Scott now is living in North Carolina where he is a pharmaceutical sales representative. He also helps coach with USA Baseball in Durham, and

Bill played his high school baseball at Decorah High School, where he graduated in 1970. He played shortstop, outfield and pitched for Decorah. Pitching was his strength. He finished his high school career with 1,042 strike outs (2nd all-time state best), 32 shut outs (1st all-time state best), 0.63 career ERA (3rd alltime state best), and his senior year he struck out 377 batters, which is a state single season record. He pitched 5 no-hitters during his high school career, 72 career wins, and only walked 212 batters in four years. Bill was a first team allconference and first team all-state selection in 1969 and 1970. He was also a 3rd team all-state football player and finished second at the state wrestling tournament his senior year. Bill attended lowa State University. He was one of the best left-handed pitchers in Iowa State history. He was a regular in the ISU

rotation all four years. He ended with 26 starts, 7 complete games, an ERA of 3.83, and ended his career with a 16-14 record. He was cocaptain in 1973 and 1974. His senior season in 1974, Bill was one of the most dominate pitchers on the mound. He broke single season marks in innings pitched (74), wins (9), and strike outs (74). As a freshman in 1971, Bill helped the Cyclones win the Big Eight Conference Title. Bill is now retired, living in Wazeta, Minnesota.

Milo Hamilton (Contributor)

graduated from Fairfield in 1945. He

Milo is from Fairfield, Iowa. He

made his first radio broadcast on the Armed Forces Radio while serving in the Navy at the age of 18 during WWII. He graduated from the University of Iowa in 1949. He called football and basketball games for the Hawkeyes, as well as minor league baseball games in the Quad Cities region and the Tri-City Blackhawks of the NBA (now the Atlanta Hawks). He received his first MLB announcing job in 1953 with the St. Louis Browns of the American League. When the Browns moved to Baltimore as the Orioles, Hamilton didn't go. Instead, he moved to the St. Louis Cardinals where he worked alongside Harry Caray and Jack Buck during the 1954 season. Milo was fired only after one year to make room in the booth for Joe Garagiola. Milo moved to Chicago with the Cubs and worked alongside Jack Brickhouse and Vince Lloyd. Again, Milo was pushed out after three years to make room for Lou Boudreau. After taking three years off, Milo joined the White Sox. He worked with long time announcer Bob Elson. Hamilton left Chicago for Atlanta in 1966. While in Atlanta, Milo called Hank Aaron's recordbreaking 715th career home run in

1974 home opener. Milo joined the Pittsburgh Pirates in 1976 after friction in Atlanta the season before. Unhappy in Pittsburgh, he returned to the Cubs in 1980. He had a great working relationship with Jack Brickhouse, Vince Lloyd, and Lou Boudreau. Harry Caray came on board in 1982 after his problems with the White Sox. Milo and Harry never got along. This friction with Caray caused the firing of Hamilton in 1984. Milo made his last broadcasting stop in Houston with the Astros. He became the one announcer for the Astros in 1986 until his retirement. Milo has been honored with many awards and recognition. In 1992, he was the recipient of the Baseball Hall of Fame's Ford C. Frick Award. He was inducted into the National Radio Hall of Fame and into the Texas Radio Hall of Fame. Hamilton has called 11 no-hitters, and he was at the microphone for Roger Maris' 61st homer in 1961. During the Astros 2009 opening series against the Cubs, Houston Mayor Bill White renamed Hamilton Street near Minute Maid Park to Milo Hamilton Way.

Paul Keitel (Umpire)

Paul has been an umpire for the past 33 years. Paul averages 50-60 baseball games every summer. For the past 20 years, Paul has been assigned by the state to umpire districts games through state tournament games. He has umpired in 16 All-Star Series. Paul also umpires at the college level, having had the opportunity to umpire NAIA Regional's, D-III Regional's, and D-III College World Series. Paul has been a member of the association for 28 years. He has been named District Umpire 6 times, State Umpire 4 times, and is a member of the IHSAA Hall of Fame.

