football, basketball and baseball for the Peacocks. After college he was an assistant coach at North Fayette before becoming head Baseball and Basketball Coach at Bakersfield, Missouri. He moved to Upper lowa in 1987 and took them to the Division III World Series. He went to UNI in 1999 and has won a MVC championship and took the Panther's to an NCAA Regional. Last season he won his 512th game and his 200th at Northern Iowa, winning seven conference championships overall. He has been selected Iowa Conference and College Coach of the Year several times and is a member of the Upper Iowa Hall of Fame. He has spoken at many IHSBCA clinics.

Phil Katz played high school baseball at Wakefield. He graduated from the Univ. of Iowa in 1976. He has been involved in coaching for over 25 years. He became the Linn Mar coach in 1980, leading Linn Mar to the State Tournament twice and winning many District tournaments. He has spoken at numerous clinics and has put on many clinics over the years. He was ECIC Coach of the Year twice and Metro Coach of the Year three times. Phil has served on many committees for the Association. Presently he is chairman of the Awards Committee. He is also active in the ABCA and currently serves as Chairman of District V and serves on the All-American Selection committee. Phil had 16 players from Linn Mar play in the All-Star Series. He also coached in three All-Star Series and chaired an All-Star Series in Cedar Rapids. His over-all record is 402-318.

Don Lyons played high school baseball in Maquoketa, graduating in 1975, playing Varsity baseball for four years. He pitched and played third and short. He went to Upper Iowa University in 1976-79, played shortstop and outfield and became a graduate assistant in 1981. He started his coaching career at Lytton in 1983-88 and then moved to Denison in 1989 to the present. His over-all record is 481-331, winning the State Championship once and was State runner-up once. His teams have won five District Tournaments. He has been a member of the IHSBCA for 25 years. He coached in one All-Star Series. He has served on many committees. He is a member of the 400-Win Club and has been named West 3A District Coach of Year three times and State Coach of Year in 1994. He is a member of the Upper Iowa Hall of Fame.

Marlow Van Ginkel has umpired most of his 35 years in the Northwest District. He has averaged 50-60 Varsity games each year, working in Lakes, Siouxland, War Eagle, Northwest and Missouri River Conferences. He has received numerous awards over the years--IHSAA Hall of Fame in 2001, District Umpire of the Year and NWICOA Hall of Fame in 1997. He has worked in 15 All-Star Series and 20 State tournaments. He also was named to the IGCABO Hall of Fame in 2006. Marlow has a Superior rating. He has the 35-Year Longevity Award.

He also thanked Lee Toole, Council Bluffs Lewis Central, for running a good steering committee meeting this past spring. Dan Pomeroy, Coon Rapids, made a motion to accept this report. Seconded by Ken Schreiber, Council Bluffs St. Albert's. Motion carried.

Pinky presented the Executive Secretary's report. He discussed the speakers that are scheduled for the upcoming clinic in February. He feels a great line-up has been put together for both the coaches and umpires to enjoy. Pinky reminded district reps of the protocol for selecting the nominees that will be eligible for the annual awards that are presented at the clinic. He emphasized to not include anyone who did not turn in the appropriate nomination form. He also encouraged everyone to continue to recruit new members for the betterment of the association. In order to save postage costs, Pinky will continue to utilize e-mail as much as possible. He also noted that website usage continues to grow. Pinky extended his appreciation to Jeremy Languer, Waterloo West, and his committee for organizing and hosting a great All Star Series in Waterloo this past summer. Rick Heller, UNI, and his crew were also thanked for doing a fine job on field preparations. The State of Iowa plaque will continue to be given to members for 35 years of service. Pinky also suggested that a review be conducted to consider exchanging certificates for plaques at the 15 year service levels. This would help reduce the costs associated with presenting plaques, many of which do not get picked up by recipients. Discussion was eventually tabled and left to Phil Katz's Awards committee for review. Tentative sites for future All Star Series are as follows: 2008 - Des Moines; 2009 - Cedar Rapids; 2010 - Council Bluffs; 2011 - Davenport. The Player of the Year Award for this past season was presented to Jared Norris of Urbandale. Pinky thanked Pro-Line for sponsoring this award with a plaque and for their \$1000 donation to the All Star Series. Recipient of the Lanny Peterson Academic Player of the Year Award went to Brian Inloes of Mount Ayr.

