and all-state. He was named Iowa’s top high school baseball player and played in the all-star series that summer. Todd left Ankeny for the University of Nebraska, where he played 1st base his freshman to junior years. He was a member of the All-Big XII team in 1997, and was a 3rd round pick of the Colorado Rockies that same year. Todd spent time in the major leagues with the Minnesota Twins and San Diego Padres in 2002 and 2003. In his 11 seasons in professional baseball, Todd spent time with the Colorado Rockies, Minnesota Twins, San Diego Padres, Florida Marlins, and the Seattle Mariners. Todd has been complimented by many of his past college and professional coaches as a player who maintains a high level of excellence, a player who showed the commitment and drive to become a professional baseball player, and a player who showed the leadership skills that made him an all-around teammate and person. Former Nebraska head coach Mike Anderson had this to say about Todd, “.....his commitment to his baseball career is paralleled to his commitment to his education.” “After the completion of a baseball career, the majority of players bypass the completion of their degrees”. Todd did not. He completed a degree in Business Administration, driving from his home in Kansas City to Lincoln, Nebraska. Again, Todd displayed the values and aspirations which have made him

an outstanding, admired, and successful individual.

Chris Hatcher (Player) - Chris played his high school baseball at Thomas Jefferson High School in Council Bluffs. Chris played baseball for Hall of Fame head coach Lee Toole. Chris was a four sport athlete, playing football, basketball, track, and baseball. Chris was an all-state football player, discus champ in track, and all-state in baseball. He was not only named Iowa’s best high school baseball player his senior year, but he was named Iowa’s best athlete by the Des Moines Register and USA Today. Chris bypassed some college football opportunities to play baseball at the University of Iowa under head Coach Duane Banks. Chris flourished at Iowa, being selected 1st Team All-Big Ten his sophomore and junior years; including 3rd Team All-American honors his sophomore year. Chris led the Hawkeyes in hitting his sophomore year, hitting .405, and his junior year hitting .393. As you look through the Hawkeye baseball record book, you will find Chris’s name listed in many of the offensive categories. Chris was drafted by the Houston Astros in 1990. He was a member of many minor league organizations; (Astros, Royals, Rockies, Angels, and Cubs), compiling a .275 batting average in 953 games. During the 1988 season, Chris was in Triple A Omaha where he led the minor leagues in homeruns and RBI’s.

Chris was voted the Triple A Minor League Player of the Year. Chris was promoted to Kansas City where he played in 8 games for the Royals. Chris and wife, Lisa, live in Council Bluffs with their 3 children.

John Mills (Umpire) – John has spread his umpiring experiences to all levels of the profession. He has umpired baseball games in the Big 8, Big 10, Missouri Valley Conference, Mid-West League, junior college, semi-pro and in his spare time some high school games. John officiated in three state tournaments for the IHSAA, (67’, 68’, and 69’). John officiated for 24 years before he retired. John was a decorated athlete back at Redfield High School, where he graduated in 1945. He went on to play college baseball at Simpson where he was a three year letter winner before graduating in 1949. John also worked several of Satchel Paige’s barnstorming games as he traveled throughout the Midwest during the off-season. John also played a little semi-pro baseball with the Linden Merchants from 1947-1954. John caught the bug to officiate in 1961 while attending an umpire school in Florida. He started at the high school level, but soon moved up to the semi-pro leagues. And as John stated in his bio, “the rest is history.” John has officiated in every sport, at every level in high school, junior college, college, AAU, and semi-pro. John also is a member of the Iowa High School Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Coach Middleton led his team to a 25-10 season record, a district and sub-state championship, with a trip to the state tournament. They won the Heart of Iowa (Large) conference title. Dave is a member of the 400 win club, and a member of the 25 year longevity club. He is the chairman of the membership committee and has served on the board of directors. He has been named the district coach of the year 6 times. He is assisted by Wyatt Zoske and Chris Kollbaum.

Andy has coached in the all-star series and has been active working with association committees. He has been a member for the past 10 years. He is assisted by Uby Martinez.

Six are selected to enter the IHSBCA Hall of Fame

This year, the IHSBCA Hall of Fame Class of 2012 will induct three coaches, two players, and one umpire. These six inductees are: Joel Johnson (Coach), Knoxville; Charlie Stumpff (Coach), Iowa City West; Richard Admire (Coach), Sgt. Bluff-Luton; Todd Sears (Player), Ankeny; Chris Hatcher (Player), Council Bluffs; and John Mills (Umpire), Des Moines. The Hall of Fame Class of 2012 will be inducted during the IHSBCA Awards Banquet on Saturday, January 21, 2012, in Cedar Rapids. They will join 239 previous Hall of Fame members.

