Clinic back in Cedar Rapids: This years clinic will be held back in Cedar Rapids at the Marriott Hotel, 1200 Collins Road NE, on January 17-18, 2014. You can make reservations on-line by contacting the Marriott at <http://cwp.marriott.com/cidmc/iahsbca> or call the Marriott at 1-800-396-2153. We are waiting for final confirmation from a few of our clinic speakers for this year, but we are very excited with our list. On Friday afternoon, we will have University of Iowa head baseball Coach Rick Heller, Colorado Rockies Pitching Coach Rick Mathews, and Hall of Fame umpire Dan Pomeroy speaking. Our coaches mini-clinics will conclude Friday's sessions running from 4:30 to 6:30 pm. On Saturday, we will have our annual IHSAA rules meeting, along with Cedar Rapids Kernels Pitching Coach Gary Lucas, long time University of Minnesota assistant Coach Rob Fornasiere, Rick Mathews will return, and former minor leaguer and now the head baseball coach at CR Prairie, Matt Thede speaking. We will continue to host the annual McDonalds/FCA Breakfast on Saturday morning starting at 7:30 am. Mike Botts is heading-up the umpire side of the clinic. Our Umpire sessions will follow the same time frame on both Friday and Saturday. Hope to see everyone there.

Vendors will be allowed to start setting-up their displays on Friday morning beginning at 9:00 am. The clinic sessions will begin at 1:00 pm on Friday afternoon and continue through Saturday, concluding at 3:30 pm.

The Awards Banquet will be held at the Marriott Hotel on Saturday evening, beginning at 6:00 pm. We are again looking forward to another outstanding weekend of baseball. With the clinic fast approaching, please check to make sure your membership has been paid for the 2013-2014 season. The new membership calendar year started on September 1, 2013 and runs through August 31, 2014. If your mailing label does not say 2014 on it, your dues have not yet been paid for this year. If you have questions, please give Lee Toole a call. Schools are reminded to take advantage of the school membership group rates. A reminder of how the discount works: the head coach is \$30.00, the first assistant coach is \$30.00, the second assistant coach is \$20.00, and the third assistant coach and beyond are \$15.00 each. The only catch to qualify for this coaching staff group discount rate is that all coaches, from the same school, must send in their membership forms together at the same time.

The Steering Committee, Board of Directors and each individual committee will meet prior to the start of the clinic on Friday. The Board and Steering Committee will meet on Thursday night, January 16th at the Marriott Hotel. The Steering Committee meeting will begin at 6:30pm, with the Board of Directors meeting beginning at 8:30 pm. Committee and district meetings will take place on Friday morning. Please refer to the list found in this newsletter towards the times and locations of the other individual committee meetings. The general session meeting, which is open to all association members, will take place on Friday morning at 11:00 am.

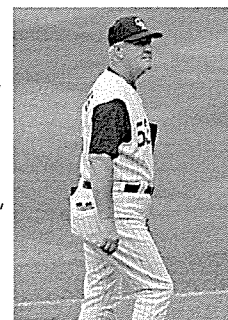
President's Award to John Reglein:

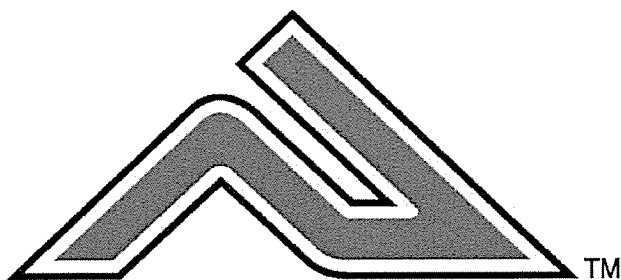

Harold "Pinky" Primrose Award to Rick Mathews:

Rick Mathews has been involved with baseball, in some way, for all his life. He has coached at the high school level, the junior college level, and in the minor and major leagues. In 1969, Rick graduated from Drake University, where he was a pitcher. He was a high school and junior college coach, as well as a part-time scout for the Kansas City Royals and the Philadelphia Phillies. Rick joined the Rockies organization in the summer of 1992 as the pitching coach at Mesa of the Arizona Rookie League. He became Colorado's bullpen coach for a large portion of the inaugural season in 1993 and again in 1995. He spent seven years as Colorado's roving minor league pitching coordinator before returning to the Rockies' Major league staff. In 2007, Rick was honored by the mayor of Centerville for his dedication to baseball and his patronage in the Centerville community. Rick has a true love for the game of baseball and has touched many youth throughout Iowa playing the game of baseball by working with little league, high school, and college players to improve their baseball experience. Five are selected to enter the IHSBCA Hall of Fame

This year, the IHSBCA Hall of Fame Class of 2014 will induct two coaches, two players, and one umpire. These five inductees are: Bret Hoyer (Coach), Cedar Rapids; Dick Smith (Coach), Ogden; Ed Sawvell (Player), Wilton; Lon Olejniczak (Player), Decorah; and Roger Barr (Umpire), Boone. The Hall of Fame Class of 2014 will be inducted during the IHSBCA Awards Banquet on Saturday, January 18, 2014, in Cedar Rapids. They will join the 251 previously inducted Hall of Fame members.

