the Year were not members of the organization or did not return their biographical information. Mike is looking for email addresses of umpires throughout the state. If conference commissioners through out the major conferences could supply him with names, addresses, and email addresses of umpires he could get more umpires involved with the association. The Umpires Committee recommended Bill Boyd to be inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2010. They also voted to name the Umpire of the Year award after the late Brent Prange, a long-time member of the IHSBCA and a member of the Hall of Fame. Dave Middleton motioned to accept. 2nd by Jerry Roling. Motion was accepted.

The Lanny Peterson Award Report was given by Brett Hoyer. Chad Piersma from Sioux City North the Lanny Peterson Award for the 2009 season. He will be attending Dartmouth.

The Academic All-State Team Report was given by John Waddle. It was brought up if the dead line for the nominations for All State Academic Award could be moved up. If that was the case the coaches could not put down the player's post-season awards. The form to turn in has been fine tuned over the years and is weighted towards an academic award. A player does not need to be present at the All-Star Series to win the Lanny Peterson Award.

Randy Wee gave the State Rating Poll Committee Report. He would like an email distribution list to help solicit more responses from coaches. Randy needs more coaches on the Rating Poll Committee to keep in touch with him on a weekly basis to help get a more accurate picture of how teams are doing around the state. This was the committee's first attempt to attach win/loss records to the poll. Randy reported it was difficult to get accurate records.

The Membership Committee Report was given by Dave Middleton. Membership is always down at this time of the year but it picks up around the time of the annual clinic. He would like to see more umpires join the association. Again, there is a need for the conference commissioner of officials to help out with mailing addresses.

Steve Hanson gave the Clinic Survey/Mini Clinic Report. Over the past month his committee has developed a list of topics and secured Iowa High School coaches to speak at the mini clinic this year. This is a new and exciting addition to the clinic. It will be high school coaches talking about high school issues. Outlines from the speakers will be provided, audio visual aids will be encouraged, and a form will be provided to those who would like to speak in the future. Steve has developed a form to evaluate all of the speakers at the clinic. The forms can be turned before the coach's leave. This will help to further develop a list of qualified speakers for the future.

The IHSAA Advisory Committee Report was given by Steve Hanson. There will be several rule changes in the upcoming years. In 2010, teams can expand their dugout towards the out, but both dugouts must be expanded equally. The lead runner will be declared out if a collision occurs between the fielder and runner or fielder and coach on a pop foul. Assistant coaches who leave the dugout or coaches box to dispute a judgment call by an umpire will be restricted to the dugout for the remainder of the game along with, possibly, the head coach. If severe enough, there may be ejections. In 2012 all bats must meet the new Batted Ball Coefficient of Restitution (BBCOR) performance standard. No more BESR. There were 73 ejections this past season; up 17 from the year before. The state also discussed have the teams that travel the farthest be allowed to play the 2 PM and 6 PM games at the state tourney to allow more time for travel. More centrally located teams would play the noon and 8 PM games. After the first round the pre-tourney seeding would take over. The disadvantage of this proposal would be scouting. A team playing at 2 PM may have their next round opponent be playing at 8 PM. This proposal will go to the Board in the spring.

Steve also gave the updated report on seeding of 4A schools. Seeding has gone well in spite of the fact that 20% of the coaches did not comply with the reporting dates for scores. It will be proposed to be permanent in the spring meeting at the Board of Control. They have set the following guidelines to determine home field. The higher seed will have host the game if they have lights. If the higher seeded team does not have lights they will travel to the lower seeded team unless it can find a lighted field that doesn't add travel time. If two teams from the same community play and neither have lights then the higher seeded team will host a 5 PM game. Discussion of the higher seeded team being the home team was tabled because they still flip a coin for home team once you get to Des Moines. Dave Rock reported that seeding for 3A will start in 2011 with a 2 year experimental period.

The IHSAA Sports Report was given by Lee Toole. There was discussion on the impact of select teams on Iowa High School teams. How can IHSAA promote high school sports to get more participation? They thought by running commercials during the state tournament and promoting the positives would help.