Joel Johnson (Coach) – Joel was the architect of the Knoxville baseball program; he built it from the ground up. He made many contributions to Knoxville High as well as the entire community of Knoxville. Knoxville baseball is the result of Coach Johnson's profound leadership, dedication, work ethic, and guidance. Joel graduated from UNI in Cedar Falls in December of 1975. He Was at Don Bosco for two years before moving to Knoxville, where he stayed for the next 25 years as their head baseball coach. Success didn't come easy for Joel in the early years, but, once he established what he wanted in the program, both on and off the field, the program took off. In his tenure as head baseball coach, Joel had 13 seasons of 20 plus wins, 19 winning seasons, 7 conference titles, 8 district titles, 6 sub-state titles, 6 state tournament

appearances, with one state championship in 2002. Joel is a member of the 500 win club, with an over-all record of 525-309. His players have flourished under Joel, with 48 players earning all-conference honors, 12 all-state players, and 5 players selected to play in the all-star series. Joel has been very active within the association, serving on many committees and coaching in 3 all-star series.

Charlie Stumpff (Coach) – Charlie began his baseball career in Norway, Iowa where he played all four years of varsity baseball as their catcher. He continued playing baseball after high school at Muscatine CC and then at Coe College. Charlie took his first coaching job at Northeast Hamilton where he was their head coach for 5 years before taking over the Iowa City West baseball program in 1993. Since that time, Charlie's teams have appeared in 5 state tournaments, finishing runner-up in 2009 and 2010. He has won 6 conference titles while at Iowa City West. Charlie is a member of the 500 win club with an over-all record of 524-335. Charlie is a past president of the association, serving on numerous committees and the Board of Directors. He has coached in four all-star series, while hosting the event five other times. Charlie works very closely with the USSSA youth baseball teams in his area and organizes weekly hitting for them at the West High hitting

facility. Charlie has been involved with high school baseball for the past 25 years.

Rick Admire (Coach) – Coach

Admire has left his mark in western Iowa, teaching and coaching all 32years at Sgt. Bluff-Luton. He has a career coaching record of 512-312. Rick played high school baseball at Primghar Community High School, where he played 3rd base. He attended Iowa Lakes Community College for two years, playing 2nd and 3rd base for the baseball team. He finished his college education at the University of Northern Iowa, but did not play baseball while attending UNI. Rick has taken his teams to 2 state tournaments, won 8 district and conference titles. He has been a member of the association for over 30 years, serving on various committees and is currently serving on the Board of Directors. He was an assistant coach in the 1990 all-star series. Rick is also very active with the youth baseball programs in his community.

Todd Sears (Player) – Todd had a very successful high school career at Ankeny High School. Todd played for Hall of Fame coach Mel Murken. He graduated from Ankeny High School in 1994, having played in three state tournaments while winning a state championship his sophomore season. His senior season, Todd had a .512 batting average, with a school record of 64 hits. He was 1st team all-conference, all-district,



College Coach of the Year Nominations

2 Year College Coach Nominations

Marc Rardin – Iowa Western Community College

Coach Rardin is entering his 10th season as head coach of the Reivers. In 9 years he has compiled a 394-137 record, with last years team going 43-20 and a trip back to World Series. In 2010, Rardin led his team to a 51-12 mark as they claimed the ***NJCAA National Championship***. He was named the 2010 Diamond Sports Coach of the Year, the 2010 Louisville Slugger Coach of the Year, the 2010 Northern District Coach of the year, and also the 2010 ***NJCAA National Coach of the Year***. During his time at IWCC, Coach Rardin has coached 7 All-Americans, 19 All-District 1st Team Performers, 41 All-Region 1st Team Performers, 9 Region Pitchers of the Year, 4 Region Defensive Players of the Year, and 5 Region Players of the Year. Off the field, he has had 12 Academic All-Americans, 10 Distinguished All-Americans, and 1 NJCAA Male Scholar Athlete of the Year. Coach Rardin has led his team to the NJCAA College World Series six of the past seven seasons and also has won five consecutive Northern District Championships.

