Happy Holidays From Lee Toole:

I first of all want to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!! It is hard to believe we are a month away from the 41st annual IHSBCA clinic. The clinic this year will be held at the Marriott Hotel, 1200 Collins Road NE, in Cedar Rapids. You can go on-line to make reservations (see IHSBCA.net website), or call the Marriott at (319) 491-9832. We are very excited about the clinic this year. Our headline speaker this year will be former LSU head baseball coach and athletic director Skip Bertman. Skip will speak on Friday and Saturday. We also will have Jack Dahm and his staff from the University of Iowa, along with Rick Heller and his staff from the University of Northern lowa. Returning after a long absence at our clinic will be ABCA Hall of Famer Bill Olson. Bill brings his experience and expertise after many years of coaching at the high school, legion, college level, along with the USA Junior Teams. A few new faces this year are head baseball coach Ed Mathey from Northern Illinois University, JJ Lally from the Chicago White Sox player development office, strength and conditioning coach with the Pittsburg Pirates organization Brandon McDaniel, and Chris Goodell from the LaCrosse Loggers baseball club. Roger Barr from the IHSAA will continue to provide for coaches his rules meeting on Saturday morning. We will end the weekend on Sunday morning at the lowa bubble as the lowa baseball team will demonstrate drills and practice situations for coaches in attendance. Vendors will be allowed to start setting up their displays on Friday morning at 9:00 am. The clinic will begin at 1:00 pm on Friday afternoon and will continue through Saturday at 4:00 pm. The Awards Banquet will be held at the Marriott Hotel on Saturday evening, beginning at 6:00 pm. We are looking forward to another outstanding weekend of baseball.

With the clinic fast approaching, please check to make sure your membership has been paid for the 2008-2009 season. Roger Barr > IHSAA

Barr has been the director of officials for the Iowa High School Athletic Association for the past three years. He was an Iowa official in football, basketball and baseball for 30 years before accepting this position at the IHSAA. His responsibilities revolve around observing, evaluation, recruiting, training and assigning officials for IHSAA tournament contests. Barr has been a rules interpreter in all three sports for the IHSAA for more than 20 years. Barr's four-year term on the NFHS Basketball Rules Committee ends in 2010

Skip Bertman > LSU

Bertman's unyielding desire to succeed drove him to the pinnacle of his profession, and his astute knowledge of the game -- obtained from over 40 years of coaching -- combined with his steadfast determination and irrepressible enthusiasm transformed LSU Baseball into the nation's premier program. Bertman has been inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame, the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame and the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Ryan Brownlee > University of Iowa

Over the past eight seasons, Brownlee has had 16 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Caleb Curry and Kevin Hoef were drafted by major league teams. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Luke Scott of the Astros.

Last season, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Jack Dahm > University of Iowa

In five years as lowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the lowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence. Since taking over the lowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years.

In Dahm's 15 years as a head coach, he has produced 23 first team all-conference performers, seven freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his five years at lowa, Dahm has coached 22 all-Big Ten selections, including seven first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Coach Dahm's 2008 recruiting class was ranked that 49th-best class according to Perfect Game Cross Checker. Iowa's ranking 49 is the highest of any Big Ten

Jim Darby > Easton Senior Vice President of Promotions & Public Relations

Jim Darby has been with Easton for over twenty years. He is responsible for Easton's corporate sponsorship with the IHSBCA. Jim pitched for UC-Berkeley from 1971-73. In 1974, he became a Berkeley assistant coach. He spent 1975 as the pitching coach at St. Mary's College and in '76, returned to his alma mater where he coached knuckleballer Tom Candiotti. Jim has spent countless hours traveling the world speaking to various baseball groups on the topic of metal bat technology. Jim will speak on Saturday on the topic of wood vs. metal bats. Jim is also this years recipient of the Bill and Sherry Freese Contributors Award.

Chris Goodell > LaCrosse Loggers, Northwoods Summer League

General Manager for the LaCrosse Loggers of the Northwoods Collegiate Summer Baseball League. Chris played his high school baseball in Oelwein. Chris played in the 1993 All-Star Series in Council Bluffs/Omaha. Chris played his college ball at the University of Dubuque, where he majored in Sports Management and Business Administration. Before joining the LaCrosse Loggers organization in 2002, Chris spent two years with the Waterloo Bucks baseball organization, one year with KCRG-TV 9, and one year at Southeast Missouri State in the sports information office.