Lee reported that he received many positive letters and emails from the all-star series. The sites for the All-Star Series in the future have not been finalized. Council Bluffs and Cedar Rapids will host the next two series, but it hasn't been determined which year they will host. Davenport will host the 2012 series.

Fall Meeting - November 21, 2009

The meeting was held in the Big Ten Room at Carver Hawkeye arena. It was called to order at 8:30 by Executive Director Lee Toole. The minutes from the last meeting in April in Cedar Rapids, which were published in the newsletter as discussed. Mike Pauly motioned to approve. 2nd by Dave Rock. Minutes were accepted.

Lee went over the financial report. Balances in bank accounts are healthy. Lee reported that The All-Star Series and the Coaches Clinic made a nice profit last year. Charlie Stumpff motioned to approve. 2nd by Dave Rock. The financial report was accepted.

Report from the Officers and Committees:

Lee reported that the All-Star series was outstanding. Many thanks to the All-Star committee headed up by Dan Pomeroy and John Waddle and the Chamber of Commerce from the Carroll.

Roger Hoel gave the Hall of Fame Committee Report. The following will be inducted into the Hall of Fame in Cedar Rapids at the Banquet: Bill Burbach, a former player from Dubuque, Milo Hamilton, as a contributor from Fairfield, Harley Schieffer, a former coach from Clarinda, Joe McFarland, a former coach from Norwalk, John Lewis, a coach from Cedar Rapids, John Waddle, a coach from Coon Rapids, and Bill Boyd, an umpire from New Hampton. Tom Souhrada motioned to approve. 2nd by Brett Hoyer. Nominees were accepted.

The All-District Committee Report was given by Randy Wee and John Waddle. Because there has been some shifting of schools between 3A and 2A they are looking into restructuring districts to balance the number of teams. They are reviewing the all-district positions to see if it should be DH/utility player.

The Awards Committee Report was given by Lee Toole in place of Phil Katz who was not able to attend. Phil is interested in improving the Hall of Fame award. He would like to see the individual's picture and bio on the trophy. Since the trophies are made in Cedar Rapids this makes for easy delivery of trophies to the banquet.

Dan Pomeroy gave the All-Star Committee Report. The people from Carroll did an outstanding job with the All-Star Series. The wine tour was a great idea and it allowed parents, coaches, and staff members to mingle. Tom Souhrada's idea of having a photographer take pictures during the games and show them at the banquet proved to be very good. The parents could buy the CD of pictures; many hits were reported on the photographer's web-site. Tweaking the time and order of the games was a sound idea. It was discussed if the opening day games should be changed to have small west vs. large west play first when the series was hosted in the western part of the state. This would allow players and parents from the eastern teams more time to travel to the site. John Waddle brought up an idea to have 9 inning games on Thursday and Friday to allow more players to get into the games in case of rain later in the week.

in Carroll, Iowa. The Bears then went on to the North Plains District tournament where they defeated Miles Community College and Madison Area Technical College in three straight wins to advance to the 2009 NJCAA World Series in Enid, Oklahoma.

The Bears lost the opener of the Series to Western Oklahoma 9-1 and then rebounded to beat Monroe Community College 13-5. The Bears were then eliminated by Kankakee Community College 8-2. The Bears finished the season with the nation's best record at 55-11, and Fitzgerald was honored for their success being named the 2009 Region 11 Coach of the Year, the 2009 North Plains District Coach of the Year, and the 2009 Diamond Dreams National Junior College Coach of the Year.

Fitzgerald reached a head coaching milestone with his 100th career win on May 16th with an 8-7 victory over Miles Community College. In just two seasons as a head coach, Fitzgerald's career record stands at 103-29.