Dan Fitzgerald - DMACC Community College

Dan has taken the DMACC baseball program to new heights during his tenure. This past season, his team once again qualified for the NJCAA Division II World Series. They finished with a 48-18 season record and their 4th consecutive conference Championship. In 2009 DMACC came into the season ranked #1 in the NJCAA pre-season baseball poll. After earning an automatic bid to the NCAA Regional Championships, they fell to eventual national champions Illinois Wesleyan. Steve came to BV after a playing career at the University of Iowa and with the Cincinnati Reds and Chicago White Sox. He played seven seasons of professional baseball and reached AAA in 1999. After his playing career, he was hired as the Head Coach in 2000. His overall record at Buena Vista is 209-200-2. Coach Eddie resides in Storm Lake with his wife Stacey, and his sons Mark and Jake.

Jim Scholten - Morningside College

Coach Scholten ended his long reign at Morningside College when he announced his retirement last May after 28 seasons. He ended his career with an over-all record of 627-612-4. In 2008, Scholten led the Mustangs to a 32-17 record and the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC), post-season tournament championship to qualify for the NAIA Region III Championships as the #1 seed. In 2000, Scholten was named the North Central Conference Coach of the Year after he guided the Mustangs to the championship game of the conference tournament. He guided the Mustangs to a 42-18-1 record during the 2005 campaign to set a school record for victories in a season. Coach Scholten was an assistant coach for the Sioux City Explorers of the Northern Independent League during the 2004 and 2005 summer seasons. Jim came to Morningside in 1984 after 6 years at Nevada High School in Nevada, Iowa. And 12 years earlier as a high school coach at Mason City Newman in Mason City, Iowa. Jim took Newman to the Class 1A high school state tournament in 1977. Jim was inducted into the IHSBCA Hall of Fame in 1992. He is a Larchwood, Iowa native. He graduated from Loras College in 1970. He also holds a masters degree in guidance and counseling from Iowa State University. Jim holds the South Dakota amateur baseball record for three pitching victories during a four-day state tournament. He accomplished this feat in 1970.

Brian is entering his 9th year at Virginia where he is a three time ACC Coach of the Year and the 2009 National College Coach of the Year recipient. Brian is in a very small elite group that can say they played in the CWS, then coached in the CWS as an assistant coach and then a head coach. On behalf of the IHSBCA, Congratulations to Brian O'Connor for being named our 2011 President's Award winner.

Harold “Pinky” Primrose Award to Gary Barta:

Gary Barta is entering his sixth year as the Director of Athletics at the University of Iowa, and 25 years in athletic administration. Roger Barr — IHSAA

Roger Barr has been the Director of Officials for the Iowa High School Athletic Association for the past six years. Roger has officiated football, basketball, and baseball for over 30 years before accepting this position with the IHSAA. His job duties revolve around observing, evaluating, recruiting, training, and assigning officials for IHSAA tournament contests. Roger has been a rules interpreter in all three sports for the IHSAA for more than 20 years. Roger is also responsible for meeting with the Baseball Advisory committee each fall. He reports back to the Board of Control with baseball recommendations.

Marc Rardin — Iowa Western Community College

Coach Rardin will begin his tenth season at Iowa Western this coming spring. He enters the season coming off another good year with a third place finish at the NJCAA World Series. Marc has guided his Reiver squads to 394 wins and only 137 losses. Over that same time period, he has accumulated a 190-29 record in regular season conference and conference tournament play. His teams have averaged over 43 wins per season at Iowa Western. His 2010 team won the NJCAA National Championship going 52-19. He has appeared in the 6 NJCAA College World Series Tournaments during the past 7 years. Marc was named the 2010 NJCAA National "Coach of the Year", Louisville Slugger "Coach of the Year", and Diamond Sports "Coach of the Year". Justin Toole - Cleveland Indians

Justin will return for his third full season to spring training battling for a spot on the "AA" Akron or "AAA" Columbus roster. Justin has become a true utility player for the Indians organization. Last season Justin played every infield and outfield position, and has even pitched an inning or two in a middle relief spot. Justin was named to the 2011 Carolina League All-Star Team, which played the California League All-Star Team in Modesto, California last summer. While at the University of Iowa, Justin was All-Big Ten for three seasons, All-Mideast Region for two seasons, and gained pre-season All-American honors his senior year. He also was selected as the Big Ten Player of the Week in March, his senior season. Justin holds the longest hitting streak in Iowa baseball history with 25 games, second on the list with 87 hits in a season, and top ten in batting average with a .395 average. Justin was voted team "MVP" his junior and senior seasons while at Iowa.