Steve Eddie – Buena Vista University

Coach Eddie is entering his 10th season as Head Coach at Buena Vista. In 2002 he was named Iowa Conference Coach of the Year after he guided his team to a 2nd place finish in the conference. In 2009 his team tied the school record for wins in a season with 27. That same year, 2009, he reached his milestone 150th coaching victory after previously claiming his 100th victory in 2007. Coach Eddie came to Buena Vista after a playing career at the University of Iowa and with the Cincinnati Reds and Chicago White Sox. He played seven seasons of professional baseball and reached AAA in 1999. After his playing career, he was hired as the Head Coach in 2000. His overall record at Buena Vista is 163-169-2. Coach Eddie resides in Storm Lake with his wife Stacey, and his sons Mark and Jake.

Jack Dahm - University of Iowa

Coach Dahm is entering his 8th season as Head Coach of the University of Iowa. He has guided the Black and Gold to 30 or more wins two of the last four seasons. In Dahm's 17 years as a head coach he has produced 24 first team All-Conference performers, eight freshman All-Americans, and two All-Americans. This past season, the Hawkeyes ended the season strong winning 11 of its final 14 games to earn a berth in the Big Ten Tournament where they finished runner-up. Ten Hawkeyes have been drafted the last two seasons under Coach Dahm, and another signed a free agent contract. In his coaching career, 37 of his players have been selected in the MLB Draft and four of them have gone on to play in the Major Leagues. His most recent recruiting class has been rated 1st in the Big Ten by Perfect Game USA, 4th in the Midwest, and 48th best nationally. Prior to coming to lowa, Coach Dahm spent 18 years with Creighton University as both a player and a coach. He left Creighton as the all time winningest coach in school history with 283 victories. In 1991, as an assistant coach, Coach Dahm helped the Bluejays reach the College World Series. Coach Dahm resides in Coralville with his wife Lynn, daughter Lyndsey, and sons Casey and Tyler.

The Hall of Fame Class of 2011 will be inducted during the IHSBCA Awards Banquet on Saturday, January 29th, 2011 in Cedar Rapids. They will join 232 previous Hall of Fame members.

Steve Hanson (Coach)

Steve enters his 18th season as head coach at Marshalltown High School. Steve has over 30 years coaching experience under his belt. He began his coaching career in 1980 as an assistant coach at his old high school, Cedar Rapids LaSalle. The next year he moved on and spent one year as an assistant coach in Vinton before becoming the head coach in 1982. Steve spent 4 years in Vinton as their head coach before moving on to Marshalltown, where he spent 8 years as an assistant coach under Hall of Fame coach Brad Clement. In 1994, Steve took over the Marshalltown Bobcat baseball program. Steve played his college baseball at Buena Vista as a pitcher. He lettered all four years at Buena Vista. Steve has won numerous state and national awards. Steve was named the IHSBCA District Coach of the Year and State Coach of the Year in 2002. He also was named the BCA District 5 Coach of the Year in 2002, while being named the ABCA Regional Coach of the Year in 2003. Steve's

2002 team won the Class 4A State Championship. Steve has 3 runner-up state tournament finishes. Steve has been a member of the IHSBCA for 30 years, serving on many committees, board positions, and as an All-Star Series coach.

Steve Sanders (Coach)

Steve enters his 36th year as the

head varsity baseball coach at Oelwein High School. Steve graduated from Janesville High School in 1965, playing baseball all four years in high school. He played his college baseball at UNI in Cedar Falls. He played 2nd base for the Panthers. Upon graduation from UNI, Steve took over the Oelwein baseball program. In his 36 years of baseball coaching, Steve has accumulated over 735 wins, has won 10 conference championships, 9 district titles, and made 5 trips to the state tournament. Steve has also spent time coaching the Oelwein Legion program during his tenure, along with many years of conducting clinics and camps for the youth in the area towards the betterment of baseball. Steve has been a member of the association for over 30 years. He has served on the All-State Selection and State Ratings committees. He has been an all-star coach 5 times. He has been named District Coach of the Year twice and named State Coach of the Year once in 2001. Bill played his high school baseball at Silver Lake Consolidated High School in Ayrshire, Iowa. Bill has said that he dedicated his first state title to God the Father, his second state title to God the Son, and he hopes to win a third state title and dedicate it to God the Holy Spirit.