Marc Rardin — Iowa Western CC

Coach Rardin begins his 8th season as the head baseball coach at Iowa Western. His 2009 squad finished the season with a 39-24 record, a Conference Championship, Region XI Championship, Northern District Championship, and a third straight trip to the JUCO World Series. His 2008 squad finished the year with a 55-12 record. Over the past 7 seasons, he guided his Reiver squads to 301 wins and only 104 losses, a .766 winning percentage. During that same 7 year span, the Reivers have also accumulated a 107-18 conference record. Iowa Western has qualified for the JUCO World Series in each of the last three years, five trips in the past eleven years. The Reivers finished 3rd at the 2005 JUCO World Series. His 2007 team finished with a 42-18 record, where he coached the Region XI Pitcher of the Year in Kirk Clark, and the National JUCO Player of the Year in Doug Kroll.

4 Year College Coach

Carl Tebon — Loras College

Carl Tebon began his time at the helm of the Loras College Duhawks in 1996 and has won 297 games as the skipper of the Duhawks, an average of 21 games per year. In 2009, Tebon directed the first Duhawks team since 1952 to win the Iowa Conference championship. In his fourteen years as Loras' head coach, Tebon has had the Duhawks in the top four in the standings seven times. He has coached two All-Americans, 11 All-Region picks, and 42 All-Iowa Conference players, including league MVP's Justin Pierre (1998), Cory Schultz (2002), and Nick Olberding (2009). Pierre went on to a three-year minor league career with the Cook County Cheetahs and the Dubois County Dragons of the Frontier League. Schultz was a free agent signing by the Philadelphia Phillies and was a part of their minor league system for three seasons, throwing a total of 123 innings.

The Sturgeon Bay, Wisconsin native is a 1989 graduate of Mount Scenario College where he was a two-time all-conference pick and MVP in baseball, while also starring on the football field. He earned his master's degree in Education/Sports Management from Old Dominion University in 1992.

Prior to coming to the Duhawks, Tebon served as the head coach at UW-River Falls, compiling a 56-38 record. He was also an assistant baseball coach at Virginia Wesleyan from 1989-1992.

Rick Heller — Indiana State (Former UNI Head Coach)

Indiana State Director of Athletics Ron Prettyman announced today (Aug. 14) the hiring of Rick Heller as the 28th head baseball coach in the 113-year history of the Sycamore program.

"It is with great excitement that we announce the addition of Rick Heller as head baseball coach at Indiana State," Prettyman said. "Coach Heller's teams have had a tremendous history of success both on the field and in the classroom. We welcome coach Heller and his wife Rachelle to the Sycamore family and look forward to his leadership of our baseball program."

Heller spent the previous 10 seasons as the head coach at Northern Iowa. With the Panthers, Heller earned a Missouri Valley Conference championship and the school's only trip to the NCAA Championship. Heller's final season at Northern Iowa saw Travis Bennett grab Missouri Valley Conference Newcomer of the Year honors. Bennett made an immediate impact on the Panther lineup, hitting .315 in league games with a team-high 28 hits, 13 runs batted in and a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage. Overall, he started all 48 UNI games and was the Panthers' leading hitter (.338) with 67 hits, 43 RBI and a .490 slugging percentage. Bennett delivered 18 multi-hit games and hit safely in 38 contests and was the first-ever Panther to earn the Valley's Newcomer of the Year honor.

In 2007, Heller earned his 200th win with the Panthers, as well as his 500th win as a head coach. During his tenure, Heller developed the program into a conference contender year in and year out, while coaching three MVC Most Valuable Players, one MVC Pitcher of the Year and one MVC Newcomer of the Year. The Panthers broke 57 team or individual school records with Heller at the helm, which included UNI posting a 4.63 earned run average in 2006, its lowest ERA since becoming a NCAA Division I program in 1981. UNI also broke team records for hits, runs batted in, doubles and extra base hits during the 2001 season.