Dave Rock, Calamus-Wheatland, committee chairman for the Lanny Peterson Academic and Player of the Year Awards, noted there were 78 nominations for the academic award.

Pinky recommended John Reglein, Graphic Edge for the President's Award; Tom & Linda Souhrada, Davenport, for the Bill and Sherry Freese Award; and Randy Wayne White, former Davenport Central player for the Harold "Pinky" Primrose Award. Paul Keitel, DeWitt, motioned to accept these nominees. Charlie Stumpff, Iowa City West, seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Tim O'Neill, West Des Moines Dowling, presented the All Star Series report. He said current preparations are going well for the event scheduled to be held in Des Moines this summer. He did note a format change, stating that games played on Friday and Saturday would be begin at 10:00 am and noon at Principal Park. This will also change the All State voting times. The Super Team voting will start at 7:00 am, while the other selections will be chosen at approximately 2:30 pm. During Tim's report, Pinky noted that he has some concerns about the number of coaches volunteering to coach in the All Star Series at the 4A level. He encouraged coaches to apply, including assistants. Motion by Dan Pomeroy to accept the report. Seconded by Steve Westphal, Lenox. Motion carried.

Roger Hoel gave the Hall of Fame report. The committee recommended the following people be inducted into the Hall of Fame at the 2008 Awards Banquet. Cal Eldred, Urbana/University of Iowa, player; Stan Bahnsen, Davenport Central, player; Don Lyons, Denison, coach; Rick Heller, UNI, coach; Phil Katz, Linn-Mar, coach. Discussion was held during Roger's report about the qualifications required to be considered for induction into the Hall of Fame. Roger noted there are "guidelines" for the committee to follow, however, it is also necessary to review each nominee on an individual basis. Roger and his committee were commended for the excellent job they do. Mike Morrison, West Delaware, made a motion to accept all recommendations for the Hall of Fame. Motion was seconded by Jeff Frese, Norway. Motion carried.

Jeff Frese presented the Umpires report. The committee recommended Marlow Van Ginkel, Rock Valley, for induction as an umpire into the Hall of Fame. Tom Souhrada, Davenport, made a motion to accept this recommendation. Jim Donohue, former Martensdale St. Mary's coach, seconded the motion. Motion carried. The committee also asked the advisory committee to discuss with the IHSAA using three man umpiring crews for all district final and sub-state games.

John Waddle, Coon Rapids-Bayard, gave the All-District report. He distributed a copy of the All-District sheet that is to be submitted to Pinky following the summer selection meetings. It includes an expanded stats format and should be filled out completely for each of the selected players. This form will then be distributed by Pinky and used at the All-State selection meetings. The purpose of the form is to have a uniform format in which to easily compare players from all of the districts across the state. The All-State nomination forms need to continue to be submitted by each coach before leaving their respective All-District meeting. This form provides coaches an opportunity to share more information about a nominated player. Steve Westphal made a motion to accept the report. Seconded by Jim Donohue. Motion carried.

Lee Toole, presented the Rating Poll committee report. He said interest continues to increase and the process seems to be getting better each year. Lee did note that one school was incorrectly classified and the problem was taken care of. He will work with Roger Barr at the athletic association to try and eliminate any future problems. Motion by Lenny Weih to accept the report. Seconded by Roger Hoel. Carried.

Steve Hanson, Marshalltown, pinch hit for Dave Middleton, North Polk, by presenting the Membership Committee report. The committee sent out 91 letters soliciting membership and was able to enroll 16 new members as a result. Great job! During the report, Randy Wee, Johnston, suggested that the association consider working with colleges to help endorse our organization. By including information about who we are and what we do into their coaching curriculums, it was felt future coaches may be more inclined to join. This will be left up to Dave's committee for further review.

Marshalltown coach, Steve Hanson, stated the All-State Coach committee is running smoothly.