Rick Heller > University of Northern Iowa

Head Coach Rick Heller begins his ninth season as the head baseball coach at the University of Northern Iowa where he has earned one Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) championship and an NCAA Regional berth. Last season Heller earned his 200th win with the Panthers, as well as his 500th win as a head coach. During his tenure, Heller has developed the program into a conference contender year in and year out, while coaching two MVC Most Valuable Players and one MVC Pitcher of the Year.

The Panthers have broken 50 team or individual school records with Heller at the helm which includes UNI posting a 4.63 earned run average in 2006, its lowest ERA since joining Division I in 1981. They also broke team records for hits, runs batted in, doubles and extra base hits during the 2001 season.

JJ Lally > Chicago White Sox

Assistant director for player development with the Chicago White Sox. J.J. played his high school baseball for Don Lyons at Denison High School. He played three years of college baseball while attending Briar Cliff College in Sioux City. J.J. played one more year of college baseball for the University of South Dakota while working on his graduate degree. After graduation from the University of South Dakota, J.J. played for a few years in the Independent leagues, (Prairie and Atlantic Leagues), before hanging up his spikes and taking a front office job with the independent Northern League's St. Paul Saints. That front office experience with the St. Paul Saints led him to an interview and hiring in 1999 with the Chicago White Sox.

Chris Maliszewski > University of Iowa

Maliszewski was hired as the lowa pitching coach this past year after a stint at Valparaiso. Prior to joining Valparaiso's staff, Maliszewski was a volunteer assistant coach for Dahm and the Hawkeyes in 2005 and 2006. Working with the pitching staff in 2005, he helped lead the Black and Gold to one of their most

successful seasons in the program's history, posting a 19-13 Big Ten mark.
Maliszewski has also coached in the Northwoods League, a top collegiate summer league, leading the Mankato Moondog pitching staff in 2004 and serving as the associate head coach of the Madison Mallards in 2005 and 2006. He was named Coach of the Year with Madison after leading the Mallard pitching staff to the best earned run average in league history.

Ed Mathey > Northern Illinois University

Ed Mathey has produced the three winningest teams in school history and 17 professional players in his five seasons as head coach at Northern Illinois. As he enters his sixth campaign at NIU, Mathey is on the brink of becoming the school's all-time coaching victory leader, just five wins shy of achieving that mark. Along the way, Mathey has led the Huskies to a bevy of unparalleled team accomplishments and individual accolades.

Mathey's 2007 squad was the most decorated team in Northern Illinois history, notching a school-record 34 Division I wins and 16 MAC victories while equaling the overall school season record for wins and making their furthest run in MAC Tournament history with a third-place finish that was one win away from a championship

Brandon McDaniel > Pittsburg Pirates Strength & Conditioning

Brandon will be entering his third season as Strength and Conditioning coach for the Pittsburg Pirates organization. He played his college baseball at Wayne State in Wayne, Nebraska. Brandon graduated from Wayne State with a degree in Exercise Science. Brandon is a member of the National Strength and Conditioning Association where he is a certified strength and conditioning specialist. In the off-season, Brandon is a personal trainer for athletes in the Council Bluffs/Omaha area.

Bill Olson > Ultimate Baseball Academy (Omaha)

Bill has coached for 35 years. His Omaha Northwest High School (1971-1997) base-ball teams dominated the sport for years and were especially impressive during son Gregg's four-year career. His teams won six high school state championships, eight American Legion State Championships, and one National High School Championship (1983). His 1983 team was ranked #1 nationally in high school baseball. His team won 53 consecutive games. Bill had more than 1500 career wins and winning percentage over .700. He was also the pitching/catching coach at Creighton University. He is now helping at Omaha North High School and is the Dean of the Strike Zone Baseball Academy. In 1997, USA Baseball selected Bill as the Olympic Developmental Coach of the Year.



President's Award to Jack Dahm:

Coach Dahm is entering his 6th season as the head baseball coach at the University of Iowa. He has made many positive changes with the baseball program, one of which has been qualifying for the Big Ten Tournament twice so far in his tenure. He also has had the top rated recruiting class in the Big Ten three times. Dividends which are paying-off. Coach Dahm has also spent countless hours giving back to the community and to the IHSBCA. He not only helps fundraise thousands of dollars for cancer research with a fall golf outing and the annual Corridor Classic baseball game between lowa and Northern lowa in Cedar Rapids, but also gives his time to lowa High School Baseball with camps/clinics, coaching expertise, field usage for the all-star series, and allowing the high school coaches to be involved with a practice in the lowa bubble the Sunday of the clinic weekend. His office door is always open for any lowa high school baseball coach. We appreciate the time and effort that Coach Dahm has given back to the IHSBCA.