In 2008, UNI finished with its third 30-win season, posting a 30-24 mark. Shortstop Brandon Douglas earned MVC Player of the Year honors, as well as second-team All-America honors. The Panthers finished

with the third-highest batting average in the Valley, and Douglas finished the year with the league's second highest average at the plate. Including 2008, Heller led the Panthers to four MVC tournaments, winning the championship in 2001 with All-American Ryan Brunner claiming the league MVP award and All-American Nic Ungs taking home Pitcher of the Year honors. Under Heller, 18 Panther players went on to play professional baseball, including current minor leaguers Brandon Douglas, Guido Fonseca, Nic Ungs, and Adam Boeve. The Panthers recorded back-to-back 30-plus win seasons in 2001 and 2002 for the first time in school history and set the school single-season record at 35 wins in 2001. UNI's NCAA Regional appearance in 2001 was the school's first since becoming Division I in 1981. Heller also coached two ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans in Travis Welsch and Ryan Brunner.

Heller became just the sixth UNI baseball coach since 1926 when he was hired in 1999. He had spent the previous 12 seasons building a nationally-ranked program as the head coach at Upper Iowa University in Fayette, Iowa. While at Upper Iowa, Heller recorded a 291-194-3 record and was named Iowa Conference Coach of the Year four times. The Peacocks won three regular-season and three Iowa Conference Tournament titles in his tenure. Heller arrived in Fayette in the fall of 1987 and quickly turned things around, earning his first Iowa Conference Coach of the Year honor in 1989. One year later, he led Upper Iowa to its first winning season in 17 years. In 1993, Heller won his first conference championship, and the first for any UIU program in 20 years, while advancing to the NCAA Division III Regionals.

Heller's team won the Iowa Conference and advanced to a NCAA Regional again in 1995. His team finished 19th in the national rankings, and he won his third Coach of the Year honor. He repeated Coach of the Year honors again in 1996 when the Peacocks won the Iowa Conference and Central Regional to advance to the NCAA Division III College World Series. His team finished the year ranked sixth nationally, and he was named NCAA Division III Central Region Coach of the Year. That 39-12 team also set a school record for wins.

In 1997, his team was ranked seventh nationally in the preseason poll and won the Iowa Conference Tournament. In 1998, his team reached as high as 10th nationally while finishing with a 38-8 record to set a school record for winning percentage. His final UIU team finished 30-15-1 and finished third in the Iowa Conference while setting five school records. As a player at Upper Iowa from 1982-86, he was a four-year starter at shortstop, and he also lettered in football and basketball. He is a member of the Upper Iowa Athletic Hall of Fame.

2010 Hall of Fame Inductees

Milo Hamilton (Contributor):

Milo graduated from Fairfield High School in 1943. His first radio broadcast came on the Armed Forces Radio Service WXLI, in Guam, at the age of 18 while in the U.S. Navy. He came back home and worked for radio station KBIZ in Ottumwa. The next year he attended the University of Iowa while working for a variety of stations in the area, which include WSUI-KSUI in Iowa City and KCRG in Cedar Rapids. During that time period, Milo worked on the radio broadcast for Iowa football and basketball games. Milo graduated from the University of Iowa in 1950. His 60 year career of broadcasting includes assignments with: the St. Louis Browns, St. Louis Cardinals, Chicago Cubs, Chicago White Sox, Atlanta Braves, Pittsburgh Pirates, and Houston Astros. He has also broadcast for many major college teams: University of Iowa, Northwestern, DePaul, Georgia Tech, Ohio State, and the Southwestern Conference. Milo has also had the honor and opportunity of calling many major league memorable moments and record breaking events: Roger Maris's 61st home run, Ernie Banks five grand slams in one season, Stan Musial's five home runs in a double header, and Henry Aaron's 715th home run. He has served as Master of Ceremonies for many charities, helping raise over 20 million dollars: March of Dimes, City of Hope, American Cancer Society, Leukemia Society, American Heart Association, Junior Diabetes, and "Give Kids the World". Milo has won numerous awards and honors.

Milo was inducted into the Major League Hall of Fame in 1992 and the Radio Hall of Fame in 2000. Milo has also received honors in other areas such as: Bob Costa's "Top 50 Calls", "The Sporting News" 25 Greatest Moments, Texas Baseball Hall of Fame, Texas Radio Hall of Fame, and the Chicago Sportsman of the Year Award.