At 10:00am, the meeting was called to order by President John Waddle. Dave Middleton gave the Membership Committee Report. In class 4-A, 100% of the schools were members. In 3-A, a 92% membership rating (59/64 schools). In 2-A, a 79% membership rating and in 1-A a 60% membership rating. Total Membership was at 79% (285/361 schools). Dave gave the board a hand out listing every school that was not a member. Charlie Stumpff commented how amazing this was that 80% of the schools were members. Mike Pauley motioned to accept this report and Gary Paulson seconded, motion was accepted.

Steve Hanson gave the Clinic Survey/ Mini Clinic Report. Steve brought up that the mini clinics were a little rushed for time last year and that they would be slightly longer this year. There was a short discussion on the clinic evaluation forms and how to tweak these forms. One idea was to have the person who introduces the speaker(s), remind the session to fill out the evaluation forms. Steve mentioned that one of this year's mini clinics would be focused on how to properly score a game. The intent of this session would be to improve the quick stats data in a way that would make it more "Accurate". Roger Barr has agreed to moderate this session. Paul Keitel motioned to accept this report, seconded by Roger Hoel, motion approved.

Steve Hanson gave the IHSAA Advisory Committee Report. Steve indicated that there was a healthy discussion regarding changing classifications. The discussion centered on the state not being comfortable with 2A being larger than 1A. Three options were on the table for examination:

- 1. Leave it alone. 128-2A teams with the rest to follow. (Doesn't appear this will fly)
- 2. 96 rest scenario. Cut 2A to 96 teams and leave the rest at 1A.
- 3. 50/50 split.

Steve mentioned that those in attendance seem to have a healthy and open discussion on this and felt that the Advisory Committees suggestions were at least being listened to. Steve then gave the ejection report. There were 96 ejections during the 2009-2010 season, up 23 from the previous season. Ejected coaches must now get on-line and pay \$25.00 to take a sportsmanship video from the National Federation which will then produce a certificate that must be faxed or sent to the IHSAA before that coach can be on the field again. Steve also informed the group of the new bat regulations. No composite bat are legal for play in the 2011 season except those that are listed on the IHSAA web site, (All of those bats are Demarini). In 2012, all bats must meet BBCOR ratings and have an appropriate sticker. 4-A seeding was briefly discussed with Steve mentioning that only 3-A and 4-A games will be counted. Games against 1A and 2A opponents will not factor into sub state seeding and will not be counted among the first 30 games. Steve's committee recommended that experiment seeding should take place in 3A this summer, much like the 4A process a few years ago, then 3A seeding would begin for real in 2012. It was brought up that 11 Class 4A schools had to be contacted by the state for seeding information. Roughly a ¼ of the 4A schools either don't want seeding or don't care about it, which is too bad embarrassing. This 4A apathy might impact the opportunity for 2A and 1A schools to be seeded. If the 3A coaches are as negligent, the IHSAA will have all the ammo it needs to restrict future seeding. Mike Pauley motioned to accept report, Chris Oberbroeckling seconded, motion approved.







Hamilton was born in Fairfield, Iowa. He served in the United States Navy during World War II. During his time in the Navy, he broadcast on Armed Forces Radio. He graduated from the University of Iowa in 1949. After beginning his sports casting career by calling college football and basketball for the Iowa Hawkeyes, as well as minor league baseball in the Quad Cities region and the Tri-Cities Blackhawks of the NBA, (now theAtlanta Hawks), he got his first MLB announcing job in 1953, with the St. Louis Browns of the American League. When the Browns moved to Baltimore as the Orioles, Hamilton didn't go along. Instead, he moved to the St. Louis Cardinals, where he worked alongside Harry Caray and Jack Buck during the 1954 season. However, he was fired after only one year when the Cardinals wanted a spot in the booth for Joe Garagiola. He then moved to the Chicago Cubs, working alongside Jack Brickhouse and Vince Lloyd. After three years, he was fired when Cubs owner P.K. Wrigley wanted to make room for Lou Boudreau. Milo continued his broadcasting career with four other teams: Atlanta Braves (1966-75), Pittsburg Pirates (1976-79), Chicago Cubs (1980-84), and the Houston Astros (1985-2009). CONSTITUTION OF THE IOWA HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION (REV. 10/2010)

Article I - Name

The name of this organization shall be the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association, organized as a non profit voluntary organization.

