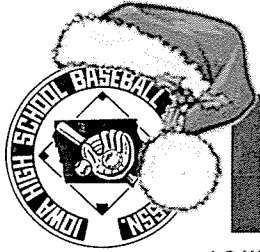

Clinic back in Cedar Rapids: This years clinic will again be held in Cedar Rapids at the Marriott Hotel, 1200 Collins Road NE, on January 16-17, 2015. You can make reservations on-line by contacting the Marriott at <https://resweb.passkey.com/go/IAHSBCA2015> or call the Marriott at 1-800-396-2153. We are very excited with our list of clinic speakers. On Friday afternoon, we will have Georgia Tech University head baseball Coach Danny Hall, Chicago White Sox Advanced Scouting Supervisor JJ Lally, and Cleveland Indians minor leaguer and author of the motivational book, 9 N 9 - Justin Toole. Our coaches mini-clinics will conclude Friday's sessions running from 4:55 to 6:50 pm. On Saturday, we will have our annual IHSAA rules meeting, along with Iowa assistant coaches Marty Sutherland (Infield) and Scott Brickman (Pitching), Accelerated Rehab talking about a proven off-season throwing program, and Duane Magee from the Department of Education talking about social media and coaching. We will continue to host the annual McDonalds/FCA Breakfast on Saturday morning starting at 7:30 am. Mike Botts is heading-up the umpire side of the clinic. Our Umpire sessions will follow the same time frame on both Friday and Saturday. Hope to see everyone there.

Vendors will be allowed to start setting-up their displays on Friday morning beginning at 9:00 am. The clinic sessions will begin at 1:00 pm on Friday afternoon and continue through Saturday, concluding at 3:30 pm.

The Awards Banquet will be held at the Marriott Hotel on Saturday evening, beginning at 6:00 pm. We are again looking forward to another outstanding weekend of baseball. With the clinic fast approaching, please check to make sure your membership has been paid for the 2014-2015 season. The new membership calendar year started on September 1, 2014 and runs through August 31, 2015. If your mailing label does not say 2015 on it, your dues have not yet been paid for this year. If you have questions, please give Lee Toole a call. Schools are reminded to take advantage of the school membership group rates. A reminder of how the discount works: the head coach is \$30.00, the first assistant coach is \$30.00, the second assistant coach is \$20.00, and the third assistant coach and beyond are \$15.00 each. The only catch to qualify for this coaching staff group discount rate is that all coaches, from the same school, must send in their membership forms together at the same time.

The Steering Committee, Board of Directors and each individual committee will meet prior to the start of the clinic on Friday. The Board and Steering Committee will meet on Thursday night, January 15th at the Marriott Hotel. 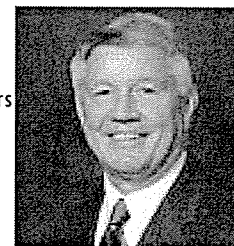
President's Award to Roger Hoel:

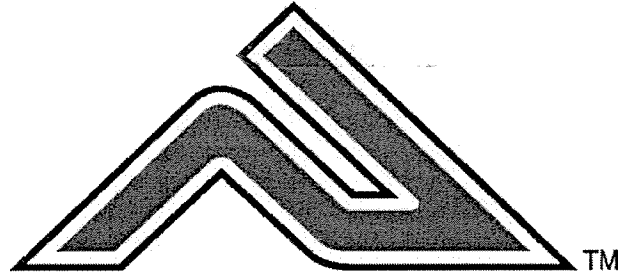

Harold "Pinky" Primrose Award to Rick Wulkow:

Rick Wulkow, executive director of the Iowa High School Athletic Association and one of the strongest athletic directors in the nation, is stepping down after 35 years of service to Iowa students and member schools. Rick became the fourth executive director of the 109 year old Association when he accepted the leadership reins from long time executive director Bernie Saggau in January of 2005. Rick joined the association in 1980 as the assistant executive director after Mr. Saggau recruited him from the public school ranks. As an assistant director, he held prominent leadership positions on national rules committees for football and chaired the basketball committee, two of the sports he administered as an assistant director for the IHSAA. Rick is a native and graduate of Lytton High School, where he was an all around athlete. While at Buena Vista, he earned the Jerry Ibach Award given for athletic and academic excellence. He was inducted into the Buena Vista University Hall of Fame in 1975. He was a teacher and football, track and baseball coach at Radcliffe and Denison, where he also was athletic director. He also served as an administrator at Paullina and Jefferson. His wife Donna, is a teacher in the Boone Community Schools systems. They have two adult children, Kyle and Megan. 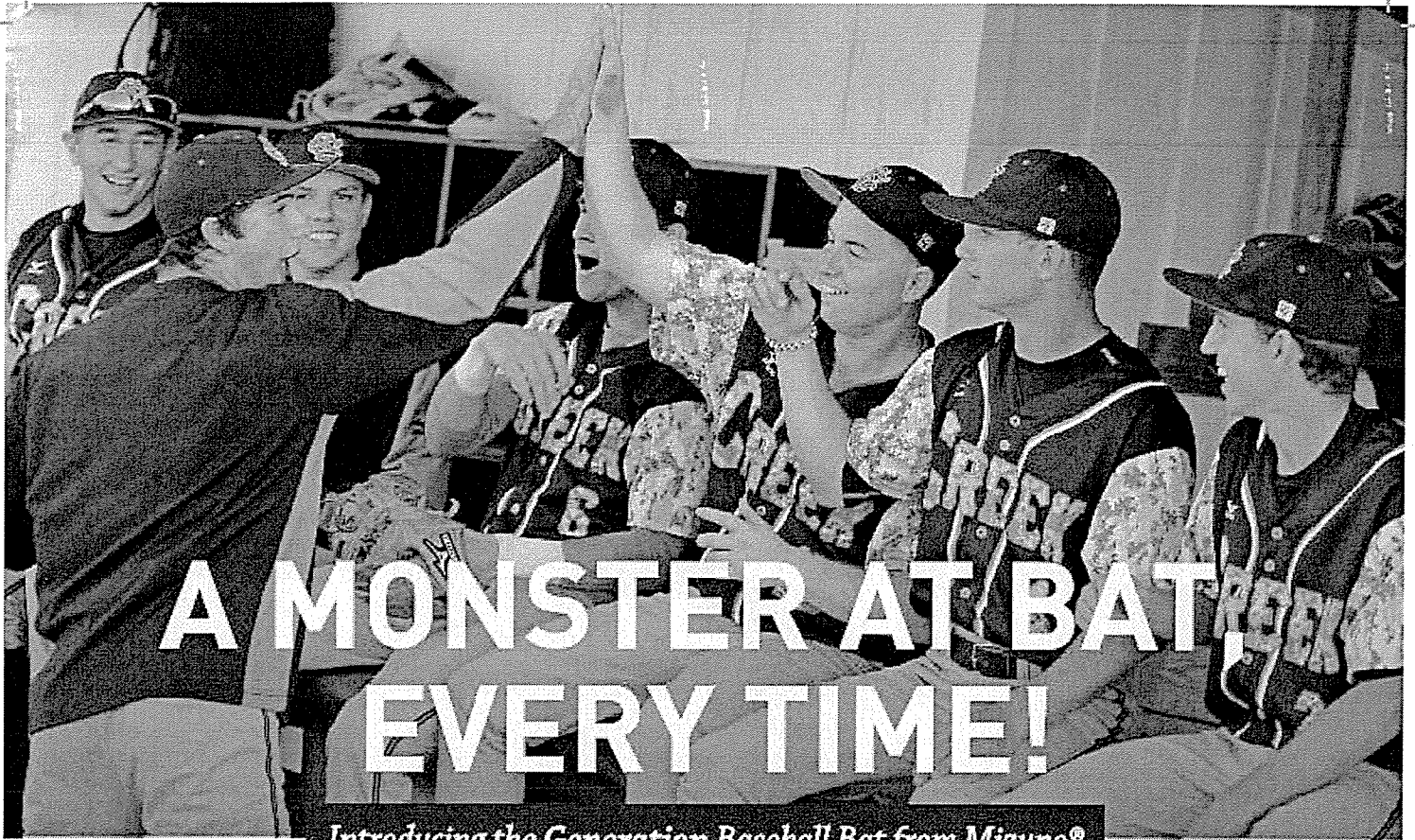