Bill Boyd (Umpire):

Bill has been umpiring since 1991. He has worked in 14 state tournaments, (1996-2009). Bill was the IHSBCA Bob Vrbicek Newcomer of the Year in 1995. Bill has been active with the umpire committee, with the umpire clinic, as well as being selected to umpire in many of the associations all-star series.

2 year College Coach

Dan Fitzgerald - DMACC

Following up the most successful season in school history, the 2009 DMACC Bears came into the season ranked #1 in the NJCAA Pre-Season Baseball Poll. Returning a veteran pitching staff and seven starters from the 2008 World Series Team, the Bears were picked unanimously as the early favorite. The Bears certainly lived up to the billing going 55-11 and making a second straight trip to the JUCO World Series.

The Bears featured a starting rotation of four NJCAA Division 1 players. Current LSU Tiger, Mitch Mormann anchored the staff going 10-3 with a 3.40 ERA. Mormann was also taken by the San Francisco Giants in the 20 round of the MLB First year Player Draft. Bradley University standout, Patrick Cooper picked up 1st Team All-American honors after going 8-1 with a school record 106 strikeouts in just 72.1 innings pitched. Cooper was selected in the 34th round by the Arizona Diamondbacks. Also at Bradley University, Eric Holmes became the DMACC all-time wins leader (18), after posting a 10-3 record. North Dakota State pitcher Mark Schroeder dominated in his starts going 8-0 with a 2.92 ERA. The Bears bullpen was equally as tough. Current Auburn Tiger, Cole Nelson solidified the relief pitching with 28 appearances and 8 saves. Nelson was selected by the Tampa Bay Rays in the 45th round of the MLB Draft. Freshman George Jensen was equally as tough in his 25 appearances, striking out 35 hitters in just 33 innings pitched.

The Bears offense was led by two-time 1st Team All-American, 2009 ICCAC Player of the Year, and 2009 NJCAA Player of the Year, Jake Astor. Astor, who signed with Southern Arkansas, hit .444 with 84 hits, 14 HRs, 51 BBs, and an astounding .574 on-base percentage. 2008 1st Team All-American and current Dallas Baptist Patriot Tyler Robbins had another big year for the Bears, hitting .379 with 25 2Bs and a .500 on-base percentage. Indiana Purdue-Fort Wayne standout Matt Keys became the DMACC homerun record holder (32) with his 13 HRs and also picked up 1st Team All-Region honors for the second time. Freshman Joel Hutter started all 66 games for the Bears and also received 1st Team All-Region honors after hitting .385 with a team high 89 hits. North Dakota State catcher Tanner Adam also had a big year for the Bears hitting .328 while handling a tough pitching staff.

Defensively the Bears also excelled with a .958 fielding percentage. Robbins was honored with the Rawlings Gold Glove Award as one of the nation's top fielders after committing just 5 errors in 60 games. Freshman Brashad Johnson started 64 games at SS while racking up a team high 142 attempts.

The Bears rolled to their second straight ICCAC Regular Season Championship with a 20-4 conference record. They also won their second straight Region 11 Championship defeating Ellsworth, Iowa Central, and Kirkwood twice in four straight wins at the regional

Four coaches, one player, one umpire, and one contributor have been selected for induction into the 2010 IHSBCA Hall of Fame.

The seven inductees are: Harley Schieffer (Coach), Clarinda/West Lyon; Joe McFarland (Coach), Norwalk; John Lewis (Coach), Kirkwood CC; John Waddle (Coach), Coon-Rapids; Bill Burbach (Player), Dubuque Wahlert; Milo Hamilton (Contributor), Fairfield; and Bill Boyd (Umpire), New Hampton.

The Hall of Fame class of 2010 will be inducted during the IHSBCA Awards Banquet on Saturday, January 30, 2010, in Cedar Rapids. They will join 226 other Hall of Fame members.