Steve Hanson remained busy by presenting an Advisory committee update. He noted that the IHSAA Board would be voting on the 4A seeding issue during the state football championships. He reported a successful trial run with the process during the past summer. There was a 91% efficiency rating on returning the required seeding prerequisites. During Hanson's report, President Barton provided clarification about the potential consequences of a junior or senior player pitching at the JV level. He noted that this participation counted toward their 40 game limit. President Barton also wanted clarification as to whether or not it is legal for a coach to watch their player(s) at an indoor hitting facility. He will contact Boone for a ruling. Mike Morrison motioned to accept all of Hanson's reports. Fritz Keeling, seconded the motion. Carried.

Pinky noted that the IHSBCA is represented on the Iowa Sports Council. Gary Paulsen, Ogden, keeps us informed of any developments within this organization.

Pinky noted that he continues to receive thank you letters from All Star players and parents.

Pinky emphasized that ad hoc committees cannot be allowed to run the association. It is the Executive Secretary's responsibility to be in charge and to follow and enforce previously established rules/protocol.

The board meeting adjourned at 11:37 am with members moving to their respective district meetings.

The next meeting will be held at the US Cellular Crowne Plaza Hotel in Cedar Rapids, Iowa on Thursday, January 31, 2008.

DUTIES:

- Shall serve as evaluators of the All-Star Series along with the Board of Directors.
- 2. Shall recommend to the Board of Directors any changes and possible solutions to problems.
- 3. Shall secure advertising for series program.
- 4. Shall help in running the day-to-day operation of All-Star Series. a/ Gate keepers b/ Foul ball chasers c/ Program sellers d/ Field maintenance e/ PA announcer f/ Score keeper
- 5. Shall secure a printer of the All-Star Program.
- 6. Shall secure a photographer for taking All-Star team pictures.
- 7. Shall help process the players upon arrival.
- 8. Shall help in transportation to ball park.
- 9. Shall help in securing equipment.

Executive Secretary's Responsibility at All-Star Series:

- Shall send out material to All-Star Coaches in late June.

- Shall handle all monies from the: a/ program b/ ticket sales c/ banquet d/ sponsors e/ etc.
- Will be in charge of the Games: a/Times b/ Setting up SeriesUmpires
- 4. Overseer of Banquet, Meals, Total operation
- 5 Shall instruct the coaches about duties of All-Star Series and rules to live by.
- 7. Shall secure housing--food, etc.

President's Responsibility:

1/ Evaluate series 2/ Hand out medals 3/ Help in any area necessary.

HALL OF FAME COMMITTEE:

Function of Committee: There shall be a Hall of Fame Committee of the Board of Directors composed of present Hall of Fame members and two members of the board, appointed by the President. The President will appoint the Chairman.

DUTIES:

- Shall have the power to select Hall of Fame members each year.
- Shall set up the selection process for other Hall of Fame members.
- 3. Shall set up a meeting of the Hall of Fame members at the annual clinic meeting for the selection and discussion of future Hall of Fame members.
- Shall send out a note to present Hall of Fame members to encourage them to continue to be active in the Association.
- 5. Shall present to Board of Directors at their Fall meeting the Hall of Fame members for the up-coming year.
- 6. Shall recommend after evaluation of the Hall of Fame Award methods to improve the program of the Hall of Fame induction.

Executive Secretary's Responsibility:

1. Shall send out letters to the nominees of the Hall of Fame.

STEERING COMMITTEE:

Function of Committee: There shall be a Steering committee of the Board of Directors composed of the dues-paying Past Presidents. The past immediate president will serve as chairman.

All recommendations of the Committee shall be reported in full to the Board of Directors. All transactions of the Committee shall be reported to the Board and acted upon the next regular meeting of the Board of Directors.

The Steering committee shall have two meetings annually.

DUTIES:

- 1. Shall have the power to select the All-Star coaching staff.
- 2. Shall be the nominating committee.
- Shall study long-range needs of the Association and make recommendations to the Board.
- Shall serve as a screening committee, arrange interviews and make recommendations to the Board of Directors in the selection of the Executive Secretary.
- Shall serve the President in any capacity deemed necessary by the President
- 6. Shall evaluate the Executive Secretary's work annually.

AUDITING COMMITTEE:

Function of Committee: There shall be an Auditing Committee of the Board of Directors. The Committee shall consist of 1 member of the Board and other members appointed by the President. The President will appoint the Chairman.