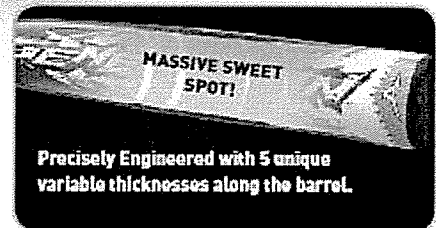

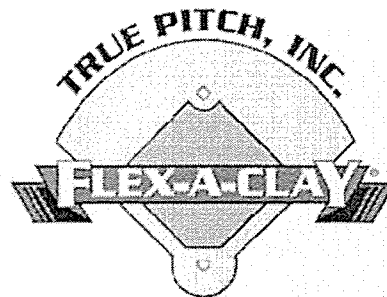

Four are selected to enter the IHSBCA Hall of Fame

This year, the IHSBCA Hall of Fame Class of 2015 will induct two coaches, one player, and one contributor. These four inductees are: Joe Shanks (Coach), Fort Dodge; Jerry Spieler (Coach), Carroll; Kip Peters (Player), Lansing Kee; and Dave Rock (Contributor), Wheatland. The Hall of Fame Class of 2015 will be inducted during the IHSBCA Awards Banquet on Saturday, January 17, 2015, in Cedar Rapids. They will join the 256 previously inducted Hall of Fame members.

Joe Shanks (Coach) – Joe has been the head baseball coach and athletic director at St. Edmond High School in Fort Dodge since 1996. Joe graduated from St. Edmond High School in 1976. He played 3 years varsity baseball at 3rd and 2nd base, where he earned All-State honors his junior and senior years at St. Edmond. Upon high school graduation, Joe continued his baseball career at Iowa Central CC and then onto Briar Cliff University. Joe played second base while at Iowa Central CC and moved over and played some third base at Briar Cliff. Joe graduated from Briar Cliff in 1980 with All-American honors. Joe started his high school coaching career at Sgt. Bluff in 1980. He coached volleyball, basketball, and track. His first baseball coaching job came in 1983 at Sioux City Heelan. Joe had a very successful 7 year run at Heelan; winning four conference championships, a trip to the state tournament in 1985, and finishing with a 208-82 record. Joe stepped away from high school coaching for a few years and attended Mankato State University, where he earned a master's degree in athletic administration in 1991. While at Mankato State, Joe also helped as the assistant baseball coach, working with the middle infielders. Joe returned to high school coaching in May of 1991 at Iowa City West High School. Joe coached at West for two seasons. Joe returned to his home town high school in 1996 as the athletic director and took over the baseball program shortly there-after. Joe also had two other short baseball coaching experiences at LeMars Gehlen and in Sparta, Wisconsin. Joe has been a long time member of the association. Joe has served on numerous committees, coached in two all-star series, and

served on the board of directors for the northwest district. Joe is a member of the association's 400 win club. He was voted district coach of the year in 1987, voted into the Briar Cliff Hall of Fame in 1996, and was awarded the Iowa Volunteer Governors Award in 1986.

Jerry Spieler (Coach) – In a day when coaching positions frequently turn over every few years, Jerry Spieler's departure in 2007 ended a remarkable 35-year career on the baseball diamond for Carroll Kuemper. Jerry served as assistant coach under Lou Galetich for three seasons and then with Bill Wieland for 20 years before becoming the head coach in 1996. His departure in 2007 ended a 12 year head coaching career. In those 35 years, Jerry played a major role in one of Kuemper Catholic High School's most successful athletic programs. In the 32-year Wieland/Spieler era, the Knights posted a 662-341 record, winning 66% of their games. Spieler's teams compiled a 304-135 record, capturing four Hawkeye Ten Conference titles, two trips to the state tournament and a second place finish in 2005. Jerry developed his coaching style over the years, learning the game he loved from his dad, where he played baseball nearly year-round at Granville Spalding Catholic High School, and then coaching at Kuemper. Jerry played shortstop during his playing days at Spalding, idolizing New York Yankees greats Tony Kubek and Phil Rizutto along with Chicago White Sox star Luis Aparicio. Jerry's 1965 high school team advanced to the state championship game, losing to Norway. Jerry went on to Briar Cliff College in Sioux City, where he played forward on the basketball team. The school didn't have a baseball program at that time. After graduating from Briar Cliff College in 1970, he took a job at Our Lady Mount Carmel Catholic School in Mount Carmel, teaching Math, Science, and Physical Education. He also coached freshman football at Kuemper. He joined the baseball staff a couple of years later with Coach Galetich. For Coach Spieler, coaching combines his enjoyment of teaching with sports. Over the years, Coach Spieler also coached junior high basketball and track. Jerry is married to his wife of over 42 years, Jeanne, who he met when they both attended Briar Cliff College. Jeanne is also a

long time volleyball and golf coach at Kuemper. Jerry has been a long time member of the association, a member of the 300 win club, named Class 2A Assistant Coach of the Year in 1991 and 1995, and named District Coach of the Year in 2005 and 2007.