Harley Schieffer (Coach):

Harley is currently the athletic director for the Clarinda Community School system. Harley has spent the past 18 years in his current position in Clarinda. He was voted the Southwest Iowa "Athletic Director of the Year" in 2005. In his spare time, Harley has also spent the past 20 years umpiring high school and college baseball. He has accumulated numerous honors as an umpire. Harley was named the Southwest Iowa "Umpire of the Year" in 2004, selected to umpire in the 2005 All-Star Series, has served many years on the umpire committee, and has umpired in the state tournament for 7 years. And, if that isn't enough, Harley has a coaching resume that many would be thrilled to have. Harley coached varsity baseball for 23 years at West Lyon, (1971-1994). Harley's over-all coaching record is 396-129. His teams earned 9 conference titles, 7 district titles, and four state tournament appearances. Harley coached in the 1987 All-Star Series. He was named the Northwest Iowa "Coach of the Year" in 1987 and 1993. Harley has many fond coaching memories. As one reads his bio, a memory that stands out was his first year as head baseball coach at West Lyon. He not only coached the 9th grade team, the JV team, and the varsity baseball team, he did all of the field maintenance work before and after the game and drove the school bus to all the away games.

John Lewis (Coach):

John is currently the head baseball coach at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids. He will enter his 31st year of coaching baseball this spring as the 2010 baseball season begins. John has guided the Eagles to four Junior College World Series appearances over the last ten seasons. Kirkwood finished 8th in 1993, 2nd in 1995, 3rd in 1998 and 5th in 1999. Kirkwood is 374-193 over the past eight seasons and looks to continue on their success in 2010. His overall coaching record is 1042-522.

John began his reign in 1978 as an assistant coach at Kirkwood and took over the head coaching duties the following year. John serves as a professor at Kirkwood in the CAD/Mechanical Engineering Technology program, where he has put in 30+ years of teaching. John has been married to his wife, Sandy, for 40 years and has two sons, Jeremy and Darren. John has definitely influenced his family with the baseball tradition. Both of his sons played four years of college baseball. Jeremy, who played at the University of Iowa, went on to play three years of professional baseball in the Cubs organization. Darren, who played on Kirkwood's 1995 2nd place team and St. Ambrose's 1996 2nd place team, also served as an assistant on the 1998 team that finished 3rd nationally. John has received several awards during his "dynasty". He has been named the Iowa Junior College Coach of the Year six times (85-87-93-95-98-99) and the District B Coach of the Year four times (93-95-98-99).

Bill Burbach (Player):

Bill played his high school baseball at Dubuque Wahlert High School from 1963 — 1965. He was a right-handed pitcher for Wahlert High School where his career pitching record was 21-2 in his three years of varsity action. Bill threw his fastball in the low 90's. Bill threw two no-hitters his junior year. His senior year, while averaging 14 strikeouts per game, Bill pitched Wahlert to the state tournament and a 2nd place finish. During the 1965 major league draft, Bill was selected in the first round, 19th overall, by the New York Yankees. He signed for a \$35,000 bonus, which was a big bonus back in 1965. Bill pitched five years in the minor leagues before getting his opportunity with the Yankees during the 1969 season. In the popular baseball book by Jim Bouton, "Ball Four", Bill is mentioned as being the hardest thrower in the majors at that time. He became the No. 4 starter behind Mel Stottlemyer, Fritz Peterson, and Stan Bahnsen. Bill threw a shutout in his first major league start. He pitched against the Detroit Tigers and Denny McLain. He finished that year with a 6-8 record, and a 3.64 ERA. Bill became ill his next season with mononucleosis and finished the season in Triple "A" Syracuse. He was traded in 1971 to Baltimore, where he pitched for their Triple "A" team in Rochester, and finished with a 7-0 record. During the 1972 and 1973 seasons, Bill spent time with Detroit, Minnesota, and St. Louis in their minor league organizations, but never made it back to the majors. Following the 1973 season, Bill decided to retire after 9 seasons in professional baseball.