All recommendations of the Committee shall be in full to the Board of Directors. All transactions of the Committee shall be reported to the Board for action upon.

DUTIES:

- 1. Shall serve no more than two terms.
- Shall complete the audit by the Annual Convention Clinic meeting of the total membership.
- 3. Shall report their findings to the membership.
- 4. Shall give a written report of their findings to the Third Vice-President to be recorded in the minutes.
- 5. Shall visit with the accountant of the organization and recommend changes that are necessary with Board approval.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE:

Function of Membership Committee: The committee shall consist of the two-year voted members of the Board of Directors from each district. The President will appoint the Chairman.

DUTIES:

- Shall develop and execute plans for increasing the membership of the Association.
- Membership shall be chosen to represent the various geographic sections of the state.
- 3. Shall devise ways and means of cooperation with Umpires in securing members and in methods of organization for making such membership effective.
- Such action shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Directors.
- Shall work closely with Conference Representatives in their respective Districts.
- Shall work to get 100% membership in each conference in the State
- 7. Shall make a written annual report to the Board.

UMPIRE COMMITTEE:

Function of Umpires Committee: There shall be an umpire committee of the Board of Directors composed of one 2-year umpire from each District and one alternate from each district. Two at-large umpires appointed by the 5-member committee. This committee selects its chairman. The two highest vote-getters will serve as the 2-year representative and alternate on the Board of Directors of I.H.S.B.C.A.

All recommendations of the committee shall be reported in full to the Board of Directors. All transactions of the committee shall be reported to the Board and acted upon at the meeting or next regular meeting of the Board of Directors.

Elected committee members may serve 2 three-year terms and then should drop off for 1 term. Appointed members are appointed for a 1-year term and may be reappointed at the wish of the committee chairman.

DUTIES:

- Shall have the power to select one Hall of Fame member each year.
- Shall set up the Clinic for umpires. This shall be completed by November 15.
- 3. Shall set up the process of nomination and selection of District Umpire of the Year along with the Board of Directors.
- Shall serve as evaluators of the District nominees and State Umpire of the Year along with the Board of Directors.
- Shall serve, plan, organize and implement program of information about Umpire of the Year.
- Obtain names of umpires who will serve on this committee from different districts.
- Complete reports from district on problems, possible solutions and changes.
- 8. Shall make a written annual report of committee to the Board of Directors at the annual Clinic/Convention.
- Each District Representative is responsible for membership for the District.
- 10. Other duties set out by the President.

DUTIES FOR ALL-STAR GAMES

- Umpires nominated for District Umpire of the Year are to be invited to work All-Star games. If not enough umpires from this source are available, the Chairman of the Umpires Committee or his designee is to appoint other umpires to work.
- 2. Chairman of Umpires Committee <u>or his designee</u> makes assignments based upon responses from above.
- 3. Umpires who work All-Star games receive the following:
 - a/ 2 tickets for banquet
 - b/ No less than \$40.00 cash to defray other expenses involved such as transportation and /or lodging.
 - Other momentos as deemed appropriate by Executive Secretary.
- 4. Each umpire who works will sign a waiver of injury form before working any games.

LONGEVITY AWARDS FOR UMPIRES

Awards to be presented:

5 and 10-Year Certificate of Service

15 Years, 20 Years, 25 Years, 30 Years of Service Plaques

Requirements for Above:

- 1. Must be an active umpire
- Must have at least 3 consecutive years of membership in IHSBCA for certificate.
- 3. Must have a least 5 consecutive years of membership in IHSBCA for a plaque.

- 4. Years as umpire certified by IHSAA Further Stipulations:
 - 1. Awards to be presented at banquet.
 - Umpires eligible for more than one award will be given the award for the longest number of years; however, he may purchase additional awards for earlier years.
 - Announcements of awards to be made in winter newsletter and umpire responses to be received by deadline as stated in newsletter.
 - 4. All awards will be given on 5-year anniversary.

RATING POLL COMMITTEE:

Function of Rating Poll Committee: There shall be a Rating Poll Committee of the Board of Directors. This Committee shall consist of the Directors from each district plus one at-large member. All members must be a member of the Association.