The Bill & Sherry Freese Contributors Award to Jim Darby:

Jim Darby is the Senior Vice-President of Easton Sports. He is in charge of promotions and the public relations division with Easton. Jim spends many hours traveling the world talking baseball with many non-related baseball organizations and businesses. One of Jim's favorite topics is speaking about metal vs. wood bats. He has gained an appreciation for the topic; but come well prepared if your cause is to argue against metal bats. One year ago, Jim and Easton made a commitment to the IHSBCA and became a corporate sponsor. Their goal is to help support our efforts as an organization and also help promote high school baseball in the state of lowa. Easton has committed to donating equipment, bats, and clothing for the all-star series. Easton will also help to secure and bring-in top college coaches to speak at our annual clinic. We, as an association, are gratefully appreciative for the efforts and generosity that Jim Darby and Easton has shared with us.

Harold "Pinky" Primrose Award to Richard "Doc" Brink:

Mr. Brink is the CEO and Chairman of L.M. Gill Welding & Manufacturing, L.L.C., in Manchester, Connecticut. He played his high school baseball at Franklin High School in Cedar Rapids. He then went on to lowa State and played third base for lowa State. In 1957, Doc led the Cyclones to a Big Seven Championship. The Cyclones then defeated Bradley for the District Five title and placed third in the College World Series in Omaha. Cap Timm was named Coach of the Year. Doc hit .379 with 9 doubles, 3 triples, 1 homerun and 25 RBI's. He played with some greats on that team: All-American Gary Thompson, Jerry McNertney, and Dick Bertel. He graduated from Iowa State with an Engineering Degree. He also served in the Korean War conflict. Today, Dick is the owner of a large manufacturing company that makes parts for the Polaris Sub and Missiles. We honor Richard "Doc" Brink for his accomplishments and dedication to the game of baseball.

2009 Hall of Fame Selections

Two players, two coaches, one umpire, and one contributor have been selected for induction into this years IHSBCA Hall of Fame.

The six inductees are: Jerry Patterson, Fort Dodge; Bill Drummond, Council Bluffs; William Galetich, Madrid; Charles Wolever, Council Bluffs; Jake Leabo, Davenport; and Mike Droll, Tipton. The Hall of Fame class of 2009 will be inducted at the Awards Banquet on Saturday, January 31, 2009, in Cedar Rapids. They will join 220 other Hall of Fame members.

Jerry Patterson has been a strong proponent for the game of baseball in the Fort Dodge area for many years. Some forty years ago, Jerry borrowed money on a \$4,800 annual teacher's salary. He smoothed the lowa farm ground into a diamond for kids and adults in Fort Dodge and parts beyond to play the game for decades. Every day, every inning, is faster now. At age 70 and fighting a rare disease that grows bulging tumors in his stomach, he figures his life is in extra innings. Year by year, he has added other amenities to the ballpark that was busy from April through October with everyone from school boys to future pros such as Hall of Famer Dave Winfield and pitcher Dennis Leonard. What started as nothing more than a diamond of sand with a chickenwire backstop and discarded old school bleachers has become a gem. Jerry learned the game from his days as a youngster choosing sides at the sandlot to his brief tenure with the Washington Senators Class D team in Florida training camp. Still today, Jerry spends most of his time working the infield dirt, announcing the players names, and playing the music between innings.

Bill Drummond played his high school baseball for Thomas Jefferson High School in Council Bluffs. Bill pitched for the Yellow Jackets from 1959-1962. He never lost a regular season game in the 4 years while pitching on the varsity, 61-2. His two loses were to Bancroft St. Johns in the Spring of 1961 at the Sub-State tournament and again in the summer of 1961 against Ames in the Sub-State finals. He played on 4 State Championship teams while playing for Thomas Jefferson. In 1962, Bill played in the lowa-Nebraska All-Star game. He had 673 strike outs in his career, 274 of them during the 1962 season. He had a consecutive scoreless inning streak of 35 from 1960-62. Upon high school graduation, Bill attended Buena Vista College where he became an All-Conference Pitcher. He was ranked 7th nationally that year in strike outs with 14.3 per game. He was selected in his first Major League Draft in June of 1965 by the Minnesota Twins. He turned down that offer to stay in school. Bill was drafted a second time in the re-entry draft by the Chicago White Sox in 1966. He again turned that down to stay in school. He did sign as a free agent upon graduating from Buena Vista in 1970 by the New York Yankees. He played 5 years in the Yankees organization until a rotator cuff injury ended his career. Bill turned to teaching and worked in the Waukee School District for 30 years. He is a member of the Buena Vista Hall of Fame. Bill works now as an independent carpenter in the Des Moines area.