Joe McFarland (Coach):

Joe began his coaching career in 1958 at Callaway High School in Callaway, Nebraska. He not only coached baseball at Callaway High School, but also was the head football and head track coach. After leaving Callaway High School in 1960, Joe had coaching stops in North Platte, Neb. (1960-1963); Cozad, Neb. (1963-1968); Ida Grove, Iowa (1968-1969); and Clarke of Osceola, Iowa (1969-1974), before arriving at Norwalk High School in 1974. Joe coached baseball in Norwalk for 20 years before he retired in 1998. After retiring from Norwalk, Joe spent one more season coaching in the high school ranks at Diagonal High School as the head basketball and baseball coach. From Diagonal High School, Joe moved into college coaching at Grand View College for seven more years in both the men's and women's basketball programs. His 21 year high school baseball coaching record is 313-196. His teams won 11 conference championships, 2 sectional championships, 4 district championships, and one state championship in 1982. His 1982 Norwalk state championship team finished the season with a 23-3 record. Joe spent 40 years in education, 10 in Nebraska and 30 in Iowa. Joe retired in 1998 from Norwalk High School.

John Waddle (Coach):

John is a 1979 graduate from Urbana High School where he played 5 years of varsity baseball as a catcher and second baseman. John attended Luther College in 1979 where he played varsity baseball for 3 years as Luther's catcher. At Luther, John was a three letterman, team captain his senior year, and was selected to the 1st team all-conference as a catcher in 1983. John has been the head baseball coach in Coon-Rapids for the past 26 years where he has accumulated a career record of 479-245. John's teams have won 11 conference titles, 8 district titles, and have made 3 trips to the state tournament. John has been very active in the association serving on the Membership, Hall of Fame, and All-District committees. He served for many years as the All-District Chairman, where he was very instrumental in reorganizing the all-district format which we still follow today. John has also served for many years on the Board of Directors, and is currently an officer in the president elect chair. John has coached in four all-star series, twice as the head coach. John has also been very active as a host for the all-star series. In Carroll this past summer. John has been honored by his conference peers four times by being named "conference coach of the year". In addition, John has been named "District Coach of the Year" four times.

Roger Barr has been the Director of Officials for the Iowa High School Athletic Association for the past four years. Roger has officiated football, basketball, and baseball for over 30 years before accepting this position with the IHSAA. His responsibilities revolve around observing, evaluating, recruiting, training, and assigning officials for IHSAA tournament contests. Roger has been a rules interpreter in all three sports for the IHSAA for more than 20 years. Roger is also responsible for meeting with the Baseball Advisory committee each fall and reporting back to the Board of Control with baseball recommendations.

Mike Anderson — University of Nebraska

Mike is entering his 8th year as the head coach for the Cornhuskers. During that 8 year span, he has a record of 255-116-1, two Big 12 titles (2003 and 2005) and the school's third trip to the College World Series this decade. The Huskers have reached NCAA Regional play in five of the past seven years, including three regional title games (2003, 2005, 2007) and have won 40-or-more games four times in that stretch, including a school record 57 games in 2005. Since joining the Nebraska staff, Anderson has coached a total of 25 first-team all-conference honorees, while 47 of his players have signed pro contracts. Anderson has seen 10 of his players reach the Major Leagues, including Alex Gordon (Kansas City Royals) and Joba Chamberlain (New York Yankees) in 2007. Anderson's most famous pupil is Houston Astros outfielder Darin Erstad, who earned first-team All-American honors in 1995, when he was the first overall selection in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Erstad, a three time Gold Glove winner, also appeared in the 2000 and 2002 All-Star Games. Anderson also helped Ken Harvey develop into the nation's best hitter in 1999. Harvey led Division I with a .478 average, while belting 23 homers en route to first-team All-American honors. Harvey represented the Kansas City Royals in the 2004 All-Star Game. Before Mike was named the head coach following the 2002 season, he enjoyed a successful tenure as the Husker's hitting coach, as NU led the Big 12 in hitting in each of his final four seasons.