Doug West — University of Iowa

Doug is the Associate Director of Athletic Training at the University of Iowa. Doug has been at Iowa since 2004 and is responsible for the Recreation Building, Recreation Center Athletic Training rooms, Hawkeye Football, along with other Iowa athletic teams. Doug has served as president of the Iowa Athletic Trainers' Society since 2002. He is also the chair of the District V Mid-American Athletic Trainers' Association Symposium. Doug received his B.A. in biology, physical education and secondary education from Coe College in 1992. He attended graduate school at Western Michigan and received his masters in physical education and athletic training in 1994. He also has a doctorate in athletic administration/athletic training from Iowa.

Seth Wing - Cornell College

Seth is a native of Maquoketa and is excited to be back in eastern Iowa. Seth spent the past 8 years as an assistant coach at Winona State, the last three as associate head coach. Coach Wing helped lead the Warriors to their first regional championship and a berth in the Division II World Series for the first time. They lost the championship game to West Florida, finishing the year with a 42-18 record. At Maquoketa HS, Seth was all-state in baseball and played in the 1999 All-Star Series.

Dan Fitzgerald - DMACC

Dan is coming off another solid year at DMACC. The Bears qualified for another NJCAA Division II World Series in 2011. His team finished with a 48-18 record and their 4th consecutive conference championship. Dan also guided DMACC to the NJCAA D-II World Series in 2008 and 2009. His 2009 team finished the year 55-11.

Jack Dahm/Ryan Brownlee - University of Iowa

In his 8 years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the program to new heights and standards with his commitment to excellence. Since taking over the program in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence back into the Iowa Hawkeye program. The 2010 squad finished the year strong, placing third in the conference during the regular season with a 30-28 record. They qualified for the Big Ten Tournament for only the 8th time in school history, the fourth trip under Coach Dahm. The Hawks finished the tournament in second place, losing in the Championship game to Minnesota. The second place finish tied a school record that dated back to 1983. This year's 2011 recruiting class is ranked the best in the Big Ten and 48th nationally. The 2012 class is ranked 3rd in the Big Ten and 45th nationally.

Mike Mahoney - Sportsplex West/Former major league catcher

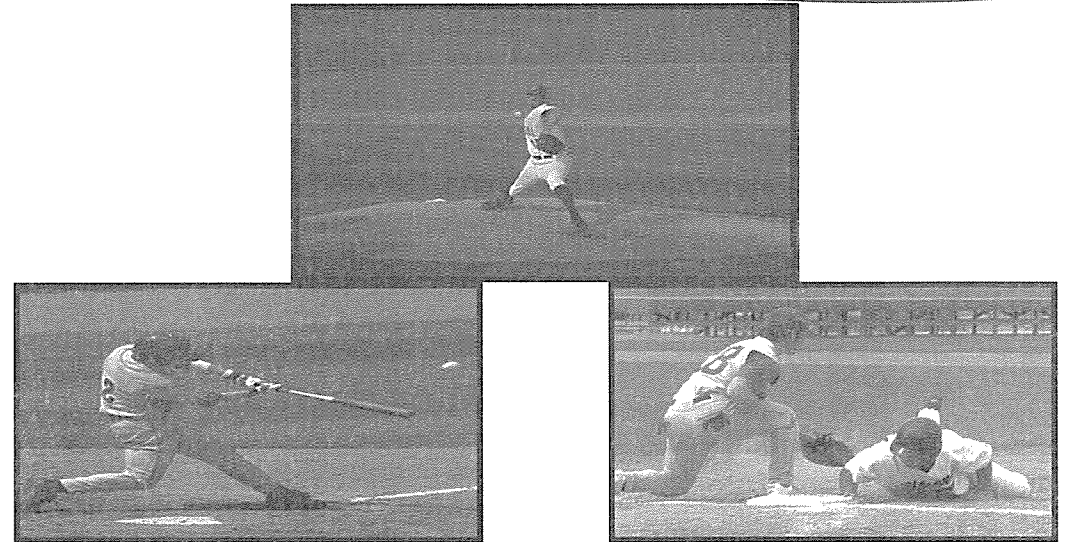