Kip Peters (Player) – Kip played his high school baseball at Lansing Kee High School from 1989-1992. Kip played shortstop and pitched for Kee High, even pitching 14 innings on the varsity his 8th grade summer going 2-0. Kip played in four state tournaments. He has the distinction of being the winning pitcher in four consecutive state championship games from 1989 through 1992. Kip broke many individual team and season records while playing at Kee High. He led his team in hitting his junior and senior seasons, while leading the pitching staff in wins and ERA. His senior season, Kip led the state with an impressive 18-1 pitching record, an ERA of 1.02, with 169 strike outs while allowing only 20 walks. He finished his high school career with an impressive 51-4 pitching record, an ERA of 1.35, with 391 K's, with only 81 walks, and four State Championships. Kip earned all-conference and all-district honors his sophomore through senior years, while earning all-state honors his junior and senior seasons. Kip went on to play college baseball at Kirkwood College in Cedar Rapids. He finished his two years at Kirkwood with a career batting average of .362, hit 23 doubles, with 9 triples, 8 homeruns, and 84 RBI's. On the mound, Kip faced 51 batters, giving up only 3 singles, with an impressive 0.00 ERA, and a 1-0 pitching record. Kip now lives in Cedar Rapids and works for Old Dominion Freight.

Dave Rock (Contributor) – Dave has been a long time member and very good friend of the association. Dave's contributions go far beyond anyone's expectations. He has earned high praise and respect from his coaching peers and fellow association members, along with being recognized as one of our association's outstanding leaders. He has invested many hours of his time helping

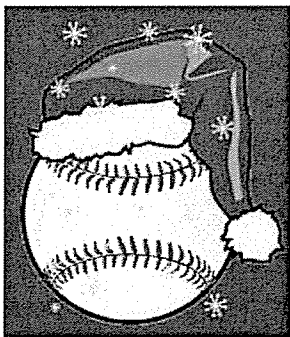
run, direct, and promote the association, our annual clinic, and the annual summer all-star series. Dave has been a member of the association for over 17 years, has chaired the Southwest 1A district meetings for 12 years, served on the Board of Directors for 9 years, served through the officers chairs and then onto our one year presidents position. He has coached in the all-star series as an assistant and then head coach, along with hosting the all-star series in Clinton back in 2006 and 2012. Dave will again host the all-star series this coming summer in Clinton. Dave also served for 6 years on the association's advisory board for the Iowa High School Athletic Association in Boone. Dave was very instrumental during the association's transitional period back in 2008 with the change at the top with the executive director's position. Dave spent 13 years as the head varsity baseball coach at Calamus-Wheatland High School. Dave's teams won 155 games, four district titles, one sub-state title, with one trip to the state tournament. He was named the Big East Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 and 2007. Dave was very instrumental towards developing the youth baseball programs in his area. He also spearheaded a major renovation project with the baseball and softball facilities; including the addition of lights on both fields. Dave chaired the Awards committee the past few years and made some very positive cosmetic changes to a number of the association's banquet awards. He also spent many hours helping re-work the academic all-state criteria and worked to modified and up-date the association's constitution. Dave played his high school baseball at Calamus High School, where he was a four year starter as a catcher. He went on to Black Hawk Community College and then to St. Ambrose College where he continued to play in the catcher position, but also played some third base. Dave's contributions to the association can't be over-looked without mention his wife Kendra, who has been as involved with the All-Star Series and annual clinic as anyone else has in then association. Dave will take on a new role for the association this coming summer as co-chairman organizing and running the Junior Showcase. Dave is our association's energizer bunny.