Bret Hoyer (Coach) – Bret has been the head baseball coach at Cedar Rapids Kennedy since 1993. His first head baseball coaching position came in 1990 at his old high school, Iowa City Regina. Bret played varsity baseball at Regina as an outfielder. Upon high school graduation, Bret continued his baseball career at Wartburg College, graduating in 1987 with All-American honors as an outfielder. Bret has ingrained those winning ways at Kennedy High School the past 20 years. He has coached 14 State Tournament appearances, one State Championship, 3 State Runner-up finishes, and has accumulated over 620 career wins thus far in his baseball coaching career. Bret has also been very active in his community helping start the first school based USSSA Baseball program in the state of Iowa back in 2000. He has organized and coached numerous clinics in the area for young kids and youth coaches. Bret has also been active with fundraising efforts in the community to help build youth baseball diamonds at local elementary schools and churches. Bret is not only an outstanding baseball coach, but he is an outstanding teacher. Bret is a National Board Certified Math Teacher. He was also given the President's Award for Excellence in Science and Math in 1995. Bret has earned many baseball honors during his tenure. He has been named the Metro, Conference and District Coach of the Year many times. He was also named the State's Class 4A Baseball Coach of the Year award in 2011 after his team won the State Title. Bret has been a long time member of the association, a past president and board member, along with serving on various committee and chairman positions.

Dick Smith (Coach) – Dick has made only one coaching

stop during his high school baseball career. For 33 years, Dick has been the head baseball coach at Ogden High School. Dick graduated from Griswold High School where he was a four year starter as a pitcher, outfielder, and catcher. Dick took his baseball talents to Kansas State where he walked-on the baseball team. He pitched for the Wildcats for two years before graduating in 1977. Dick began coaching for the Ogden school system from day one after signing his teaching contract. Dick has been involved in coaching the girls and boys basketball teams along with junior high football during his tenure in Ogden. Dick took over the baseball program in 1980, where he took over a struggling baseball program and has built a power house program. He has taken his baseball teams to the state tournament three times. He has won many conference titles and district titles. Dick has also been very active with the youth baseball programs in Ogden since taking over the high school baseball program. Dick has promoted youth AAU baseball in the community along with Babe Ruth and Little League programs. Dick has been a member of the association for 35 years. He has served on several committees, has been on the Board of Directors, and has been the chairman for the all-district meetings. Dick currently serves on the Awards Committee.

Lon Olejniczak (Player) – Lon played his high school baseball at Decorah High School. Lon was an all-around athlete at Decorah. His athletic resume includes football, basketball, along with baseball. Lon played short and pitched varsity all four years for his father, the legendary coach, Dennis Olejniczak. Lon broke many school records while playing baseball at Decorah. He finished his high school career with a 64-16 pitching record, which is still listed 4th Best All-Time in the Iowa High School Baseball Records book. He holds the state record for wins during a single season with 28. He is listed 9th Best All-Time for career strike outs with 651, and the single season 5th All-Time Best at 263. He also ranks 10th Best All-Time in ERA with a career 0.83 ERA. Lon earned all-state honors in multiple sports at Decorah: baseball, football, and basketball. Lon also earned high school All-American honors in 1979 by the American Association of College Baseball Coaches. He

played in the 1979 All-Star Series. Another honor that was bestowed on Lon was making the Centennial Honor Roll. He was listed as one of the top 125 most repeated names in Iowa. Listed best high school male athlete in the past century in a survey of more than 250 long-time coaches, athletic directors, school administrators, officials, sportswriters and fans. Lon was one of 16 individuals named from the 1970's. Lon finished his high school career hitting .380, 234 hits, 139 RBI's, and 179 runs scored. Lon graduated from Decorah in 1979 and continued his outstanding baseball career for the University of Iowa. He was a three year letter winner at Iowa as a pitcher, outfielder, and designated hitter. Lon's career at the University of Iowa ended early with an unfortunate broken leg. Lon is currently the Chief Executive Officer and Chief Sales Officer for TransAmerica Capital Management in Cedar Rapids.