Article II - Purpose

Section 1 - To promote cooperation and understanding between the administration, teachers, coaches, and the community concerning the place of baseball in the total education program.

Section 2 – To promote pure, wholesome amateur inter-scholastic baseball.

Section 3 – To help instruct and maintain the highest possible standards in inter-scholastic baseball and the baseball coaching profession.

Section 4 – To secure a better understanding of inter-scholastic baseball by exchanging and discussing methods and ideas.

Section 5 – To promote cooperation and understanding between coaches and umpires designed to form a productive working relationship that ensures a positive, inter-scholastic baseball experience.

Section 6 – To have a representative group of coaches and umpires interested in fostering a close working relationship with the Iowa High School Athletic Association, schools, colleges, and professional organizations.

Section 7 – To develop and promote greater unity, uniformity, and fellowship among all members and players.

Article III - Membership

Section 1 - There shall be three classes of membership within this organization; active, associate, and honorary.

Section 2 – Active membership shall include all actively engaged dues paying baseball coaches of secondary schools, and they shall be the voting body.

Section 3 – Associate membership shall include all interested dues paying supporters of secondary school baseball programs, including college coaches.

Section 4 – Honorary membership shall be elected to the membership at the pleasure of the Executive Committee upon two-thirds vote.

Section 5 – Membership shall extend from September 1 to August 31 of the following year.

Article IV - Dues

Section 1 – The annual active individual membership shall be no less than \$30.00

Section 2 – The annual associate membership may be less than \$30.00, when an entire coaching staff from the same school pays as a group (at the same time) for that calendar year. In this situation, the head $coach/1^{st}$ assistant coach membership is \$30.00 each, the second assistant coach is \$20.00, and each assistant coach thereafter is \$15.00 each.

Section 3 – There will be no fee for honorary membership.

Article V - Officers, Board of Directors, and Steering Committee

Section 1 – The officers shall be comprised of a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, and Third Vice President, and Executive Director. Only active members of the association shall hold office.

Section 2 – The Board of Directors shall consist of twenty members comprised as follows, (1) two year representative, (1) one year representative, as well as an alternate for coaches, and (1) two year representative and (1) one year representative for umpires in each of the five districts. Each officer has voting privileges during board meetings with the exception of the alternate coach, who can vote only in the absence of a coaching representative from within his district.

Section 3 – The Steering Committee shall be comprised of all dues paying past presidents, as well as any honorary members.

Article VI - Elections and Terms of Office

Section 1 (A) – Candidates for each of the four offices shall be nominated by a nomination committee of the Board of Directors at the late winter annual clinic meeting. In the normal course of events the First Vice President shall succeed the retiring President, with the Second and Third Vice Presidents proceeding through the chairs, with a new Third Vice President to be elected by the current members present at the General Meeting held during the clinic.

(B) – Elected officers shall take office upon duly being elected. Terms of office shall be one year. Officers shall be eligible for re-election.

Section 2 (A) – The representatives to the Board of Directors shall be elected by the members within their district. Each representative board member will be elected for a period of two years, with one-half of the representative board members being elected each year. In each election, the person receiving the second highest vote total will become the alternate. By October 15 of each year, the association members will receive an official blank nomination ballot. Upon voting, the nomination ballot to be returned (within ten days from mailing) to the executive director. In the presence of two other association members, there shall be a canvass of the ballots. The 3 receiving the highest number of votes shall be considered the nominees. In case of a tie of more than 3, all those in the ties shall be considered nominees. In case the number of nomination ballots for any one of the nominees is a majority of the number of members in the respective district, he shall be declared elected. The executive director shall prepare and mail official election ballots to the members of the district. Upon voting, the election ballot is to be returned (within ten days from mailing) to the executive director. The procedure in canvassing shall be the same as in canvassing nomination ballots and the person receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected. In case of a tie, the election shall be decided by lot by the candidates in the presence of the canvassing committee.