Marti Wolever — Philadelphia Phillies

Marti has been the Scouting Director of the Philadelphia Phillies since 2002. He has been instrumental in developing and drafting current Phillies players who have played in the past two World Series, winning the Series in 2008. Marti was inducted this past August into the Scouts Hall of Fame. Marti was drafted in 1975 by the Cincinnati Reds in the 22nd round. Marti is from Council Bluffs where he played his high school baseball at St. Albert High School.

Kimera Bartee — Pittsburgh Pirates

Kimera played for the 1991 Creighton University College World Series team under Jim Hendry. He was drafted by the Baltimore Orioles in the 14th round of the 1993 MLB amateur draft. He made his Major League Baseball debut with the Detroit Tigers on April 3, 1996. He has spent time with the Minnesota Twins, Cincinnati Reds, Anaheim Angels, and Colorado Rockies. He spent the 2002 season with the Triple A Iowa Cubs. Before retiring in 2004, Kimera played two seasons with the independent team, the Long Island Ducks. Since retiring, he became a field coach for the Delmarva Shorebirds and is currently a roving instructor for the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Joel Holst — Wartburg College

Joel has been the head coach at Wartburg College for the past 14 years, with a career record of 435-192-2. The Knights have won a remarkable 12 straight Iowa Conference championships under his leadership. His Knights' teams have qualified for the NCAA Division III national tournament nine times in the past 13 years. Holst's 2000 baseball team won the school's first regional championship and went on to compete in the NCAA Division III College World Series to

finish the season ranked 6th in the nation. The 2005 team also won a regional championship and finished 4th in the College World Series with a final ranking nationally of fifth. Joel has also been named the Iowa Conference Coach of the Year eight of the last 13 seasons, and was named the Four-year College Coach of the Year in Iowa for the 1998, 1999, and 2000 seasons, and was runner-up in 1997, 2001, and 2002. He was named Central Region Collegiate Coach of the Year in 2000 and 2005.

Ryan Brownlee - University of Iowa

Over the past nine seasons, Brownlee has had 19 players he coached or recruited drafted; three more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Steve Turnbull, Mike Schurz, and Kyle Heim were drafted by major league teams, while infielder Justin Toole signed a free agent contract. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Luke Scott of the Astros. During the 2008 season, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The 2008 Iowa team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles that year for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Jack Dahm - University of Iowa

In six years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the Iowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence. Since taking over the Iowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years. In Dahm's 16 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, seven freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his six years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 25 All-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City. Coach Dahm's 2008 recruiting class was ranked that 49th-best class according to Perfect Game Cross Checker. Iowa's ranking 49 is the highest of any Big Ten team. His 2009 recruiting class has brought in some of the top pitchers and a catcher in the country. Pitcher Matt Dermody was drafted in the 26th round by the Pittsburgh Pirates and catcher Dan Sheppard was drafted in the 30th round by the Chicago Cubs.

Dan Fitzgerald — DMACC

Dan has taken the DMACC baseball program to new heights during his tenure. The 2009 DMACC Bears came into the season ranked #1 in the NJCAA Pre-Season Baseball Poll. Returning a veteran pitching staff and seven starters from the 2008 World Series Team, the Bears were picked unanimously as the early favorite. The Bears certainly lived up to the billing going 55-11 and making a second straight trip to the JUCO World Series. The Bears rolled to their second straight ICCAC Regular Season Championship with a 20-4 conference record. They also won their second straight Region 11 Championship defeating Ellsworth, Iowa Central, and Kirkwood twice in four straight wins at the regional in Carroll, Iowa. The Bears then went on to the North Plains District tournament where they defeated Miles Community College and Madison Area Technical College in three straight wins to advance to the 2009 NJCAA World Series in Enid, Oklahoma. The Bears finished the season with the nation's best record at 55-11, and Fitzgerald was honored for their success being named the 2009 Region 11 Coach of the Year, the 2009 North Plains District Coach of the Year, and the 2009 Diamond Dreams National Junior College Coach of the Year.