Ed Sawvell (Player) – Ed is no stranger to baseball. He has not only had success as a high school and college player, but he has continued to amaze the opponents as he competed as a pitcher playing in many MSBL leagues across the country. Oh, by the way, he has 10 National Titles under his belt. Ed played his high school years at Wilton High School. He still remembers pitching in his 8th grade year against Burlington. He did lose that game, 2-0, but remembers the Burlington coach coming over and telling him that he pitched one heck of a game. He finished his junior and senior years with a combined 20-2 record. He graduated from Wilton High School in 1969. He went on to Muscatine Community College on a baseball scholarship. His promising pitching career took a turn for the worse after Ed injured a tendon in his elbow. After a year of rehab, Ed went on to play baseball at the University of Northern Iowa. His senior year, UNI won the conference title. He graduated from UNI in 1973 with a degree in recreation and a minor in business. Ed's baseball career did not stop there. He continued to pitch playing with the Walford Brewers, a semi-pro team in the Iowa Valley Baseball League. He played for 25 years. In 1989, Ed was asked to join a team out of Davenport, the Quad City Silver Bullets, and travel to Phoenix to play in the

Men's Senior Baseball League World Series. He played for the Silver Bullets from 1989-1994 when the team disbanded. In 1998, he was asked to play for a team out of Kansas City, the Monarchs, where in 1999 he won his first MSBL World Series. He won six titles with the Kansas City Monarchs. Ed went on to win four more titles playing for the New England Red Sox in the Roy Hobbs baseball tournament in Fort Myers, Florida. For a little perspective, the last game Ed pitched was at age 58 in the Hobbs Tournament in Florida was the semi-final game in the 55-and-over-division. He struck out 8 batters, no walks and allowed just 4 hits in a 4-1 complete game win over the defending champions. He only needed 89 pitches and was clocked at 84 mph on the radar gun. Since 1999, Ed has been the pitching coach for Jake Souhrada at Wilton High School. Coaching at Wilton is a dream come true for Coach Sawvell. Funny how things can go full circle.

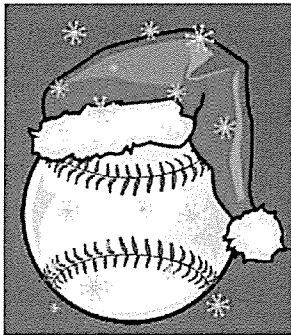
Roger Barr (Umpire) - Roger Barr is a long time friend and advocate for Iowa high school baseball. Roger joined the IHSAA in May as Director of Officials after a 30 year career as a highly successful football, basketball, and baseball official. He is one of two officials all-time in Iowa to rank among the top eight in state assignments and championship games in football, boys' basketball, and baseball. When his work in girls' basketball is added in, he is the only Iowa official to rank in the top eight in state tournament assignments and championship games in all four sports. His expertise in officiating has earned him numerous honors from the NFHS, coaching, and officials groups. Most recently, he was honored in Denver at the 2013 National federation summer meetings with the NFHS Citation Award in recognition of outstanding contributions to Interscholastic Athletics. In 2000, Roger was awarded the NFHS-NFOA Distinguished Officials Award for the Central section. He has been honored with Officials Hall of Fame induction by the IHSAA in 1996 and by the Iowa Girls Basketball Coaches Association in 2012. He is a past inductee of the Northwest Iowa Officials' Association Hall of Fame. He also received the NFHS Outstanding Service Award to State Associations.

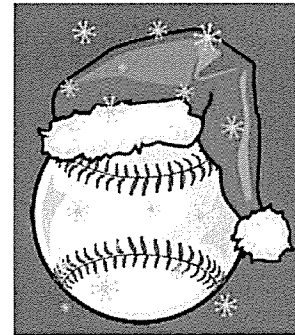

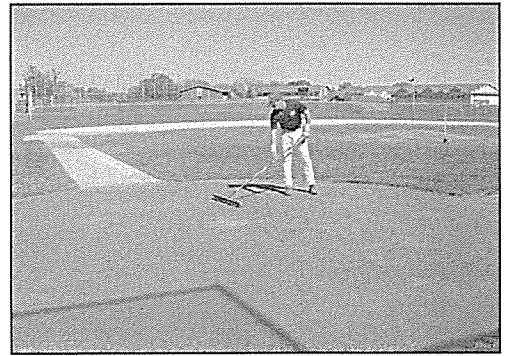

2 Year College Coach Nominations

Kyle Hanna - Des Moines Area Community College

Coach Hanna is entering his 2nd season as the head coach at DMACC. In his first season he compiled a 44-11 record, (4th highest win total in the country), won the ICCAC Championship for the 6th straight year, ranked #1 in the nation for several weeks, had 10 players on the ICCAC All-Region Team, 3 players on the North Plains All-District Team, and one All-American. He also had one player drafted in the 2013 Major League Baseball Draft; Dakota Freese was a 12th round pick by the Oakland Athletics.