2011 Clinic Speakers

Roger Barr - IHSAA

Roger Barr has been the Director of Officials for the Iowa High School Athletic Association for the past five years. Roger has officiated football, basketball, and baseball for over 30 years before accepting this position with the IHSAA. His job duties revolve around observing, evaluating, recruiting, training, and assigning officials for IHSAA tournament contests. Roger has been a rules interpreter in all three sports for the IHSAA for more than 20 years. Roger is also responsible for meeting with the Baseball Advisory committee each fall. He reports back to the Board of Control with baseball recommendations.

Marc Rardin — Iowa Western Community College

Coach Rardin will begin his ninth season at lowa Western this coming spring. He enters the season coming off a historic year, winning the 2010 NJCAA National Championship. Marc has guided his Reiver squads to 351 wins and only 117 losses. Over that same time period, he has accumulated a 172-27 record in regular season conference and conference tournament play. His teams have averaged over 43 wins per season at lowa Western. Six players off last year's team signed with D-1 college programs. Has appeared in the 5 NJCAA College World Series Tournaments during the past 6 years. Marc was named the 2010 NJCAA National "Coach of the Year", Louisville Slugger "Coach of the Year", and Diamond Sports "Coach of the Year". Over-all, he has had the following team/player achievements:

- 3 Rawlings "Big Stick" Award winners
- 2 NJCAA Rawlings Gold Glove "Defensive Players of the Year"
- 5 NJCAA All-Star National Team Members

Lou Yacinich - Grand View University

Coach Yacinich will begin his 36th year as the Viking head coach this spring. Coach Yacinich has compiled a record of 929-627 at Grand View. His career record is at an eye-opening 1077-819. His Viking team played in the 2010 NAIA Baseball Championships in Oklahoma City this past May. Lou is a member of the IHSBCA Hall of Fame, the NAIA Baseball Hall of Fame, and the Grand View Athletic Hall of Fame. The ABCA will induct Coach Yacinich into their Hall of Fame this coming January. He has served on various baseball boards and committees', none more enjoyable than helping select the 1996 USA Baseball Team at Homestead, Florida. While at Grand View, his teams have won 7 district titles, 5 Midwest Classic Conference Championships, 4 area Championships, 1 Region VII Championship, and 3 trips to the NAIA College World Series.

Doug West - University of Iowa

Doug is the Associate Director of Athletic Training at the University of Iowa. Doug has been at Iowa since 2004 and is responsible for the Recreation Building, Recreation Center Athletic Training rooms, Hawkeye Tennis. along with eight Iowa athletic teams. Doug has served as president of the Iowa Athletic Trainers' Society since 2002. He is also the chair of the District V Mid-American Athletic Trainers' Association Symposium. Doug received his B.A. in biology, physical education and secondary education from Coe College in 1992. He attended graduate school at Western Michigan and received his masters in physical education and athletic training in 1994. He also has a doctorate in athletic administration/athletic training from Iowa.

Ryan Brownlee - University of Iowa

Over the past 10 seasons, Coach Brownlee has had 22 players drafted, with three more players signing free agent contracts. This past season Kurtis Muller, Patrick Schatz, and Zach Robertson were drafted. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he coached 33 players that signed pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Luke Scott of the Astros. Coach Brownlee's expertise on base stealing and hitting are a big reason why the baseball team continues to break team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases in 2008, a single season record; which broke the previous record of 127 set back in 1981. That 2008 team was ranked third in the nation in stolen bases. Coach has also established team hitting records while at Iowa. His teams have set the single season singles record (436), and season hit-by-pitch record (86).

Jack Dahm — University of Iowa

In his 7 years as lowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the program to new heights and standards with his commitment to excellence. Since taking over the program in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence back into the lowa Hawkeye program. The 2010 squad finished the year strong, placing third in the conference during the regular season with a 30-28 record. They qualified for the Big Ten Tournament for only the 8th time in school history, the fourth trip under Coach Dahm. The Hawks finished the tournament in second place, losing in the Championship game to Minnesota. The second place finish tied a school record that dated back to 1983. This year's 2011 recruiting class is ranked the best in the Big Ten, 4th in the mid-west, and 48th nationally.