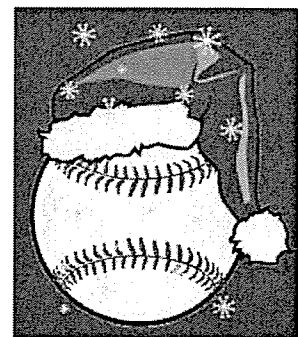

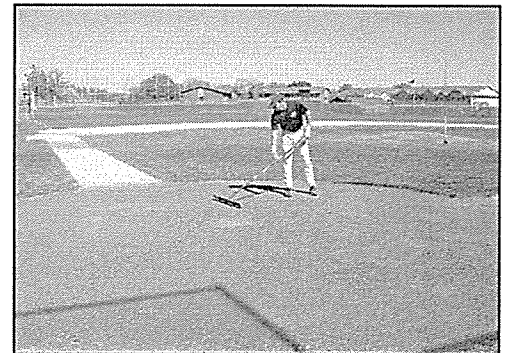

College Coach of the Year Nominations

2 Year College Coach Nominations

Marc Rardin - Iowa Western Community College

Coach Rardin begins his 13 season as the head coach at Iowa Western. During Rardins time leading the Reivers baseball program, Rardins teams have rewrote the record books in every facet of the program and made the junior college baseball history by winning the Junior College World Series in 2010, 2012, and 2014. The first Northern District representative to ever win the Junior College World Series. In the 12 seasons at Iowa Western, Rardin's Reiver's have participated in 8 Junior College World Series, have won 10 consecutive Regional titles, and 8 Northern District titles. That's 21 post season titles, more than any other Division I junior college program in the country. Rardin's teams have averaged nearly 46 wins per season and have a record of 559 wins to only 168 losses. That is a winning percentage of .769. In that same time period, he has accumulated 265 wins to only 43 losses in regular season conference and conference tournament play. That is a .860 winning percentage. To further describe the level of success under Coach Rardin is to describe the post season numbers. He has coached in 88 post season games, winning 79 of them. Easy to see why they are the 2014 Junior College National Champions!

Justin Schulte - Southeastern Community College

Justin enters his 17th season as a head coach, and his 20th season coaching in college baseball. The 2014-15 season will mark Coach Schulte's 10th season leading the Blackhawk baseball program. In his first 16 seasons as a head coach, he has compiled over 623 wins, with 347 coming in his 9 seasons at Southeastern, making him the all-time winningest coach in Blackhawk baseball history. Since 1999, no other junior college coach in the state of Iowa has amassed more than the 623 coaching victories that Schulte's squads have produced. The 2014 season proved to be one for the record books as the Blackhawks clinched a berth to the NJCAA DII World Series. The 2014 Blackhawks finished ranked 4th in the country with a record of 45-22, which breaks the single season win record of 44 wins in 2011. This squad was made up of 10 All-Region players, the ICCAC Defensive Player of the Year, and the ICCAC Pitcher of the Year. The sophomore class saw 10 players continue their baseball careers at the 4 year college level.



4 Year College Coach Nominations

Rick Heller – University of Iowa

Rick is entering his second season as head coach of the Hawkeye baseball program. Heller was tabbed as the 20th head coach in the Iowa baseball program history. Coach Heller is a native of Eldon, Iowa and has been a head coach at four institutions - Iowa, Indiana State, UNI, and Upper Iowa. In his first season in Iowa City, Heller helped guide the Hawkeyes to a 9-1 start - the program's best start since 1940 - a Big Ten Tournament berth and conference tournament win against Minnesota. Iowa finished the year with a 30-23 record for just the third 30 win season since 1993. The 30 wins are the most by a first year coach in Iowa history. Coach Heller won his 700th career game in a 13-1 rout of Georgetown on March 15 at the Snowbird Classic in Florida. The Hawkeyes also took 2-of-3 games from Nebraska to open the Big Ten regular season, Iowa's first conference opening series win since 1998 and then took 2-of-3 from Minnesota for the first time since 2005. Under Heller's direction, Iowa became one of the most potent offensive teams in the Big Ten in 2014. The Hawkeyes led the conference in four offensive categories (batting average, hits, runs, and on-base percentage), and ranked second in four more (slugging percentage, RBI's, home runs, and total bases). Iowa finished with 23 home runs - a season after the team had only two long balls in 49 games.

Brian Wede - Northwestern College

In 2014, Coach Wede led his team to a 42-13 regular season record and 16-4 record in the GPAC. His club established a new school record with 42 wins. The Red Raiders started the season ranked 32nd and finished ranked 21st. Northwestern qualified for the NAIA National Tournament Opening Round for the second consecutive season. Northwestern leads the state of Iowa's 25 four-year college baseball programs with 251 wins in the last eight years and with 129 in the last four years. The 2014 season marked Wede's eighth as the head coach, after serving as an assistant coach for two seasons. Wede's teams have won 251 games and five conference championships. Northwestern has also been very strong in the post season winning 29 postseason games, best in the GPAC. Wede was named the GPAC Coach of the Year following the 2013 season. Wede is also very respected across the country, serving as the Chairman of the NAIA Baseball Rules Committee and the national teams rater. Wede has also served on the NAIA World Series Games Committee, All-American Committee, and National Tournament Procedures Committee. In 2014-15, Coach Wede will join the NAIA Baseball Coaches Executive Committee.