2009 Hall of Fame Selections

William Galetich played his high school baseball in Madrid. He was the catcher for his Madrid squad, known for his strong arm and a hot bat. During the 1939 high school season, Willie hit .600 for his Madrid team. Willie was the team captain during the 1940 season, in which he led his Madrid team to the state tournament. Madrid lost in the Championship game to Davenport that year, 2-1. Willie hit .700 in the state tournament that year. Willie was signed by the Detroit Tigers in 1940, and there wasn't a doubt among friends and family that he was headed for a major league career. A broken finger interrupted his second season and the Tigers released him. The St. Louis Cardinals picked him up in 1942, but the league in which he was playing in folded up and Willie went off to war with a lot of other ball players. Willie returned to sandlot ball at Madrid after the war. He not only played for his hometown Madrid team in the Mid-State league, but also with the Des Moines John Deere club. Once his playing days ended, he managed many club teams in the Carroll area. Willie was co-manager of the Carroll Merchants in 1949 when a new Carroll Stadium was erected and opened. Carroll stadium is still used today by Kuemper High School and Carroll High School. Two lasting memories for Willie are catching Bob Feller and Dizzy Dean in exhibition games. Once he finished his baseball career, he returned to Madrid to help encourage young people to play the game right and honor the game with respect. He spent many hours at the high school field in Madrid helping in anyway he could. Today, he resides in Madrid after retiring from a career with John Deere.

Charles Wolever started his high school baseball career in Plattsmouth, Nebraska, where he played varsity outfield all four years and was the team captain his senior season. Upon high school graduation, he attended Tarkio College in Tarkio, Missouri. Tarkio did not have a baseball program. Charlie was picked up by the New York Yankees where he played in the Sooner State League and the ABLA League for one year each. He then joined the White Sox organization, playing one year in the Northern League. He was released after suffering a broken bone on the instep of his foot. Charlie turned his efforts to teaching and coaching, where he coached for 4 years in Columbus, Nebraska. He then moved to Council Bluffs where he coached for 14 years at St. Albert High School. Charlie not only started the St. Albert baseball program in 1966, he fundraised and built the baseball field. He was also responsible for re-starting the Rainbow Post 2 Junior American Legion baseball program. Coach Wolever brought the four Council Bluffs Schools; Abraham Lincoln, Thomas Jefferson, Lewis Central and St. Albert's together. He was responsible for promoting goodwill and sportsmanship among players and coaches alike. As the legion coach, his teams won State Championships in 1969, '73, '75, '83 and '84. He coached the high school team for 14 years while at St. Albert. His 1977 team qualified for the state tournament. Charlie was named Southwest lowa Coach of the Year that same year. He was instrumental in establishing the strong winning baseball tradition in Council Bluffs. After his retire-

ment, Charlie worked as a scout for the Philadelphia Phillies in the Council Bluffs/Omaha area. Coach Wolever was honored in June 2005 by having the St. Albert baseball field named after him.

Jack Leabo has been involved with baseball in the state of lowa since 1954, where he played prep baseball for Davenport High School. He then moved on to play baseball for the University of lowa until his graduation in 1961. Coach Leabo started his high school coaching career at his alma mater as the head sophomore coach in 1968. He continued in that position until 1978 when he became the assistant coach at the varsity level to the legendary Hall of Fame coach Bill Freese. Upon Bill's retirement in 1985, Jack took over the varsity program. In all, Coach Leabo coached baseball at Davenport High School for 29 years. His over-all varsity record is 285-185. He has two state runner-up titles to his credit; made three trips to the state tournament and has a state championship under his belt while he assisted Bill Freese during the 1979 season. Jack's 29 year coaching career came to an end in 1997 when he suffered a heart attack. Coach Leabo's baseball knowledge also found its way down to the youth level in the Davenport area. He served as an assistant coach on the 1972 Little League World Series team. He also ran many successful clinics for many years for the youth in the Davenport community. Jack has been an active member of the IHSBCA, coaching in 3 All-Star Series, serving on many committees, and being named District Coach of the Year twice. He also won 2 MAC Conference titles during his tenure at Davenport High School.