Steve Eddie - Buena Vista University

Coach Eddie will be entering his 10th season at Buena Vista University this season. In just his second year as a college coach, Steve earned the 2002 lowa Conference Coach of the Year Award after his team finished 24-14, 15-5 in the conference, which was good enough for a second place finish in the conference. His squad, which has appeared in the conference tournament five times under Steve, tied a school record for wins in a season in 2009 with 27. He's reached two milestones over the last three seasons, winning his 100th career game in 2007, then reaching his 150th career win in 2009. Coach Eddie played infield for the 1990 Big Ten Champion lowa Hawkeyes. He spent seven years in the minor leagues with Cincinnati Reds and the Chicago White Sox. Steve reached Triple A for part of a season with both Chicago and Cincinnati, before ending his career in AA with the Birmingham Barons.

The second highest vote getter shall be considered the alternate and in event of inability of elected Director to serve, alternate will be appointed to the Board of Directors.

- (B) Elected Board of Directors shall take office at the late winter annual clinic meeting.
- (C) The Board of Directors shall appoint an Executive Director. The Executive Director shall be paid a fee. Only active members of the Association shall be eligible to be appointed as Executive Director. He shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years, and be eligible for re-appointment by the Board of Directors. The Executive Committee will evaluate the Executive Director annually at the late winter meeting.

Article VII - Duties of the Officers

Section 1 – The President shall preside at all meetings of the Association and Executive Committee. He shall have the power to appoint all committees and officers not otherwise provided for in the Constitution. He shall keep on file and transmit to the next president his records, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees.

Section 2 – The First Vice President shall assume the duties of the President in his inability to act. He will also be Chairman of the Academic All State Committee and all of it's duties. The First Vice President appoints members to the standing committees and names the committee chairmen.

Section 3 – The Second Vice President shall assist in the operations of the Officers Committee as needed, including the assistance of the third Vice President during meetings. He shall conduct meetings in case of the absence of the President and First Vice President.

Section 4 – The Third Vice President shall assume the duties of noting meeting minutes and attendance. He shall conduct meetings in the absence of the President, First Vice President, and Second Vice President.

Section 5 – The Executive Director shall be responsible for the publication and distribution of nomination ballots and election ballots, the IHSBCA Website, the publication and distribution of the NEWSLETTER and other materials as authorized by the Executive Committee. He shall attend all Board and Executive Meetings and make reports to the same. He shall carry on the day to day operations of the Association. He has the right to award stipends (from his salary) to individuals that agree to perform various activities on behalf of the Association.

Article VIII – Executive Committee

Section 1 – Membership - The Executive Committee shall be comprised of all duly elected and appointed officers and board members as specified in Article VI, each having one vote on all legislative matters.

Section 2 – Legislative Action - The Executive Committee shall be responsible for proper management of affairs of the Association and shall act on all matters pertaining to membership and legislation in accordance with the constitution.

Section 3 – Quorum - A quorum shall consist of the active members present, due notice having been given of the meeting.

Article IX – Meetings

Section 1 - Regular - To be decided by the Executive Committee.

Section 2 – Quorum - A quorum shall consist of the active members present, due notice having been given of the meeting.

<u>Article X – Committees</u>

Section 1 – Standing Committees – The standing committees shall consist of Hall of Fame, All District, Awards, All Star, Umpires, Lanny Petersen, Ratings Poll, Membership, Clinic Evaluation, Junior Select Showcase, Audit/Constitution, Advisory, and Steering.

Section 2 – Each committee will research and study issues. Committee chairmen will present a summary of their research and make recommendations to the Board of Directors and general membership for action.

Section 3 – The First Vice President shall appoint a chairman for each of the standing committees, as well as assign membership to each committee.

Article XI – Publication and Promotion

Section 1 – The official publication shall be the lowa High School Baseball Coaches Association NEWSLETTER.

Section 2 – The official website of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association shall be www.iowahsbca.net

Section 3 – The distribution and publication of other materials may be authorized by the Executive Committee.

Article XII - Amendments

Section 1 – An amendment to this constitution may be proposed by the Executive Committee or by written petition of ten (10) active members of the Executive Committee.

Section 2 – Proposed amendments or changes must appear in the NEWSLETTER prior to the time of any regular meeting.

Section 3 – An Affirmative vote equivalent to two-thirds of the active membership attending the General Membership Meeting during the Winter Clinic and Convention shall be necessary for the adoption of the amendment.


