**CLINIC MARCH 12-13:** The 1976 Clinic tentative lineup is enclosed. We hope you are planning to get the day off and join us for another super clinic for baseball coaches, players, umpires and fans. It is open to your ball team if they are interested in learning a lot of baseball. Every session will be offered twice. The High School students will have sessions by themselves with speakers talking just to them, demonstrating, etc. We hope to have 300 or more high school students in attendance.

Admission to the Clinic will be \$10.00. This is for all members. It will include all meals, a favor, and the opportunity to hear many good speakers. If you are not a member of the association it will cost you \$15.00 for the clinic. This will include your membership. Late registration will cost an extra \$2.50. High school student rates are still the same \$3.00 for full clinic or \$2.00 per day. If they want the meals it will cost high school students \$10.00 for the full clinic.

## SUPER CLINIC SPEAKER LINE-UP:

**DINNER SPEAKER:** United States Senator John C. Culver. Senator Culver was elected to the U.S. Senate in 1974, after serving the previous 10 years as the Second District Congressman. Senator Culver is a member of the Senate Armed Services Committee and the Senate Public Works Committee. Recently he was appointed on the Senate Olympic Committee. Time magazine named Senator Culver as one of their "200 Leaders of the Future."

**JIM BROSNAN:** One of the very first baseball players to write a book about their on and off the field experiences. Jim wrote the "The Long Season". Jim has written many articles for Sports Illustrated and coming up in the near future a article in Play boy magazine. Jim spent 9 years in the big leagues with Chicago and Cincinnati. He was in 385 winning 55 and losing 47 with an E.R.A. of 3.54. Jim pitched in the 1961 World Series.

**JOHN RICE:** John Rice umpired in the American League for 19 years. He has a total of 27 years of experience in professional baseball as an umpire. John retired in 1973 after working in four world series and many All Star games. He has given clinics in Europe and the United States. Was recognized as one of the outstanding umpires.

**CARLTON "BUZ" KELLER:** By popular request, Buz Keller comes back to our clinic. Everyone who attend the 1974 Clinic will recall Buz Keller and his knowledge of the great game. Buz was the Director of Player Development and Coordinator of Instruction and Manager of the Kansas City Royals Academy Team. He was a former infielder for the Cubs farm system. He coached baseball at Texas Lutheran College for 11 years. He has given many clinics throughout the United States. Outstanding speaker and motivator.

**JAY HANKINS:** Jay played outfield for the Kansas City Athletics. He was the Athletics Road Secretary in the late 60's. Jay played his college baseball at the University of Missouri. Jay spoke at our clinic last year, and was invited back to speak on outfield play. Jay is presently Midwest Scout for the Scouting Bureau.

## MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS November 8, 1975

The meeting was called to order at 9:50 A.M. by President Jim Jagim at Iowa State University, Beyer Hall.

Members present were: **OFFICERS:** President Jim Jagim, Vice-President Dave Hoyt, Treasurer Mick Mattiace and Secretary Jim Schulz; Executive Secretary Harold Primrose; **DIRECTORS:** Northeast, Al Seabrook, Clermont; Lowell Thompson, Mason City; Denny Olejniczak, Decorah; Northwest, Marv Thelen, Remsen St. Mary's; Central, Jim Ellwanger, St. Edmonds, Fort Dodge; Bill Sapp, Boone; Dave Posegate, Ames; Southwest, Dean Witmer, Perry; Dale Allensworth, Jefferson; Southeast, (none); **PAST PRESIDENT:** Dick Wagner, Burlington; **COLLEGE COACHES:** Clair Rierson, Iowa State University and Duane Banks, University of Iowa.

**Financial Report:** The financial report was given by Executive Secretary Primrose covering March 13, 1975 through November 8, 1975 showing total receipts of \$6,967.01 with disbursements totaling \$5,545.63. A total cash balance of \$1,421.38 was shown. Marv Thelen moved to accept the financial report, seconded by Bill Sapp. Motion carried.

**Report of Officers and Committees:** **PRESIDENT'S REPORT:** 1. Urging the I.H.S.B.C.A. to boost organizations that support our Association; 2. Representatives of the Metro Conference were recognized by President Jagim as keeping the people informed of Conference play; 3. The rating pole definitely helps make people more aware of High School Baseball; 4. The clinic success has been outstanding and with the 1976 Clinic program planned we now need to continue its promotion; 5. Association membership needs to bring forth those coaches that should be recognized for years of coaching (15 years, 20 years, etc.) plus those coaches with 200, 300, 400 and 500 wins; 6. The Shrine All-Star Baseball game could be a possibility so all be ready if this becomes a reality in 1976; 7. The motivational outcomes of improved programs in our high schools helps our Association; 8. The following improvements in high school baseball occurred last year: a. Medals are now awarded for tournament qualifiers; b. handling of rained out games were improved on in last years tourney; 9. The following concerns were expressed by President Jagim: a. Big turnover in high school coaches and urges every possible effort be made to keep our good coaches in baseball; b. Baseball tournaments should be terminating at an earlier date; c. Communications from the Association often remains unanswered, such as questionnaires and ballots, so get them filled out when received and mailed in; 10. The officer chain-of-command needs attention because of Dave Hoyt moving out of coaching to accept an Assistant Principals position at Cedar Rapids Jefferson High School and Director Lowell Grunwald moving out of the State; 11. Request Standing Committee chairmen contact your committee members personally to get all to be at the March Clinic meetings.

At this time a question was asked of President Jagim regarding the problem of not having coaches home address and phone numbers for communications. Clair Rierson suggested putting out a list of all baseball coaches to include their name, address, home phone and school phone. It was recommended by Marv Thelen that this be done through the Iowa High School Athletic Association.

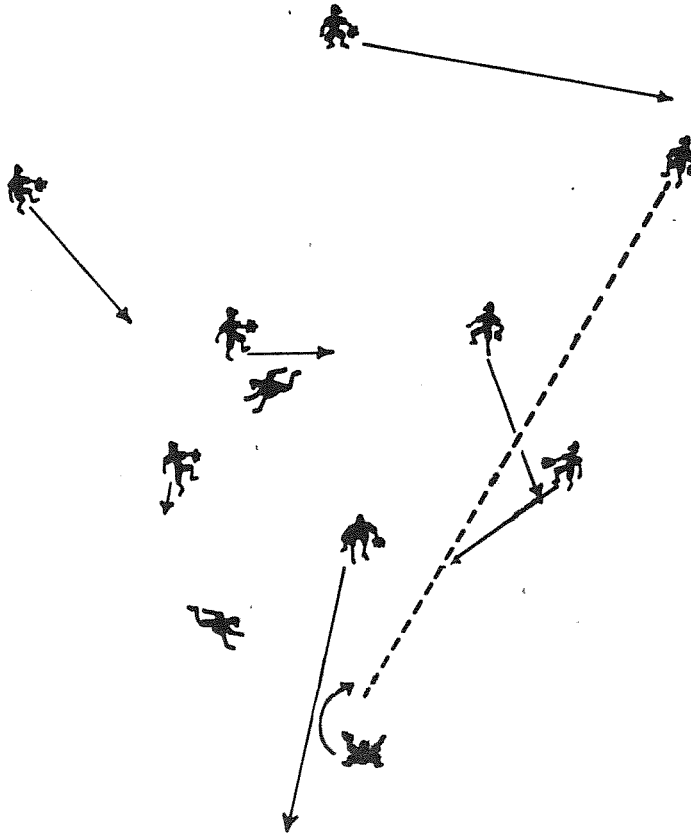