DUTIES:

- 1. Shall set up the rating poll members by district.
- Shall send out material to committee members to help evaluate the teams in their district, such as cards, telephone #, key coaches, etc.
- 3. Shall try to work through the Conference representatives as much as possible.
- Shall study needs of this committee and make recommendations to the Board of Directors.
- 5. All transactions of the committee shall be reported to the board in writing and acted upon at the regular scheduled meeting.

CLINIC COMMITTEE:

Functions of Clinic Committee: There shall be a Clinic Committee of the Board of Directors composed of the Executive Secretary, Umpire Chairman, President and College advisory.

The Executive Secretary will serve as chairman.

Recommendations of the committee shall be reported to the full Board of Directors and acted upon at the next meeting of the Board of Directors.

DUTIES:

- 1. Shall set up and run the Annual clinic.
- 2. Shall secure speakers for Annual clinic.
- 3. Shall set up program for Annual clinic.
- 4. Shall mail out press releases for Annual clinic.
- The site (city & school) will be selected by the Board of Directors after invitation has been tendered.
- The convention shall be scheduled at such a time, location at such a site and housed in such property which shall maximize convention attendance, administrative efficiency, organization independence, membership convenience and the association image and prestige.

CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE:

Function of Constitution Committee: There shall be a constitution Committee of the Board of Directors composed of two Board of Directors and other members appointed by the Chairman. The President shall appoint the chairman of this committee. They shall serve no more than two terms.

DUTIES:

- 1. Shall report any recommendations of the committee to the Board of Directors.
 - a/ These recommendations shall then be voted by the Board and then sent out in the newsletter for action at the next regular meeting.

hey shall be put into proper language before submitting to vote of the Board of Directors.

- Shall conduct annual Committee meeting prior to Clinic/ Convention meeting.
- Shall make a written annual report of Committee to the Board of Directors.

ALL DISTRICT COMMITTEE:

Function of All-District Committee: There shall be an All-District Committee of the Board of Directors composed of two members of the Board of Directors and other members appointed by the Chairman. The chairman shall be appointed by the President.

They may not serve more than two terms on committee.

DUTIES:

- Should develop and execute plans to review the All-District selection process.
- Make recommendations to the Board on problems, possible solutions and purpose changes.
- Serve as evaluators of All-District meetings and selection process.
- 4. Make a written annual report of Committee to the Board.

ALL STATE COACH COMMITTEE:

Function of All-State Coach Committee: There shall be an All-State Coach Committee of the Board of Directors composed of two members from the Board of Directors and 3 appointed by the Chairman. The President shall appoint the chairman. They may not serve more than two terms.

DUTIES:

- 1. Evaluate the Association All-State Coach Awards program and recommend methods of improving the program.
- Make recommendations to improve the process of electing All-State Coach of the Year and District Coach of Year.
- 3. Plan, organize, and implement program of information about All-State Coach to be announced in the newsletter.
- 4. Make a written annual report of Committee to the Board of Directors at the February meeting.

- 5. Serve as evaluators of District nominees and State Coach of the Year along with the Board of Directors.
- Conduct an annual committee meeting prior to clinic/convention.
- Obtain names of coaches who will serve on this committee from different districts.
- 8. Complete reports from district on problems, possible solution and purpose changes.

LANNY PETERSON ACADEMIC COMMITTEE:

FUNCTION OF ACADEMIC COMMITTEE: To review and evaluate the process of choosing academic award winners and report to the Board any of their findings. Members of the committee shall serve at the request of the president until the end of each annual clinic/Convention or until their successor are appointed.

Committee chairman shall be the Vice-President, who shall call the committee together at the clinic/convention. This meeting should be held in the a.m. on Friday. The chairman shall report on their committee's direction at the Thursday night meeting and also at the general session. They should call as many meetings as necessary in order to get the job done.

DUTIES:

- 1. Select the First Team and Honorable Mention All-Academic.
- 2. Interview the candidates for the Lanny Peterson Award.
- 3. Evaluate the criteria for selection of candidates.
- Report to the Board in writing an annual report of the Committee
- 5. If any changes shall be necessary, they should be in writing and presented to the Board at the next regular meeting.