Michael Droll can be found umpiring a baseball game at any time, on any day, during the spring and summer baseball seasons. Mike is credited by his peers as being one of the top umpires in the state. Mike works many college games during the spring. Working the Big 12 Conference, the Big Ten Conference, and the Missouri Valley Conference. He logs many miles during the summer months traveling around Eastern lowa umpiring high school games in four different conferences. Mike is also a regular at the lowa State Tournament and IHSBCA All-Star Series. Mike was named State Umpire of the Year in 1993 and 1998. He has also been named District Umpire of the year five times, with the most recent in 2006. Mike has been very active within the association, serving on the Board of Directors and umpiring on a regular basis at the All-Star Series. Mike has been umpiring for the past 27 seasons.

4 Year College Coach

Joel Holst, Wartburg

Coach Holst recently ended his 13th year as Wartburg's head coach. The level of success attained by the program in Holst's tenure couldn't be much higher.

The 28th member of NCAA Division III's 500-win club has guided the Knights to 12 straight Iowa Conference Championships and into the NCAA Division III national tournament eight of the last 10 seasons. His 2000 baseball team won the school's first regional championship and went on to compete in the NCAA Division III College World Series to finish the season ranked sixth in the nation. The 2005 team also won a regional championship and finished fourth in the College World Series with a final ranking nationally of fifth. Holst has also been named the Iowa Conference Coach of the Year eight of the last 10 seasons, and was named the Four-year College Coach of the Year in lowa for the 1998, 1999, and 2000 seasons, and was runner-up in 1997, 2001, and 2002. He was named Central Region Collegiate Coach of the Year in 2000 and 2005. He has posted a career record at Wartburg of 405-173-2. Holst spent four years as head coach at West Delaware High School after graduating from Coe. At West Delaware, he was nominated District Coach of the Year three times; won a Wa-Mac Conference title and compiled a record of 100-50. He then earned his master's degree in health and physical education at Northwest Missouri State, while serving as recruiting coordinator and pitching coach for the nationally ranked NCAA Division II Bearcats for two seasons, before taking his first collegiate head coaching job at Loras in 1990. Holst carried out responsibilities in the football programs at Wartburg, Loras, and West Delaware.

Rick Heller, Northern Iowa

Rick is a member of the IHSBCA Hall of Fame. He begins his ninth season as the head baseball coach at the University of Northern lowa where he has earned one Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) championship and an NCAA Regional berth. Last season Heller earned his 200th win with the Panthers, as well as his 500th win as a head coach. During his tenure, Heller has developed the program into a conference contender year in and year out, while coaching two MVC Most Valuable Players and one MVC Pitcher of the Year. The Panthers have broken 50 team or individual school records with Heller at the helm which includes UNI posting a 4.63 earned run average in 2006, its lowest ERA since joining Division 1 in 1981. It also broke team records for hits, runs batted in, doubles and extra base hits during the 2001 season. Heller has led the Panthers to three MVC tournaments, winning the Championship in 2001 with all-American Ryan Brunner claiming the league MVP award and all-American Nic Ungs taking home Pitcher of the Year honors. Since Heller's arrival, 14 Panther players have gone on to play professional baseball, including current minor leaguers Zach Jevne, Josh Habel, Nic Ungs, Adam Boeve and Aaron McEachran. The Panthers recorded back-to-back 30-plus win seasons in 2001 and 2002 for the first time in school history and set the school single-season record at 35 wins in 2001. UNI's NCAA Regional appearance in 2001 was the school's first since becoming Division I in 1981. Heller also has coached two academic all-Americans in Travis Welsch and Ryan Brunner. Since Heller's arrival in 2000, the school record books virtually have been rewritten. The Panthers have a strong tradition as one of the best offensive teams in the conference as well as the country. In Heller's six years, UNI has led the league in hitting three times and finished second once. As a player at Upper Iowa from 1982-86, he was a four-year starter at shortstop and he also lettered in football and basketball. He is a member of the Upper Iowa Athletic Hall of Fame.