AWARDS COMMITTEE:

Function of the Awards Committee: There shall be an Awards Committee of the Board of Directors composed of two members of the Board of Directors and other members appointed by the Chairman. The Chairman shall be appointed by the President.

DUTIES:

- 1. To evaluate all awards presented by Association.
- To evaluate a named award after 5 years, and recommend to the Board to continue the name or change the name of the award.



Questions frequently asked: (Repeat from earlier letter)


- 1. How can I get involved with the Association? All that is necessary is to attend the clinic and All-Star series. Volunteer to work or coach at the All-Star series and/or at the clinic. Serve on committees!
- 2. How can I coach in the All-Star Series? Fill out the form in this newsletter. The Steering Committee selects the All-Star coaches. They try to get a balance of coaches in each District, hoping to be able to cover the state. Your nomination form stays on file for two years.
- 3. How can I umpire in the All-Star games? An umpire in the All-Star Series must have been a member of the Association for at least three years. He must be nominated at the District meetings held in July. All the nominations from these meetings go to the Umpires Committee, which meets at the All-Star site. The nominees are narrowed down to three per district. The umpire chairman and committee will then select four additional umpires from the area to fill in the other four spots. Sixteen umpires are selected to work each year. If you are interested, fill out a nomination form that will be in the next newsletter. This form will be forwarded to the Umpire Committee chairman. All the umpires are selected by the Umpire committee.
- 4. How can I get on the Board of Directors? All a coach or umpire must do is get nominated by fellow coaches or umpires. The nomination form is in the Sept.-Oct.-Nov. Newsletter. The nominees who receive the most votes go on the ballot. The one- year representative and alternate stay on the ballot, but must win the votes to go on the Board.
- 5. Who makes the committee assignments? The Vice-President (President-elect) always makes the committee assignments for the coming year. A coach may request a certain committee. The president-elect will try to spread the committee assignments around so all sections of the state are represented. The chairmen of the committees are usually Board of Directors.
- 6. How are the district nominees selected? The district nominees are selected in the July meetings. Any coach who takes his team to the State tournament becomes an automatic nominee. The coaches who are nominated in the July All-District meeting and the State tournament are then narrowed down to three for each class at the fall meeting of the Board of Directors. The District Representatives (Two-Year, One-Year and 2-Year Umpire Reps) select the three nominees who go on the ballot. It is very important that a coach fill out the nomination form that is sent to him.

- 7. Who selects the officers? The steering committee, which is made up of dues-paying past presidents, selects the officers. The office of President moves around the state by each district. It is in this rotation: Northeast, West, Central, Southeast. The past president is chairman of the steering committee.
- 8. Who selects the award winners? The award winners are all selected by the Board of Directors. The Hall of Fame is selected by the Hall of Fame committee. All Hall of Fame nominations go to the Hall of Fame committee. This committee is made up of Hall of Fame members of the Board of Directors, Steering Committee and Hall of Famers.
- 9. Who selects the President's Award? The Board of Directors upon the recommendation of the Executive Secretary.
- 10. Who selects the Bill & Sherry Freese Award? The Board of Directors upon the recommendation of the Executive Secretary.
- 11. Who selects the Harold "Pinky" Primrose Award? The Board of Directors upon the recommendation of the Executive Secretary.
- 12. Who selects the District Media Winners? The District chairman of each district with the help of the other representatives selects the winners at the fall meeting.
- 13. How can a coach or umpire speak at the Annual Clinic? Very easy. Volunteer, give the Clinic chairman your topic, expertise and topic. That committee meets in October and puts the clinic together with the speakers.
- 14. How can I get my good ball player on the All-Star Team? Fill out the profile form in the newsletter or on the web site and submit to the Executive Secretary. The forms are then forwarded to the Head Coach of each team. Each coaching staff then selects the team that they feel can win the Series. They also must have a balance on their team; not everyone can play shortstop. After you submit the form, please let the coaches know that your player has been doing the job for you all year. Make sure you try to get the player exposure. Have other coaches recommend him.

If you have questions that you want answered, please forward them to the Executive Secretary or President of the Association. This is your organization; it needs you and you need it in order to get better and improve. Our business is to help improve high school baseball in the state of lowa and also honor the coaches and players each year who have done an outstanding job in their district.


